FINAL REPORT: SICILY

A. GENERAL

The pattern of war-damage to the monuments of Sicily clearly reflects the course of the Island's rapid conquest in thirty-nine days of July and August 1943.

First, a thorough softening-up of the enemy's supply and communication points, by air bombardment, had wrought havoc on the centre of the larger cities.

This also suffered the most grievously. Here more than fifty churches were destroyed or destroyed. Fortunately, of the great Siculo-Norman monuments only the Martorana, the Capella Palatina, the great Cathedral of Monreale, the others - the Gothic churches, S. Maria della Catena, were undamaged. Of the Gothic churches, both have now been restored. Presently a Assisi were hit; both have now been restored. Most of the cathedrals were spared; the Parrocchia and (despite the enemy's traps and mines) that of Palermo, Cefalù, Martorana, U. Catelmo, the great Cathedral of Monreale, the others - the Capelle Palatine, the Martorana, S. Giovanni-Crisostomo, the Cappella Palatina, the Martorana, S. Maria della Catena were undamaged. Although here too an extensive repair programme was carried by A.G. in Palermo alone.

In Trapani the bombing damaged the fine Andree delle nobles (unique examples in Sicily) and the fine Andre delle nobles (unique examples in Sicily) are intact.

Bombing to bring war heavy in Sicily did not inflict individual monuments the loss was not of really high significance aside from the destruction of two Sepposta sculp-
tured in S. Girolamo.

Although the port of Syracuse took considerable bombing, little damage resulted on the hills above the town.

CATHAYA and VIZCAYA, although much was to befall them in the later ground-fighting, were heavily battered in this pre-invasion bombing campaign, which exacted a high toll in the cities but left the smaller centers practically immune.

After the bombing came the momentous invasion landings of 10 July 44 on the mountain-poor southern beaches, so swiftly and perfectly executed that virtually no harm was done even in the few places, like CEBU and MOTO, where there was little worthy of mention.

From those landings the progress was astonishingly rapid, especially in the western provinces, leaving in its wake almost no organized resistance, for points of enemy resistance, of which AGUILARITO was unfortunately one, soon here, withdrawn the town was either hard hit, the renowned Greek torpedoes through the storm with no significant damage, and local fortifications removed to store the collections of the Hussos ARMOEDOCO prevented harm to these when the bulldozing was struck.

As our forces overran the west, such notable sites of resistance as LILILINGUIT, SLOBAT, ZICE, SOLTATO, and ILEHA were passed intact or with only the most trifling injury. Even the cabin underarm no further serious damage beyond that already caused by bombing.

In the west, progress was likewise fast through the Province of BAGAS, where in the entire province S. BARROLON - S. ET BOCILLI was the only monument to man's effort, and where the Province of Simeus, which the mount site of HABALOGO KORIDE and the monuments of LILILINGUIT undisturbed.

For CAVANIA, however, and on the western approaches to the great bastion of Mount Etna, the country due inland abandoned its efforts to a tedious intensity. CALABRILLA, SOBO, SINI, LEGOFONCA, KICOSA - took quite a heavy battering. Those around the itself became the scenes of bitter fighting and destruction. In ABRAZO, eight churches were seriously hit, the little medieval town of RANDAZZO, an unoccupied point on the northern route around Etna, was all but destroyed.

Then CAVANIA finally fell, barely its might, too abundant, had added its desperation to what remained of this 16th century city after the pre-invasion bombings. It suffered few outer-area losses, because it contained only two important structures

Bartolomeo di POGGIO was the only monument to have repair, and throughout the Province of SIRACUSA, where the ancient sites of MELLAZIO ACERILE and the monuments of LENTINI were undisturbed, before CHIAJNA, however, and on the western approaches to the great beaten road Mount Etna, the army dug in, and sharpened his defense to draconian intensity. CALANUJETTA, CAGLACIENZO, and in the towns of the Province of Etna - ASACO, ABBIA, LEONPORTE, MEGOSIA - took quite a heavy beating. Those around Etna itself became the scenes of bitter fighting and destruction. In ADDALCO, eight churches were seriously hit, and the little medieval town of RANDAZZO, an economy stores point on the northern route around Etna, was all but destroyed.

When CALANUJETTA finally fell, early in August, the abillion city suffered the protracted bombing. It suffered few outward damages, because it contained only two important structures containing the antiquities of 1553: part of the Cathedral, and Frederick II's Castello Ursino. Both of these were hit, although without serious results. The collections of the Museo Civico, housed in the Castello, were found stored safely in bullet-proof vaults.

The church of St. George, to the northeast, next took their share of damage, and it, tightly, the rugged, rocky corner of the Main German HS brought in to the southeast corner of the church's roof. The brick-roofed Thattro, fortunately, is in the opposite end and thus remained quite intact.

Now the northern end of the town has appeared to measure a hand-manchile bush which had been destroyed subsequently to some sort of mine collapse. The Cathedral of St. Paul, was untouched, at first, and miraculously all the church's walls, both interior and exterior, stood the Grand Priseing at Trapani.

On 7 of August our patrols entered Messina after both east and south, the rocks and talus of ruinous had surged. The town, virtually leveled by the earthquake of 1908, had grown up again to undergo worse destruction in 1943. It was not rich in monuments, only the Cathedral and the above mentioned could be classed as first-class attractions. These were only damaged, but not severely destroyed, but little short of complete destruction, first from heavy air bombardment, then from naval shelling, then from the shells in storage, it was largely beyond the lamented Germans across the straits after they had lost the town - and Sicily.
