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Militarized Civilians

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Civilians employed by the Italian Army are known as militarized civilians, and are divided into three main categories.

A. State employees who will be pensioned at the age of 65, and who cannot be discharged, are divided into three groups.

1. College graduates with directive capabilities. They are accorded a military status from Lieutenant to General.
2. Specialists with college education, but not graduates. They are accorded a military status from 2nd Lieutenant to Colonel.
3. Office employees with grammar school education. They have a military status from Warrant Officer to Capt.

B. Temporary State employees who are not entitled to a pension, and who work on a yearly contract basis are divided into three groups.

1. College graduates. Military status of Second Lieutenant.
2. College education - not graduates. Military status of Second Lieutenant.
3. Grammar school graduates. Military status of Warrant Officer.

C. Shop workmen are in this category, and are divided into two classes viz. - State Employees and Temporary employees.

1. State employees are accorded a military status of Warrant Officer and are shop ⁵⁰³ workmen.
2. Temporary employees are graded in the following manner:
 - a. Specialists - Sergeant Major
 - b. Qualified workers - Sergeant
 - c. Unskilled labor - Corp. Major
 - d. Laborers - Corp.

II Militarized civilians receive the following food rations for which a sum of seven (?) lire is with-held from their wages.

1. The following is a result of an investigation into the availability of Skilled Labour in the Area of BAIA, BACOLI, MONTE DI PROCIDA and FUSARO. The district has been surveyed very carefully and both from previous experience and present investigation it can be safely stated that over 90% of the population are engaged either on agriculture - predominately wine production - fishing and Allied Trades. There is no large town in that District, the nearest town being POZZUOLI with a large industry - British American and French.
2. On visiting the SILURIFICIO ITALIANA at BAIA this factory was found to be partially working under the supervision of the Royal Navy, mostly producing torpedoes. Nearly all their skilled labour comes from NAPIES and always has come from there. Most of the skilled men discharged from that factory are now employed with the Allied Forces, proof of which is that hundreds have come through this Office. Most of the unskilled labour previously employed by the SILURIFICIO are now employed by various installations at POZZUOLI such as STERNIT, ILVA and others. The number of people actually employed at BAIA now is approximately 400.
3. The a/m factory has an annex in TUCARO. This factory has been built right out in the country, mostly underground, to be safe from bombing. There is not even a village in the near vicinity and all their labour has to be imported, most of them from NAPIES. They are doing maintenance work and cleaning up work only and employ 82 laborers.
4. The Major of BACOLI, BAIA, CAPPALLA and MISERNO - district, states that in that area, there have never been any appreciable numbers of skilled men and that there are none to be found who are unemployed. He further stated that he would not like to guarantee to be able to find more than a total of 30 unskilled labourers in the whole of his district.
5. At MONTE DI PROCIDA an A.M.G. Labour Office is functioning. ^{The} Italian Official stated that 16 skilled tradesmen are available in this office. Most of their labour which again is mostly unskilled is working at NAPIES Docks, POZZUOLI Docks, 16 Base W/Shops R.E.M.E., POZZUOLI, 557 A.O.D. W/T Machine Section POZZUOLI and at the ILVA Installation at BACOLI. This statement was confirmed by the Mayor of MONTE DI PROCIDA who was also interviewed.
6. The Civil Affairs Officer of the District whose Office is situated in POZZUOLI could not be contacted as he also administers another district and happened to be away for several days. His secretary did not think that there was any appreciable number of skilled tradesmen to be found in the a/m district.
7. Summing up it can be safely said that there are certainly no great number of unemployed skilled tradesmen in the district.

Allied Trades. There is no large town in that District, the nearest town being POZZUOLI with a large industry - British American and French.

2. On visiting the SIDERIFICIO ITALIANA at BAIA this factory was found to be partially working under the supervision of the Royal Navy, mostly producing torpedoes. 4. The Major of BACOLI, BAIA, CAPPALLA and MISERNC - district, states that in that area, there have never been any appreciable numbers of skilled men and that there are none to be found who are unemployed. He further stated that he would not like to guarantee to be able to find more than a total of 30 unskilled labourers in the whole of his district.
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7. Summing up it can be safely said that there are certainly no great number of unemployed skilled tradesmen in the district and that there have never been any in the past, the two big factories having drawn most of their skilled labour from NAPLES.

MEMORANDUM TO: The Theater Commander.

SUBJECT : Supply of Italian Military and Civilian Personnel and Labor Regulations Pertaining to Civilian Labor.

I. The following is a resume of general policies and directives covering the supply of Italians, and authorized exceptions:

1. Military Forces.

a. Policy.

(1) A General Policy for Italian Troops, other than POW, is stated by the CC/S in FAN 338 (Tab A).

(a) Only effective troops will be supplied within limitations recommended by the Theater Commander, and as approved by CC/S. Supply is limited to subsistence, clothing, medical supplies and fuel.

(b) Supplies are to be under control of an agency charged with authority and responsibility for handling the problem of requirements, issues and record keeping.

(c) Procurement Responsibility is:

Subsistence	- - - - -	U.S.
Clothing	- - - - -	Joint U.K. - U.S.
Medical Supply	- - - - -	U.K.
Fuel	- - - - -	U.K.

(2) Supply Responsibility for Italian Military is made a function of AAI with the Army Sub-Commission (AMIA) of ACC, its agency. Letter, AFHQ, 21 April "Organization for Supply of Effective Italian Troops" (Tab B).

(3) Supply Organization for Italian Military is made a function of the Italian Military under supervision of the Allied Armies. AFHQ Letter, 9 January, "Supply Organization - Italian Military" (Tab C).

(4) Consolidation of AFHQ Directives is covered in AAI Administrative Instructions No. 24 of 20 May. (Tab D).

b. Class I Supply.

(1) Ration Scales, Basic and Combat, as presently in effect, are:

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(4) Consolidation of AFHQ Directives is covered in AAI Administrative Instructions No. 24 of 20 May. (Tab D).

b. Class I Supply.

(1) Ration Scales, Basic and Combat, as presently in effect, are:

Detail is shown in (Appendix "A" to Tab C).

(a) Imported rations are carried on a 20-day maintenance factor, including working margin, under Italian control and are presently based on a strength of 500,000.

(2) Classification of Italian Military to be Issued Rations, Basic and Combat.

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 2 of 10 January, subject, "Subsistence for Italian Military" (Tab E).

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- (a) Combat Ration is for troops forward of Army Rear Boundaries, Air Forces in combat and Navy in combat.
- (b) Basic Ration is for Army, Air Force and Navy personnel NOT performing combat functions and who are in rear of Army Rear Boundaries.
- (c) Italian Military Rations will NOT be issued to: POW, Civilians, Hospital patients in Allied Hospitals, Liaison Groups or Missions.
- (d) Cigarette and Tobacco Ration is furnished by the Italian Military and NO SALE of P.X. or M.I.I. supplies is authorized.

(3) Exception - Corsica.

Since the Italian Military Ration is not shipped to Corsica, a special ration for Italian Troops employed in airport construction has been approved by HQ MTOUSA.* This ration is furnished from U.S. Army stocks and local purchase. Its component is 26 1/2 ozs. plus 1/2 litre of wine. For troops performing arduous labor, 1/3 "C" Ration is added. Details are in SOS MTOUSA Cable L-794 of 13 February (Tab E).

* Cable 52060 of 15 February.

(4) Single Ration for all Italian Military.

Due to difficulty of administering two scales of rations for separate classifications of Military Personnel, request was made to CC/S for a single ration for all Italian Forces. The ration requested totalled 33 1/2 ozs. of imported commodities. Details are in MAF 649. (Tab G). The single ration has been approved by CC/S but with items and amounts reduced to 25 ozs. of imported commodities. Details are in FAW 355. (Tab H). A.I. was advised in AFHQ letter of 14 May, subject: "Single Ration Scale for Italian Military." (Tab I). First issues for consumption on or about August 1, 1944 are anticipated.

g. Class II Supply.

- (1) Policy - Clothing is a joint U.S. - U.K. responsibility. Used clothing, dyed green, from theater stocks and imports is the source of supply. FAW 338 (Tab A).
- (2) Organization and Supply is the responsibility of A.I. (M.I.I.) and the Italian Military as for rations, and is covered in AFHQ letters referred to (Tab B) and (Tab C).
- (3) Ration Scales to Meet Minimum Essential Requirements include: Irackinay, Wool Batticross, Underwear, Socks, Boots, Sweater and Comforter, Blankets, Towel and Mess Gear. As authorized in A.G.W.R. Cable 1591 of 7 March, detailed list is shown in AFHQ letter of 14 March, subject: "Scale of Supply for

a special ration for Italian Troops employed in airport construction has been approved by HQ MATOUSA.* This ration is furnished from U.S. Army stocks and local purchase. Its component is 26 1/2 ozs. plus 1/2 litre of wine. For troops performing arduous labor, 1/3 "G" ration is added. Details are in SOS MATOUSA Cable L-794 of 13 February (Tab F).

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c. Class II Supply.

- (1) Policy - Clothing is a joint U.S. - U.K. responsibility. Used clothing, dyed green, from theater stocks and imports is the source of supply. RAF 338 (Tab A).
- (2) Organization and Supply is the responsibility of AII (MIIA) and the Italian Military as for rations, and is covered in AFHQ letters referred to (Tab B) and (Tab C).
- (3) Ration Scales to Meet Minimum Essential Requirements include: Mackinaw, Wool Battledress, Underwear, Socks, Boots, Gumboots and Comforter, Blankets, Towel and Mess Gear. As authorized in AGR Cable 1591 of 7 March, detailed list is shown in AFHQ letter of 14 March, subject: "Scale of Supply for Italian Army". (Tab J).
- (4) Initial Imports amounting to some 250,000 issues were brought in, with British receipts in December 1943 and U.S. receipts in March 1944. Shipments are itemized in Appendix "B" of (Tab C).
- (5) Priority of Procurement is:
 - (a) Residue of Italian Military Stocks.
 - (b) Shipments from U.S. and U.K. to complete essential initial issues and thereafter,
 - (c) Maintenance from U.S. and British Army salvage (dyed green).

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SECRET - Repair facilities for used clothing and shoes have been established by British Ordnance Service in Naples and Bari. Used clothing and shoes from A.I. are repaired and clothing dyed green, for release to Italian Military Forces. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 5 of 27 January is the directive for this source of supply. (Tab K).

(7) Exceptions.

(a) Navy personnel are excluded from clothing rations except in an emergency. This is a Royal Navy responsibility. An approved ration scale has been requested by Royal Navy (through AFHQ) to CC/S, but no reply has been received. NAF 687 of 8 May (Tab L).

(b) Exception Disapproved.

(i) C.G. P.B.S. has authorized the issue of Class II and Miscellaneous Supplies to Italian Military Units under "T/E for Italian Units", which is intended only for P.O.W. This action is contained in P.B.S. Circular No. 55 of 5 May, "Supply of Italian Army Units Under Operational Control of P.B.S." (Tab M).

(ii) It has been brought to the attention of CG SOS MATOUSA and CG P.B.S. that this is NOT in conformity with policy, and that replacement from Army stocks cannot be expected. MATOUSA. Cable F 44884 of 12 May refers. (Tab H).

No reply has been received, 26 May.

(c) Pending is recommendation to CC/S as to authorized strength of Italian Forces, and determination of requirement levels by A.I. - 26 May 1944.

d. Class III Supply.

(1) Policy. - Fuel is defined as a U.K. responsibility in F.M. 336. (Tab I).

(a) Both Petroleum and Coal Supply for Italian Military are handled by the respective Special Staff Sections of AFHQ through coordination of A.I. (AFMA or ACC).

(i) Coal Importations and Allocations are handled by a Sub-Section of Q.M., AFHQ. Its responsibilities are to: determine overall requirements for the theater, to arrange importation and to allocate coal available for distribution. G-5, AFHQ, is charged with the development to the maximum of coal resources within the theater and exclusive of North Africa. This responsibility is delegated to ACC, Mining Section. Reference is AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 40, 3 June 1943. (Tab O). This policy is further amplified in AFHQ Adminis-

d. Class III Supply.

(1) Policy. - Fuel is defined as a U.S. responsibility in FM 338. (Tab A).

(a) Both Petroleum and Coal Supply for Italian Military are handled by the respective Special Staff Sections of AFHQ through coordination of A.I (MIA or ACC).

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G-5, AFHQ, is charged with the development to the maximum of coal resources within the theater and exclusive of North Africa. This responsibility is delegated to ACC, Mining Section. Reference is AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 40, 3 June 1943. (Tab O). This policy is further amplified in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 16, 1944. (Tab P).

Exception to (i) above - Coal for Italian Navy is supplied by Allied Navies.

(ii) Petroleum Allocation, Import, Storage and Distribution is a function of the Petroleum Section, AFHQ. Operations within their respective spheres are controlled by CG MTOUSA, D.S. and T. AFHQ, MIAAF, AIC, and C-in-C Med. Reference AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 20, 12 February 1943. (Tab Q).

Italian Military Requirements for Petroleum are supplied through normal Italian Supply Channels or from Allied Dumps to troops in Army areas, through MIA. for Mainland other than forward boundaries, through D.L.S. & T. No. 1. Petroleum Section, Sardinia. CIP delivers to Italian

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Army on a contractual basis. Italian Navy and Naval Air Force are supplied through C-in-C Med. Reference is AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 11 of 28 February 1944. (Tab R).

e. Class IV and Class V are NOT Included in Allied Supply Responsibility to Italian Military Forces.

2. Civil Population.

a. Policy.

(1) A General Policy for the Supply of Minimum Essential Requirements to the Civil Population of Occupied Territory is embodied in AWMAR Cable FORTUNE 92 of 7 April 1943. (Tab S).

(a) The Allied Force Commander is responsible for procurement and distribution of essential civilian supplies in occupied areas from military or other stocks available to him from time of landing and for a period in his discretion which is assumed to be a minimum of at least 90 days.

(b) Special requisitions for subsistence, medical supplies, clothing or other special items deemed necessary to meet essential civilian needs should be submitted to FEMB:RK.

(2) Civilian Supply as a Military Responsibility was established by a letter from The President to The Secretary of War, dated November 10, 1943. (Tab T).

(3) Responsibility for Civilian Supply in Occupied Territory is established in AFHQ Letter "Civilian Supply in Occupied Territory", 16 December 1943. (Tab U).

(a) Civilian supplies are procured by the Military Authorities and made available to ACC/AFG.

(b) A. C. of S., G-5, AFHQ is responsible for advance planning and editing of requirements.

(c) A. C. of S., G-4, AFHQ is responsible for review, and approval of requirements and for forwarding through appropriate channels for procurement and delivery.

(d) ACC is responsible for estimation, allocation and distribution of civilian supplies.

(e) CG N.TOUS and the Supply Services (Br) are responsible for procurement and delivery of approved requirements on the following basis of priority:

(1) Local procurement or Army overstockage.

(2) Imports from U.S. or U.K. as directed by CG/S.

(a) The Allied Force Commander is responsible for procurement and distribution of essential civilian supplies in occupied areas from military or other stocks available to him from time of landing and for a period in his discretion which is assumed to be a minimum of at least 90 days.

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(d) ACC is responsible for estimation, allocation and distribution of civil supplies.

(e) CG NATOUSA and the Supply Services (Br) are responsible for procurement and delivery of approved requirements on the following basis of priority:

(1) Local procurement or Army overstockage.

(2) Imports from U.S. or U.K. as directed by CC/S.

(3) Theater stocks in an emergency.

(f) Responsibilities of CG SOS NATOUSA, with regard to above, are defined in (Tab UU).

c. Class II Supply.

(1) Clothing and Shoes are NOT Rationed in Italy. Only Red Cross bundles and some repair items have been imported from U.S.A. 500,000 yards of cotton goods have been transferred to ACC from surplus stocks on closing of Labor Commissary Stores in North Africa. Some clothing will have to be imported prior to winter of 1944-45 and allocation from CC/S has been requested.

(2) Salvage. - Items of clothing not repairable for Allied Armies or Italian Army are dyed black and made available to ACC for civilian use. Class "D" Shoes are shipped to ACC from the armies and are repaired locally.

d. Class III for Civilian Consumption is handled from the common pools under Q.M. and Pet. Sec., AFHQ (See Tabs O.P.Q. and R.)

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Supplies for Rebuilding and Maintaining Essential Industries are on Special Order. Such orders are screened by ACC and AFHQ, then submitted to CC/S for allocation to U.S. or British procurement. On approval and allocation by CC/S, normal supply procedure is followed. AFHQ Letter of 8 April, subject: "Procurement of Civilian Supplies for Occupied Territory" refers. (Tab V).

3. Civil Labor Employed by the Allied Military Forces.

- a. Regulations for the Employment of Civilian Labor by all branches of the AAI in Italy and all contractors employed by them have been published in AAI Administrative Instructions No. 24 of 24 January and subsequent amendments. A copy, as amended, is (Tab V).
- b. Rationing of Labor Employed by Allied Forces. In addition to the rationing covered in AAI Administrative Instructions No. 24 (Tab V), a Mid-Shift Meal is authorized by AFHQ Cable 44982. (Tab X). The meal consists of 1/4 pound bread, 6 ozs. fresh vegetables and 1 oz. meat, if available locally. 7 lire per meal are deducted from the workers' pay to cover cost.

c. Special Consideration to Heavy Workers is given in AAI Letter 1047/L/Q of 24 May 1944. (Tab Y).

- (1) Those heavy workers employed 100% in the Military Effort, either by the Allied Forces or by Contractors, will, in addition to normal rations and the Mid-Shift Meal, be rationed 700 grams of pasta and 200 grams of dehydrated soup weekly. - d. All Imports for Italian Civil Account are charged by ACC against the
Italian Government. (Tab G').

DEFINITIONS

(to be used with "Chart of Wage Payments and Social Security Contributions Applicable to Private Contractors Serving Armed Forces")

REGULAR BASE WAGE - Refers to worker's regular, basic remuneration for his work, including pay for "overtime" which is of a regular and recurring character. Excludes Presence Indemnity and Family Allowance payments. All social security contributions required of workers and/or employers are calculated solely on the Regular Base Wage earned by the worker. Therefore, a Regular Base Wage rate must be determined for each class of workers and be stipulated in the employer's contract with the Armed Forces. Method of determination follows:

(a) Regular Base Wage is the legal collective contract rate which was in force in September 1942, increased in accordance with the Regional Wage Increase Order to the maximum permitted in that order for private employment. In Naples city, the amount of this increase which may be added to the collective contract rate is computed by applying specified percentages to the sum of contract wage plus Presence Indemnity; elsewhere, by applying specified percentages to the contract wage only. Examples:

(b) If a legal collective contract rate applicable to a particular class of workers is lacking, the employer may propose and, if approved by the Armed Forces, may use a Regular Base Wage rate which is deemed comparable to the Regular Base Wage for similar work as determined in (a), above. However, such a proposed rate shall in no circumstances exceed an amount equal to the Armed Forces Maximum Wage minus Presence Indemnity and a Family Allowance for a wife and 5 children. (Family Allowance for a wife and 5 children is L. 21.10 per day for operai and L. 28.90 per day for lapietati.)

EXTRAORDINARY PAY - Refers to pay for unusual, irregular and occasional overtime work, not covered by regular provisions. So-called "overtime" pay which is of a regular and recurring character, arising out of normal arrangements governing shifts, hours and days of work, is considered part of Regular Base Wage, as defined above.

PRESENCE INDEMNITY - This is paid in addition to the Worker's Regular Base Wage. In metropolitan Naples only, it amounts to 10 Lire per day for male operai and 15 Lire per day for male impiegati; elsewhere, 6 and 8 Lire per day, respectively. (Note that the Presence Indemnity itself was not increased by ANI Regional Wage Increase Order, although in Naples it is used as part of the base to which percentages are applied in calculating the amount of increase which may be added to the collective contract wage. See example in definition of Regular Base Wage.)

WORKERS' SOCIAL SECURITY CONTRIBUTIONS - These are deducted from the worker's pay by the employer, who is responsible for seeing that both his own and the worker's contributions are properly accredited (through stamp purchases, direct payment, or otherwise).
The Worker's Social Security Contributions are:

1. For Social Insurance - L. 9.10 per week per worker on Regular Base Wage earnings of L. 156 weekly and up.
2. For Sickness Assistance - 2.3% of Regular Base Wage in Naples Province; up to 2.55 maximum elsewhere.

SUPPLEMENTARY INDEMNITY - This is a special indemnity designed solely for the purpose of equalizing the cash income of workers employed by contractors serving the Armed Forces with the cash income of workers employed directly by the Armed Forces. It may be paid only to workers of contractors serving the Armed Forces and shall be paid only as follows:

(a) If the sum of the worker's Regular Base Wage plus Presence Indemnity plus Family Allowance, less his social security contributions as defined above, is less than the Armed Forces Maximum Wage, he is eligible for a Supplementary Indemnity.

(b) The Supplementary Indemnity paid to an eligible worker shall be the difference between (1) the sum of his Regular Base Wage plus Presence Indemnity plus Family Allowance, less his social security contributions, and (2) the Armed Forces Maximum Wage.

SUBJECT: Employment of Italian Civilians by the Italian Army.

TO : Colonel D. N. Lawley, Chairman, Control of Wages Committee,
A.F.H.C. Adv. Adm. Echelon.

1. The following material is the report of the Labor Sub-Commission, A.C.C., regarding the employment of civilians by the Italian Army. This report is in response to a request made by the Control of Wages Committee as recorded in paragraph 4 of the minutes of the Committee, dated 9 February, 1944.

2. Civilians employed by the Italian Army are divided into two categories:

- a. Specialists assigned to units of the Italian Army.
- b. All other Civilian Employees.

3. Civilian specialists were militarized by decree of the Ministry of War long before the Occupation.

a. There are about 900 civilians with militarized status distributed as follows (figures given are approximate, and add up to only 730):

Type of Work	No. of Employees
Ordnance - repair of small arms, artillery, etc.	50
Royal Arsenal - repair of cannons, anti-aircraft	300
Pyrotechnics	200
Engineers: Headquarters	20
Labor Division	30
Quartermaster - accountants, archivists, etc.	20

Fuel Workers at Torre Annunziata	150
Total	730

b. The above figures are for the Province of Campania, and most of the employees are concentrated in the Naples Area. *670*

c. Civilian specialists are subject to military discipline, but are identified only by a special arm band.

d. Their wage scale conforms closely to Army wage scales.

e. Deductions are made from their wages for social insurance, and the employees receive social insurance benefits.

f. They receive the same food allowance as the soldiers. This is the Category "B" allowance for soldiers in the rear areas as fixed by the Allied Authorities. (The following figures are exact.):

g. These civilians pay 7.50 lire per day for food. The soldiers receive an indemnity of 7.50 lire per day for food if he doesn't take the food.

4. All other civilian employees of the Italian Army:

- a. Receive wages as fixed by the Italian authorities.
- b. Receive no food ration.

5. All Italian soldiers and civilian specialists attached to forces in the combat area receive larger rations than those noted above.
