1. The attached statement was obtained in the course of my visit to Genoa, and may be of interest to you. The points of interest are that the Camera del Lavoro promised to collaborate wholeheartedly with the Allied authorities, particularly as regards Ufficio del Lavoro (Item 13), and Joint Advisory Committees (Item 14).

2. I gathered the impression that De Franceschi, the Socialist, was the dominating spirit but that the views of the three joint secretaries were much milder than of their corresponding comrades in Milano.
