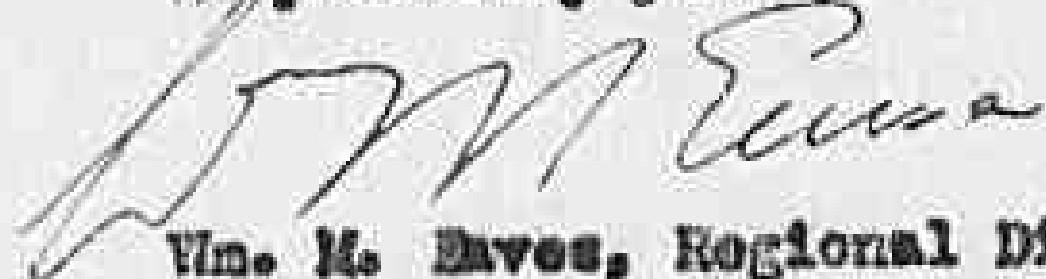
To whom it may concern:

REQUIREMENTS FOR OFFICERS FOR THE LABOR SUB-COMMISSIONA. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

The officer must have an active interest in some phase of the labor field. In order that he may be immediately useful he must have some background in economics either acquired through experience or education or both. While the term "economics" may be considered broadly in order to meet this requirement, there must be a showing that the "economics" background was related to the various problems in the labor field.

B. REQUIREMENTS PREFERRED:

1. Experience: Chief emphasis should be placed on experience in some one or more phases of the labor field. Phases of the labor field of greatest interest to this Sub-Commission are:

- a. Any type of social or industrial insurance.
- b. Labor organization, labor relations, labor disputes, arbitration, and mediation.
- c. Labor statistics, employment and unemployment statistics, labor costs, and price fixing.
- d. Labor wages, hours, working conditions.
- e. Training, up-grading, down-grading, job breakdowns, job analysis, and job classification work.
- f. Cost of living in relation to wages.

The experience in these fields may be either office or field experience with some field experience preferred.

Valuable experience of the type desired could well be gained in any of the following at the Federal or State level: The Labor Department; the Labor Relations Board; The National Mediation Board; The United States Employment Service; The War Manpower Commission; the Civil Service Commission; State Departments of Labor; Labor Activities in the A.S.F. of the War Department; and certain segments of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics and Extension Service in the Department of Agriculture, or in the cooperating Land Grant Colleges. Experience gained in labor organizations or as labor relations officers for private industrial concerns would also be acceptable.

2. Education: If education should be substituted for experience, then this educational background should include one of the following: labor economics, general economics, costs, statistics, social psychology, and political science.

SUBJECT: Assignment of Sergeant Charles Sorisi
to the Labor Sub-Commission, Salerno.

TO: Captain ELLERY STONE,
Deputy Chief Commissioner,
Salerno.

1. Request was recently made for the assignment of Sergeant Charles Sorisi, who was temporarily attached to the Deputy Secretary General in Salerno, to our Labor Sub-Commission Office in Salerno. Because of his former connection in the labor field, and his knowledge of Italian, he is admirably suited for this assignment. I have been informed that he is considered unavailable because of a very recent assignment to the Interpreters' Pool.

2. It is obvious that exceedingly important work must be done with the Italian Government in furthering our war aims in the areas turned over to that Government. In charge of the very important Salerno Office is Captain R. M. ALBRIGHT, who, since his initial assignment to this post in Brindisi, has had to operate absolutely alone without any help. The situation has become extremely critical now that Captain Albright has to maintain two offices, one with the Italian Ministry of Labor at Vietri sul Mare, and the other at ACC Rear Headquarters, Tribunale Building, Salerno. In addition, he must make frequent trips to the head office of the Sub-Commission in Naples. Clearly, the addition of one Balisted Man of the calibre of Sergeant Sorisi, to give Captain Albright direly needed assistance, is an urgent matter requiring affirmative action.

3. It is, therefore, requested that Sergeant Sorisi be relieved of his present assignment and be ordered to the Labor Sub-Commission Office in Salerno, NOT as an interpreter but as a specialist in the field of Labor.

1. Pursuant to the authority contained in Freedom Cable, 60302, and MATOUSA letter, AG 210.3/324-AGP, Subject: Transfer of Officers, dated 28 January 1944, Captain DAVID A. MORSE, 0902599, AC, is relieved from assignment and duty in the North African Theater of Operations, and will proceed on or about 11 March 1944, from present station to the United Kingdom, reporting upon arrival to the Commanding General, MATOUSA, for assignment and duty.

SUBJECT: Retaining Services of Capt. D. A. Morse.

TO : Colonel Spofford

1. The undersigned has had several conversations with you regarding the imperative necessity of keeping Capt. Morse on our Labor Sub-Commission Staff in Italy. As you know, he was designated to go to another theater, and you were good enough to arrange delaying his departure until 1 March.
2. The success attendant upon the promulgation and initiation of our Labor Program, as well as the handling and solution of current critical situations and problems, depends exclusively upon the competency and background of our personnel. Frankly, as you well know, we are tackling the huge problem before us with a mere handful of really competent men. Despite numerous urgent requests, we have not secured one single addition in the way of Officer personnel. With the exception of two or three men who may come under our jurisdiction ultimately, they are simply not available without calling on known competent personnel in the United States.
3. The foregoing recitation gives emphasis to the tremendously irreparable loss to our Staff, and equally severe blow to the successful progress of our plans that would be occasioned by the withdrawal of Capt. Morse at this time. Besides his complete competency in the Labor field, he, above all others in the Sub-Commission, has had the longest and most intimate contact with all of the developments in this field since our initial occupancy in Sicily. He has the widest acquaintance with all the important Heads in the various units, whether American, British or Italian, who deal with Labor. He has himself evolved or been responsible for most of the important Proclamations, Rules and Regulations which have been issued both in Sicily and on the Mainland, dealing with important basic changes in renovation of the Italian Labor structure.
4. You are aware of the well developed program we are initiating. The new authority given to A.C.C. has increased our responsibilities tremendously. Therefore, at this time particularly, the loss of Capt. Morse would be inexcusable, and I, therefore, most urgently request that every possible effort be made to insure the retention of his services in this Sub-Commission for an indefinite period.

Thus, minimum personnel requirements of Headquarters total nineteen (19) officers of which only seven (7) are, at the moment, assured this

Sub-Commission, namely, Bain, Smith, Babcock, Seicluna, Fisher, Albright and Moffitt (who is temporarily attached to Region I). It is agreed that Headquarters at least shall have trained specialists, and it is apparent after numerous attempts made, that such are not available unless recourse is made to known competent personnel in the United Kingdom and the United States of America. In lieu of such additions, it is submitted that new representation be made to retain Morse, that Ciannarco be assigned to us permanently, and request for Lyon and Pringle be expedited. (Of these four, the retention of Morse is our most important need.) In event these four men are not kept, we are in the impossible situation of requiring twelve (12) additional trained men, or an increase of nearly 200%.

Thus, the proposal is to operate, for the time being, and because manpower is presumed to be scarce, with nineteen (19) instead of thirty (30) announced for Headquarters use, and which latter figure truly represents our adequate requirement.

It is suggested that, on loan or extended leave of absence bases for six months, competent officers can be furnished from the home countries, and thus, not violate the ceiling of permanently assigned officers set by General Devers.

- c) The present and future work of Liaison with the Italian Ministry of Labor will require (1) more travel in assisting and supervising the development of the Employment Exchanges and Labor Offices in regions restored to Italian Control; (2) more interpretation and translation of Italian Decrees and Regulations in the field of labor; and (3) more developmental work in the revision and improvement of the Social Security Program.
- d) It is submitted that the work to be done requires additional personnel, and that experience, such as that of Sgt. Sorisi, in the labor and Social Insurance field is essential to adequate performance.

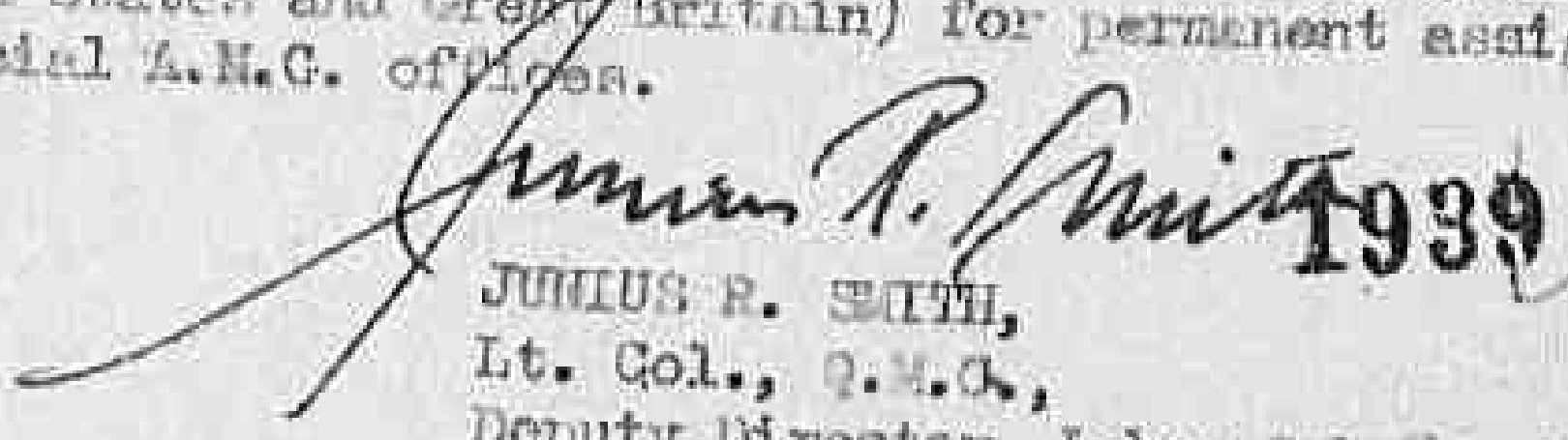

SUBJECT: Personnel Needs of Labor Sub-Commission.

1. A number of requests have been made both in Tizi Ouzou and here, addressed at various times to Brigadier Gueterbock, Brigadier Haulyn, Colonel Albright, Colonel Rathbone and Colonel Adams regarding the imperative necessity for an adequate staff to handle the wide extent of work which labor problems involve. We were originally allotted seventeen officers to include one British full colonel and one American full colonel. In spite of our protests, our present allotted number has been reduced to ten, of which one is temporarily assigned to General Joyce in Brindisi, two are in Regions II and III for important wage studies and to cooperate with the Labor Officer in Region III, one is assisting the Labor Officer of Region I, one is engaged in important labor exchange investigations, one is working with the Regional Labor Director and one is on the way from Tizi Ouzou. Therefore, actually at the moment there are only Colonel Bain, Captain Robertson and myself at Headquarters.
2. Attached are copies of two documents setting forth our sphere of activities and present assignments on paper. You will note that important positions are filled by officers of low rank who are perfectly competent to assume the duties indicated.
3. We have been advised from Tizi that no competent labor men are available, either American or British, and that no further shipments are expected. A second important factor is that each of the regions and provinces are pitifully undermanned, and in too many spots labor problems are taken on as a side line by an officer entirely unacquainted with the subject. It is our thought, in order to achieve completely coordinated action and handling throughout the entire occupied territory, that screening and selection of men to fill these positions whether at Provincial, Regional or A.C.C. levels should be done by this Headquarters. If the report from Tizi is correct, it will be impossible to perform a successful job unless qualified men are brought in from the United States and from British Ministry of Labor (see paragraph 5 of our November 12 attachment).
4. It is obvious that as long as there is Allied Occupancy, close watch must be maintained over all labor departments in the country very actively under A.M.C. operation, conditions, and just as importantly, under conditions of occupancy and full control by the Italian Government. In the latter situation it is palpably to our interests to see that our plans, suggestions and advice are actually carried out by the Italian Government up to the time of our complete evacuation. It is not our thought to foist our own notions upon the Italian people, but to inaugurate such procedures as will insure the success of our task while here.
5. In the light of the foregoing statements, we feel that the total of eighteen asked for is dangerously small to handle the work of the Labor Sub-Commission Headquarters and Field Forces. We must also recognize now that in addition, we should secure at least twelve other competent officers (and they are available in the United States and Great Britain) for permanent assignment to the regional and provincial A.M.C. offices.

The following comments are my own. The reduction in numbers of officers allocated to sub coms was made at the direction of MBS AFHQ who were forced to reduce T/O/W/E's drastically by a top ^{for all military coo.} figure of 829 Am. Officers and 650 Brit. Of this 1479 officers only 251 were available for Sub. Coms. It became necessary to revise figures as best we ¹⁹³⁷ could under that Directive.

At the present time, we are operating under a policy of keeping within that overall

36

total. So long as all Regions are not actively in the field, additional officers are available from the other Regions until they are called forward. Thereafter ACC can only be increased in size by "robbing" the Regions.

American Officers thus far furnished exceed the total of 829 and MGS will not request more. In addition, we are already being called upon to select officers for reassignment to the AT.

SUBJECT: Personnel Recommendations for Essential Staffing of Labor Sub-Commission.

TO : Chief of Staff,

As an important addition to the statement furnished you November 11 regarding personnel, the following requirements represent the minimum amount of personnel needed even to approximately perform the necessary functions of this Sub-Commission.

1. STAFF. The original allotment of officers to staff this Sub-Commission at Tisi Ouzou was indicated as 17, which number included 2 full Colonels -- 1 British, 1 American. Subsequently, an arbitrary reduction to 11 officers was made. In view of the basic importance of the work to be undertaken by this Sub-Commission, both in its relationship to the restoration of normal economy in Italy, as well as to the enormous extent of the work that labor problems involve, it is manifestly impossible to operate with such an inadequate staff. Considering allocation limitations, however, it has been determined that an absolute minimum of 18 officers is required to do the job.

At Tizi-Ouzou, under date of October 8, 1943, AG/1006/1, request was made that 2 Ministry of Labor officers, now serving in Malta, be asked for (one to fill a vacancy as an "indoors" 1st Lieutenant). It was also suggested since there is a marked dearth of suitable candidates for selection on the British side, that request be made at once to the Ministry of Labor for the release of two officers to fill the Major (B) vacancies, and that one of them should have Trade Board experience. On the American side it was suggested that there are available extremely capable commissioned officers now in 1934 who are excellently equipped for our work, viz., Capt. James Doan, 6th Service Command, Cleveland, Ohio; Capt. David King, 9th Service Command, San Francisco, California; Capt. Joseph Frank, Industrial Personnel Division, Army Service

Force, Washington, D.C.; Capt. Richard Leigh, 6th Service Command, Chicago, Ill.

6. The proposed duties of the 18 officers requested on 8 October, at Tini-Ouzon is set forth in that request. In addition the following statements are submitted as justification for consideration:

a. Labor will have extensive responsibilities not only in policy and administrative control, but in operation and supervision, including the National system of employment exchanges; the labor control agencies; industrial relations; labor courts; factory inspection; hours, wages, and working conditions; training agencies; unemployment and other benefit payments; labor statistics; "dopo lavoro".

b. In addition, labor will have many special problems of labor unrest; questions of free labor organization, of dispute, of the reaction against former Fascist Controls -- as well as new problems of absorption of former prisoners of war, demobilized soldiers, and return of industrial workers. It will have the responsibility of coordinating, supervising, and assisting Regional Labor Offices.

c. The inadequacy of the present allotment of 10 officers is apparent when it is noted that only one officer would be available for each of the following groups of responsibilities (1) all labor disputes and industrial relations (2) all inspection and control of hours, wages, working conditions, (3) all Field Operations and Control.

1. In conformance with your request made at the Executive Council Meeting, 29 October, herewith are set forth the plans and organizational setup of the Labor Sub-Commission.

2. In order to achieve proper direction and uniform policy, it is obvious that all matters of policy affecting labor problems for all of Italy shall be decided and promulgated from this office. This means that the various Regional and Provincial Labor Offices shall be responsible to this Commission for the proper carrying out of policies and procedures issued therefrom.

It also follows that in order to achieve proper coordinated effort and to maintain a uniformly high standard of Regional and Provincial operation, that the selection of Labor Officers to effectuate such operations shall be under the control of and the responsibility of this Commission.

3. The MISSION of this Commission is conceived to encompass the following:

a. To formulate the policy and to supervise the organization and administration of the supply and distribution of labor (of all types) on demand by other branches to services essential to:

- (1) the successful prosecution of the war, and
- (2) the rehabilitation, life and well being of the Community.

b. To supervise industrial relations and determine the policy and procedure to be followed for the formation of free associations of employers and employees and for arbitration between them.

c. To ensure that approved standards of safety and welfare are adopted in factories and workshops.

d. To secure the reinstatement in each occupied Province, as far as they are acceptable or feasible, of prewar labor laws controlling hours of work and employment of women and children.

e. To study, promulgate and enforce wage standards in each industry and Province.

1. Reference is made to the request of 3 Oct., for the allotment of 18 (A) & (B) Officers to Labour Sub-Commission, A.C. Minute VI of 13 Oct., indicates that the number allotted is 10, and that no further increase is now being considered.
2. This letter is respectfully submitted as a formal request for reconsideration of the needs of the Labour Sub-Commission and the apparent difference in the size of its present allotment in comparison to the size of other Sub-Commissions of similar responsibility.
3. The proposed duties of the 18 Officers requested on 3 Oct., is set forth in that request. In addition the following statements are submitted as justification for reconsideration:
 - (a) Labour will have extensive responsibilities not only in policy and administrative control but in operation and supervision, including the National system of employment exchanges; the labour control agencies; industrial relations; labour courts; factory inspection; hours, wages, and working conditions; training agencies; unemployment and other benefit payment; labor statistics; "Dopolavoro".
 - (b) In addition, Labour will have many special problems of labor unrest; questions of free labor organization, of dispute, of the reaction against former Fascist Controls--as well new problems of absorption of former Prisoners of War, demobilized soldiers, and return of industrial workers. 2. This letter is respectfully submitted as a formal request for reconsideration of the needs of the Labour Sub-Commission and the apparent difference in the size of its present allotment in comparison to the size of other Sub-Commissions of similar responsibility.

3. The proposed duties of the 13 Officers requested on 8 Oct., is set forth in that request. In addition the following statements are submitted as justification for reconsideration:

(a) Labour will have extensive responsibilities not only in policy and administrative control but in operation and supervision, including the National system of employment exchanges; the labour control agencies; industrial relations; labour courts; factory inspection; hours, wages, and working conditions; training agencies; unemployment and other benefit payment; labor statistics; "Dopolavoro".

(b) In addition, Labour will have many special problems of labor unrest; questions of free labor organization, of dispute, of the reaction against former Fascist Controls--as well new problems of absorption of former Prisoners of War, demobilized soldiers, and return of industrial workers. It will have the responsibility of coordinating, supervising, and assisting Regional labour officers.

(c) The inadequacy of the present allotment is apparent when it is noted that only one officer would be available for each of the following groups of responsibilities (1) all labor dispute & industrial relations (2) all inspection and control of hours, wages, working conditions, (3) all field operations and control.

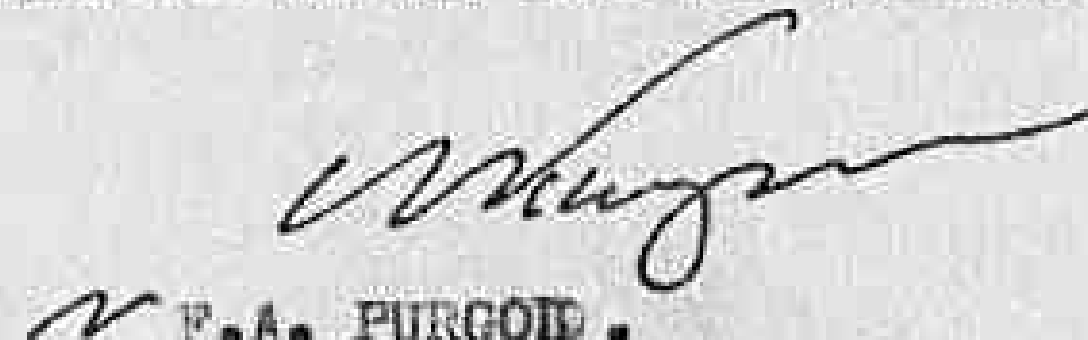

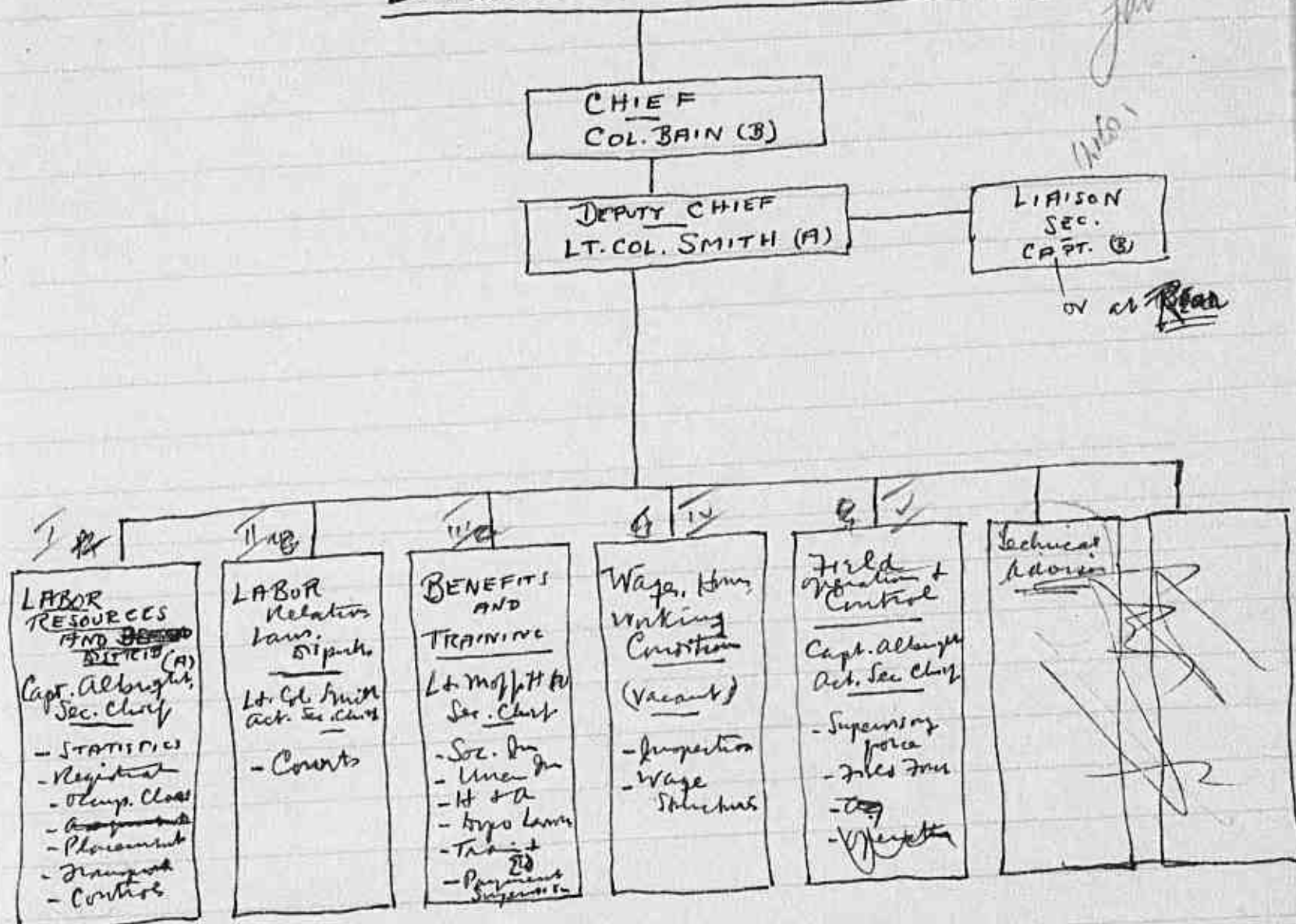
