This applies equally to Allied civilians who come here on temporary duty or personal business. All concerned will comply with procedure as indicated in Establishment Memorandum 35, 1944. (Est Sec)

3. CIVILIAN USE, U. S. ARMY POSTAL SERVICE:

The following is extracted from Section III, Circular #44, Hq MTOUSA, dated 20 March 1945, for the information, guidance and compliance of all concerned:

1. The facilities of the U. S. Army Postal Service are available for use by U. S. military personnel and civilian nationals of the United States attached to the U. S. Armed Forces only, except that when specifically authorized by this headquarters, in each instance, other U. S. civilian nationals may use the service. Foreign civilians may not use the U. S. Army Postal Service or use U. S. military addresses regardless of the fact that they may be employed by an American organization.
2. Mail written by foreign civilians bearing the imprint of unit censor stamps has been received at APO's with outgoing mail from units. All commanding officers concerned will take necessary action to insure that foreign civilian employees are properly instructed that they may not use the U. S. Army Postal Service either to send or receive mail and may not use U. S. military return addresses. Unit censors and unit mail orderlies will be instructed that mail written by foreign civilians will not be unit censored or deposited in the APO.

3. Foreign civilians may not purchase U. S. stamps or U. S. postal money orders and may not cash U. S. postal money orders at U. S. APO's. (Adj)

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3. CIVILIAN USE, U. S. ARMY POSTAL SERVICE:

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2. Mail written by foreign civilians bearing the imprint of unit censor stamps has been received at APO's with outgoing mail from units. All commanding officers concerned will take necessary action to insure that foreign civilian employees are properly instructed that they may not use the U. S. Army Postal Service either to send or receive mail and may not use U. S. military return addresses. Unit censors and unit mail orderlies will be instructed that mail written by foreign civilians will not be unit censored or deposited in the APO.

3. Foreign civilians may not purchase U. S. stamps or U. S. postal money orders and may not cash U. S. postal money orders at U. S. APO's. (Adj) 3436

4. PROPER DIALING OF TELEPHONES:

- a. Reference is made to page 6 of Allied Commission Telephone Directory, November 1944 edition.
- b. On numerous occasions, outside telephone calls are inadvertently made from internal telephones; without dialing the zero "0" first; with the result that some offices having internal extension telephone numbers (corresponding with the first three numbers of the outside number erroneously dialed without the zero "0" first), having to answer the telephone unnecessarily.
- c. When making an outside telephone call from an internal telephone (3 digit phone), connections to the city dial system are made by first dialing zero "0", waiting for the dial tone, and then dialing the city outside number. (Est Sec)

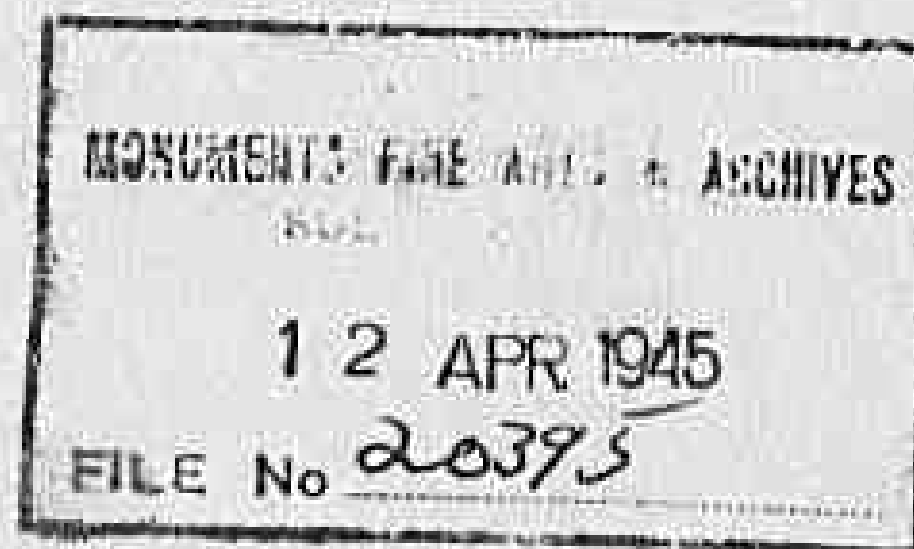

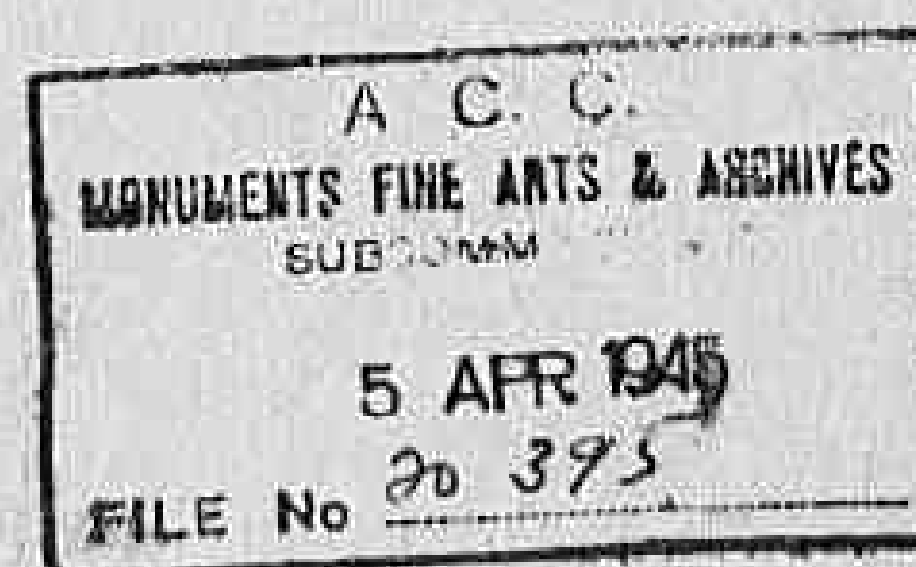
