The following is the result of my enquiries concerning possibilities of enlisting Maltese Clerks for duty with AMST:

(a). Service personnel

The G.O.C., Malta Command, does not wish to allow Army Clerks to leave the service for duty outside Malta owing to incomplete establishments. Maltese ranks are taking the places of British ranks who the latter are posted away from Malta. The G.O.C. is however prepared to release a few unlocated Maltese other ranks, passing them to the reserve, if these are taken for duty with AMST as civilians. This supply is limited according to the number that can be released from the Army. These ranks are not filling important Army posts at present. None of these were interviewed, but there are a few designation.

(b). Civilians.

In consultation with the Lieutenant Governor's staff, a notice was inserted in the local papers, asking for male volunteers for duty with AMST outside Malta. No conditions were enlarged, but applicants were interviewed individually and asked how much pay, etc. they expected for service in Italy or Spain. The attached list shows details. Candidates were marked, and it is considered that anybody with B against his name is suitable. All candidates were marked that they may expect to be away from Malta for a considerable period. Candidates with B are to be considered outstanding amongst the number interviewed. 162 candidates came up for interview. A few Army and B.A.F. enlisted applicants were refused interview in accordance with the wishes of G.O.C. Malta Command. 27 candidates are considered suitable. 5 of these have volunteered for a service in Italy only. The real ones are those marked with a G. These were marked with a G as they were taken on if required as with a little experience they would make. There are a few broken persons and a few short-hand typists. All applicants expect free accommodation, uniforms, and medical attendance. The rates of pay asked for vary from £25 to £55 per month (gross of all taxes). A few will have to obtain releases from present employers which I am sure will be granted. The Director of Personnel is prepared to exempt selected volunteers from conscription. A few civilian applicants, some of whom do not appear on the attached list, would make good radio operators, and have asked for employment as such.

The supply of good material is not extensive, and is the result of a few days of pay and service are made attractive, many more men will come forward.

In view of the above, it is recommended as follows:

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establishments. Selected ranks are taken to the place of origin where the letter are posted every three months. The C.I.C. is however prepared to release a few selected soldiers from other ranks, sending them to reserve, if these are taken for duty with the C.I.C. as civilians. This supply is limited according to the number that can be released from the Army. These ranks are not filling important Army posts at present. Some of these were interviewed, but there were a few deficiencies.

(b). Civilians.

In collaboration with the Lieutenant Governor's Staff, a notice was inserted in the local papers, asking for male volunteers for duty with Army outside India. No conditions were claimed, but applicants were interviewed individually and asked for much pay, etc. they expected for service in Italy or Greece. The attached list shows details. Candidates were marked, and it is considered that anybody with B against his name is suitable. All candidates were warned that they may expect to be sent from India for a considerable period. Candidates with D are to be considered outstanding amongst the number interviewed. 124 candidates came up for interview. A few Army and N.A.A. enlisted applicants were rejected. Interview is conducted with the Chief of C.I.C. while on duty. 67 candidates are considered suitable. 5 of these have volunteered for service in Italy only. The rest are required as with a little experience they would make. There are a few books, some and a few unpublished typists. All applicants expect from accommodation, ration, and medical attendance. The rates of pay asked for vary from £25 to £45 per month (plus all taxes). A few will have to obtain release from present commitments which I am sure, will be granted. The Director of Recruitment is prepared to exempt selected volunteers from conscription. A few civilian applicants, whose names do not appear on the attached list, would take good administrative, and have asked for employment as such.

The supply of good material is not exhausted, and in the conditions of pay and service are made attractive, many more men will come forward.

1. Attached is translation of statement of background submitted by Avv. Henry La Loggia who has been in the employ of the Labor Division (previously Labor Section) since 8 September 1943, as Civilian Labor Advisor.

2. It is difficult to find prospects for the Directorship of the Regional Office. People with the required training and integrity are not available in any number. La Loggia is the most likely prospect thus far, and has proven himself to be completely trustworthy.

3. It is recommended that La Loggia be appointed Executive Secretary of the Office (not Director) and be authorized to proceed immediately with its organization and handling of routine administrative matters. But he never had held any hierarchical office in the Fascist Syndicalism.

He has been legal adviser of the "National Ente of the Cooperation" from 1932 to 1933, counsellor of the Syndicates of the Agriculture workers from 1933 to 1942.

His work has been always addressed to protect the working and producing classes.

In 1932, he also organized the Office of Statistics and Economical Observation of the "Ente of the Cooperation"; from 1934 to 1940, he was a member of the Committee liquidator of the Agricultural accidents in the Provinces of Palermo, Trapani, Agrigento and Caltanissetta.

In 1938, 1939, he was administrator of the Providence Fund for the Staff of the Provincial Agrarian Syndicate of Palermo.

In 1935, he was appointed as deputy of the Agricultural workers, Vice President of the olive culture section.

As permanent deputy of the working classes, he has held the Office of Counsellor of the Provincial Council of Economy in Palermo.

In 1937 he was called to Rome to partake of the Confederal Committee for the reformation of the Civil Procedure Code.

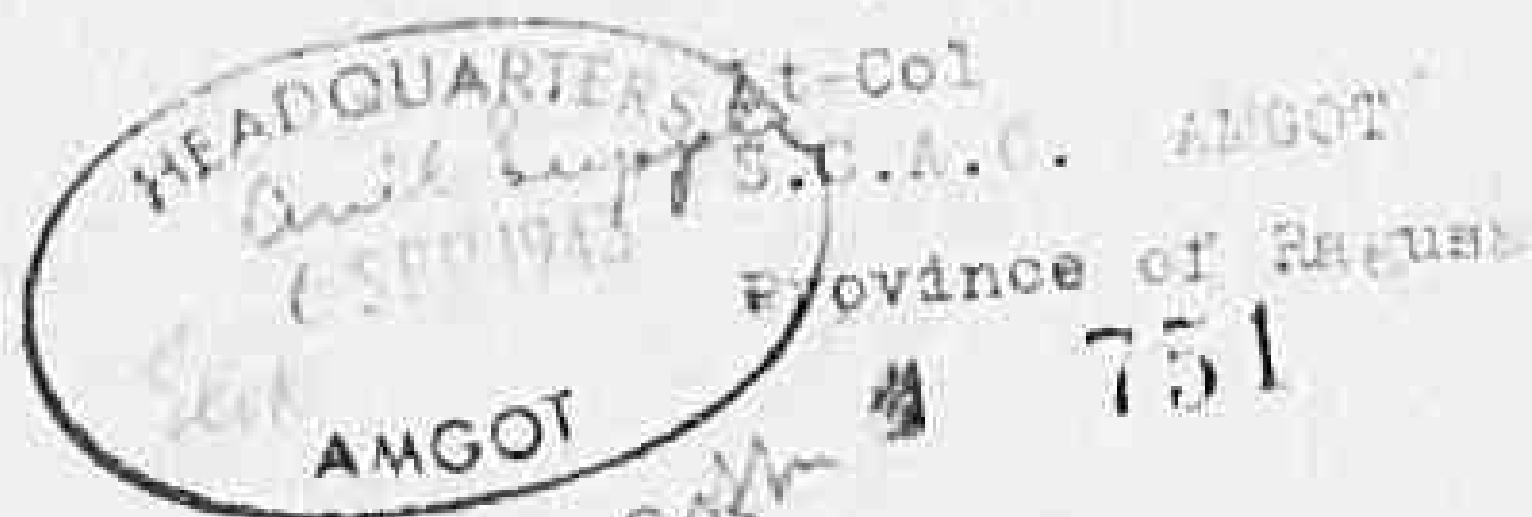

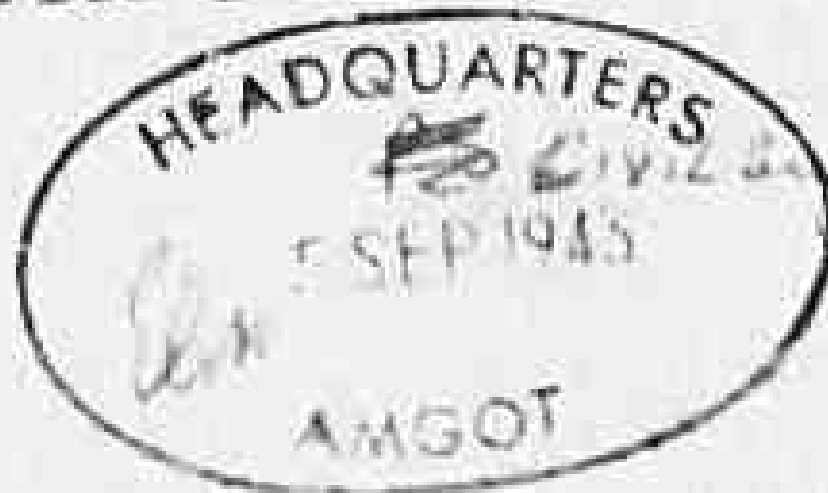

In order to coordinate economic control the offices of this Division have been established in the former Hall of Corporations.

Many Government offices concerned with economic affairs are without accommodation owing to the events of war and for this reason and for ease of control such departments are being housed here.

At the same time the actual economic functions of the Ministry of Corporations are being reviewed with the object of retaining the good and rejecting the bad. Such functions as Petrol, Wood, Coal and Transport rationing etc must obviously be retained. Other functions such as the control and representation of employers and workers syndicates are in principle desirable but may have been so closely connected with Fascist institutions as to predicate major reform. On this latter point a clear policy directive from H.Q. is requested.

In the meantime the new administrative unit created by the bringing together of these various bodies has been collectively named the Commissariato degli Affari Economici.

In order to facilitate indirect administration it is proposed to appoint a principle officer, with the title of Commissario to supervise the work of the various departments and to be responsible to A.M.G.O.T.

The person intended in Comm. Dr. Carlo Amico former Vice President of Corporations. He has been tried out and shows an outstanding degree of ability and initiative.
