nated Mr. Alessandro Cota to occupy this position.

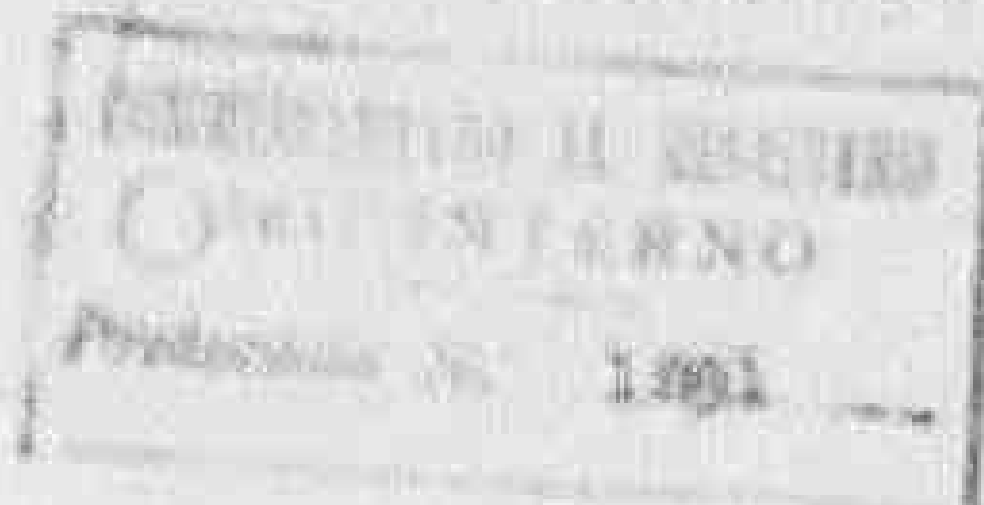
The appropriate Military Government authority, however,

Subject: Unfinished Business of the Regional
Archivist.

To: Director, Monuments, Fine Arts and
Archives Division, Lombard Region.

1. The Regional Archivist previously arranged to have Dr. Maria Schellenberg Desnantes, Directrice della R. Biblioteca Nazionale Brera, Milano, appointed custodian of a large collection of books stored in the Albergo Principe e Savoia and owned by the German government. In this collection were supposed to be 63 volumes belonging to the Archaeological Society of Como and which had been given to the Germans for transportation to subscribers in Switzerland. Today the Biblioteca Nazionale Brera stated that only 45 of these volumes had been found in the part of the collection that has been examined. These volumes and any additional ones found should be turned over to Prof. Calderini of the Catholic University of Milano and president of the Archaeological Society of Como. If Prof. Calderini should so direct in writing, the volumes may be turned over to the Swiss consul in Milano for transmission to subscribers in Switzerland. All matters pertaining to this business have been agreed upon between the Regional Archivist and the Regional Property Control Officer whose files contain the necessary information. You will probably not need to take any action on the matter until approached by the interested parties.

2. It will be appreciated if you will render any possible aid to Dr. Schellenberg and the Biblioteca Nazionale Brera. She is a fine woman

and is doing an excellent job in trying circumstances. Her predecessor, one Paolo Malli, has been trying to oust her in order to regain his former position. The case has been investigated carefully, and Malli's position is wholly unethical and unprofessional. No attention should be given to any statements or complaints made by him. The matter of his future employment should be settled by the Ministry of Education after this territory reverts to the Italian government.

3. It will further be appreciated if aid and assistance can be given to Dr. Guido Manganoili, Soprintendente del R. Archivio di Stato, Milano. The six buildings formerly occupied by the Archivio di Stato have been badly damaged or destroyed by bombing. Most of the records in his custody are still evacuated in neighboring villages. The problem of housing is very acute in his case. There was previous difficulty in his case when Cinto Anselmi, who has a position under Colonel Feltrino Scoviver for the Ministero dell'Interno, appointed one Alexandre Cutolo as Dr. Manganoili's successor. The Regional Archivist permitted the said Cutolo to remain in office one hour before firing him and returning Dr. Manganoili to his position. No further trouble is expected from this quarter, but please see that Dr. Manganoili remains in his position. The Commissario agli Archivi del Regno, Dr. Emilio De, Ministero dell'Interno, Rome, is in full accord with this request. Dr. Manganoili has been employed in archives work some 37 years, has always done excellent work, and is a gentleman of the highest type. He has been given a clean political bill of health by the local Speranza Commission.

Subject: Monthly Report of Regional Archivist.

To : Regional Commissioner, Lombardis Region.

1. The Regional Archivist presented the Receiver for the Ministers del'Interno from Major Mr. Guido Ungarelli, Superintendent of the Archivio di Stato of Milano, and replacing him with a somewhat undesirable character. Dr. Guido Ungarelli was carried from Brescia to Bologna and there installed as Superintendent of the Archivio di Stato at the request of officials of Venetia Region.

2. The Regional Archivist secured the appointment of Dr. Maria Schiallombria Bazzano, Divisrice della B. Biblioteca Nazionale Brancaccio, as custodian of the deposit of German-owned books stored in the Albergo Principe a Savoia. The books were then carried to the Biblioteca Nazionale Brancaccio.

3. The collection of information on Italian Government records and the records of Fascist officials was continued. Special attention was given to the protection of records in the village along Lago di Garda where the headquarters of the Fifth Army is located.

4. One trip was made to Rome to confer with Major R. B. Bell and with Dr. Emilio B. Comissario agli Archivi del Regno, concerning the plans for moving the evacuated records of the Italian Government back to Rome.

1. The attached article which appeared in the July 15 issue of L'Unita: Cronaca del Partito Comunista Italiano, Milano, will indicate the reason life remains interesting up here. It is assumed that the article was written by one Count F. Gelli, who was formerly superintendent of the Biblioteca Nazionale Fiorentina and who is now trying to oust the present superintendent. The said catalogue in question are the ones that the Regional Archivio recently brought back to Milano. The main part of the "tempe di concentramento" was produced by the writer of the article, so he was familiar with it. While he is trying to oust the present superintendent of the library, he also finds time to criticize A. Pirella, the gentleman who is trying to replace the superintendent of the Archivio di Stato.

2. Dr. Guido Mangano reports verbally that the Spagnuolo Commission gave him a clean bill of political health and that a document to that effect will soon be in his hands. Otherwise, the front has been permitted to remain static. It is possible that the first patrol clashes disclosed our weaknesses only to ourselves.

As already reported in correspondence with this office, there were sent here for our disposal, early in May of this year, an estimated collection of letters reported found among "papers from the Secretariat of Benito Mussolini". This no further information as to the circumstances of their discovery is available, it is reasonably sure that they came from the archives of Benito Mussolini, Governor (Prime Minister).

This collection of 25 letters, which constitutes mainly of a correspondence between Brewster and Lloyd and L. A. Mearns, is the second in time to you for our interest, as earlier agreed.

The letters are arranged in numbered cover-envelopes ranging from 1 to 277, but in this series the following 26 numbers are missing: 1, 3, 19, 24, 30, 124, 153, 156-174, 237. No information is presently available as to the whereabouts of the missing letters.

a. Library of the National Assembly, Phnom Penh.

The Library of the National Assembly of Cambodia has a large deposit of books and manuscripts in Pali, Sanskrit, Khmer, and French. Other records may be in the files of the Committee or from the Department of Buildings. The great mass of records in the files (some 1000 boxes) would probably be safer when stored in Mexico. The value of the land located on Day 1 in Mexico, which comprises some 1000 to 1500 acres, might be questioned. The Deputy Chairman under review has also requested further investigation would be made to the allied military Government, but that a request might be made for a study to accompany the records on Chapultepec.

1. PROBLEM IS REFERRED TO EXPERTS OF THE MINISTRIES.

The appointment by the National Councils of Ministers for the various ministries and other government agencies has been made to solve the problem of taking care of their records. The Italian now have custody of the records and will make detailed reports on them by 10 June 1943. The Italian government presumably will use those reports to make detailed plans for transferring the records to Italy. The Italians have done an excellent job in safeguarding those records and the losses appear to have been small. The real problems arise when Allied troops move in and requisition buildings housing records. The Archive Officer will continue to give special attention to deposits in villages on the shores of LAGO DI GARDA. Apparently nothing can be done at the moment in regard to the vast amount of records carried off by innumerable intelligence and semi-intelligence agencies. Some definite policy should be determined for handling these records, great masses of which obviously have no permanent intelligence value. The Allied Nations might realize themselves at this point of the fact that they have been extremely original of the Germans when they carried off contents of art galleries, museums, libraries, and archives. Their intelligence agencies should be careful not to do the same thing in Italy.

2. PROBLEM IS REFERRED TO LOCAL ARCHIVES.

The Archivio di Stato at VARENNY and SANCIA present no particular problems. The Departmental archives are on the job and only need aid to transfer their deposits back to their buildings. The real problem is the Archivio di Stato at MILANO. Both buildings are destroyed. The great deposits of records evacuated to the country have served no useful purpose for nearly two years and will serve none until they are again available for public use. It costs no money to maintain the public buildings and should be made to restore the records to the State. In the meantime, space should be found for temporary use and the deposits should be brought back into MILANO. The other deposits evacuated from MILANO should also be returned as soon as possible. Local archives in most of the towns of LOMBARDIA appear to have suffered little and should be the exclusive problem of the Italians. The Archive Officer will probably give little attention to local archives in the future, but will spend some time in aiding librarians who have deposits scattered throughout the region.

Where the offices and records are left in the custody of the Italians, no problems of any note seem to arise. There is also the problem of transport to remove the records to Rome, as well as transport to bring back local archives and book collections that were evacuated from such cities as Milano, Cremona, Brescia, and Mantova.

2. ARCHIVES IN LILLO AND LILLO

Another inspection of Lillo Lorenzolo, the Lorenzolo administrative building, and Lillo Lorenzolo was made. No records of any importance remain in Lillo Lorenzolo or the Lorenzolo administrative building in Lorenzolo. Lillo Lorenzolo was used for the offices of the President del Comune del Lillo and a group of records in Lillo. 3. MUSEUM. Visited 3-4 May. Inspected manuscripts with Prof. Ugo Bressanelli, who is extremely able and cooperative. Copies of his reports on damages are included herewith. Most serious damage are the Ch. of S. Maria del Carmine which has lost the vaults and most of the apse, but facade is almost intact thanks to the anti-air protection. Repairs and clearance are well under way and it will probably be possible to restore this church. The damaged Salvatorini revealed direct hits and the celebrated tapestry frescoes were somewhat damaged. Largely by concussion since the window had not been damaged. These have been removed from the walls and are now ready for hanging; the work was done by an excellent restorer from Milano and seemed to me a very good job. Repairs and clearance are well under way in fresco due to Prof. Bressanelli's energetic efforts. Prof. B. has a complete photographic documentation of damage to monuments and he has provided me two copies of each photo for CPA archives.

4. ART objects, books and archives from Brescia are stored in various places nearby. Prof. B. assured me that he knew that all those deposits are intact. He visited the deposit of books and archives in a villa at Linate, which were in fairly good order considering that the villa had been occupied by the Fascist army. The cathedral at Linate is intact.

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1. UNIDENTIFIED. Visited on afternoon of 3 May together with various people from various offices. All monuments are listed according to driver of the same class; this was also confirmed by Carlo D'Alia. All art objects from various (17 cases) and 19 cases, and managed. FABRIZIO, later were asked to return (about 20 square miles). Knowned territory of these objects, which appeared to be in order.

2. MONTEBELLINO. Superintendent Casella (Montevia) advised that all art objects from various offices registered in the Villa were had been stored there and there are reportedly intact.

3. MONTEBELLINO. Visited 5-6 May. Inspected monuments with Prof. MONTEBELLINO, who is extremely able and cooperative. Copies of his reports on monuments are unlimited herewith. Most serious damage are the case of MONTEBELLINO, which has lost its walls and most of the facade, but facade is almost intact because the entire is well protected. Despite and elsewhere are well under way and MONTEBELLINO received direct hits and the celebrated statue frescoed were somewhat damaged, largely by shrapnel since the statue had not been completely damaged. These have been detached from the walls and are now ready for hauling; the work was done by an excellent restorer from Milano and seemed to be a very good job. Mural and mosaics are well under way in Brescia due to Prof. MONTEBELLINO of damages to monuments and he has produced as two copies of each photo for IFAA archives.

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Art objects, books and archives from Brescia are stored in various places nearby Prof. MONTEBELLINO. I. advised me that as known that all those deposited are intact. He visited the deposit of books and archives in a villa at MONTEBELLINO, which were in fairly good order considering that the villa had been occupied by the Republic of Salvi. The cathedral at MONTEBELLINO is intact.

4. MONTEBELLINO. Visited on 6 May, with Capt. MONTEBELLINO. He damaged to monuments. All pictures and furnishings of value removed from Villa Belmont by expert provided to its occupation by Fascist provisions dal MONTEBELLINO. The Villa will probably be requisitioned by 5th Army as rest center, to which I would see as objection. The owner is Col. MONTEBELLINO, who is commander of the Partisans in Brescia. Also visited Villa Feltrinelli, occupied

by Washington as a residence; it is of no artistic value at all and has been requisitioned by the Army.

3. General. I hope to obtain permission to go to Japan tomorrow for the day. It is rumored that Mr. will finally be permitted to go to the shore at Chongqing.
