

SUBJECT: Material from Tripolitania

TO : Direction General of Antiquities and Fine Arts -
Ministry of Public Instruction - Rome

1. In reference to your letter No. 4518, Div. III of 17 June 1946, it is noted with satisfaction that all arrangements have been made for the transfer of the material due for re-shipment to Libya. The authorities in Tripoli have been asked to give the maximum possible notice of the availability of shipping, and this will be passed as soon as received both to yourself and directly to Professor Molajoli at Naples.

2. To avoid any misunderstanding I must make it clear that the Allied Commission, while anxious to help in any possible way, cannot accept any responsibility for the material while in transit. The authorities in Tripoli will accept custody on arrival at Tripoli. It will be the responsibility of your representative at Naples to ensure that the conditions of shipment are satisfactory, and that suitable precautions are taken in the case of any objects of value that could be easily tampered with. Inventories shall accompany all material despatched.

3. Your helpful cooperation in this matter is much appreciated.



Memorandum on arrangements to ship to Tripolimuseum-specimens on temporary loan to Italy from Tripoli and Cyrenaica during the war and due for restitution.

1. The material comprises four main groups:
 - 1) Archaeological collections in the charge of Prof. Maiuri of Naples Museum.
 - 2) Objects in the charge of the Museo Coloniale at Rome.
 - 3) Palaeontological specimens in the charge of Prof. Petrocchi of Rome University.
 - 4) Books borrowed from Cyrene Library by Prof. Oliverio.
2. The responsibility for concentrating these at Naples and arranging transport onto shipping rests with the Direction General of Fine Arts. His responsible delegate at Naples is Professor Molajoli at the Soprintendenza ai Monumenti, Palazzo Reale, Naples. BEAMA Tripoli (British military Administration) have been signalled to contact CLO Alcom Naples copy to H.Q. Alcom; we have written CLO Alcom Naples; and Professor Molajoli has been asked to get in touch direct with CLO Alcom Naples. That should be alright.
3. Shipping (believed to be 2nd P.O.W. ship from Tripoli returning empty) is being arranged by BEAMA Tripoli (Chief Secretary, Col. Mercer). Payment is obscure. I have told the Director General that must be prepared to pay, but I believe the shipping to be chartered by the Tripoli Government.
4. Responsibility rests with The Italian Government until delivery at Tripoli.
5. Organisation is in the hands of the Director General of Fine Arts, Professor Bianchi-Bandinelli, who is completely reliable. It is possible that a part of the shipment may be held up by obstruction from the Ministry of Africa Italiana, over which he has no direct jurisdiction, and which has custody of items 2 and 3. In that event all we can do is notify BEAMA of the deficit, reply formally to the Italian government regretting that the opportunity, for which we have had to work so hard, and requesting them to say what action they propose to take now.

6. My secretary, Mrs. Bonajuto, knows all the details and is in personal touch with the Director General of Fine Arts. She should be able to answer all questions.

 - a) to inform Director General (Tel. 585395, or thro', Mrs. Bonajuto)

Reference signal dated 13th June sent by this HQ. to BEZA, Tripoli, copy to you.

1. It is hoped in the near future to arrange restitution from Italy to Tripoli of a number of antiquities and works of art which were brought during, and immediately before, the war from Tripoli for safe-custody or for temporary exhibition. In view of the short notice that will probably be received of the availability of shipping, these are already being concentrated under the charge of Professor MOLAJOLI at the Superintendency of Monuments, Palazzo Reale, Naples.

2. Transfer to the docks and all other administrative arrangements are an Italian responsibility. For purposes however of rapid communication between BEZA TRIPOLITANIA, which is arranging the shipping, and the Italian authorities, it may be necessary for them to signal through you. It would be much appreciated if in that case you will ensure that the Italian authorities receive the maximum possible notice.

I am writing to you direct as Haynes may already have left you. I promised him I would write a brief report on my visit. I imagine recent political events must have made the future very uncertain; notwithstanding, I have thought it best to act as if, for the time being at anyrate, the antiquities would be a continued responsibility.

I imagine that the immediate provision of a successor for Haynes may prove a problem. In this I fear the British School may be partly to blame, as we are looking for a librarian (to be appointed 9 July) and I believe all potential candidates for the African job may well be in the field for this too. I am going home about 1 July, and should you still be short of an Antiquities officer, any help that I can give I would happily do. Will you let me know?

If it is possible to fix transport for the antiquities from Italy before 1 July, it will be a help as I shall be on the spot. If not, I will leave it all tied up as I can with the Allied Commission, Civil Affairs Section.

I gave your regards to brigadier Lush, who asked ⁰⁸⁹ me to return them when writing. For myself, my very warm thanks for all your help. I had a very pleasant and most profitable time, indeed could not have asked for better.

BRIEF REPORT ON ANTIQUITIES, TRIPOLITANIA, APRIL 1946.

1.) CONSERVATION AND MAINTENANCE.

It is encouraging to see the general good condition of the excavations. At Sabratha the major problem remains erosion of the soft sandstone. At Leptis, the larger and more difficult site, there is a constant struggle against sand and vegetation, and while the sand only reburies, the vegetation actively disrupts. The floods of October 1945 have already done damage in this respect, and it is urged that as an eventual economy the construction of some form of protective barrier be studied to prevent a recurrence. The Great Baths at least should be cleared of silt without further delay, to prevent damage to structural and decorative detail from plant-growth.

The need for the continued employment of Italian technical staff is clearly recognized and needs no further stressing.

2.) PUBLICATION.

The war is the latest only of a series of events which have interrupted the proper scientific publication of the excavations. Considering the quality and importance of the discoveries, the published record is almost unbelievably inadequate. Every opportunity and encouragement should be given to the present Superintendent Professor Caputo, and to his assistant, Doctor Pesce, to publish the results of their excavations conducted under their direction before the war. While they have in fact now that opportunity in Tripolitania, they have not as yet in Cyrenaica. The present difficulties are appreciated; but as a future objective there is a very strong scientific obligation that they should receive every reasonable chance to complete the publication of such important recent excavations as the Temple of Zeus at Cyrene and the great Hellenistic house at Tolmota.

In this connection the British School at Rome would gladly be of any assistance possible. On the one hand it can serve, and is indeed already serving as a link with those Italian scholars who are already

doing good work in this field and with the appropriate Italian learned journals. It can perhaps also serve to direct into practical channels the interest of British scholars and students in the potential fields of study in Tripoli and Cyrene.

While this work of publication can hardly be considered a proper charge on the administration, it does seem that the administration could with propriety and profit initiate some official account of the work of conservation undertaken over the last three years, a work of which the administration may feel justly proud. This work has, of necessity, revealed much of scientific interest, and its publication should lie well within the possibilities of local printing resources. The writer would be very happy to provide the necessary material within the limits of his own knowledge.

3.4 RETURN OF ANTIQUITIES AND MUSEUM-EXHIBITS FROM ITALY.

As already notified separately to the Antiquities adviser, this is completely accepted in principle by the Italian Government and preparation for travel is well advanced. The greater part of the heavy material is already at Naples. It would be appreciated if at least a week's notice could be given of availability of onward transport from Naples; to ensure the timely concentration of what remains.

Dear Denys,

I have delayed writing to you until I could confirm that the on matter of any urgency, the preparation for transport of the objects to return to Libya, was in hand. Yesterday I saw the Director General of Fine Arts, Bianchi-Bandinelli, who confirms that instructions have already been issued, and acknowledged, for the immediate crating. The only difficulty was raised by Oliviero, who is being firmly overruled. The bulk of the heavy stuff is already at Naples, and includes at least one major object (an Augustan inscription from Cyrene) about which nobody at either end has previously breathed a word. I have asked for an estimate of total bulk. If we can have ten days notice, it will be more than ample, unless the shipping is to go elsewhere than to Naples, which would raise such difficulties of transport that it should be avoided if there is any reasonable alternative.

It looks very much as if the recent political sonersault will put a very different complexion upon most of the problems we discussed, at any rate as regard Tripolitania. However, inasmuch as one never knows, I am compiling a brief report to you, which will follow in a few days time. Meanwhile I am anxious to get the details in paragraph I into your hands.

Please tell Caputo that I have seen Bianchi-Bandinelli. The difficulty over his wife's money arises from the internal complexities of the bureaucratic machine within the Ministry of Public Instruction and Caputo's own rather unusual position at the time. Bianchi-Bandinelli is fully alive to it and is doing the best. He is also ready to help with the publication of the Theatre, and his advice is that Caputo should get on with preparing the material. I have not yet seen Miele, but shall do so shortly, and will in any case write Caputo soon. Meantime my cordial greetings and thanks for all his good will and help.

And thank you so very much for all your hospitality, and help. A most profitable visit, and I enjoyed it enormously. My humble duty to the Casa McCarthy.

1. Herewith is a report on an inspection of colonial material which took place in the Museo Coloniale, Rome.
2. The material in question had been hidden under the floor of the Storeroom of the Museo Coloniale - at one time a garage and mechanical repair shop - in an enclosure some six ft. long, three feet wide and 4 ft. deep. The ceiling of this enclosure was bricked up and camouflaged to resemble the floor of the storeroom.
3. On the 28th May 1945 in the presence of the undersigned, Prof. VITALE, Director of the Museo Coloniale, Rome, Prof. NARDUCCI, of the Museo Libico di Storia Naturale in Tripoli and some four members of the Museo Coloniale, the above enclosure was opened and six boxes were unearthed. It was noticed that damp had penetrated into the enclosure and one box, whose top and bottom halves had been glued together, had come unglued, so that the two halves were detachable. On successive days the material in the boxes was examined and checked - the undersigned and Salvatore Scarpitta being present on alternate days - and found to be complete. Also present throughout the inspections was Professore Emilio LAVAGNINO of the Direzione delle Belle Arti, Rome.
4. Of the six boxes, two (Nos 11 and 12) contained material from the Superintendency of Antiquities for Tripolitania and from the Museo Libico di Storia Naturale, which had been scheduled for the "Ostria d'Oltremare in Naples. The other four boxes (Nos 1, 2, 8, and 10) contained material belonging to the Museo Coloniale in Rome. All this material had remained in Rome and had been hidden as above in order to escape - so it was alleged - the vigilant eyes of the Germans and the Republican Fascists.
5. The material from Libya consisted of:
 - a) Varied collection of Arab and Byzantine coins (bronze and gold), from Axum and Eritrea and important archaeological material all from the "Collezioni MELLIU", which belonged to the Superintendency of Antiquities for Tripolitania.

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5. The material from Libya consisted of:

- b) Collection of gold and silver Arab jewelry, hair adorment, bridal belts, perfume sprayers, amulets, incense burners, silver pairs of shoes, jewelry cases etc. belonging to the Ethnographical Section of the Museo Libico di Storia Naturale in Tripoli.

Much of the material was corroded with rust, but is restorable. In one box (No. 12) the damp had penetrated the interior so severely as to either way the paper in which the objects were packed leaving them mostly dispersed. In this box supplementary material (Arab jewelry) was discovered. At the request of the undersigned list of this latter material and all material of a) and b) above will be sent to the Sub-Commission.

6. The four other boxes (Nos. 1, 2, 8 and 10) contained material from the Museo Coloniale divided as follows:

- a) Numismatic collection of gold and silver coins of Arab Dynasties in Tripolitania, which formed the "Collezione Gimino".
- b) Miscellaneous collection of colonial antiquities and other objects such as silver fly flickers, domestic objects, jewelry, ivory cigarette cases, Abyssinian bracelets with figures of the Negus Menelik, Abyssinian Priestly Coptic Crowns, elephants' tusks etc.

Again damp had penetrated the interior and some of the objects were corroded with rust.

7. All the above material is now stored in safe custody in the Museo Coloniale, via Aldovrandi, Rome.

Alfredo SINISCHIATI il quale, in quel momento, era a capo degli Uffici del Ministero dell'Africa Italiana rimasti a Roma.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your 3/4/1 of July 1944 and of photos therein, which arrived in rather damaged condition. The photos will be returned as soon as they have been copied.

2. Of the object referred to:

a. The Statue of Venus Genetrix cannot at present be located;

b. The bust of Jove is stored for safety in the Museo Nazionale, NAPLES; 5251

c. The 2 marble capitals are probably those reported still in situ in the Exhibition Ground.

3. There is also in the Museo Nazionale, NAPLES, a marble statue of a seated nymph (NINFA SEDUTA) reputedly from Leptis Magna.

4. Dr. Pesce makes no mention of Cyrenaica, where he was, until late 1942, Inspector of Antiquities. At least one item (7 bas-reliefs representing Bacchantes from Tolemaide) is stored in Naples and there may well have been others.

To : D.C.C.A.O., Tripolitania.

1. The Monuments and Fine Arts Sub-Commission of ACC is anxious to obtain information of any objects from museum-collections in Tripoli and Cyrenaica which may have been sent on loan or temporary exhibition to Italy within the last six years. In particular it is believed that in 1940 certain items were sent to the Mostra Triennale delle Terre Italiane d'Oltremare at Naples and never returned.

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2. The records for both Cyrenaica and Tripolitania are at present in Tripolitania, and both Dr. Pesce, the Superintendent of Antiquities, and Cav. Raganato, the head of the Sabratha excavations, were transferred to Tripoli from Cyrenaica shortly before the Allied occupation and should therefore be in a position to answer from personal knowledge.

3. If any information is forthcoming a signed statement from the Italian official concerned would be appreciated. It should include sufficient detail for purposes of identifications, the circumstances of the loan, and particulars of any publications or photographic records which may exist.
