1. Receipt is acknowledged of your two letters of 10 January 1946, reference number 468/46, regarding facilities for the journey by air of Signori Linberg and Kuncz to Milan and Signore Bartolo to Turin.

2. Action has been taken to prepare travel orders and to endeavor to obtain reservations on the aircraft travelling on the dates you desire.

3. You may be aware that Labor Sub-Commission of Allied Commission will very shortly cease to function and that its duties will be transferred to the British and American Commissions. With the closure of Labor Sub-Commission it will no longer be possible for the previous procedure in connection with travel arrangements to be continued, and the Embassies will have no authority for preparing travel orders or assigning priority as has hitherto been the practice. In order, therefore, that officials of the Confederation may be spared inconvenience it is suggested that the possibility of making alternative arrangements for travel should be considered. In the absence of a Labor Sub-Commission it will no longer be possible for us to sponsor applications for travel of your officers by air, and the alternatives will, therefore, be for you to arrange independent air travel or to arrange for your officials to make use of railway transport. As you know the railway facilities for travel to the North of Italy and elsewhere have recently been considerably extended and improved. In any case air transport during the winter months is so unpredictable that one is well advised to arrange, wherever possible, to travel by rail.

4. It is hoped that the efforts of this Sub-Commission in the past to facilitate the travel of officers of the Confederation on official business have assisted the successful development and prosecution of the Confederation's work. It would be appreciated, however, that with the handing over of Northern Italy to the full control of the Italian Government, and the closure of Labor Sub-Commission as such, reliance can no longer be placed on the

SUBJECT: Use of Taxi Cabs by Italian Civilian Employees.

TO : Commandant
HQ Allied Commission

1. I was informed yesterday of a new rule which prohibits the use of taxi cabs by Italian civilian employees on official business unless accompanied by military personnel.
2. Your attention is invited to the fact that this rule will result in considerable inconvenience to this Sub-Commission.
3. We have at least two Italian civilian employees who perform responsible work for us and who have occasion to make trips to the Ministry and to other offices on business of this Sub-Commission. It would be a considerable waste of time for these people to have to be accompanied by personnel of officer status. We have only one enlisted man who is in charge of the clerk's office and who is ordinarily very busy.
4. In addition, occasion frequently arises for the use of Italian civilians to make trips in taxi cabs on errands of minor importance. These occasions arise by reason of the fact that we have only one enlisted man who is not available for this purpose. Under such circumstances it is, of course, impossible for him to accompany the Italian civilian.
5. It is hoped that consideration will be given to the possibility of making some modification in this rule.

1. Supplementing travel orders for Captain Alfred L. Dorf, O-358375, Field Control and Labor Liaison Officer of this Sub-Commission, this is to state that it is imperative that a C&R or other equally suitable vehicle be placed at the disposal of this officer for a trip North.
2. The points generally covered in Northern Italy are off the beaten path and away from air and courier stations.
3. Time is an essential element in reaching these points and cities and air and courier service is far from meeting the requirements of the situation.
4. Italian Labor Officials are transported on competent orders between these points and cities and it is practically inconceivable that the use of air and courier service would accomodate the transportation.
5. Several efforts have been made at the various Regions, Liguria, Lombardia, and Venezia for transport up to and including two days ago while the Headquarters AC vehicle was used and requiring repair but none was available and there was no expectation of any transport being available in discussing the matter with the transportation officers.
6. Therefore, request that you make available the above transportation to the Labor Sub-Commission.
