MEMORANDUM:

TO: All Concerned.

MOVEMENT TO SALERNO

1. Reference is made to Warning Order of today's date.

2. PERSONAL BAGGAGE. - a. Baggage of officers who will move to SALERNO on 26 January 1944:

(1) Officers will pack as much baggage as will not be needed the night of 25 January, and prepare it for shipment, marking it clearly with name and rank. By 0900, 25 January, every officer will report to the Billeting Office, Headquarters Commandant's Section, the location and description of such baggage. This will be assembled during the day by the Headquarters Commandant's Section at a central point.

(2) On the morning of 26 January, the Headquarters Commandant will spot vehicles in front of, or near, each billet between 0700 and 0730 to pick up the remaining baggage. It is the responsibility of each officer to notify the Billeting Office, (Extension 39), before 1800, 25 January, where he wants this vehicle spotted. This baggage also should be clearly marked with the officer's name and rank. This baggage will then be carried to a central point.

(3) Baggage not ready by 0730 will have to be carried by the officer himself.

b. Officers moving to SALERNO on 27 January 1944:

(1) Same rules as the above, except that each item will take place 24 hours later.

3. OFFICE EQUIPMENT. - a. No T/E equipment, namely, typewriters, stapling machines, field desks, and the like will be taken to SALERNO.

b. No office equipment, such as desks, tables, chairs, bookcases, filing cabinets, and the like will be taken to SALERNO.

c. Before 1300, 26 January, the Administrative Directorate and AG will phone the Office Section (Extension 39), Headquarters Commandant's Office, stating the number and size of boxes desired for transport of equipment for each sub-section. Empty boxes will be delivered promptly as called for.

- d. Before 1530, 26 January, all boxes will be packed.
- e. Between 1530 and 1630, carpenters will come to each section to close the boxes. Boxes that are not ready by 1530, 26 January, cannot be taken. Painters will come at the same time and will paint on the boxes the identification of the section, and number the boxes.
- f. After being properly marked, the boxes will then be removed to a central point, and will be placed under guard until delivered to the convoy.
- g. The necessary office equipment and T/E equipment will be drawn from the Headquarters Company at SALERNO.
4. Office equipment, baggage and T/E equipment will be loaded on the convoy trucks and be ready at the IP at 0930 on 26 January for those ordered to go on that date, and on 27 January for those ordered to go on that date.
5. PERSONAL - All officers will sign out both with the AG Branch and the Billeting Office before leaving.

MOVE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HALF SECTION TO SALERNO

1. Move.

a. Reference Memorandum to all concerned, dated 24 January 1944 (Warning Order). Officers and EM/OR to move on 26 January (Party "A") are listed in Appendix "A", and those to move on 27 January (Party "B") in Appendix "B" to this order.

b. Both moves will be by road in own transport.

2. Command.

Lt Col CRIPPS, (Administrative Staff) will be in command of Party "A" and Lieut. W. V. M. LEWIS (Interior) of Party "B".

3. Transport.

b. Lord STANSGATE'S Staff Car and one other Staff Car accompanying Party "B" will remain permanently at Salerno together with their drivers (See Appendix "B").

c. 2nd Lt SHADWICK will accompany both convoys as Transport Officer. All Staff Cars (except as ordered in b. above) C & R cars and Jeeps will return to Naples on completion of duty on both days, under command of Lt Shadwick.

4. Time and Place of Start.

I.P. and start time on both days will be the same - 61 Via Medina at 1030 hours.

5. Procedure on Arrival.

On arrival at the Palace of Justice, Salerno, convoy commanders will report to HQ Comdt (Capt DRAGE) before any Officer or man is permitted to leave his vehicle.

6. Officers Moving Independently.

- a. Viscount Stansgate and Capt Kerker (Party "B") will move independently (See par 3 b) on 27 January 1944 either ahead of or behind the convoy.
- b. The following Officers, not now present in Naples, will move independently to Salerno at a date and time to be notified later under arrangements of G-4 direct with the Officers concerned:

7. Officers' Mess - Salerno.

Until the move from Brindisi to Salerno takes place, Capt Drage will act as Mess Secretary and Treasurer. Lt. Col Cripps will, if necessary, detail a part-time Mess Officer to assist.

8. Office Procedure at Salerno.

- a. During the interim period, i.e., until the Brindisi - Salerno move takes place, no correspondence will be addressed to Salerno as an echelon of HQ, ACC. All correspondence and cables will be dealt with at Naples, and distributed to the Administrative Half Section from there by the twice-daily courier service.

- b. Cable address of Salerno detachment is "Fatima Forward", and there is now a direct telephone line.

9. Reallotment of Office Space at Naples.

- a. Separate orders will be issued at an early date.
- b. Under the revised office plan, no office space will be provided at HQ, ACC, Naples for Officers of the Administrative Half Section except as provided in the attached Memorandum to all concerned, dated 27 January 1944, i.e., for Vice President and RA, two Legal Officers and four (4) visiting Officers of Sub-Commissions. Any Officers not in this category who have special work in Naples must vacate their offices and arrange for office accommodation with Region III. They may continue to occupy HQ billets and use HQ Messes.

1. Capt. E. Hammond has reported to me the arrival in Naples of Major J.B. Ward-Perkins, D.A. on assignment to Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives. Whether his assignment is to the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Sub-commission of Hq. AMG (AGC) or to Region III is not known to me.

2. You will recall that Major E. Sizer travelled with the Hq. AMG convey to Naples in response to a cable suggesting the attachment of a Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives officer to Hq. 5th Army.

3. If Major Sizer has not yet been attached to 5th Army, I would recommend that Major Ward-Perkins would be more suitable for the attachment.

4. My reasons for this recommendation are as follows:

a) On general principles I consider it would be preferable to have a British Officer attached to the Hq. of a British Army.

Dear Woolley,

Many thanks for your letter of the 2nd. I hope this reply will reach you; I do not know how long you will be staying in Naples, nor with whom, but I presume AFHQ will know where you are.

I will reply to your points in order.

a) 5th Army.

Owing to the separation of AMG.Hq and AMG.15 Army Group, we have no control whatever over the way in which AMG.15 Army Group disposes of the AFHQ officers it already has. It is true we have succeeded in getting Hammond assigned to Region III for duty with 15 Army Group, and he is due to leave to-morrow or the next day, but I have no means of getting anybody assigned to 5th Army unless an official request is made by that Army via HQ 15 Army Group, via AFHQ, via AMG.Hq to me. If such a request were to be received, I could not assign Sewall and Vaughn, who are posted to Region IV and are under the orders of AMG.15 Army Group and HQF under AMG.Hq. But as far as I can see there is nothing whatever to prevent AMG.15 Army Group from assigning them to 5th Army, and I should gladly approve of such an arrangement. The fighting is all in the Region to which they have been assigned, and they could most properly be employed up with the Army rather than kicking their heels in Naples, if that is what they are doing. If and when the fighting passes beyond Region IV we can consider whether they should remain in that Region or with the Army Staff. I feel that decision may not be required for a week or two, and in the meantime I should strongly approve of their being attached to the 5th Army Staff.

b) Plans and lists.

i) Plans. Three copies of some and two of others of the town plans were taken from Tizi Ouzou by the staff of Region III when it left early in September, and were signed for by a Major Murray-Praser. As we had only four copies originally we now have either one or two copies of each in our file. Since they are more urgently required in the Region than here, I am sending Gardner the complete set, one copy only, which will leave us with no copy of some. However a further supply has already been asked for from Washington, and will no doubt arrive in due course.

ii) Harvard lists. The lists had not been received at Tizi

0824

Cuzon when Region III left. When Sizer arrived with the list I had them all copied, and sent three copies of the Region III list to Region III by the usual channels: Dewald also took a copy with him when he left. I have had it copied again, and am sending Gardner two copies: if Dewald goes forward he can hand over his copy if required.

iii) Long Handbooks. We have never had the Long Handbook for Region III. Whether there are copies in this HQ I do not know, and with everything being packed up, I cannot at present discover. Anyway they are not of much use for our purposes: Paedaker, even in old editions, is far more useful.

c) Directives and Reports.

i) Directives. Gardner has received none for two reasons; firstly because none have been issued to anybody: they have been drafted and redrafted and boiled down and chopped and changed, but never issued. Secondly because even if they had been issued they would not have been issued to Region III officially, since we have no control over that Region.

ii) Reports. Similarly I have no authority to tell Gardner to submit reports to me. He is in NO sense under the control of the Sub-commission. All I can do, and am doing, is to ask him personally to let me have unofficially a copy of any report which he submits to his legitimate superiors.

d) Education.

The Education Sub-commission tried a short while ago to replace Gardner by an Educationalist. I was asked my views, and protested strongly. At the same time I repeated the question I have asked five or six times as to whether the split between Education and APAA at the top level is to be continued down to Regional level. The answer I believe will be that for regions under AMG.HQ there will be no W/S, and officers will form a pool to be used at the discretion of HQs of sub-commissions. That however does not at present apply to Region III which is not under AMG.HQ and which has a W/S. There the matter rests for the moment, but I believe that Education intend to try to get a man of their own into Region III.

Three of the four difficulties you have raised are directly attributable to this curious dual control of AMG.HQ and AMG IS AG. I am not, of course, criticising the arrangement.

Meanwhile none of this Sub-commission is moving forward with the rest of this menagerie when it goes. We are not essential.

1. It will obviously take some time and possibly practical experience before the final required composition of Sub-Commissions can be determined. What is quite certain is that no further specialist personnel will be forthcoming from the U.K. or the U.S.
2. Proposals for final composition should not, therefore, be sent to G-1 until called for, but should be filed with the appropriate Directorate or Section Staff.
3. It is pointed out,
 - (a) That Regions 8 and 9 are being formed into a pool, which will be available for H.Q. A.C.C. and Regions under its command, and for A.M.G. 15 Army Group and Regions under its command.
 - (b) That, in view of the existing overall American T.O. (2675 Regt.) and the overall British W.E. to be published, transfers of personnel from Regions under command to H.Q. A.C.C., on permanent or temporary duty will present no difficulty since no fixed establishment is involved.
4. Action by Sub-Commissions should therefore for the present be confined to requests (through Directorate H.Q.) for Officers actually required for present duties, either by name or rank, nationality and qualifications. Action will then be taken by G-1, in approved cases, to obtain such officers, either from Regions under command or from the pool.
5. It should be noted that if the number of officers in a Sub-Commission is increased, a corresponding increase in clerks can by no means be counted upon.

Dear P.K.

Excuse this being in pencil, but I have nothing else than pencil wherewith to write.

I have been up to 5th Army HQ and they normally ask that two MFA officers should go up to the front to be attached to the Staff. Colonel Hume is away so I reported this to Col. Ashley who will probably send along Dewald & Waugh; but I told him that the decision as to who were the right men ⁴¹⁶⁵rest with you, so I asked him to let you know & to regard any steps that he might take himself as provisional. I trust that you will be satisfied with this.

I find that for Region 3 there is, apparently, only one copy available of the Zone handbook, and that the Committee's detailed maps showing monuments, and the Harvard lists are entirely lacking: - the copies which were brought to Salerno were taken off by a British officer who is reported missing & all the stock disappeared with him. So replacement is urgently required. At present, I believe, the Italian Museum authorities decide what is or is not an important monument, & we ought not to be bound by their decisions which may not coincide with the views of the Committees etc.

never

Also, Gardner has received any directives, which he ought to have. He has not been told to send in reports to anyone other than his immediate superior on the spot, Colonel Hume, & while he did send in reports long since they are (a) edited & abbreviated and (b) held up to be incorporated in the general AMG report representing all branches, which report is not yet ready; consequently material which we might have had & used a month ago is not forthcoming yet. This is a matter which I think you can put straight, for it should be clear that reports from officers of the Sub-commission should be forwarded at once to the Acting Director of that Sub-commission.

Here, Gardner is still acting for education as well as for MFA; another thing that needs to be straightened out.

That's all for the moment. I hope you are feeling better.

1. In view of the arrival of three more officers tonight, the question of assignment and of office space becomes acute.
2. In recent conversation with Lt. Col. Poletti he expressed eagerness to have Regional advisers appointed.
3. In conversation with Brig. Gen. McSherry, he stated that the assignment of personnel rested with you.
4. In conversation, Brig. Gen. McSherry stated that when a driver was ~~available~~ available, I was to be sent by one of the Region 4 transport through Southern Italy to Naples. The verbal promises of the Army are likely to be write in water, but I trust that this will come to pass.
5. In a previous memo, it was suggested that steps should be taken at once to select the Region 1 personnel (two officers) and to suggest them to Lt. Col. Poletti for approval, to secure office space and equipment in the Region 1 Hqs (always requiring prompt action), and to have the assignment made by AMG Hq.
6. It is suggested that the transitional period should be made by settling up Region 1 Hqs for a few days in Room 58, while their Office in the Palazzo Bordonaro is secured, and while the files are separated. It is suggested that for this period one Officer familiar with the conditions here (Capt. Maxse or Lt. Cott) remain as Region 1 representative in Room 58 with one of the new officers as assistant (to break him into the type of problem met with). The other officer (Maxse or Cott) should be sent to stay for some days in some other of the main centers - perhaps also with one of the new comers who could get field experience. Since transport is short, they might be sent by air to Catania and allowed there to try and get themselves about, e.g. to Siracusa, to Messina, etc., and eventually to get themselves back.
7. It is my strong feeling that a stay of several days to a week should be made in at least Messina, Catania, Siracusa, and Agrigento by a representative of this office familiar with the problems, who could examine the situation and remain long enough to get things organized. Catania is perhaps the least important as Lt. Col. Wellesley is much interested. But it is a good starting place. Naturally, trips could be engineered in company of local officers to other sites. The daily round of problems here strongly convinces me that the other cities are not getting along because there is no one there to follow things through.

III ORGANISATION.

- (a) Title. (The suggestion as to title was submitted again in my memo of 7th November.)
- (b) Separation from Education. It is assumed that with the formation of a separate Subcommission of A.C.C. for MFA&A separate representation in the Regions will also be sanctioned.

(c) Organisation. The following organisation is envisaged:-

(i) Officers attached to Staffs of advancing armies.

This is considered especially important, since experience has shown that immediately after occupation much damage has been done by Allied troops through ignorance or indifference, - damage which could have been avoided if there had been competent advisers on the spot. Such officers should be of at least rank of Major if their advice is to carry weight with Commanders in the field, and the scale to be aimed at would be one with HQ 15 Army Group and one with each Army. These officers should have transport available, and should NOT be left behind as Regions are formed, but should remain with their respective Hqs.

(ii) Officers attached to Regional HQ. It is recommended that there should be at least two officers attached to each Region as Advisers, and more in the more important Regions (eg. IV and VIII). There is a large amount of office work to be done, but the major part of a Regional MFA&A officer's work is to inspect and to report on the monuments etc. of his Region. One in the Office and one in the Field is required, with adequate clerical assistance, and with transport at command, and not dependent upon a pool. The senior officer should be a Major. As the Italian authorities resume control one officer could be withdrawn and sent to another Region.

(iii) Sub-commission at AMGHQ or A.C.C. It is recommended that there should be

- A Director, head of Sub-commission, not of lower rank than other heads of Sub-commissions (Col: or Lt.Col:)
- Two Assistant Directors (Lt.Col: or Major)
- Administrative officer (Captain)
- One or more assistants might be provided as officers are released from Regions returned to the Italian Govt.
- Adequate clerical staff and transport should be available.
