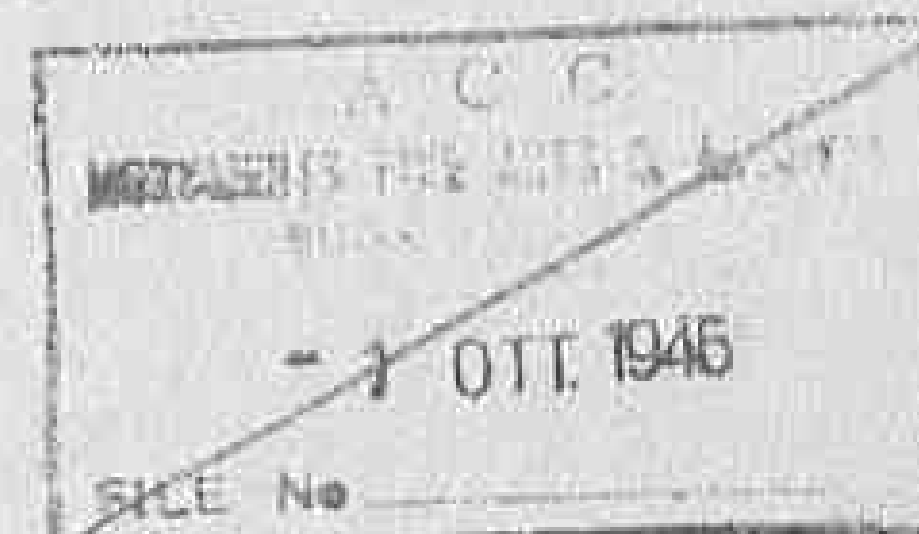

Italian civilian by the name of Albert J. Scoggin. Sergeants Hill and Sullivan have been with Maj. Birch for 17 months. Scoggin for 14 and Davis for ten months. The Office is responsible for the proper allocation of 430 assigned vehicles. Of these, 152 are WD vehicles, which are used for long-distance trips, in July, for instance, 168 such trips having been made. C. ambulances, and of course, dispatches the road couriers to the Army AMGs (twice weekly) and to Naples (daily).

The air transport section is now a considerably expanded activity since the A. C. has been flying its own line, or more precisely, using converted Italian bombers with Italian pilots. Sergeant Louis Galanga (U. S.), Lance Corporal Leonard V. Smith (B) and Pte. Vincent Arnone (U. S.) work this end of the business. Sgt. Galanga has been at it in the same office 17 months and Cpl. Smith 10 months while Private Arnone is a newcomer of a few months. (May we at this point say we are sorry we could not run Sgt. Galanga's picture: it was not reproducible for technical reasons.) Helping with both air and road transport, as well as interpreting and being a general factotum, is another civilian, a Russian, Miss Tatiana Wolodimeroff.

taining the respect for noble traditions that it has always had. Food Minister Mole further appealed to farmers for the *ammassi*. In Sicily the Separatists' "army" is reported as disbanded and the whole Separatist movement apparently dying out as an organized entity. Senator Federico Ricci was appointed Minister of the Treasury; he is well known for his opposition to Fascist financial policy and is reported good administrator.

As we go to press, the Potsdam communiqué has been issued, in which Italian support of the Allied war effort was praised and announcement made of an Italian peace treaty to be negotiated, after which Italy was promised a seat among the United Nations. The entire press, of course, carried the news in banner headlines, Patti was quoted as expressing his pleasure at the recognition accorded Italy for her efforts to acquire a democratic order and voiced gratitude to the Allies for recognizing Italy's needs. He said he hoped that the nation's "just aspirations will be satisfied in the peace treaty".

ECONOMIC FRONT

Heading the economic news of the week was the virtual complete freedom of foreign trade restored to the Italian Government, effective 1 August. All activities of the Allied Commission with respect to exports in Italy, with the exception of Venezia Giulia, ceased as of July 31. The Commission will no longer serve as a channel of communication for export orders. Hereafter, all countries are free to deal directly with the appropriate Italian Government export authorities or with private Italian dealers subject only to such regulations as the Italian Government itself may impose.

The United Kingdom will use both the British Embassy and private British dealers in its trade relations with Italy. British Government purchases will be made through the British Embassy while private British buyers will contact appropriate Italian authority. For the time being, the United States Government will act as agent for private American buyers through the intermediary of the United States Commercial Company of the Foreign Economic Administration. This channel has already been accepted by the Italian Government and will function only until details

follows: (1) *In order not to upset the Allied civilian supply program already formulated for Italy by confining export activities, all Italian declarations of exportable surpluses will be examined by the Allied Commission.* (2) *In the interests of the United Nations world-wide war economy, any goods falling under the Reserved Commodities List of the Combined Chiefs of Staff in Washington will be exported only to specified countries.* The list in question is one of articles in short supply throughout the world and to which Allied military necessities have prior claim. (3) *Exports from AMG-controlled areas will be handled by the general agency established by the Italian Government as part of one economic unit, but such AMG-area exports will be subject to AMG approval, under the powers of military government, as long as AMG authority prevails in the territory.* (4) *No dealings will be had with firms on Allied "black lists".*

ECONOMIC FRONT

Heading the economic news of the week was the virtual complete freedom of foreign trade restored to the Italian Government, effective 1 August. All activities of the Allied Commission with respect to exports in Italy, with the exception of Venezia Giulia, ceased as of July 31. The Commission will no longer serve as a channel of communication for export orders. Hereafter, all countries are free to deal directly with the appropriate Italian Government export authorities or with private Italian dealers subject only to such regulations as the Italian Government itself may impose.

The United Kingdom will use both the British Embassy and private British dealers in its trade relations with Italy. British Government purchases will be made through the British Embassy while private British buyers will contact appropriate Italian authority. For the time being, the United States Government will act as agent for private American buyers through the intermediary of the United States Commercial Company of the Foreign Economic Administration. This channel has already been accepted by the Italian Government and will function only until details of full resumption of private American trade with Italy have been worked out. The USCC will thus be the agent of the *Istituto Commercio Estero* in the United States as of August 1.

The sole conditions laid upon the new trade policy refer to Allied operational necessities, as
