1. I have been called on by Capt. Scotten (A) of Public Works, and by a young American of Italian parentage named SCARPITTA, a painter who worked at RMH since 1937 and was interned there, escaped to the hills with his family and recently arrived in NAPLES.

2. He appears a nice youth, Scotten knows him personally and says he is very active and he is anxious to do work of any sort in the Subcommission.

3. I gather that regulations are in hand to enable Subcommissions to employ civilian Allied personnel of this sort, but I am making further enquiries. Meanwhile I have told Scarpitta:

(a - this for you sake!) that I can make no decision in your absence.

(b) that the work would be of a general character in and around the office and no painting! This did not appear to worry him. He has no typing, but says he writes a legible hand.

4. If I can get him up to Rome, would you agree to look him over? My inclination is to say yes, every time, as he will not be held against any establishment and I think he could be very useful in the heavy work of registration of tegori, misplaced depositi and so on which we are due to meet.

5. Please reply by courier so that I can make arrangements.

6. At Tuesday's meeting Subcommissions with one voice demanded an early move to join you. I am sending this in the hands of Lt. YOUNG, who will explain himself.
