See accompanying correspondence:

- a. In mid-May 1945 agents, of the Ministry of Africa Italiana removed to Rome from Lombardia two crates of very important and valuable archaeological material (see report at 4A). These crates had been brought to Rome from Cyrenaica in 1942 for safe custody and subsequently removed to the North. Unofficial enquiry confirms the crates are in fact now in Rome.
- b. On 10 June we wrote to the Ministry (at 2) and got no reply. Our hastener of 9 July (at 3) has been similarly disregarded.
- c. The Ministry are evidently hoping that a policy of masterly inactivity may serve to prevent this material returning to CYRENAICA where it belongs. I feel it is time for a high-level rocket. If you agree, may I prepare a draft, and if so for whom, to whom?

1. Herewith inventories of the contents of two crates of antiquities from Tripolitania & Cyrenaica at present stored in the Museo Coloniale, Rome. It is regretted that, by an oversight, these were not despatched earlier.
2. Your request for the early return of all antiquities, palaeontological specimens, and books is noted and arrangements will be made to have the material crated and ready for travel. This headquarters would however welcome any suggestion as to the practical means of moving it at the present time from Italy to Tripoli. There do not appear to be any direct shipping facilities, and the material is of considerable bulk and value. The Allied Commission is strongly of the opinion that the heavy responsibility for safe shipment ought to rest with the Italian Government and should not be assumed by Allied authority.
3. Perhaps you would care to discuss the matter in detail with Mr. Ward Perkins who, it is understood, has been asked to visit BIA Tripolitania in the near future.

SUBJECT: Material from Tripolitania

TO : The Director General of Fine Arts
 Ministry of Public Instruction

1. The Allied Commission has received from the Military Administration of Tripolitania a request that the Commission should examine the possibility of arranging for the return to Tripolitania (and to Cyrenaica) of various objects, at present held in Italy either on temporary loan or for safe-custody during the war.
2. The objects in question are:
 - a) Bronze antiquities from Tripolitania, loaned to the Mostra d'Oltremare, and at present housed in Rome at the Museo Coloniale.
 - b) The contents of two crates of coins and ethnographic jewelry, brought in 1942 from Tripoli & Cyrenaica for safe custody and now housed in Rome at the Museo Coloniale.
 - c) A series of palaeontological specimens from the Museo Libico di Storia Naturale on loan to the Istituto di Paleontologia of Rome University for study by Professor Petrocchi.
 - d) A number of books from the library of the Superintendency in Cyrenaica, loaned to Professor Oliverio in 1938.
 - e) Classical sculptures from Tripolitania & Cyrenaica, loaned to the Mostra d'Oltremare, and at present housed in Naples Museum.
3. It is appreciated that the actual transport of these objects may not be immediately practical. It is however understood that the Italian Government is agreed in principle to their restitution

to their proper home; and it would seem therefore desirable, not only to put formally on record the intention to return them at the earliest opportunity, but also to collect and crate them ready to take advantage of any opportunity for transport which may offer.

4. It is further appreciated that many or all of the objects mentioned fall within the competence of the Ministry of African Affairs. This letter is however addressed to the Director General in the belief that you will prefer all problems of administration to pass through the same office.
5. It is believed that you already possess inventories of most of the objects represented. If required however copies are available for inspection in the files of this submission.

1. This HQ's 20904/3/MFAA of 19 Oct 44 enclosed a report by Prof Micacchi on two crates of precious antiquities transferred from Libya to Rome for safe-custody and removed thence by the Republican Fascist Government.

2. These have been recovered intact and in good condition, and are at present stored in the Museo Coloniale at Rome. They have been inspected and inventorized by a joint Commission upon which the Monuments and Fine Arts Subcommittee was represented. A copy of the agreed inventory will follow as soon as received.

3. In addition to the above, the following palaeontological specimens are at the Istituto di Paleontologia della R. Università di Roma, in the custody of Prof C. Petrocchi, until 1940 Director of the Museo Libico di Storia Naturale in Tripoli, and excavator of the important fossil-bed at Sahabi in Cyrenaica. They had been loaned provisionally for study to the excavator by the Government of Libya:

1. Mandible of MASTODON SIVALENSIS (cast)
2. Mandible of RINOCEROS (cast)
3. Shell of TESTUDO (cast)
4. Complete head of CROCODYLUS (original)
5. Molar of MASTODON SIVALENSIS (original)
6. Molar of STEGOTRAHELODON (original)
7. Molar of STEGOLOPHODON (original)
8. Skull of BOVID (original)

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4. The small metal classical exhibits from the Mostra d'Oltremare at Naples, now stored in the Museo Coloniale at Rome, were inspected in May 1945 (20034/5/A/MFAA of 27 June 45, para 4 refers). Several were found in poor condition owing to humidity of storage. By kind arrangement with the Ministry of Public Instruction, such measures as are practicable are being taken to arrest deterioration.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

In December 1942 two crates, containing important and valuable archaeological material from Cyrenaica and Tripolitania, were brought to Rome for safe-custody and were lodged in the Museo Coloniale. In May 1944 they were removed to North Italy by Comm. Achille Ragni of the Republican Fascist Government.

About the middle of May a representative of the Ministry of Africa Italiana presented himself at Pallanza, the seat of the Ministry of Africa Italiana in North Italy, and without any authorization from the Allied Military Government removed the two crates for transport to Rome.

On 10 June the Civil Affairs Section of the Allied Commission addressed a letter (20904/3/AFAA) to the Ministry of Africa Italiana requesting information as to the whereabouts of these crates. On 9 July the enquiry was repeated. To neither of these letters has any reply been received.

I must request therefore that you instruct the Commissario of the Ministry of Africa Italiana to notify this Commission forthwith of the whereabouts of the two crates, and that, in the event of their being in his charge, he be further instructed to arrange for a check of the contents to take place at an early date in the presence of a representative of the Monuments & Fine Arts Subcommittee of this Commission.



Report by Prof. Micsocchi, Head of the Inspectorate for schools and Antiquities in Italian Africa, on two crates of material sent for safe-custody from Libya.

Nel dicembre 1942, il Governo generale della Libia inviava al dott. In seguito alla presentazione di tale ordine, il Direttore del Museo consegnò le due cassette che dal Regni vennero esportate dal Ministero, e, si ritiene, portate a Cremona.
