1. I must make formal protest against the order issued by General Brown of the Rome Area Command, stopping the elevator service. Such an order may be considered quite calmly by those fortunate enough to be on any of the floors up to and including the 4th. Above that level climbing becomes a serious proposition, and although I am a fairly robust individual, I find it impossible to climb up seven flights of stairs three or four times a day, and be in proper condition to carry on my duties.

2. This complaint is made in all seriousness and I must request immediate assignment of office space at a much lower floor level than I have at present. In lieu of such a possibility, I request that formal demand be made on General Brown that elevator service be restored for those on the 5th floor and above, at least during certain periods in the early morning and early afternoon.

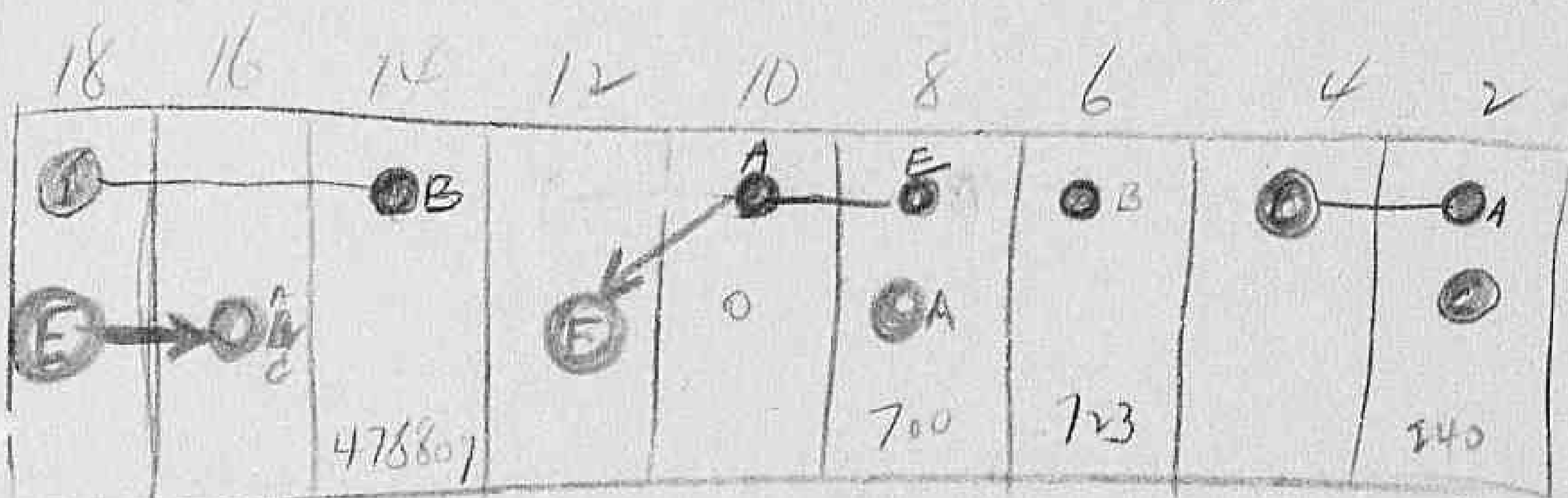
LABOR SUB COM 7TH FLOOR PHONE PLAN

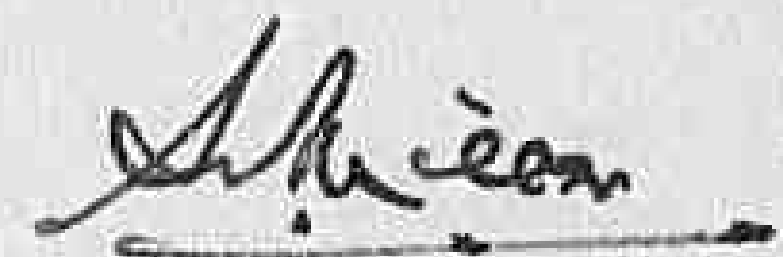

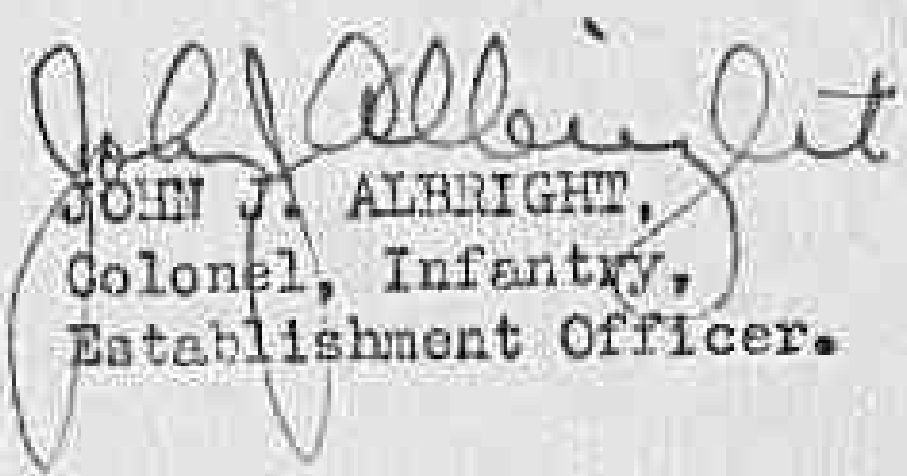

1. Captain Gotham told me that one of the new military vehicles for Region Two was to be assigned to the Labor department and that I was to notify you should this not be done. Not only has the labor department not received any vehicle - but Region Two has not received any additional vehicles and the transportation officer tells me today this was all apparently a mistake as he was informed no more vehicles have been assigned to Region Two.

2. I succeeded in putting my twelve year old Lancia in operation again by taking parts from a wrecked car. It is not at all satisfactory and cannot make a hard trip. Also the tires are in very bad condition. This is the only transportation available to the regional director, to the Labor officer, to Captain Gotham or to the provincial director, and most of the time it is in the garage for repair.

3. The transportation officer apparently has no military vehicle which can be assigned to the Labor department and if one could be obtained from Naples it would be greatly appreciated.

SUBJECT: Transportation for Regional Labor Officer.

1. The Director of the Labor Sub-Commission has written me a letter stating that the Labor Officer of Region II cannot properly carry out his duties without transportation, and that it has been impossible in the past for you to furnish him with transportation. Since four passenger vehicles were transferred to Region II, on or about 25 March, I think that it is quite possible that you will now be able to furnish transportation for your Labor Officer.

SUBJECT: Supply of Transport to Labor Officer Attached to Region II.

TO : Brigadier Lush, Executive Commissioner

1. For some considerable time now the Labor Officer, Region II, has attempted to carry out his duties without a car, and it is represented that the present almost impossible position cannot continue if the duties assigned are to be performed in the manner expected.

2. Request has repeatedly been made to the Regional Commissioner, Region II, who is apparently unable to help as to the availability of cars in the region. I have no official information.

3. Captain Frazer frequently has occasion to visit outlying offices, and to take with him or send the Regional Labor Officer (Civilian). They have traveled in open trucks, been stranded, and seriously delayed. It is thought that a car should be assigned specifically to the Labor Officer. Region II extends over a distance of some 360 miles, and while a case can be made for a car even during times that could be regarded as normal, in these days of disputes, threatened disputes and unrest, it is essential that the Labor Officer be immediately independently mobile. Your good offices in securing the assignment of a car to Captain Frazer would be appreciated.

SUBJECT: Request for Transportation

TO: Col. John J. Albright, Executive Officer, A.C.C.

1. Requested civilian driver because many have been observed, in employment of other units perhaps. Purpose also was not to increase demand for services of our EM/OF personnel, and in keeping also with established policy of spreading civilian employment.

2. In most instances, because of heavy demands, Pool cannot furnish transportation before $\frac{1}{2}$ day, and on occasion, even 2 days. Reservations are not always met, and many times we do not submit any because need is not always anticipated.

3. We are presently engaged in setting up of scales for wages, hours and working conditions for every industry, with special emphasis on those required by the Armed Forces, and subsequently by Italian Government essential civilian needs. In order that an exact and proper job classification and rate be set, it is necessary to observe, investigate and supervise at the factory. Some are at quite a distance and in order to avoid a return trip to accomplish the survey, and so that time, gasoline, etc., may be economized, we propose remaining longer hours at the site. In addition, during the compilation of this information constant contact with Italian Governmental agencies is maintained to obtain collateral material. Hence, it is evident that being unaware of the quality and quantity of requests from the various agencies, and for other unforeseen contingencies, we are not in a position to establish or estimate the hours this transportation is required. But immediately and definitely, we do have a need.

4. Is it not possible to obtain a private car and driver-- or just a car?

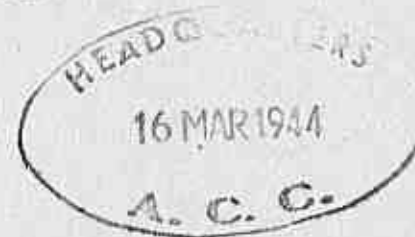
Memo to Rec:

1. It is respectfully requested that a decision be rendered as to whether or not an officer may purchase an automobile and use official gasoline and tires if the car is used on official business. I was told unofficially in Sicily this could not be done but I have been told by an officer in BARI AOC HQ that he is doing it. I should like to purchase a car if it will be possible to obtain official gasoline legitimately.

2. This request is made in view of the fact it has become almost impossible to carry on my work without transportation. There is no transportation whatever available either for the Labor Officer or for the Regional Director. Military transportation has not been available to me for some weeks. I did succeed in borrowing a car last week and took the Director and my clerk to Bari on official business, having arranged to return to Matera in the ration truck when our work was completed. The ration truck never picked us up and we were left stranded in Bari two days. I finally sent a letter back by the Director who had to return on the train and at length transportation was sent for us. There is important work which I should do in the provinces but having no transportation makes it impossible.

Memorandum to: Colonel Spofford

Subject : Actions of Lt.Col.C.G.Brown- G-4

1. The undersigned protests vigorously and requests immediate corrective action in the following:

- a) Lt.Col.C.G.Brown, G-4, in the writer's absence from the office, Saturday, Dec. 11 about 2 p.m., did summarily remove, or in his presence ordered removed, two large, brilliant electric light bulbs (one from the writer's office and one from the typists room);
- b) The locked door of the writer's office was forced open, said office being locked for security of confidential papers on the writer's table, the regular lock box having been removed several days previously for movement forward;
- c) These bulbs were purchased out of personnel funds, similar type bulbs not being available thru regular channels;
- d) The undersigned and several officers are not going forward at this time. We were and are now, therefore, deprived of necessary and proper illumination to carry on important work.
- e) Although our office is scheduled to be moved back to Via Bari, no notice has yet been given and as of Saturday morning, Col. Rogers has not assigned space for this purpose;
- f) Col. Brown alleges to have orders to remove these bulbs for use forward. The last instructions read that no bulbs shall be removed from the offices;
- g) On telephoning Col. Brown about 3:30 p.m., he stated that the bulbs were already packed and on the way when it was common knowledge that the convoy will not move until Monday and stated further that "it was too bad- nothing could be done about it"- and hung up before the conversation had finished.

2. Request is made that Col. Brown give full explanation and replace or restore the two bulbs of the identical type at once.
