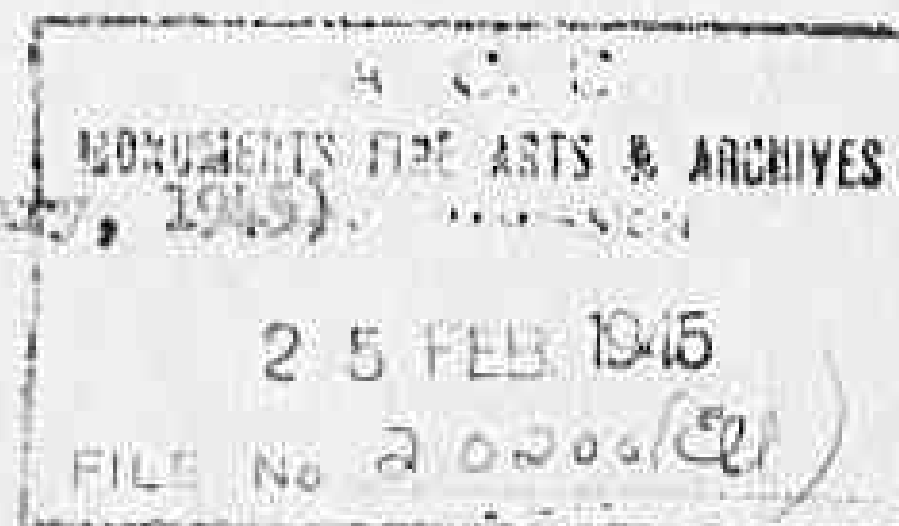

1. For some weeks past undersigned has been attached as MPAA Officer to ANG 5th Army, with a jeep supplied by HQ. ACC and Dvr. Carmine MAGLIONE as driver.
2. On arrival in Rome on 12 Oct 44 on duty, undersigned dismissed Dvr. MAGLIONE with instructions to report at the office of MPAA Subcommission at 14.30 hrs. on the following day. He did not so report, nor has he since reported to undersigned, whose return to duty in FLORENCE has consequently been delayed by at least 24 hrs.
3. Undersigned has obtained another driver (Pasquale CECI) from Captain BATTIONI, to whom the circumstances have been explained.
4. Dvr. MAGLIONE's conduct in general has not been unsatisfactory, and for this reason a previous delinquency when in Rome was overlooked. MAGLIONE was warned on that occasion that a repetition would not be tolerated; the repetition has, however, now occurred.
5. These circumstances are reported for any disciplinary action you may consider necessary.

Sir,

I have to report that at ROME on the 17th September 1944 at about 1335 hrs., I was on Mobile Patrol Duty in the Via ROMENANA accompanied by L/Cpl. M. BAUGH - C.M. POLICE, where I saw a W.D. MILLYS "JUNKY" TRUCK No. 20325870, being driven, at what I considered to be an excessive speed, and carrying a civilian passenger.

I followed the vehicle for approximately one mile, at a speed similar to that of the 'JUNKY', during which time the following speeds were registered on my speedometer:- maximum - 50 m.p.h. minimum - 40 m.p.h.

I overtook and stopped the vehicle and found the driver to be:-

MAGLIONE CARME

I conducted him to the H.Q. 'T' PROVOST COMPANY - EASTERN DIVISION, where the blankets were handed over to the Station Sergeant. I informed the Italian that he would have to bring a written statement from his Officer stating that the Blankets had been issued to him. He was then allowed to proceed.
