SUBJECT: Additional Restrictions on the Movement of
Civilians in the Army Zone.

TO: See Distribution List Below.

Reference is made to Executive Memorandum No. 77 dated
31 August 1944.

1. As a result of the placing of additional restrictions on movement in the Army Zone, applications for passes for civilians to proceed beyond the line "MEXICO (R-00) - Pistols - First will not be made by telephone or signal.

2. Where the reasons for wishing to cross the line referred to in paragraph 1 are considered sufficient to justify the granting of permission, Sub-Commissioners will submit a written application to the H.Q. A.M.C. Fifth Army. A completed pass for the proposed journey will be attached to the application. Applications emanating in Regions will be forwarded direct to A.M.C. Fifth Army by Regional Commissioners.

3. It will be noted that Lucan and Viareggio are within of the line referred to in paragraph 1.

4. Attention is called to the fact that application for passes to other parts of the Army Zone must not be made by telephone or signal except in the most urgent cases.

Reference is made to Executive Memorandum No. 77 dated 31 August 1944.

1. As a result of the placing of additional restrictions on movement in the Army Zone, applications for passes for civilians to proceed beyond the line Sicily (N-65) - Platina - Fium will not be made by telephone or signal.
2. Where the reasons for wishing to cross the line referred to in paragraph 1 are considered sufficient to justify the granting of permission, Sub-Commissioners will submit a written application to the H.Q. A.M.G. Fifth Army. A completed pass for the proposed journey ~~will~~ be attached to the application. Applications emanating in Regions will be forwarded direct to A.M.G. Fifth Army by Regional Commissioners.
3. It will be noted that Lucca and Viareggio lie north of the line referred to in paragraph 1.
4. Attention is called to the fact that application for passes to other parts of the Army Zone must not be made by telephone or signal except in the most urgent cases.

CONTROL OF CIVILIAN MOVEMENT

Minutes of Meeting, 17 July 1944

ACTION

1. Movement into Army Areas, i.e. North of the Army Control Line

It was agreed that the following procedure, which was in most points already in operation, should be followed:

(a) ACI Officers: Permission must be obtained from the ACI of the Army before the journey is made, if possible. In cases of emergency it is permissible to proceed to HQ Army ACI and there report.

(b) Italian Civilian: Normal procedure to be followed as laid down in General Order No. 24 (this General Order is fully explained in 346/76/CA of 26 April 1944).

(c) Italian Government Officials: Important officials of the Italian Government may be granted passes at the point of departure which will in most cases be free. The ACI Army will be consulted, if possible. In cases of emergency it is permissible for Italian Government officials to proceed to HQ Army ACI, without such consultation, and there report, but a pass must be first obtained from HQ ACI.

ACI wished for the Army Control Line to be clearly marked, which was not the case at present. If this was done it would assist Italian civilians and Allied officers who did not realize when they were on the wrong side of the line. ACI promised to consider this.

2. Movement between Rome and Naples.

(a) An attempt had been made to persuade HQ. ACI to relax movement south of Rome, but the request was turned down. Free movement, therefore, in the Province south of the Army Control Line but north of Italian Government territory and all Provinces of Roman III was now confined to Province. Movement from one Province into another required the usual permit. Since this was an order by ACI, ACI would do their utmost to assist the Military Police in the enforcement of this control. ACI were specifically required to provide an Army ACI. Patrols as could be made available and to ensure that such patrols were fully instructed as to their liaison duties with the Carabinieri. H.C.C.'s would give as much assistance as possible to the Military Police in this task.

(b) The chief difficulty was experienced in connection with civilian trucks sent from Rome to collect foodstuffs for the city from the Naples area. This was being dealt with by Rome Region, Region III, Region IV, and the Food Sub-Commission. It was considered that in

(a) AOC Salerno: Permission must be obtained from the WFO of the Army before the journey is made, if possible. In cases of emergency it is permissible to proceed to HQ Army ADI and there report.

(b) Italian Civilians: Normal procedure to be followed as laid down in General Order No. 24 (this General Order is fully explained in 316/76/CA of 26 April 1944).

(c) Italian Government Officials: Important officials of the Italian Government may be granted passes at the joint signature which will in most cases be Rome. The 91st Army will be consulted, if possible. In cases of emergency it is permissible for Italian Government officials to proceed to HQ Army ADI, without such consultation, and there report, but a pass must be first obtained from HQ AOC.

AOC wished for the Army Control line to be closely worked, which was not the case at present. If this was done it would assist Italian civilians and Allied officers who did not realize when they were on the wrong side of the line. ADI promised to consider this.

2. Movement between Rome and Naples.

(a) An attempt had been made to persuade HQ ADI to relax movement south of Rome, but this request was turned down. From now on, therefore, in the provinces south of the Army Control line but north of Italian Government territory and all Provinces of Region III was now confined to provinces. Movement from one Province into another required the usual permit. Since this was an order by ADI, AOC would do their utmost to assist the Military Police in the enforcement of this control. ADI were specifically required to produce as many M.P. Patrols as could be made available and to ensure that such Patrols were fully instructed as to their liaison duties with the Carabinieri. R.C.'s would give as much assistance as possible to the Military Police in this task.

(b) The chief difficulty was experienced in connection with civilian trucks sent from Rome to collect foodstuffs for the city from the Naples area. This was being dealt with by Rome Region, Region III, Region IV, and the Food Sub-Commission. It was considered that in addition to the normal movement pass for each civilian a special pass was required for each truck sent from Rome and this was being done. Rome Region also undertook to exercise a strict control over trucks coming into Rome from outside. Region III expressed themselves satisfied provided the above precautions were strictly carried out.

(c) There was considerable movement reported from Region II into Region III. Two parties containing 475 refugees without passes arrived by train in Naples. It was agreed that this should be taken up by ADI Section with the Italian Government, and also by the Refugee Branch with Sig. Lombardi.

ACTION

(d) Col. Chetani raised the question of supplying petrol for the return journey from Naples to trucks arriving from Rome. He was so short of petrol that he had none to issue. H.C.'s noted this point and it was suggested that Col. Chetani should take up the matter with Economic Section direct.

(e) The notice published in poster form in Rome saying that there was free movement north of Rome would have to be withdrawn and replaced by a green campaign of equal publicity. Civil Affairs Branch, P.A.O., Region IV and Rome Region were to arrange.

3. Italian Government Officials. (This does not include local Government officials).

The method of issuing passes to Italian Government officials would in future be as follows: The official would apply to the corresponding Sub-Commission or Section concerned for approval of his pass. If approved, Sub-Commissioners, Branches of the Idm., Rom., and H.C. & A.C. Sections to channel these passes through their Sections to the Secretary General who would sign the passes. In the case of Political Section, the current Sub-Commissioners and P.H.O., approved passes to go direct to the Secretary General for signature.

Instructions will be issued to all concerned. It was decided that some publicity was needed to the effect that the only official A.C.O. pass issued in the yellow pass (attached as a specimen).

4. Passes to Rome.

Reference letters No. 751/7/2A of 7 June 1944 and 751/22/2A of 8 July 1944, these letters are now cancelled. No special passes to Rome are required in future. The only pass now required to enter Rome is the ordinary yellow pass, which will be required by anyone coming from outside Rome Province.

5. Special Passes for Ministers.

It was decided that a special pass renewable after three months should be made out for Ministers of the Italian Government and other important officials including certain journalists. This would consist of an endorsement on the back of the official yellow pass with the following wording:

8. (Designation of office) is hereby authorized to proceed to any part of Italy north of the Army Control Line. He should be given every facility and courtesy.

The pass should be issued to cover movement anywhere north of the Army Control Line. When the pass is made out it should be signed at HQ. ADD by Secretary General, as in para. 3 above, and then sent to C.A.Br. H.C. All for counter signature. Instructions will be issued.

Reference letters No. 751/1/A of 7 June 1944 and 751/22/A of 8 July 1944, these letters are now cancelled. No special passes to Rome are required in future. The only pass now required to enter Rome is the ordinary yellow pass, which will be required by anyone coming from outside Rome Province.

5. Special Passes for Ministers.

It was decided that a special pass renewable after three months should be made out for Ministers of the Italian Government and other important officials including certain journalists. This would consist of an endorsement on the back of the official yellow pass with the following wording:

"I, (designation of office) is hereby authorized to proceed to any part of Italy south of the Army Central Line. He should be given every facility and courtesy."

The pass should be issued to cover movement anywhere south of the Army Central Line. When the pass is made out it should be signed at H. HQ by Secretary General, as in para. 3 above, and then sent to C.A.Hr. H. HQ for counter signature. Instructions will be issued.

6. Puglia Province - Issue of Passes by the Quotore.

In Military Government and Italian Government territory power has been delegated to the Quotore to issue movement passes, (see para. 4 (h) of 316/76/CA of 26 April 1944). Puglia Province however was expressly excluded from this permission. With the forthcoming transfer of Puglia Province to the Italian Government there would be a considerable reduction in A.G. personnel. P.G. Puglia Province said that he would not be able personally to deal with the issue of passes. He therefore requested that permission be granted to delegate this power to the Quotore. All promised to consider and let us have a reply.

7. Passes to enter leave Stilly via Messina.

(a) AAI had no knowledge of any special passes required to cross the Straits of Messina by Ferry. Difficulty was however encountered and people issued with passes for movement across the ferry either into Stilly or the Italian mainland were turned back at Messina or Reggio. It was decided that C.A. Branch write to the Navy to enquire what was the procedure.

8. Discharged Italian Soldiers.

A letter had been received this day from AAI agreeing to the use of demobilization papers for the movement of discharged Italian soldiers without movement passes also being required, in all areas south of Army Control Line including Reggio Province.

- 1 ACC Officers the procedure is laid down in 750/2 CA of 5 Jun.
 - a This Section has been informed that endorsement of applications by the VP will facilitate and expedite the granting of passes.
 - b Sub-Commissions desiring to obtain such an endorsement will attach to the application a memo addressed to the VP containing a short statement as to the reasons for the visit and a certificate that the visit is essential and cannot without detriment to ACC work be deferred to a later date. Below their signature they will add an endorsement "Approved" addressed to the Security Branch and signed by the CMO for VP Adm Sec.
- 2 Italian Officials : the procedure is laid down in 751/7 of 7 Jun.
 - a The CC desires that visits by Italian Nationals should be confined to the minimum.
 - b Applications for passes for Ministers and Under Secretaries will be submitted to the Secretary General.
 - c Applications for other Italian nationals will only be granted in exceptional circumstances, and will be submitted through the VP in manner similar to that described in para 1 b above.
