Dear Col. Fiske:

You will recall my conversations with you in Naples and my memorandum of April 8 to you recommending the appointment of an American Archivist to be attached to the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Sub-Commission of the Allied Control Commission. On May 6 you orally informed me that my recommendation had been approved by the Commissioner. In the place of a formal reply I was permitted to copy the following notation in your hand made on the original of the above mentioned memorandum which is your record copy.
"(4-6 Mr. Shipman was informed that the Commissioner approved the appointment of a civilian or military archivist for duty with the M.F.A. Sub-Commission to advise on Italian records and archives, but the appointment of a conscientious objector was not considered desirable. F.)"

I reported this fact to Washington and the Archivist of the United States acted on it. The difficulties encountered in selecting an archivist and getting him overseas quickly made it necessary to give up the idea of sending a civilian at this time. Capt. William D. McCain O28111, Historian, H.Q.S., 5th Army was recommended because of his training and availability. I now learn that the assignment of the American Archivist is being held up in the field.

As you know there is more than enough important work to be done on Italian records to keep several archivists busy. When I was overseas the British had two army Captains assigned as archivists on the M.F.A. Further they had an archivist assigned to the care and preservation of the records of A.A.C. The importance of the work is not questioned by the British Government. It is highly desirable that the American Government also take part in it.

He will cooperate with authorized and properly identified intelligence officers representing the United States, both overseas and after arrival in the US.

- a. Within Theater: Water, rail, government motor vehicle.
- b. To United States: Water. Reporting to CO, 7th Replacement Depot for trans-shipment.
- c. Within United States: As prescribed by CO, US Port of Arrival.

4. Address in the United States to which entitled transportation upon separation from the service: Jackson, Mississippi.

5. Immediate notice will be given to emergency addressee, all correspondents, and publishers to discontinue mailing letter, parcels and publications until further advised as to the new address. WD AGO Form 971-1 (V-Mail Notice to Correspondents and Publishers) may be used for this purpose. In the event it is known at the time this order is received that departure from the unit will be delayed the notice should not be sent until the departure date is known. Dear Colonel De Wald:

I am sorry that I missed you on my two-day stay in Rome, but I think that I discussed with Colonel Ward Perkins all necessary business. He will inform you of the matters discussed.

I am more than concerned about the application I made for release from active duty. The adjutant's office here informed me that the statement you made was an outright and unqualified disapproval. The people who finally pass on the request will have no way of knowing how long this Subcommission will be in Italy. Therefore, your statement will probably cause disapproval and will cause me to have to get new papers sent from the United States for another request.

Colonel Poletti based his statement on the fact that he is sure that we will get out of Lombardia not later than July 31. There certainly will be no need for Major Bell and me to come back and sit around Rome. Major Bell has stated that he is presently in no hurry to get out of the army and would like to come back to Rome and do whatever work is necessary. I am willing to do the job in Lombardia, but see no reason why I should come back to Rome and waste months sitting around here.

I would greatly appreciate your endorsing the application now to the effect that my services will be needed only to August 15 or 31. Since my papers have been on someone's desk around here for more than a month, they certainly cannot be expected to get to Washington and get acted upon until long after things have completely folded up in the north. 9751


