SUBJECT: Church bells removed from Italy

TO : Pontificia Commissione Centrale,

1. Pursuant to our conversation of December with Archbishop Costantini, we wrote to the Allied military authorities in Germany to inquire about the bells reported to be in Hamburg.
2. We are now informed that only loads of broken bell metal were received from Italy by the two Hamburg firms involved.
3. The Norddeutsche Affinerie received 16,660 Kilos of the broken metal, and the Zinnwerk received 2,095,876 kilos. The latter came from the Monopolio Metalli in Rome through the Montangesellschaft of Berlin.
4. We sincerely regret that we cannot furnish you more encouraging information.

Subject: Church bells removed from Italy

1. Further to our letter of even reference dated 31st December 1945 and referring to your 20485/4/FA. of 14th December 1945, we have now received the following information from Hamburg.
2. Both the Norddeutsche Affinerie and the Zinnwerk, the two Hamburg firms involved in receiving bells, only received loads of broken bell metal from Italy as under:-

3. In the case of the bell fragments delivered to the ZINNWERK, the delivery appears to have been a regular contract between that firm and the Monopolio Metall, Rome. The Italians were to receive the metal back again in the form of wire bars, gold, silver and tin. A portion (1336.013 Kg.) of the wire bars were delivered, the gold and silver was despatched (silver 199.419 Kg., gold 3370.199 grs.) and was last heard of at Staatl. Sachs. Hütten-u. Blaufarbenwerke, HALSBRUCKE, Saxony, now in the Russian Zone.
4. As the bells delivered in Hamburg were broken and it appears rather that the Italians sent them there than that the Germans took them, it would seem unprofitable to pursue the matter unless the Pontifical Commission can provide evidence to the contrary within the terms of para. 3 of our last letter on the subject.

1. The Central Pontifical Commission for Sacred Art have referred to us the possibility of tracking down some of the thousands of church bells removed from Italy by the Germans.
2. Archbishop Constantini, President of the Pontifical Commission, informs us that, even before the Armistice with Italy, 11,402 bells had been requisitioned by the Fascist Government, and that the Germans later removed many more.
3. It has been reported to Archbishop Constantini that at least some of the Italian bells have been found in a dump at HAMBURG. He says he has a record of the weights of each of the requisitioned ones, but no description beyond this.
4. It would be appreciated if you would give us your opinion as to the possibility of accomplishing the Archbishop's aim, and an indication of what type of documentation you would find necessary.

SUBJECT: Missing Painting from PESCOCCOSTANZO.

1. In December 1943 there was removed from the church (S. Francesco) of the Convento di Gesù e Maria, at PESCOCCOSTANZO (Aquila Province), a highly prized painting on wood of the Madonna and Child between two saints, size 1.07 x 0.82 meters.

2. Local testimony is that the painting was taken by German troops by order of General Heydrich of the Parachute Division and removed first to the General's quarters at INTRONACQUA (Aquila Province). The local assumption is that the painting "was transported from there to Berlin". Its present whereabouts is in fact unknown.

3. The loss has been known for some time and has been reported. A photographic reproduction has now been discovered and is attached hereto with a copy of the statement of the Superior of the Convent.

4. All concerned are requested to be on the watch for the painting and to send to this office any news of its discovery.
