I write a line about your query over the telephone this morning.

Until A.C. notifies your Regional Commissioner to the contrary, no transfers of ministerial archives to ROME or elsewhere should be permitted. This is so as to avoid the chaos that would be consequent on unilateral action by single ministries and piecemeal removal of archives.

On the other hand, there is no objection whatever to properly authorized representatives of the Ministries inspecting the repositories where their archives are now housed. Indeed, it is desirable that they should do so, in order that they may make necessary preparations for packing etc.

Your local Commissary for Archives should have full rights of entry and inspection, but he too must not make any transfers to ROME or elsewhere.

I believe this is much what Colonel Ward-Perkins told you on the telephone, but I write this letter in confirmation, and refer you for further details to A.C. letter 20905/C/4/e/MFAA dated 11th July 1945.

Being a soft-hearted mug I am sending him, but on the strict injunction that he's to report to you at once and that except for the official purposes of his movement, he's to get on with his private business and not start mucking about with yours. Make that quite clear to him, and if you don't want him about send him back. He should not arrive before the end of the month.
