The proposal for the Civilian Employment Committee is quite separate from the matter referred to by Mr. Braine and Mr. Cleveland in the memoranda on the endorsements of the attached folder.

(A) These memoranda refer to the practice of Labor Sub-Commission in reviewing appointments of Italian and other Civilians to positions of higher classifications in A.C. I concur in the thought that the Labor Sub-Commission is not the appropriate section to clear questions of this character.

The proposal for the establishment of a Civilian Employment Committee is designed to place upon the G-1 American, the full housekeeping burden of day to day questions. The Committee will consider only questions of policy or unusual questions resulting from the ambiguity in AFHQ Directives.

1. The minutes of the previous meeting held on 7 March 1945, were read and confirmed.

2. Mr. Sachs (Labour Sub-Commission) submitted for the consideration of the Committee the question of Wage Rates to be paid to those A.C. employees in North West Italy, who are already engaged by their respective Regions, and will move forward with the Regional Staffs, when the Areas are liberated. Mr. Sachs informed the Committee that the new economic policy for N.W. Italy aimed at keeping down wages and prices to the levels which will be found there upon liberation, and as part of this policy it has already been agreed by the Labour and Wages Control Committee, Allied Forces Local Resources Board that the wage scale for Civilian employees of the Allied Forces shall be applied in N.W. Italy without the cost-of-living bonuses.

But those Civilians who have already been taken up North by the embryonic Regions are on the full scale of wages and the Committee therefore considered the alternatives:-

- a) are these employees to suffer a reduction in wages, with all its concomitance of dissatisfaction and possible resignation or,
- b) should a means be found of continuing the present scale of wages (including cost-of-living bonus) in these special cases only?

The recommendation of the Committee was that alternative (b) should be resorted to, and that in order not to contravene the ruling of higher authority, these Civilians should be considered as H.Q. Allied Commission employees, attached to whichever Region was employing them. It was further agreed that the Chairman of the Committee would submit to the Executive Commissioner a draft

Committee that the new economic policy for H.W. Italy aimed at keeping down wages and prices to the levels which will be found there upon liberation, and as part of this policy it has already been agreed by the Labour and Wages Control Committee, Allied Forces Local Resources Board that the wage scale for Civilian employees of the Allied Forces shall be applied in H.W. Italy without the cost-of-living bonuses.

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- b) should a means be found of continuing the present scale of wages (including cost-of-living bonus) in these special cases only?

The recommendation of the Committee was that alternative (b) should be resorted to, and that in order not to contravene the ruling of higher authority, these Civilians should be considered as H.W. Allied Commission employees, attached to whichever Region was employing them. It was further agreed that the Chairman of the Committee would submit to the Executive Commissioner a draft letter of instruction to Regional Commissioners of the Regions involved, giving effect to this recommendation.

SUBJECT: Allied Commission Employment going into North.
TO : Economic Section,
attention Mr. McIntosh.

1. Pursuant to your suggestion, a meeting of the Civilian Employment Committee (C.E.C.) was held on 16.30 12 April 1945, to consider the problem of C.E.C. employees going into the North from Southern areas.
2. Consistent with the economic policy for the North, persons employed by the Allied Forces, including C.E.C. will not be paid the cost-of-living basis (not 75 lire per day) under the Allied Forces cost basis. The question was raised of the meeting of the Joint Inflation Board held on 12.15 hours 12 April as to whether employees who go up with the Regime will have to take a cut in salary.
3. The Civilian Employment Committee was of the opinion that these people could not be expected to go into the North at a lower salary. The Committee recommended therefore that they be carried on the payroll of the A.C. attached to Northern Regions. A recommendation to this effect will be submitted to the Executive Council on 19.4.45.

Mr. Buchan, for Labour Sub-Commission, submitted a letter from the Regional Commissioner, Burma Region, requesting the granting of a special wage rate of £15 15,000 per month to an employee considered to be a key man in the rehabilitation of the oil industry. This application was rejected, as this special rate is far outside the permitted maximum for employees of the Allied Forces, and it was considered inadvisable to put forward individual cases to the Labour and Wages Control Committee.

2. Mr. Buchan, for Labour Sub-Commission, placed before the Committee a letter from Southern Region, requesting permission to pay to employees on dismissal, one half month's wages, in lieu of notice, where they have been continuously employed for six months or more. In view of the fact that a similar suggestion has been before the Allied Forces Local Resources Board, at this time of the drawing up of AFHQ Adm. Memo. 1. On Monday, 15 January 1945, at 1030 hours, a meeting was held in the offices of the Labor Sub-Commission. This meeting was convened at the request of Lt. Colonel R. T. Uhler of Establishments Branch. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss and arrive at appropriate procedures for the guidance of officers charged with the responsibility of employing civilian personnel of A.C., both in the regions and at this Headquarters, and to obtain necessary clarification of outstanding A.F.H.Q. directives.

The following were present:

Lt. Colonel R. T. Uhler, Establishments Branch
Major A. H. Reede, Finance Sub-Commission
Captain G. H. Tipping, Finance Sub-Commission
Mr. David C. Sachs, Labor Sub-Commission

2. The following points were agreed upon by the conferees:

a. It shall be the duty of the Establishments Branch (G-1 American) to become familiar with and apply outstanding A.F.H.Q. directives with regard to wages, hours and working conditions of locally recruited civilian employees of A.C., both at this Headquarters and in the field. The appropriate channel for inquiries arising in this field on this subject shall be from the Regional Commissioners to the Establishments Branch (G-1 American), Headquarters, A.C. Should the Establishments Branch require guidance, policy, or clarification on other points, the matter will be presented to the committee referred to in the next paragraph.

b. There will be established in this Headquarters a committee which will be known as the Civilian Employment Committee. This Committee will consist of the Commanding Officer of the Establishments Branch, the Director of the Finance Sub-Commission and the Director of the Labor Sub-Commission, or their designees. The Director of the Labor

- 2 -

Sub-Commission, or his designee, will act as Chairman. It shall be the function of this Committee to determine the interpretation and policy regarding the hire, wages and working conditions of locally recruited civilian employees of A.C., within the framework of outstanding A.F.H.Q. directives. Questions may be presented to the Committee by the Establishments Branch or by the Finance Sub-Commission. Should any course of action be recommended which is not fully authorized by A.F.H.Q., or should any modification of directives be recommended, it shall be the function of the Labor Sub-Commission via its membership on the Labor and Wages Control Committee (Local Resources (Italian) Board) to institute the necessary requests.

c. The Establishments Branch will distribute to the Regions all A.F.H.Q. directives and necessary bulletins, clarifying same for the guidance of A.C. officers in the field charged with the responsibility of hiring civilian employees. The Labor Sub-Commission will see that the Establishments Branch is furnished with such directives when promulgated. The Labor Sub-Commission will continue to make distribution of such directives to the Labor Officers in the field through the Regional Commissioners.

3. It is recommended that the above be ratified and appropriate distribution made.
