To : SAC 8th Army, (attn. MSAA Officers).

1. A report is requested at your earliest convenience on the state of the personal and family archives of "uscolini" at ROCCA DELLA CASINATE near FROSINONE. These are, as already notified by Cpt. Brooks, likely to be of very first historical importance, and reports are already circulating in the Italian press purporting to show that they are in a condition of considerable neglect. A copy of one such report is attached.

2. While I am sure that such reports are exaggerated, I should be glad to receive assurance that all measures were in fact taken at the earliest possible opportunity to prevent damage by G-2 agents, by troops, and by civilians.

Similar lists are in course of preparation but the policy has been to press only for information as to the whereabouts of Archives carried away to the north. To acquire even this has entailed constant reminders by circular, telegram and personal visit; individual Ministries have been slow to reply owing to an apparent belief that nothing like a complete list could be obtained. The assistance given by the Capo del Gabinetto, Presidente del Consiglio (Eccellenza Flores) and the Soprintendente of Archives (Comm. Dott. Re) has greatly helped to overcome this difficulty.

Secret Archives of Mussolini (political and military).
- b. ROCCA DELLE CAMINATE (Forli). N 4105  
The Castello was the residence of Mussolini and contained correspondence with D'Annunzio and other personal papers. 4083
- c. TRESCORE (Bergamo). K 7686.  
Address unknown, but it is believed that the Archives of the "Ufficio Storico dello Stato Maggiore" removed from ROME to ORVIETO were later transferred to this village.

2. Although it is presumed that a. and b. will be dealt with by G-2 agents it is suggested that MFA & A Offices in the field should be in possession of this information.

1. The American Political Adviser has drawn attention to the reference in Appendix A paragraph 50 of the Monthly report for June dealing with Archives in Rome.

2. The Political Adviser asks whether, so far, a more detailed report has been prepared regarding the nature and disposition of the archives found in the general Rome Ministries.

3. The Political Adviser has emphasized that this is a matter of concern to the State Dept. and has asked for any information at present available.

4. Will you please let this Section have any information available and indicate whether a formal report on the matter is in course of preparation.

Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives.

49. Monuments and Fine Arts. Fine Arts situation in ROME City very good. Almost no war damage. Church of S. Lorenzo seriously damaged by bombing in July 1943; repairs are in progress under direction of Superintendent of Monuments, but hampered by lack of materials.

50. Archives. A general policy of removal to the North of the majority of the more important recent Archives was carried out by all Ministries before the arrival of the Allies in ROME. In the Ministry of Foreign Affairs very little remains for the period 1933/43. Regarding the Ministry of Justice, it is reported that the legal records were bombed and in large part destroyed en route North. In spite of these removals the amount remaining in the various Ministries was so large that the plans laid for the exploitation of the Archives for intelligence purposes could not be carried out. In the return intact of all evacuated documents an important preliminary is the preparation by individual Ministries of a comprehensive statement with exact lists of missing classes, files etc. This is being done.

Subject: Archival Problems.

To : G-5, AFMA.

1. With reference to your G-5: 313.3-4 of 28 July, the following report is submitted. The specific questions asked in General Hildring's letter are answered serially in the following paragraphs.
2. Advance determination of the whereabouts of Archives of importance.

This is covered in three ways:-

- a. By the use of "Brief Memorandum and List of Italian Archives" compiled by Mr. Hilary Jenkinson of the Public Record Office, London and by Capt. Brooke of the AFMA Subcommission. This lists more than 1500 repositories and is in the hands of AFMA Officers in the Field and of all Regional and Provincial Commissioners.
- b. By close liaison with G-2 Advanced Intelligence **4070**
- c. By close liaison with the Italian Ministries and with Superintendent of the Archivio del Regno, Com. Re, at Rome.
3. Guarding of Archives.
  - a. In the case of locations especially important for modern archives, such as Rome and Florence and certain of the North Italian cities, where detailed planning is practicable, it has been the function of 5th Force Advanced Intelligence, advised by the AFMA Archives Officer, to arrange for the necessary guards. In the case of Rome this worked very well.

b. In the field, AFMA Officers advise the Army Liaison

3. Guarding of Archives.

- a. In the case of locations specially important for modern archives, such as Rome and Florence and certain of the North Italian cities, where detailed planning is practicable, it has been the function of "S" Force Advanced Intelligence, advised by the MPAA Archives Officer, to arrange for the necessary guards. In the case of Rome this worked very well.
- b. In the field, MPAA Officers advise <sup>on</sup> the guard matters of protection. OFF LIMITS signs are posted at the earliest possible moment and steps taken to secure archive-repositories against entry. Only exceptionally are guards available, but in no known instance has their absence resulted in any loss.

4. Passes to Archival Deposits.

"S" Force Passes are required in the case of important repositories under guard. In cases where there is no guard (in some branches of the 18 Central Ministries alone run into hundreds), the system of passes is of course practicable. Such repositories are covered by the terms of All Administrative Instruction No. 10, para 11.

6. Division of Responsibilities.

a. Mr. Shyman's recommendation has not been put into effect owing to the non-arrival of the American Archivist on board, as a result of established difficulties, the nature of which was fully explained to Mr. Shyman when he was here. It is understood these difficulties have now been overcome, (see below).

b. Mr. Shyman's nominee will be employed as indicated. It is remarked however that such rigid delimitation of responsibilities as is proposed in Mr. Shyman's report has not in general proved very practicable and that the new officer may be glad of the help of his British Archival colleagues, one of whom has very ably handled the current Administrative Archives of base, and of the NMA Officers in the field.

The Prefect's report on three collections of Archives in the City of Trapani enclosed with your letter of 11 May (P.C. - 7070 - PC) herewith acknowledged.

This report does not cover the Biblioteca Fardelliana where a number of the earlier Archives of the Comune are preserved. This building when visited recently by two members of the Sub-Commission, Mr. Hilary Jenkinson and Capt. Brooke, was in need of minor structural repairs, particularly to the roof. In addition there appeared to be no responsible person officiating as Librarian. A number of Archives, which had been damaged by rain water were in urgent need of attention (removal from the shelves and opening out to dry). There are a number of valuable books, including some incunabula (books printed before 1500) in similar danger.

A copy of a report with details of these circumstances was forwarded to you on 9 May and this pointed out that the first-aid work required on these Archive was not of an extensive character. It is therefore hoped that you may be able to use your influence with the Prefect to secure the necessary repairs to the building and, it not too late, the salvation of the sodden documents from total destruction.

b. Effective with the publication of this bulletin, signals not so approved by the originating officer cannot be accepted, and will be returned to originator, for such authentication.

c. In order that better service may result, the Signal Section recommends that, whenever possible, messages be filed early in the day, as, in the afternoon and evening, circuits are heavily loaded, and more time is required for transmission. (Adj)
