SUBJECT: Travel Orders

TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1. With reference to the attached driver's trip ticket and travel orders dated 21 November, it is confirmed that driver Priori was Major Scicluna's driver during the whole of the thirty-eight (38) days. The travel orders originally cut provided for driver Cocilovo but he resigned his employment with the Supergarage just before the trip was due to commence. It was understood that Major Scicluna had made full arrangements with your Sub-Commission and Supergarage for a substitute driver, and that driver Priori was fully covered by orders. It now appears that Major Scicluna and/or this Sub-Commission omitted to take action to regularize the substitution of drivers, and we regret any inconvenience caused.

2. In view of this confirmation no doubt there will be no further obstacle to payment of driver Priori's subsistence for the full duration of the trip.

SUBJECT: Distribution of Civilian Supplies
Information to Dr. Velk

TO : All S/Cs, Economic Section
Requisition Branch
Info. to W.S.A., FETSEC

1. It is the desire of the Acting Vice President that Dr. Velk, UNRRA, be assisted by all of the addressees of the Economic Section in an analysis of the distribution of imported civilian supplies to Italy.

2. After the disestablishment of A.C., UNRRA will be confronted with the task of furnishing to Italy the bulk of imported civilian supplies and of seeing to it that the distribution of such supplies is effectively carried out. Although distribution as such will be the responsibility of the Italian Government, it will be UNRRA's responsibility to see to it that the distribution of the supplies which it furnishes takes place as effectively as possible, and without any discrimination. To be able to do this, UNRRA must know for each major imported commodity or group of commodities:-

- a. How and by what agency of the Italian Government are requirements, programs, and general plans for distribution to consumers prepaid?
- b. When shipments arrive, how and where are they turned over by A.C. to the Italian Government, and to what agency of that Government?
- c. Through what channels does the receiving Italian agency distribute the commodity on a regional, provincial and local level?
- d. What are the main outlines of the rationing procedure through which the ultimate consumer is obtaining his share of the imported commodity? Who devises and administers the rationing system?
- e. What are the defects and pitfalls of the distribution process, i.e.:-

- (1) What defects, if any, are there in the present method of planning for the distribution of the commodity by the responsible Government agency? Do the general criteria of distribution adopted seem equitable and efficient?
- (2) What difficulties are encountered in the process of getting the commodity from shipside to consumer? In other words, what difficulties should be anticipated in:-

Unloading
 Warehousing at the Port
 Inland transport
 Storage on a provincial level
 Distribution to local merchants or consumers

What can be done to correct such difficulties?

- (3) What weaknesses are there in the present rationing system for the commodity?
- (4) Is there a black market in the commodity, and if so - How does the commodity get into the black market? - What should be done to prevent its getting and staying there? - What are the present official and black market prices of the commodity in question?
- f. What other phases of the distribution process are significant, and what comments thereon seem pertinent?

3. It is requested that each sub-commission and the Requisition Branch of the Economic Section submit a report which will answer the questions and furnish the information outlined in para 2 above in so far as it pertains to those commodities and activities with which the respective sub-commissions and Requisition Branch are concerned.

4. UNRRA has expressed its appreciation and gratitude to this Headquarters for the material assistance which has recently been rendered by the sub-commissions and branches

a. Salvage, Scrap and Other War Materials

1. Basis for Procedure

A Chief of Staff memo dated 9 January 1945, designates War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission as the AC agency to receive from Military Services reports on availability of salvage, scrap and other war material, to collate such reports and distribute them to the appropriate Sub-Commissions of AC. The AC Priorities Board has, in Procedural Bulletin No. 1, divided all materials into four categories and has designated an Allocating Sub-Commission for each category. It is the purpose of this procedure to coordinate the activities of the Allocating Sub-Commissions and War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission.

2. Availability Statements to AC Sub-Commissions and Sections

a. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission will prepare lists of available salvage, scrap and other war materials according to the established categories and transmit to each Allocating Sub-Commission the list appropriate to that Sub-Commission's allocating function. Such lists will include relevant information as to location of materials; time limit for claiming; condition and specifications of materials; procedure for inspection, claiming and taking delivery.

b. Each Section will file with the War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission a list of its Sub-Commissions or Divisions requiring copies of availability lists and the number required by each. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission will distribute the required copies at the same time originals are transmitted to Allocating Sub-Commissions.

3. Availability Statements to Italian Government

Each Sub-Commission or Section receiving an availability list will determine if it is necessary or advisable to notify their opposite organization in the Italian Government and will transmit any notifications deemed necessary or advisable.

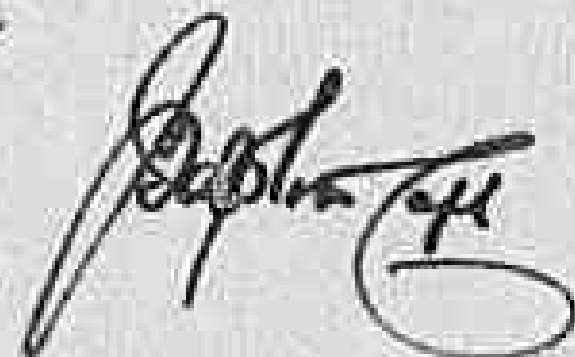

4. In the event of failure to reach agreement the matter will be referred to the Chief of Staff.
