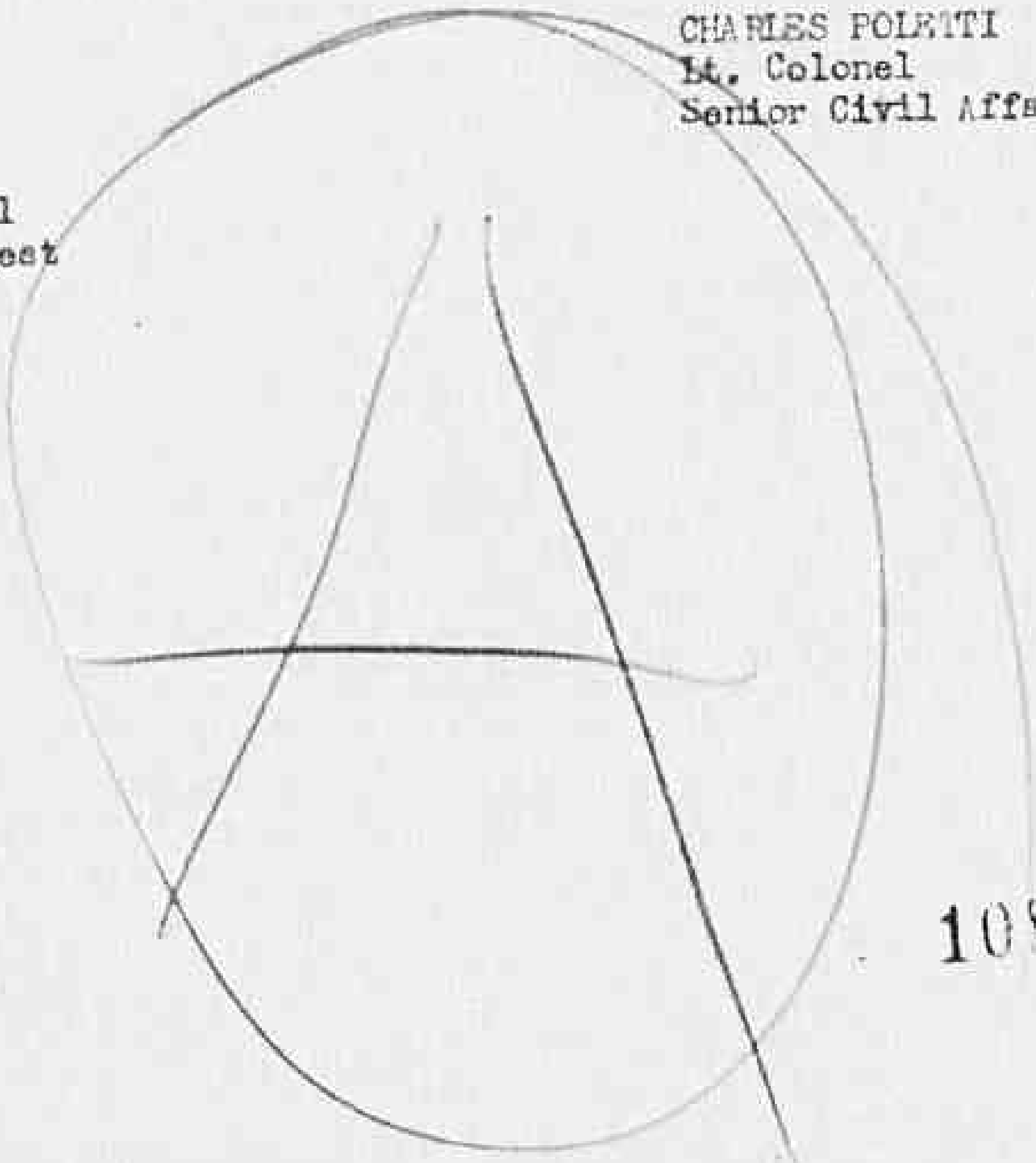

I received your three communications of sept. 27 and two of sept. 20 yesterday afternoon and I have written to the officials in Messina with reference to the advance in pay for municipal employees and also the wages for the garage personnel there. I have also passed on the information with reference to the Giracuse electric company situation. I am afraid this matter is going to cause trouble before the end of next month as Col. Armitage told me he had been having great difficulty in holding his employees.

Col. Pearman appreciated your decision on his matter. For your information Col. Pearman is leaving for the mainland and another full Colonel will take his place. It will either be a Col. Gooling or a Col. Gordon-Smith. He will live and mess with us and I will keep you advised. I am told this is the end of the changes here and that whichever one of these gentlemen is stationed here now will remain here. I regret very much to see Col. Pearman leave. He was most cooperative and an excellent gentleman. Col. Pearman leaves today.

With reference to your memo of September 11 concerning the telephone employees here in Siracuse, I made a careful investigation of the matter and do not find anything irregular. Major Koenigsbert, in charge of the P&L Office here has furnished me with a list of the labor paid by the Army and working with the telephone company here. These wages on the attached list conform with the approved scale. The difficulty is, however, that there are other employees working with the telephone company who do practically the same work and who receive their preoccupation wages. This no doubt accounts for the complaint which reached me in Catania.

As I suggested in a previous report I believe that the utility employees should have an increase. I would think they should receive the same as Army wages in most instances and certainly as much as the Army minimum of 50 lire for common labor.

Dear Dave:

This is just a personal line to tell you of some of my difficulties. I finally wangled a small fiat out of Catania HQ and have been trying to get about in it but it is not satisfactory. It breaks down about once a day. I had three breakdowns coming from Catania and was delayed from one to six hours each time. I never know whether I am going to reach my destination or not. I have noticed that HQ has seen fit to provide a jeep and driver for one of our officers to go about doing things about monuments, historic spots and things but yet Palermo does not seem able to provide adequate transportation (or any kind for that matter) for the purpose of investigating wages, labor problems and acute unemployment, etc. Don't misunderstand me. I'm glad the other fellow has a jeep and he's my good friend, etc., but there is something very inconsistent in the attitude at HQ about these two particular matters.

Major points to the letter from the Mayor.

Following the verbal exposition that I have had the honour to submit to your Command reflecting the immense economical difficulties to which our personnel (employees), especially those employees of the Provincial Administrative, we beg to point out the major points:

The personnel of our Administration, so that depending by the Italian State or other Public institutions during the second half part of July were paid 5 months of salary including July, in order to provide the employees through funds to be able to meet the new situation created by political and belligerent acts, which situation obliged many to keep two homes as long as to double the alimentary expense. Because while the family was kept at a distant village, the employee in order to be present at work was obliged to live in the city. The other difficulty arose from the advance in price of food products, also for heavier expenses, in order to be able to go from one place to another.

All these difficulties already mentioned and others not mentioned have brought about real disturbance to the mind of the employees, that more or less acts against the full performance of their work.

By this we beg to call your kind attention and consideration to hold present that the salaries now being paid to employees are not adequate to be able to meet the high cost of life, and much less in rapport to salaries now being paid to the laboring class that your Command has fixed in figures very acceptable.

Therefore we respectfully urge you to rise the scale of price in rapport to the high cost of life beginning as from ~~decem~~ 1st.

For the period of time dated from August 1st and until the new ~~scale~~ scale of price is fixed, I pray your office to fix a daily indemnity only for those days that such employees were at ~~that~~ their duty, such employees that with great risk of their life and personal sacrifice, in order to be present at the Public institutions, such as belong to the following categories :

Dear Dave:

I have just returned from Messina where I spent Monday and Tuesday and I found Col. Seitz' two letters of Sept. 8, one of Sept. 9, one of Sept. 10 awaiting me - as well as yours of September 9 and 11. I am sorry I did not get Col. Seitz' letters before I left for Messina as I would have gone to Syracuse and Ragusa first had I received his letters. I shall leave early tomorrow morning to attend to the matters in Syracuse and Ragusa. I will appreciate it if you will advise him to this effect. Please also advise him I shall discuss with Col. Pearson of the British Army the matters he wrote about when I got home tonight and I shall ask Col. Pearson to write to Col. Seitz promptly about them.

I feel that my trip to Messina was well worth while. I interviewed many people about wages, living conditions and labor in general. I talked with industrialists, labor leaders and Army officers.

There is ample labor available in Messina province but the food problem is more acute there than anywhere I have been. The civilians have only received 100 grams of bread in the past ten days though laborers are now getting 50 a day. I am advised "G" rations are soon to be distributed in Messina and it is hoped this will help the situation.

Salaries have increased about 40% between Jan. 1 and Jan. 9 in Messina province. I was somewhat surprised to find that the people I talked with did not seem to think the cost of living had increased as much since January 1 to date as it apparently has increased in Catania province. It is estimated by people who should know that the increase in cost of living in Messina is about 20% between Jan. 1 and July 9. I do not agree with this estimate personally - as I think it has increased considerably more than that. I was told that our official wage scale was just about in line with salaries as of January 1 and that on July 9 they were about 40% higher - due to the allotments which were added.

I interviewed Count Eugenio Caneva, a citrus products producer, and one of the most prominent industrialists in Sicily with large plants in Messina and other cities both in Sicily and Italy. He has been in business there for many years and is familiar with labor conditions and the general economic outlook. It was rather significant to me that he is not opposed to a wage increase for his many employees and thinks they will have to be brought up to a 50 lire a day basis. They are now getting from 30 to 45 a day - or more when the plants were operating. He says both Italians and Germans subsidized business in Sicily in order to keep the prices down. He says labor syndicates have caused no trouble but he feels it would be a good idea to suspend them during the occupation. This is the general feeling everywhere.

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The white collar workers are in the same situation in Messina as they are here in Catania. I would recommend an increase to put them on a par with common labor at least - on a merit basis in individual cases, as I outlined in my last report. If possible the salaries should be a flat monthly sum of course.

There are no utility company operations in Messina at present but I would recommend that the utility employees also be put on a par with common labor when the operations recommence. This same situation applies to Siracusa and Catania.

increased in price - and without trying to be fundamental about an economic principle, the increase must be exactly the same in salary as in price of the commodity. I think these two things should be fixed at the same time if possible. I think also that the Army prices should be considered at the time this is done and that an effort be made to keep in line with the Army prices for labor.

At the 8th Army Labor Office things are getting along fine. Major Tregenza in charge of the PLXO there has 1900 laborers in Messina and the only trouble is feeding them.

I hope to have an opportunity to discuss with you sometime the matter of a reconstruction program. I realize that there is a very debatable question as to whether we should pay for reconstruction - but I see no reason why some system of loans should not be worked out whereby we can lend the necessary funds. The provinces will not be able to bear the expense - and I think it very necessary that we soon have a work program or we are going to have a serious unemployment problem. I would also urge that the building material industry be encouraged at once to produce as much building material as possible. There is ample stone, gesso, clay for roofing and tiles, etc., and wood can be brought over from Calabria. There is of course no glass or metal here but Sicily should begin producing everything she can and storing it for a future reconstruction program.

Capt. Borak's recommendations for garage personnel's wages is enclosed. X I think it is OK. I am also enclosing a request from the Podesta in Messina for X an advance to some of his employees. They got an advance under the old regime of four months which they have spent and are now about to starve. While I am opposed to paying salaries in advance I believe something will have to be done. I would not advocate a four months advance but would advance each employee only such money as may be necessary to care for the immediate emergency. Please let me have your views.

I have obtained from the prefetto of Messina a list of salaries formerly paid and his recommendation for necessary increases in each instance. As I have X previously stated - I think this class of workers should have an increase.

I have written this hurriedly as I found considerable work for me on my return and I am anxious to get on to Siracuse and Ragusa as soon as possible. I shall leave in the morning and will get back here as soon as possible. I shall investigate the utility employees in Siracuse while there. The Army people seem to know nothing about the complaint which I heard.

I am sure you will advise the Colonel of this report and I shall report on the matters he sent me just as soon as I can get there.

I hope to have an opportunity to discuss with you sometime the matter of a reconstruction program. I realize that there is a very debatable question as to whether we should pay for reconstruction - but I see no reason why some system of loans should not be worked out whereby we can lend the necessary funds. The provinces will not be able to bear the expense - and I think it very necessary that we soon have a work program or we are going to have a serious unemployment problem. I would also urge that the building material industry be encouraged at once to produce as much building material as possible. There is ample stone, gesso, clay for roofing and tiles, etc., and wood can be brought over from Calabria. There is of course no glass or metal here but Sicily should begin producing everything and can and storing it for a future reconstruction program.

Dept. Gorak's recommendations for garage personnel's wages is enclosed. ^X I think it is OK. I am also enclosing a request from the Podesta in Messina for an advance to some of his employees. They got an advance under the old regime of four months which they have spent and are now about to starve. While I am opposed to paying salaries in advance I believe something will have to be done. I would not advocate a four months advance but would advance each employee only such money as may be necessary to care for the immediate emergency. Please let me have your views.

I have obtained from the prefetto of Messina a list of salaries formerly paid and his recommendation for necessary increases in each instance. As I have ^X previously stated - I think this class of workers should have an increase.

I have written this hurriedly as I found considerable work for me on my return and I am anxious to get on to Siracuse and Ragusa as soon as possible. I shall leave in the morning and will get back here as soon as possible. I shall investigate the utility employees in Siracuse while there. The Army people seem to know nothing about the complaint which I heard.

I am sure you will advise the Colonel of this report and I shall report on the matters he sent me just as soon as I can get there.

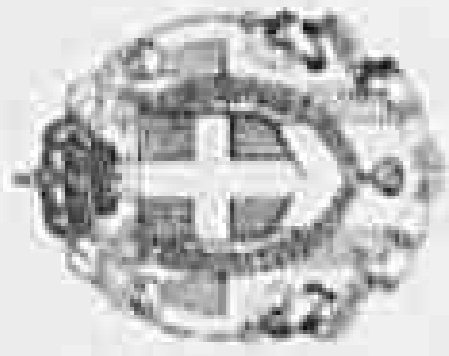

With reference to Col. Seitz instructions that I make an investigation in this case, I spent two days in Ragusa and went into the matter thoroughly.

These asphalt mines produce asphalt and crude oil from oil-bearing limestone rock and are the largest asphalt producers in Europe. Considerable diesel oil and a higher grade of oil also is produced. I went to the mines and inspected the whole operation from the time the rock is taken from the mines until the oil is put in drums and the asphalt shipped away for road building. I saw every process and every type of work performed there. Normally the mines employ some 1300 men. At present about 200 are working there. The mines had not operated for several months prior to the occupation and it is not possible to operate them on full scale at present because it is impossible to get blasting powder. Only the crushing part of the operation is possible now.

The U.S. Air Corps needs the asphalt badly and wants the whole output for the month of September. The mines are operated on a contract basis under a contract made by a Major Colt, former purchasing officer for the Army. The Superintendent of the mines, actually in charge of operations is a Sicilian named Moy. The operation is supervised by Major Lee, Military Controller of Essential Products, - who has had much experience in this work. Major Ousley, our Civilian Supply Officer at Ragusa is also widely experienced in asphalt mining and in fact I believe he represented these particular mines in Europe. The SCAO, Col. Thurburn, accompanied me to the mines this morning where we had the opportunity of discussing the matter in detail with Supt. Moy, Major Lee and Major Ousley.

I attached hereto a wage scale of preoccupation wages received by the miners. On August 9 the Army requested the asphalt for the whole month of September. Col. Thurburn authorized an increase in wages on August 12 as shown on the attached scale. On August 15 dissatisfaction developed again and the employees insisted they could not live on the wages; that even the increase approved was insufficient. Col. Thurburn, Major Lee, Major Ousley and Supt. Moy all feel that another increase should be authorized but they differ in their views as to how much the increase should be. Col. Thurburn thinks 5 lire a day; Major Lee and Major Ousley think it should be more; Supt. Moy thinks it should be 15 lire a day. I think an increase should also be authorized but I would think the correct increase should be somewhere between 5 and 10 lire a day.

The asphalt now sells for \$1.50 a ton and it is estimated if 15 lire a day increase is approved the asphalt will sell for \$2.00 a ton which I am informed is still well under the official approved price.

Major Ousley speaks fluent Italian and through him I ~~explained~~ ^{explained} the workers that we will soon have a wage conference, etc., at which time the matter would receive careful and sympathetic consideration and that I would present all the facts to AMSCOT HQ.

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Major Ousley would like very much to attend the abovementioned wage conference and present some further and more detailed information about asphalt mining.
