PLAYING PLACES

BUILT BY THE EMPEROR DOMITIAN (A.D. 81-96). CONSISTED OF RECEPTION AND
STATE APARTMENTS (EMPERORIAL COURT OF JUSTICE, CROSS HALL, DINING ROOM),
PRIVATE APARTMENTS, A GARDEN WITH PERSIAN, BATHS AND A PRIVATE CHAPEL.

FORUM OF TRAJAN

BUILT FOR THE EMPEROR TRAJAN (A.D. 98-117) BY THE ARCHITECT APOLLODORUS.
CONSISTED OF A LARGE SQUARE FLANKED BY PORTICOES AND TWO SIDEWALKS FORMED
OF STONE. IN THE MIDDLE OF THE SQUARE STANDS TRAJAN'S COLUMN DECORATED
WITH A SPiral RELIEF, 660 FT. LONG, ILLUSTRATING THE EMPEROR'S MARTIAL VICTORIES.
ON THE FAR SIDE OF THE SQUARE IS DOUBLE-STORY BUILDING, THE AUDITORY OF TRAJAN,
FOR TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE, AND BEHIND IT TWO

Built by the Emperor Domitian (A.D. 81-96). Consisted of reception and
state apartments (Imperial court of Justice, throne hall, dining room),
private apartments, a garden with porticos, baths and a private chapel.

FOOT OF TRAJAN

Hall for the Emperor Trajan (A.D. 98-117) by the architect Apollodorus.

Consists of a large square flanked by porticos and two semicircular rows
of shops. In the middle of the square stands Trajan's column decorated
with a spiral band, 660 ft. long, illustrating the emperor's Roman wars.

On the N. side of the square is double-walled building, the Basilica Ulpia,
for transaction of business and administration of justice, and behind it two
libraries and the Temple of Trajan.

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FORUM OF CAESAR

Built by Caesar (B.C. 46th). The temple in the centre is that of Venus Consulix.

AUGUSTUS QUADRIGA

Built in the third century A.D. on the site of the Forum Iherium or cattle market.

"TEMPLE OF VESTA"

Built in the 1st century A.D.

"TEMPLE OF PORTUNUS VIRILIS"

Built during the last years of the Roman Republic (1st century B.C.).

PICTURE OF OCTAVIA

Work of G. Cattini, created in 12 B.C.

PICTURE OF OCTAVIA

Erected by the Emperor Augustus (A.D. 27-A.D. 14) to honour his sister Octavia

THEATRE OF MARCELLUS

Built by Augustus (L.C. 27 - A.D. 14) and named after his nephew and heir-in-law, Marcellus, Marcellinus.

PICTURE OF THE SCIPIOS

Contains copies of the ancient sarcophagi in which were buried numbers of the Scipio family.

PIRATED OR COUNTERFEIT

Tomb of G. Caesar, erected in 42 B.C.

TOMB OF OCTAVIA

Erected by the Emperor Augustus (B.C. 27-43, A.D. 14) to honour his sister Octavia

MANSION OF MARCELLUS

Built by Augustus (B.C. 27 - A.D. 14) and named after his nephew and brother-in-law, Marcellus, Marcellus.

COOP OF THE SCIPIOS

Contains copies of the ancient manuscripts, in which were buried members of the Scipio family.

CATH. SAINT AGELLO

Tomb erected by the Emperor Hadrian (A.D. 117-138) for himself and his successors. In the Middle Ages converted into a fortress

FORTRESS OF TREVI

Designed by Borromini and built in the years 1732-62.

MANSION OF AUGUSTUS

Tomb erected by the Emperor Augustus (B.C. 27 - A.D. 14) for himself and his family.

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PALATINUM

Pagan temple erected and dedicated by Agrippa (B.C. 27), later turned into a Christian church. Contains the tomb of the Kings of Italy and of Raphael.

TOWER DELLA MUSICA

Medieval tower erected by the Pope Gregory IX (A.D. 1230)

PORTA MAGGIORA

Auditory of an aqueduct converted by the Emperor Maxentius (A.D. 270-275) into a gate of the city wall.

MONUMENT TO VICTOR EMMANUEL II

erected to honour the first King of Italy, Victor Emmanuel II. (1870-1878)

STADIUM

Garden in the form of a racetrack, for systematic exercises. Built by the Emperor Domitian (A.D. 81-96).

STATUE OF THE EMPEROR MARCUS AURELIUS

Bronze honorary statue of the Emperor Marcus Aurelius (A.D. 161-180) which stands now on the Quirinal, one of the seven hills and (political and religious) centre of Rome.

The square was designed by Michelangelo and lies at the back the Senatorial Palace and at the sides the Capitaline Museum and the Palace of the Conservatori, both used as Museums.

Devoted to honour the First King of Italy, Victor Manuel II. (1870-1878)

GRANDINE

Garden in the form of a macrocosm, for gynaecio exercises, built by the
Emperor Ferdinand (A.D. 81-96).

SCULPTURE OF THE SILENT HARVEST AURELIUS

Second honorary statue of the Emperor Marcus Aurelius (A.D. 161-180) which
stands now on the Quirinal, one of the seven hills and hilltops and fortifications
of Rome.

The statue was designed by Michelangelo and has at the back the Senatorial
Palace and at the sides the Capitoline Museum and the Palace of the
Conservators, both used as museums.

SCULPTURE OF MARCUS AURELIUS

Built by the Emperor Marcus Aurelius (A.D. 161-180) and established with
a golden base representing the walls against the Vandals.



(1) Very great importance is attached to preserving existing arrangements and series where it is necessary to transfer archives from one location to another. In forward areas such transfers often have to be made rapidly and under difficult conditions. If the existing arrangement is to be maintained, it is therefore necessary that MFAA Officers recommending such transfers should be in a position to issue tape to Italian personnel concerned.

The undersigned therefore requests that he may be supplied with 300 packets of office tape for use in this connection by himself and by MFAA Officers 5th and 8th Armies, to whom he will pass on supplies.

(2) Cases have arisen where archive repositories of certain, though limited, importance are occupied by troops, and where circumstances do not admit of transfer of the archives.

You are therefore requested to consider the advisability of having printed a simple notice on the lines of the attached, copies of which would be made available to MFAA officers for posting at their discretion.

(3) May Captain Brooke please be asked to obtain from Comendator Re for the undersigned a copy of the Nuovo orologamento degli Archivi del Regno, 22 December 1939.
