1. The following ruling reference the issue of servant allowance has recently been received from GHO:-

"Servant Allowance may continue in issue to officers absent from their unit on account of ordinary leave, sickness etc., up to 61 days, subject to the services of the civilian servants being retained, and the necessary certificates rendered to Army Pay Office, 'enclomaster'."

2. Directive immediately the following procedure will apply:-

(a) (i) All entitled officers posted to Allied Commission on or after 3 Nov 45 (who have not already claimed) will submit claim certificate in accordance with attached proforma 'A'.

(ii) Once claim has been submitted and entitlement established, allowance will remain in issue for as long as the conditions under which it was granted remain unchanged, subject to para (b) below.

(b) (i) All officers who are absent from their unit on account of sickness, temporary duty or ordinary leave, will, providing they are retaining the services of their civilian servants, certify same in accordance with the attached proforma 'B'.

(ii) If retention of servant certificates are not required for periods of absence it will be assumed that officers concerned have not retained the services of their civilian servants, and issue of allowance will cease automatically for the period of absence.

3. Both forms of certificate will be fully completed (in duplicate) by the officer concerned, and will be countersigned by Chief Liaison Officer or Head of Sub-Commission as appropriate. They will be forwarded to this H.Q. with the relevant casualty (AC Form R.3) which will be endorsed accordingly. "certificates 'A' (or 'B') attached".

4. Officers on the present posted or attached strength of this Commission who have, during the period of their posting or attachment, been absent on leave, duty or sickness, and who did not receive servant allowance for the period of absence in accordance with para 2(b) and 3(c).

(ii) Once claim has been submitted and entitlement established, allowance will remain in issue for as long as the conditions under which it was granted remain unchanged, subject to para (b) below.

(b) (i) All officers who are absent from their unit on account of sickness, temporary duty or ordinary leave, will, providing they are retaining the services of their civilian servants, certify same in accordance with the attached proforma 'B'.

(ii) If retention of servant certificates are not rendered for periods of absence it will be assumed that officers concerned have not retained the services of their civilian servants, and issue of allowance will cease automatically for the period of absence.

3. Both forms of certificate will be fully completed (in duplicate) by the officer concerned, and will be countersigned by Chief Liaison Officer or Head of Sub-Commission as appropriate. They will be forwarded to this H.Q. with the relevant casualty (AO Form E.3) which will be endorsed accordingly "certificate 'A' (or 'B') attached".

4. Officers on the present posted or attached strength of this Commission who have, during the period of their posting or attachment, been absent on leave, duty or sickness, and who did not receive servant allowance for the period in question, may now submit claims in accordance with para 2(b) and 263 above, provided that the services of their civilian servants were retained.

5. This H.Q. letters of even reference dated 17 Nov and 19 Dec 45 are hereby cancelled.
