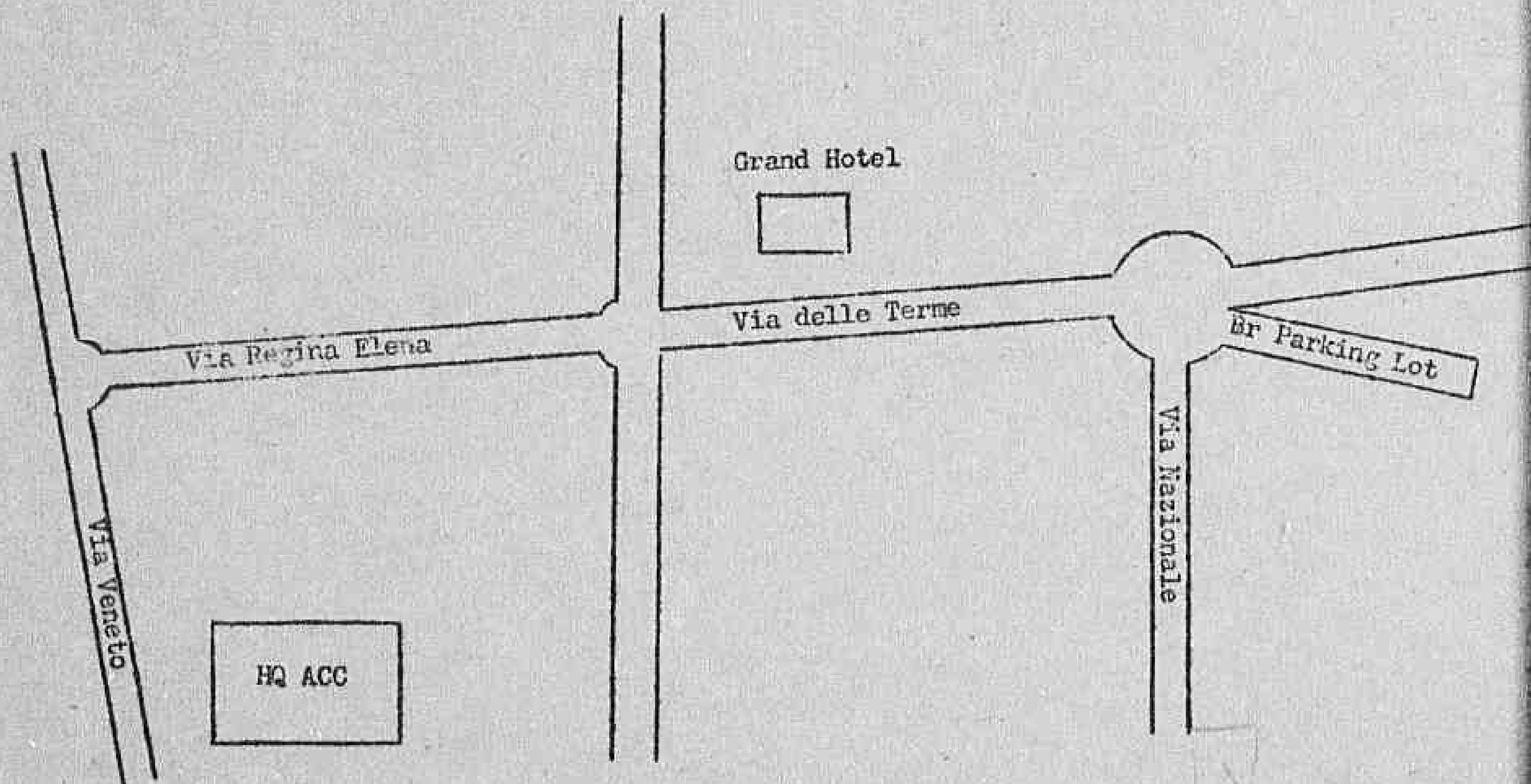

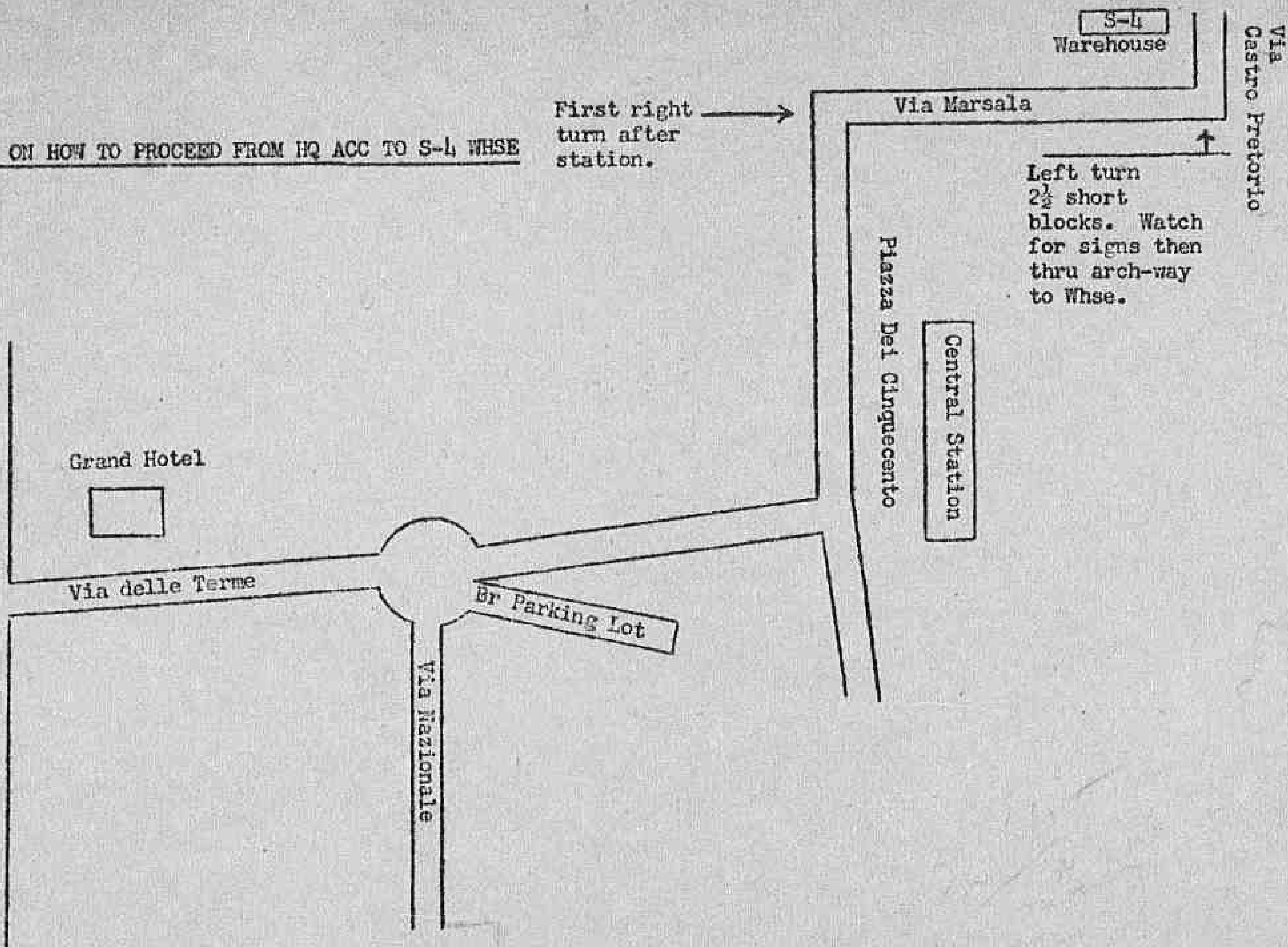

To : Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission
Headquarters Commandant, Allied Control Commission
All Small Messes

1. It is impossible to continue the breakdown of U.S. Army Rations for small messes on the present two (2) day cycle, i.e. Approximate strength of messes is from 5 to 15 and on present two day issue, ration breakdown becomes 10 to 30 respectively. An example of the present difficulties is the issue of one (1) Number 10 can of peas, issued on the basis of one hundred (100) individuals, which has to be issued three or four days.

2. Consequently, effective Monday, 16 September 1944, small messes will draw on a four (4) day cycle, which results in a repetition of the same mess for four (4) days.
