The Commune of Ancona has expressed its appreciation of the work done by the Allies on behalf of this Province by conferring the freedom of the City on: Brig. G. St. C. O. Fullbrook-Leggatt, Commander 61 Area; Lt. Gen. W. Anders, G.O.C. 2 Pol. Corps; and Lt. Col. P. Shipman Andrews, Comdt. 'H' Group DP & RSC.

The Water, Tramways and Gas Depts. of the Commune have been successfully re-activated.

The School situation has remarkably improved as a large number of class-rooms are now fit for scholastic purposes during winter.

Out of 1300 applications for State subsidies for Repairs to damaged property, which have been submitted to the Communal Committee, 857 have been dealt with and forwarded for approval to the Genio Civile.

The Government contribution for the balancing of the Communal Budget amounts to 2,000,000 Lire only; consequently a loan of 15,000,000 Lire must be resorted to, which will weigh heavily on the budgets of the next years.

Prices have been rather steady, except for an increase regarding Fish consequent to the price control on this commodity being abolished for the time being.

The number of Unemployed in the Province is given as 13,080.

Health conditions fairly good. 17 cases of Infectious diseases have been reported, as against 31 in the previous month.

MONTHLY REPORTCOMMUNE OF ANCONA

December 1945.

POLITICAL SITUATION AND PUBLIC FEELING.

1. There has been no new development in the political situation.
2. The Commune of Ancona has expressed its appreciation of the work done by the Allies of behalf of this Province by conferring the freedom of the City on Brig. C. St. C. O. Pullbrook-Leggatt, C.B.E., D.S.O., M.C., Commander 61 Area; Lt. Gen. Wladislaw Anders, C.B., D.S.O., C. Pol. Corps; and Lt. Col. Paul Shipman Andrews, A.N.S., Comdt. H. Group DF & HSC.
3. A large distribution of gift parcels on Christmas by Allied Authorities to the poorer classes of the population has been gratefully welcomed by the public.

COMMUNAL ADMINISTRATION.

4. The Communal Departments for Water, Tramways and Gas have been successfully re-activated.
5. The Aqueduct which used to supply water on a reduced scale is now utilised to its full capacity.
6. The "Tramways" Dept. is really running a truck service within the City and to the localities under this Commune for passengers transport.
7. Finally, Gas in small supply, just enough for domestic cooking purposes, is now available.
8. A "Populated Mass, controlled and assisted by the Commune, has been established.
9. The Electoral Lists, which have now been approved by the Polling Commission, are ready and comprise 55,000 voters, divided into 59 Sections.

PUBLIC WORKSRoads and Sewerage.

10. In spite of transport shortage the maintenance of territorial roads has been carried on satisfactorily by supplying them with a fair amount of rubble. This work is not completed, however, and further transport facilities are required for the carriage of rubble, if the improvements achieved so far shall be maintained.
11. The Commune is still looking forward to the approval by Genio Civile of the plans for road repairs, for which the sum of 14,750,000 lire, mentioned in my previous report, should be approved.

3. A large distribution of gift parcels on Christmas by Allied Authorities to the poorer classes of the population has been gratefully welcomed by the public.

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#### PUBLIC WORKS

##### Roads and Sewerage.

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11. The Commune is still looking forward to the approval by Genio Civile of the plans for road repairs, for which the sum of 14,750,000 lire, mentioned in my previous report, should be appropriated.

#### SCHOOLS.

12. The School situation has remarkably improved during last month: a fair amount of glass for window panes could be obtained. This and the heating laid on (although with short supply of fuel) have put quite a number of class-rooms in a fit condition for scholastic purposes during the winter months.

13. Work of repair and adaptation has been carried on, especially in buildings newly handed over for the use of schools.

#### HOUSING ACCOMMODATION.

14. The number of applications for State subsidies to assist repairs, which have been received by the relevant Communal Committee, has risen to 1300, of which 857 have been examined and forwarded for approval to the Genio Civile.

15. The repair work of "Popular" houses started by the "Istituto Autonomo per le Case Popolari" is being actively pushed on in the Montirozzo and Posatora quarters, while the building containing 40 flats in Via Toti is being completed by the Firm Lenardi.

16. The building of new "Popular" houses undertaken by C.A.M.A. (Cooperative Anconitane Muratori ed Affini) is being carried on under supervision of the Commune, which is waiting for authority from Genio Civile to start the building of another lot of houses.

17. The housing problem remains difficult but 61 Area has greatly assisted the Italian authorities in the matter by speedily de-requisitioning as many properties as possible. Under the administration of the present Housing Commissioner, who is assisted by a Housing Committee, disturbances arising as a result of people occupying de-requisitioned or empty housing accommodation without permission from the appropriate Italian authorities have been avoided.

#### FINANCIAL SITUATION OF THE COMMUNE.

18. While the yield of Communal taxes has been exceptionally good the Commune is still in difficulty because the Government contributed only 2,000,000 lire for the balancing of the Communal Budget instead of the 25,000,000 lire hoped for. Thus the Commune will have to negotiate a loan of 15,000,000 lire which will weigh heavily on the budgets of the next years. The Commune must meet fresh expenses on account of the recent increase of the cost of living bonus to its employees.

#### FOOD SUPPLY.

20. The following prices have been realized for FRUIT on this market during last month: Oranges from 20 to 45, Lemons from 20 to 30 lire per kilo.

21. 2000 lbs of Apples are brought to this market, which

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#### FOOD SUPPLY.

20. The following prices have been realized for PMWT on this market during last month: Oranges from 20 to 45, Lemons from 20 to 30 lire per kilo.

21. 2000 Qls of APPLES were brought to this market; prices are slightly increasing.

22. The supply of POTATOES (1500 Qls) was more plentiful than last month but prices are still on a high level (45 lire per kilo).

23. GARDEN PRODUCE is very abundant and prices are decreasing.  
24. There was a weekly distribution of MEAT on food cards (100-200 grammes per person).

FISHERIES.

25. It was pointed out in previous Monthly Report of this H.Q. that the supply of fish was scanty, mostly because the fishermen brought that commodity to other markets outside this Province where fish sold at 100 lire higher than here.

26. In order to meet this situation a new experiment was tried this month by abolishing price control on fish. As a result market 602 Qls of fish, worth 7,705,000 Lire, were brought to the local market as against 143 Qls in the previous month. The prices rose of course (wholesale prices from a previous average of 140, 54, and 26 Lire, according to quality, but it is anticipated that the plentiful influx of this commodity will result in its becoming cheaper.

AGRICULTURE AND CATTLE.

27. Weather conditions have favoured all kinds of agricultural output.

28. GRAIN grows vigorously but shortage of chemical manures is felt.

29. GRASS PLOTS are in excellent shape and cattle rising will benefit from the plenty of fodder available.

30. The sanitary conditions of cattle are generally good.

HYGIENE AND SANITATION.

31. Conditions continue being fairly good notwithstanding adverse housing conditions, lack of soap, and shortage of fats and sugar which particularly affects children and sick persons.

32. The following cases of infectious diseases have been reported:

If, and when, these factories are re-activated a number of workers will find employment there.

1. ORGANIZATION.

The provincial and Regional offices have been completely organized. there has been some re-adjustment of communal offices.

2. LABOUR DISTURBANCES.

There has been no serious labour disturbance. There has been many threats to strike, walk-out, etc. in the Province of Ancona and Pesaro. The greatest pressure has been brought by state and public employees, whose income has been low indeed. At present authorization has been given by the Regional Finance Officer to give state and parastatal employees a "year-end" bonus of approximately 1,500 lire, payable before 1 April. We also have authorization for the payment of 1,500 lire on account of the pending law which increases state and parastatal employees salaries 50% and their family allowances 100%. This will without doubt bring to rest disturbances by these employees.

3. POLITICAL DISTURBANCES.

The only political disturbance in the Region was at Ascoli. This was not due to labour difficulties but to the fact that some civilians had been put in prison, and a mob demand their release.

4. WAGES AND SALARIES.

There is still intensification over the rates of wages. This is largely due to high wages paid by the Army, which pushes the price of consumers goods beyond the ability of people who are not in the higher income brackets to buy. (see Par.2)

5. GENERAL.

In the past month there has been a sudden awakening of the Camera del Lavoro in the Provinces of Pesaro, Ancona and Macerata. In Pesaro town the Camera del Lavoro has issued a wage rate for certain classes of workers and is insisting that these new rates be applied by employees. In Ancona the Camera del Lavoro has organized the state and parastatal employees. The cost of living has in the last 30 days has declined a little, a very little. The high cost can still be credited to the high prices charged on the free or black markets, and the short supplies in the controlled markets. While the armed forces are still the chief source of employment there are

# 1. ORGANIZATION.

The Labour Offices for Abruzzi-Marche Region have been completely organized, and their staffs have been completed.

# 2. LABOUR DISTURBANCES.

There has been no labour disturbance of serious consequence during the past month. There is confusion, especially in Ancona and Pesaro. This is largely due to various prefectural decrees, and differences in 8th Army pay, also the Prov. Commissioner advanced the pay of wages beyond the legal wage, and now the contractor wants a part of the wages back.

# 3. POLITICAL DISTURBANCES.

The political situation remains quiet. There have been a few efforts made to organize labour unions with a political background. These were of little importance and came to nothing.

# 4. WAGES AND SALARIES.

There is further intensification over the rates of wages and salaries. This is especially true in Ancona and Pesaro. This disturbance is unfortunately added to by the different economic notions or ideas held by different Regional and Provincial Commissioners, and different Regional Labour Officers. For example in Ancona and Ravenna Provinces the 8th Army gave authority for the immediate operation of the following Decrees.

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## 2. LABOUR DISTURBANCES.

I am also informed that Perugia has put into effect most of these decrees. Whereas here I have put into effect only D.L. No. 228. I believe that there are sound economic reasoning back of my idea, but in any event the policy should be uniform in my opinion (see below). There has been for sometime much discontent among state employees. Many letters have been passed between the Regional Commissioner, Legal, Finance and the Labour Sub-Commission. As a result, the Labour Office was asked to make a cost of living study, and recommend measures where salaries should be increased, as well as the amount of increase. Following is the report.

1. ORGANIZATION.

The organization of the Provincial Labour offices has been completed. Ancona and Pesaro have been undergoing a slight reorganization, and their staffs are now about completed. There has also been a general inspection of safety and general working conditions in the industries that are now operating; according to American standards they are pretty bad, but according to the Italian standards they are "pretty good".

2. LABOUR DISTURBANCES.

There has been no labour disturbance in the Region during the past month. However, the labour situation took a slight change for the worse, in the southern provinces, as the expected troops coming for winter quarters did not develop. There are many workers unemployed, and hunger, cold and doubt is the order of their minds.

3. POLITICAL DISTURBANCES.

We have had no political disturbances in the Region. In fact the political factors have been unusually quiet.

4. WAGES AND SALARIES.

At present the discontent over the rates of wages and salaries has been intensified. Especially is this true in Ancona. Employees who work for a salary are indeed hard hit. They have had no increase whereas day laborers, and persons working for Allied Forces have. Which of course means their purchasing power has decreased. Something should be done for them.

5. GENERAL.

The labour situation in the Region has turned a little toward the dark. There is an intensification of the differences between salaries and wages in Ancona. There have been no political disturbances, and no labour difficulties.

SUBJECT: Abruzzi-Marche Region December Report.

TO : Labor Sub-Commission.

1. The following information is passed to you for any action you deem fit:

"5. Labour.

All the Labour Offices in this Region have now been organised. During the past month there have been no political or labour disturbances. Generally speaking, there have been increased demands for labour, though a good deal of unemployment still exists.

✓ The only disturbance has been caused by the Camera del Lavoro. This organisation apparently feels itself uncontrolled and boundless in its activities. It issues orders for the payment of indemnity of "Carovita" and also fixes wage rates and wage adjustments. In Ancona it is operating a Collocamento office. In Asimo they set a rate of 140 Lire a day for women employed in the silk works there. In brief, the Camera del Lavoro is a "lawless outfit".

Present wage scales are giving rise to discontent, particularly in Ancona and Macerata Provinces."

1. Attached is a report of unions that have been organised in Ancona Province, to date, and have become federated units of the Camera del Lavoro, Ancona Province.

Unions that are confederated with the Camera del Lavoro must require their members to hold membership in the Camera and pay a fee of 15 lire. Of the monthly union dues collected from members (averaging 5 lire a month), a maximum of 2 lire must be paid to the Camera which acts as secretary for all confederated unions.

2. The Camera del Lavoro, Ancona, claim to be in compliance with General Order No 28; specifically Art. II, "Right of Organisation"; that they have the right to assist groups of workers in organisation of unions, and in return the workers have chosen to confederate themselves with the Camera.

By this confederation the Camera is authorised to act for the unions in all matters of collective bargaining with respect to matters pertaining to or connected with their employment, including such matters as concern hours, wages, working conditions, grievances, disputes and mutual social and economic assistance. (A copy of a letter to a unit of the R.N. from the Camera on this subject is attached.)

3. On this basis the Camera del Lavoro, Ancona, believe they have the right to operate collocamenti offices, set rates for wages and salaries, (without reference to AC or AMG for approval) act as conciliators, mediators or arbitrators in labour disputes, act as consultants for union members with their employers, and handle social assistance.

4. Many of the functions claimed by the Camera are set out as functions of the Provincial Labour Office in Gen. Order No 28, and a statement outlining the relations between the Labour Office and the Camera, when the latter controls through a federation agreement a member of unions, which places the welfare of many
