1. Vatican City employees are reported either Socialist-Communist or lacking any political affiliation. Christian Democrat party workers recently sought new enrollments among Vatican workers, but were unsuccessful.
2. Christian Democratic party sources ascribe the situation to the low wages paid by the Vatican, and to aid facilities provided by Communist cooperatives for members of the Communist party. The cooperatives sell at low prices; fresh meat is 60 lire a kilo, while on the black market it sells at 300 lire a kilo.
3. Vatican workers complain that the Pope's declarations on social betterments are not put in practice in the Vatican itself. They maintain that the Pope should set the example in social reforms.
