SUBJECT: Discontinuance of A.C. Functions and Withdrawal of A.C. Personnel.

TO : Economic Section
 Attention: Colonel L. D. Densmore

1. Referring to your memorandum of 18 November on the above subject, this Sub-Commission comments with respect to functions and duties in the labor field:-

- (a) No functions of A.C. should be discontinued in Italian Government territory. Representation is needed in every region for liaison on labor policy and in the interests of Army and Navy installations.
- (b) Functions shall continue as long as there are any A.C. officials left in Italian territory.
- (c) Labor personnel is at a low point, and further withdrawals will prove entirely disastrous.
- (d) Withdrawals of labor representatives should not be made until the Regional Commissioner's office is abolished.
- (e) In addition to the appointments listed for A.C. approval, the following should be added: Regional and Provincial Labor Directors; Commissari for the various social insurance agencies.
- (f) See (e).

2. The principal functions of the Labor Sub-Commission are as follows:

- (a) General policy on all labor matters -- Armed Forces and civilian.
- (b) Wages -- Armed Forces and private.
- (c) Liaison with Italian Government.
- (d) Field direction of AG/AMG labor officers and activities.
- (e) Social security program and operation.
- (f) Labor office development, including employment service, statistics and inspection.
- (g) Labor representation at AFHQ level.
- (h) Industrial relations.

All of the above are continuing functions at A.C. Headquarters, which ultimately may be continued by properly trained technicians (civilians) under a civilian director. At all times, however, it is recommended that at least one officer remain for military liaison.

3. In AMG territory officer personnel is needed with non-com assistants, with the following minimum requirements:

- 1 field grade officer at each regional headquarters;
- 1 field or junior grade officer in the largest industrial centers;
- 1 additional officer for every 4 smaller provinces.

4. Because of the critical political situation, it is again recommended that in Italian territory there be a minimum of two officers in every region for an indefinite period.

SUBJECT : Proper Administration of
Civilian Personnel Office.

TO : Vice President, Administrative Section
(Through Economic Section)

1. This Sub-Commission has been informed by G-1 (A) that it is proposed to attach the Civilian Personnel office directly to G-1, eliminating the Employment Officer and leaving a Corporal in charge.

2. G-1 (A) already has its hands full without acting as Employment Officers. It is urged that the matter be reconsidered continuing the present civilian personnel set-up and an Employment Officer be retained to perform the functions listed below:

a. Recruit and test qualified persons for civilian employment in ACC. When ACC functions are eventually turned over to the Italian Government the calibre of civilian employees will be of critical importance. Experience here has shown that many of the officers wish assistance in finding and testing employees and for want of such assistance unqualified persons have been employed, resulting in waste of time and public funds.

b. Examine and rule on reclassifications of present employees and classifications of new ones. Experience again has shown that many offices need assistance in determining classifications, not only to remove pressure from the officer in charge but also to prevent high classifications based on sympathy and other personal reasons. Classifications based on personal reasons cause dissatisfaction among other employees and illegal expenditure of AFA funds.

c. Supervise the audit of civilian payrolls to insure that payments are in accordance with AFHQ directives. A recent audit disclosed many errors, in one case an overpayment of 12,000 Lire per month for several months, concealed by incorrect job titles.

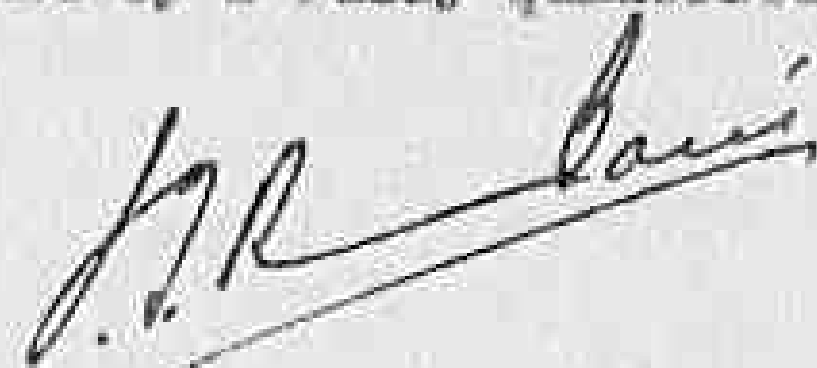
d. To furnish special information, such as the recent report on key personnel receiving quarters and rations. Matters that require officer attention are continually being referred to the Civilian Personnel Office.

3. The Labor Sub-Commission has an officer, Major Small, at present heading the Civilian Personnel office, and believes the efficient operation of that office of sufficient importance to leave him in that assignment, if desired by higher authority. He has an employment

background, including college training and five years experience, and is a Personnel Examiner in civil life. In any case, without regard to any particular officer, it is our belief that a serious mistake would be made if the ACC Civilian Personnel office were not continued as a separate entity and headed by a fully qualified officer.

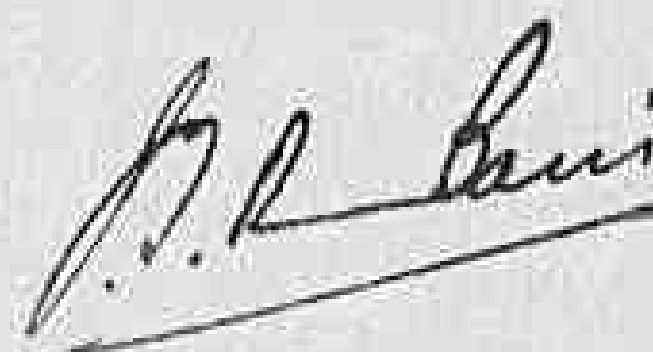

1. It is appreciated that officers and clerks cannot produce their best work in over-crowded conditions.

As you will have heard from John Moffett, I have been laid-up for some time so have not been able to pick-up the threads as early as expected; consequently a plea for his retention at Palermo for a longer period than anticipated is submitted. I was "took-ill" on Tues 11th and was put on Aspirin by the British M.O. and staged a come-back in a few days only to be put on M. & B. by the American M.O. which just about knocked me clean out. Came back again but was virtually ordered by Hancock to take two-days of which I completed yesterday at Mondello and am now feeling quite fit again but afraid to face the Junk M.O. in case he prescribes something worse.

One of my days back included the meeting with the Railway strikers' delegates which was good experience but our tour of the Island has had to be postponed. We expect, however, to start on Mon. or Tues.

A British Sergeant has been taken on at the Mess and the food is improving. The drink is still not worth consuming.

I hope things are going well with you and friends at the Sn Brigida.
