1. The following is a report concerning the illness and hospitalization of ALFRED L. BORY, Captain QMC-ORC O-358375 - Hq 2675 Regt - assigned to Labor Sub-Commission Allied Commission, as Executive Officer and Liaison and Field Labor Control Officer.

This report is contingent upon my original back injury (torn lumbar ligaments and dislocated intervertebral disks) received while in the performance of official duties about March 1942, at Indiantown Gap Military Res. Pa. I was hospitalized for about 10 weeks and advised to take light work only.

From that time on, my back injury has become chronic and rather painful and unbearable at times. Notwithstanding, I did not permit its condition to interfere in any of my official duties. As a matter of record, the first time I had to call attention to its painful presence since its origin was in Naples in early 1944. Soon thereafter a Medical Board was called and declared me only fit for "Limited Service".

I have had three severe and painful attacks since that time. The last two attacks occurring while in the service of the Allied Commission. I felt that I could continue regardless of the pain because of war conditions and that I had an important job to complete.

From about June 1945 onward, due to the heavy Labor Sub-Commission schedule, limited personnel and required travel to all parts of Italy by automobile and aircraft, and its attending discomforts and lack of sufficient rest and unavailable medical care, my back injury has taken on a turn for the worse. So that at this writing it requires definite and prolonged hospitalization and possibly a major operation.

which under present (U.S.) regulations must be performed in the U.S.

Upon completion of a trip North in early September 1945 I had a slight attack. Soon thereafter the real painful and annoying attack came on, while in Milan. In early October when the pain became unbearable and I was unable to get up, walk or move.

I was advised to go to the Hospital without further delay and left for Rome.

On 15 October 1945, I entered the 64th General Hospital at Leghorn and have been there since. There follows excerpts of the case history from the Medical Chart and the findings of the Medical Board that "r.I.d." my case to the U.S.

This was done, notwithstanding my several requests and desire to remain with the Allied Commission until the A.C. Labor problem is completed in Italy.

Brief Medical History : - Could not bend or walk, sitting painful, no radiation of the severe low back pain into the legs, backache intermittently, motion aggravated the pain, loss of lumbar curve with muscle spasm. Flexion and extension of the back limited to 20 degrees. Kernigs sign present bilaterally - Xray indicates narrowing of fifth interspace. Patient failed to respond to any treatment, bed rest and traction.

Board finds the diagnosis as follows:

1. Herniation of nucleus pulposus, ruptured intervertebral disc, level L5-S1 manifest by pain in back, narrowing of intervertebral space, neurologic change and atrophy, cause unknown, first manifest in 1942, again in March 1944, and now in October 1945.

1. PROPOSED RE-ORGANIZATION

(a) It is proposed that Labor Sub-Commission cease to operate in its present form approximately three weeks after the date of turn-over of North Italy to the administration of the Italian Government, (hereinafter referred to as "target date").

(b) It is suggested that after that date advisory services on labor questions be rendered jointly by the Labor Attaches of the British and American Embassies.

(c) It is recommended that a small Labor Office, comprising a staff of Italian civilians, be maintained for a limited period after the target date to dispose of outstanding questions, and matters that may arise after the turn-over of territory.

2. The closure of Labor Sub-Commission at target date is proposed because:

(a) The labor program has been carried out;

(b) The functions now being performed by Labor Sub-Commission may at that time be discontinued or can be assumed by other agencies of the Allied Governments.

3118

3. FULFILMENT OF PROGRAM

The labor program has been fulfilled:

(a) The Fascist Syndicates have been abolished and employees enjoy full freedom of self-organization and collective bargaining.

- 2 -

(b) Assistance has been given to the Italian Government in connection with the preparation of labor and social security legislation, and schemes for the relief of unemployment and plans concerning surplus labor.

(c) Provincial and Regional Labor Offices, staffed by Italian civilians, have been established throughout Italy. They are engaged in the work of conciliation and mediation, strike settlement, wage control, collection of wage and cost-of-living statistics, unemployment registration, and labor placement. In territory already turned over to the Italian Government these offices are operating under the supervision of the Ministry of Labor and Social Security, and in present AMG territory they are ready for turn-over to that Ministry.

(d) The Labor Inspectorate has been reactivated.

(e) The social insurance agencies have been reconstructed and are in operation.

(f) In present AMG territory, wage regulation machinery, including the participation of the Regional Italian Joint Advisory Committees (RIJACs), has been established and is functioning. This machinery may be taken over by the Italian Government should it so desire.

(g) With the guidance and assistance of the Labor Sub-Commission the Allied Forces have worked out a labor policy for the employees of the Allied Forces in Italy.

4. DISCHARGE OF REMAINING FUNCTIONS

The functions now being performed by Labor Sub-Commission can at target date be conveniently dropped **3117** assumed by other agencies.

(i) One of the principal functions now being performed is that of serving as Headquarters for labor matters arising in the administration of Allied Military Government and supervision of Labor Officers in the field. In this connection Labor Sub-Commission is engaged in furnishing advice and assistance to Economic Section in the development of labor policy, in making allocations of personnel, in making recommendations concerning the implementation of Italian Government legislation, and effecting liaison with the Italian Government in connection with the formulation of labor policy and the solution of labor problems arising in AMG territory. With the turn-over of this territory to the administration of Italian Government these functions need be no longer performed at this Headquarters.

- 3 -

(ii) There will remain, of course, the administration of Venezia-Giulia, and possibly of Udine Province. Information and guidance for these areas can be supplied on request by the Labor Attaches.

(iii) Another function at present being performed by the Labor Sub-Commission is that of rendering advice and assistance to the Allied Forces with respect to the establishment of policy, wage rates and working conditions for the employees of the Allied Forces. Allied Commission via Labor Sub-Commission has been represented on the Labor and Wages' Control Committee of which Mr. Braine, Director of Labor Sub-Commission, is Chairman. Present plans call for the termination of the Allied Force Labor and Wages Committee on 30 November 1945. AFHQ is engaged in a study of plans for performing the work at present being done by this Committee. Should the Allied Forces need any assistance or information in connection with dealings with the Italian Government or the General Confederation of Labor, or with regard to prevailing wage and labor conditions, the Labor Attaches of the respective Embassies would be available to render such assistance and information.


(iv) Another function is the collection of information, statistics, and data concerning labor, wages, working conditions, unemployment, cost-of-living, etc., in the labor field. This information can be collected by the Labor Attaches acting in their capacity as such and submitted to the Allied Governments through Embassy channels.

(v) Another function being performed is that of providing advice and assistance upon request to the Italian Government with respect to the development of labor policy and the preparation of Decrees in the labor and social insurance fields. It is suggested that the Labor Attaches would be available to deal with requests of this nature that may arise in the future.

5. DETERMINATION OF TARGET DATE

3116

It is anticipated that the target date selected would enable Labor Sub-Commission to complete any administrative or executive functions remaining. Target date may be deferred a week or so if necessary, should further business be at hand to dispose of at that time. Should any administrative or executive matters arise after target date, Mr. Braine who has served as Director, Labor Sub-Commission, would be readily available to render service.

6. LABOR ADVISORS

With the winding up of Labor Sub-Commission as a going concern, the Labor Attaches would be in a position to furnish Allied Commission with such advice as may be necessary from time to time. They could serve in a manner similar to that of the Political Advisors. It is not felt that during this period any important or any large number of questions in the labor field will arise to be disposed of by Allied Commission. The availability of the Labor Attaches will, however, give assurance that the Chief Commissioner will not be cut off from expert advice and assistance in this field.

7. Approval is requested for the proposals contained in Paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this memorandum, which supersede the proposals contained in memoranda LSC/107 of 17 September 1945 and LSC/107 of 24 September 1945.







TO : Brig.-General E. M. McKinley

1. It is understood that objection has been raised to this Labor Sub-Commission's proposal to allocate two Labor Officers for liaison work in Lombardy as from 20 September 1945. You have requested that if it is desired to retain these two posts on the proposed establishment of the Milan liaison team, we should submit more detailed information in justification.

2. It is anticipated that following the handing over of the Northern Provinces to the Italian Government there will be a considerable amount of advisory and consultative work in which the services of experienced Officers will be of great help to the Italian Government. It is our intention that the two Officers, whilst shown on the Milan liaison strength, will be responsible for giving assistance throughout the whole of the North. Their work will fall under two broad headings:

- (a) Giving advice and assistance direct to the Italian authorities in the North;
- (b) Supplying information to this Headquarters on the strength of which questions of policy can be discussed at a high level with the Italian Government.

3. The more specific duties of the Liaison Officers will be:

- (a) Reports on labor disputes, strikes and labor unrest;
- (b) Reports on wage negotiation, collective agreements and wage levels;
- (c) Review of developments in the field of labor organization;

- (d) Cooperation with the Italian Government in the operation and efficiency of their labor agencies;
- (e) Reporting and advising on the extent of unemployment and the success or failure of relief schemes;
- (f) Special reports and investigations to furnish this Headquarters and other interested authorities with information about work stoppages, strikes, availability of labor which will affect the program of supplies to Italy. This covers the effective utilization of imported materials;
- (g) To make recommendations to this Headquarters and other interested authorities on the allocation of coal and other raw materials with a view to their maximum utility.

4. It is the firm opinion of this Sub-Commission that if the organization of Allied Commission, subsequent to 30 September, includes a Labor Sub-Commission, it is essential that there should be at least one, and probably two, experienced Labor Officers stationed at Milan for liaison work.

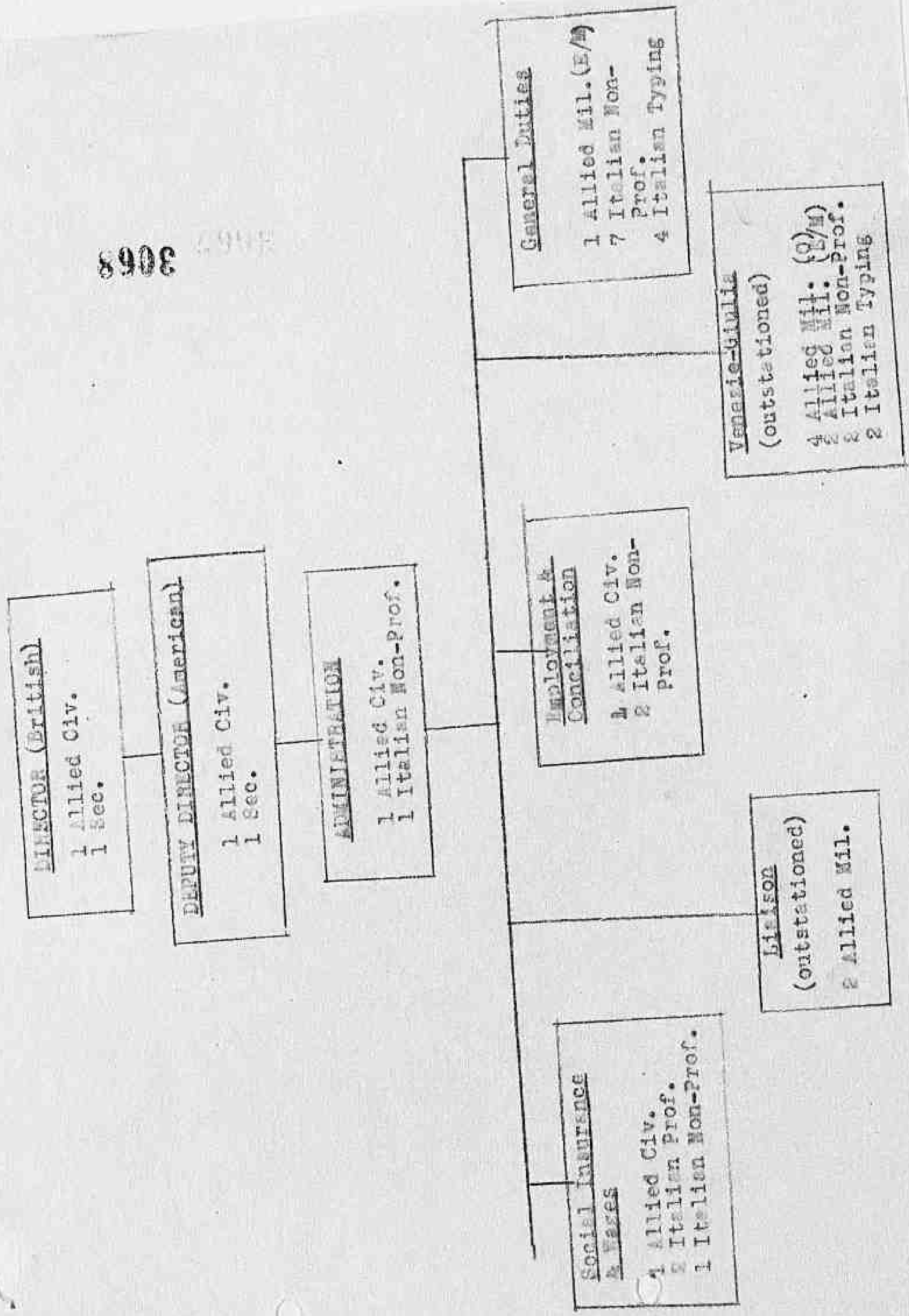
