SUBJ: Proficiency in Italian.

TO: Distribution below.

1. It is clearly desirable that all officers of the Allied Commission should have a working knowledge of the Italian language. It is felt that the number of Italian speaking officers is far too small considering the length of time most officers have spent in this country.

2. Regional Commissioners and Heads of Subcommissions will ensure that all officers under their command take advantage of opportunities afforded to learn the language and will impress on all the importance of such action. Where necessary classes may be set up for formal instruction. There is a sufficient number of bilingual officers in the various Regions and Subcommissions to make such a procedure easy and efficacious.

3. Regional Commissioners and Heads of Subcommissions will submit at the end of January, 1943 a report indicating the number of officers under their command adequately skilled in the language and the number still in need of instruction. Similar reports will be made at the end of each month until further notice.

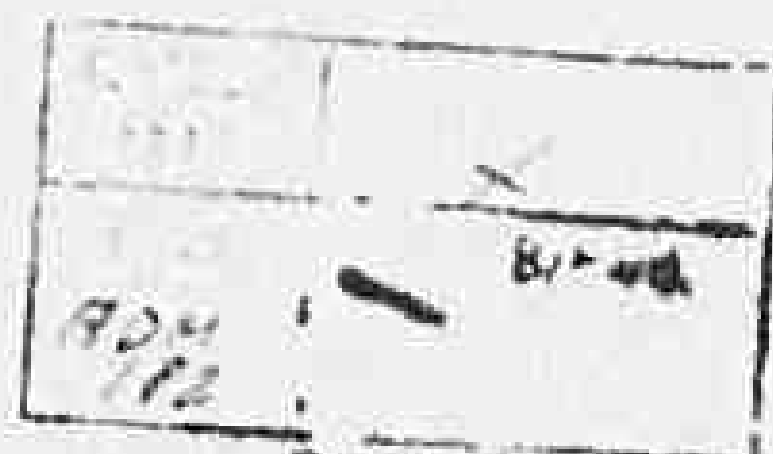

SUBJECT: Allied Commission Duty Officer

TO : All Concerned

1. The following procedure with regard to Duty Officers is effective 1 July 1946:

a. The functions of the various duty officers (Chief Commissioner's, (MIA, etc), within the Allied Commission will all be performed by one individual, who will be known as the Staff Duty Officer, Allied Commission. Only one officer and one EM/OR will be on duty for each tour, which will be carried out according to a roster.

b. The Staff Duty Officer's tour and the Assistant Adjutant's duty hours will be coordinated so that an official representative, a commissioned officer or warrant officer is on duty within the headquarters building for 24 hours a day. Each officer will therefore remain at his post until relieved in person by his successor. Delays in reporting for duty will be reported immediately in writing to the Adjutant, Allied Commission.

2. All officers below the rank of Lt Col or equivalent and all EM/OR below the rank of Sgt or equivalent are eligible for duty as Staff Duty Officer and Duty Clerk except Motor Transportation Officer (1) Major ARTHUR M. MCNEILL, Motor Transportation Officer (2) Major J. S. LYON, Headquarters Company, 2675th Regiment Commanding Officer Capt THOMAS R. SWISHER, and Officer in Charge, British Detachment Capt R. V. HEDDER-CLARK. Other exemptions from duty will be sanctioned only by the Executive Commissioner, to whom applications should be made in writing through the Executive Officer (1) or (2).

3. Duty rosters will be kept by the Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission, G-1 (B), G-1 (A), and the Personnel Officers of Navy, Land Forces and Air Forces Sub-Commissions will submit to the Assistant Adjutant each week nominal rolls of all officers and EM/OR assigned or attached to Allied Commission. This procedure is necessary in view of the great reduction in strength of commissioned personnel of the Allied Commission and in order to prevent undue hardship on the part of a few officers.

4. Duty tours for off-duty daylight periods will be on half-day schedules and will be kept as a roster separate from the night duty tour. The post for this tour will be in the office of the Chief Staff Officer to the Chief Commissioner, 3rd Floor, phone Ext. 485. This tour will be as follows:

Wednesdays	1300 -- 1800
Saturdays	1300 -- 1800
Sundays & Holidays	0830 -- 1300 and 1300 -- 1800

Officers going on duty on Wednesdays and Saturdays will report to the Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission, at 1255 hours prior to going on duty. Those going on duty on Wednesdays and Saturdays will report to the Assistant Adjutant at 1200 hours on the

The post for this tour will be in the office of the Chief Staff Officer to the Chief Commissioner, 3rd Floor, phone Ext. 425. This tour will be as follows:

Wednesdays	1300 -- 1800
Saturdays	1300 -- 1800
Sundays & Holidays	0830 -- 1300 and 1300 -- 1800

Officers going on duty on Wednesdays and Saturdays will report to the Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission, at 1255 hours prior to going on duty. Those going on duty on Sundays will report to the Assistant Adjutant at 1200 hours on the Saturday before. They will be relieved by the night duty officer.

5. Night Duty Tour will be from 1800 to 0830 each night. Post of tour, Room 5, 1st Floor, Ministère des Relations Internationales Building, phone Ext 423. Officers going on night duty will report to the Assistant Adjutant at 1200 hours prior to duty tour. Those taking night duty on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays will take over from the Staff Duty Officer in his office at 1755 hours.

FUNCTIONS OF A.C. TELECOMS OFFICERSReference: Attached Circular

1. The functions of the Telecomms Officer, in the light of the attached circular, may be summarised as follows:

a) To inform this HQ of any circumstances arising which may seriously affect Allied or Italian Government communications (e.g. political, labour, or technical difficulties).

b) To maintain close liaison with officers of the Military District who are stationed in the Liaison Officer's area, and to assist them in their relations with Italian Govt. Depts. and agencies.

c) To check that Italian organisations are maintaining military communications reasonably well, and have the stores, etc. to do so.

d) To continue to make contact with Italian senior telecomms officials not only in the Headquarters town, but in the larger towns of Liaison Officer's area, and to assist them in their relations with Allied military organisations and with other A.C. Liaison Officers of the area.

e) To keep this HQ informed by monthly report of the telecomms situation (to be received here by seventh day of the month) and of events affecting telecomms work in the Liaison Area. Such reports should include mention of any cases that come to the liaison officer's notice of difficulties of the important telecomms Manufacturing Companies in meeting any of the Italian Government requirements. This primarily concerns Milan.

2. Telecomms officers may give technical advice ³⁰to assist local Italian officials, (as a matter of personal opinion), but it should be made clear that it is advice and not an instruction.

All instructions to do the work must be obtained by these officials through normal Italian channels, and no instructions must be given to Italian staffs by telecomms Officers while

the areas are administered by the Italian Government. Care should be taken as well to avoid doing much of the thinking for senior Italian officials.

3. Briefly the aim is to have the Italians run their own show, without reference to A.C. officers except where liaison work with the military is necessary, to keep a close watch on any tendencies which might result in serious interruptions to communications, and to keep this HQ up-to-date on the general position.

FUNCTIONS OF ALLIED COMMISSION LIAISON OFFICERS

1. The first duty of Allied Commission Liaison Officers will be to keep themselves, at all times, informed of the situation in the areas with which they are concerned. This will involve the use of all available means of information: Press, Intelligence, Summaries, etc. They will inform HQ Allied Commission direct of any circumstances arising which may in their opinion adversely affect Allied interests or influence the general policy of the Commission. They will submit a monthly report to HQ which will include comment on the political situation.

2. Liaison Officers will, by study of previous Regional monthly reports and other records, inform themselves of the present position of various Commission functions now being handed over to Italian agencies. They will specially watch those cases where previous difficulties have been encountered.

Liaison Officers will bear in mind that HQ Allied Commission and APHQ are interested in activities in all parts of the area with which Liaison Officers are concerned and not merely with the situation in the leading cities. Consequently Liaison Officers should make frequent trips to the smaller towns and country districts and acquaint themselves with the political and economic conditions in such districts. They must endeavour to be on the spot where the trouble is expected and observe any incidents, strikes, demonstrations and the like in their areas. All Liaison Officers will remember, however, that their role is solely that of observers and reporters and they will not interfere in any way in such incidents, nor will they give any advice to the Italian authorities in the handling thereof. Liaison Officers have no authority to pledge the use of Allied troops in quelling any disturbance; this is a matter of the local Allied Commander. They should, however, keep Allied Commanders informed of the course of events. In cases where they consider safety of Allied property or nationals likely to become endangered, they must inform the Allied Commanders concerned, advising HQ AC of such action.

3. Liaison Officers will keep close touch with the senior military formation, American and British, in their areas. They will endeavour at all times to assist military formations in their relations with Italian Government departments and agencies. They must, however,

All Liaison Officers will remember, however, that their role is solely that of observers and reporters and they will not interfere in any way in such incidents, nor will they give any advice to the Italian authorities in the handling thereof. Liaison Officers have no authority to pledge the use of Allied troops in quelling any disturbance; this is a matter of the local Allied Commander. They should, however, keep Allied Commanders informed of the course of events. In cases where they consider safety of Allied property or nationals likely to become endangered, they must inform the Allied Commanders concerned, advising HQ AC of such action.

3. Liaison Officers will keep close touch with the senior military formation, American and British, in their areas. They will endeavour at all times to assist military formations in their relations with Italian Government departments and agencies. They must, however, remember that they are Liaison Officers and not Executive Officers and will not be able to carry out in any sense the former functions of Provincial Commissioners.

Points which require special attention are:-

- a) Disease and unrest.
- b) Law cases affecting Allied personnel and property.
- c) Requisitioning and derequisitioning.
- d) Relations between Allied forces and Italian police forces.

Liaison Officers will also keep in touch with British and U.S. consular Officers, as well as any U.S. Information Service and British

Press Officials in their areas.

4. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian Local Government and, even if asked, they will NOT give official advice on behalf of the Allied Commission to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome. The Allied Governments are most anxious to promote free and secret elections and an essential preliminary is the preparation of a proper electoral list. Any points which affect these matters coming to the notice of liaison officers should be included in their monthly reports.

5. The Officer in charge Liaison Group will be responsible for discipline and administration of all Allied Commission officers in his area.

2. The strength of the Sub-Commission does not allow of a Telecommunications Officer or a Postal Officer with each Region. The officers to cover Emilia Region have been assigned to other Regions, but it has been made abundantly clear to the officers concerned and has also been formally notified by order that the Emilia Region forms an equal part of their duties.

3. The Telecommunications Officer for Emilia Region is Major W.F. 4500, assigned to TOSCANA Region. He is nominated as a member of the Telecommunications Board for Bologna and will make BOLOGNA his head office as early as possible. A copy of the original telegram stating this order is attached; to clear the matter finally an order will be requested for publication in HQs. Allied Commission Special Program. The usual way. He will be transferred to Emilia Region on his move to BOLOGNA, and Lieut. RUSHING from HQs. will be moved to TOSCANA Region.

4. The Postal Officer for Emilia Region is Lieut. A.J. 1124 assigned to ABRUZZO-MARCHE Region. A copy of the order for him to cover Emilia Region is attached.

My Dear Colonel,

You have stated that Establishment Section will, in the next several weeks, prepare a table showing by name, the distribution of specialist officers to Regions, and will thereafter submit draft copies of such table to all interested regional administrators for their "shoot at", this table to be the subject of further clearance at a meeting to which I shall be invited.

I am therefore taking the liberty, in this letter, of pointing out some of the respects in which I feel that the proposed numerical allotment of specialists set forth in the addendum to your letter G-12/51/3/A, "Officer-Officers", 7 March 1948, are most illogical and inadequate as regards this Region. I hope that you will refer to it in the course of your discussions with the sub-commissions and that modifications which will produce a more equitable and suitable allocation, will result.

I shall refrain from discussing over-all numbers (also inadequate), resting the security of Emilia in that regard on informal assurances from you and the Executive Commissioner that additional bodies, as such, up to a reasonable, workable ceiling, will be forthcoming from (1) officers earmarked for Austria but not taken into account in preparing the chart (2) additional officers to be "harvested" out of Headquarters, and (3) other sources. This latter relates solely to numbers allotted to specific special classifications--specialists, who cannot be pulled out of a set or picked up casually in just any group of assorted officers. With even more asphasia, it relates to heads of special divisions.

Preliminarily, I call attention to the following pertinent basic facts upon which judgment of the needs

of Emilia must presumably be to some extent predicated, and which I feel must have been overlooked in the preparation of the table above referred to:

1. Emilia Region is still, as such, totally non-operational to exactly the same extent as Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia and Venetia. By grace of the Eighth Army, a certain amount of emergency work has been done in one-and-a-half provinces, but the regional job proper is still ahead.

2. The devastation in the northern of Emilia already liberated exceeds anything experienced north of Cassino, and there is every indication that the remainder of the Region has been, or will be, hit equally hard.

3. Emilia has eight provinces--the same number as Piemonte; twice as many as Liguria. Except for Torino and Genova, respectively, the Emilian provinces are not inferior in importance or population to those of these Regions. In fact, the provinces of Liguria other than Genova are not comparable with Forli, Bologna, Modena, Parma, Piacenza, etc., in strategic and industrial significance.

4. Bologna is the transportation, communications, and commercial "hub", of all of northern Italy, and is an important industrial area.

5. There will evidently be more troops stationed in Emilia for a long period of time than in any other comparable area in northern Italy.

6. There is some indication that up to one million German military and civilian personnel will be concentrated, unconfined in Emilia.

Bearing these facts in mind, I submit that the following typical comparative figures from your chart speak for themselves as to the inadequacy of the provision made for this Region:

Thus, in this group of important Economic Section divisions, we find that (excluding officers transferred for Austria) personnel provision per province is, for Liguria, 40%, and for Piemonte, 25%, of that for Emilia.

The fact that the most glaring inequities and ineptitudes (though there are others I shall not have belabor) all relate to Economic Section classifications, leads me to wonder whether the advice and counsel of the Economic Section have been asked and considered in connection with these allocations. I have not, and do not wish to, press this inquiry, but I have learned by chance that the Transportation Sub-Commission did recommend an allotment of twelve (12) officers to Emilia, and that Commerce Sub-Commission planned to provide a minimum of ten (2) commerce officers.

I cannot believe that those to whom the economic aspects of I.C.'s mission are entrusted really regard Emilia as of so little importance industrially and commercially, as your proposed personnel chart would imply. If they do, I should be glad upon some occasion

sion to attempt, with the aid of Lt. Cassano's "hand-book of Basic Information", to show them their error. For the present, knowing that the allocations are completely out of line with the recommendations of at least two of the Directors of Economic Sub-commissions, I prefer to believe that the true answer lies either in a failure to consult the sub-commission at all or in giving insufficient weight to their recommendations.

The only other possible explanation, would be that Emilia Region officers are regarded as so much more efficiently trained, indoctrinated, organized and directed, than those of other regions, that one of them could do the work of two to four ordinary people. Flattering as I might find this hypothesis, it is rejected as unfair to the individual officers of Liguria and Piemonte.

As far as heads are concerned, I assume that the basic rule will be that those officers now assigned to Emilia and who have participated in our operations and planning for up to eight months now, will in any event be retained. Except in a few cases where the training and qualifications of officers assigned are ill-adapted to Emilia's special needs, I shall find it necessary to resist any measures to move officers indoctrinated in our methods to Regions farther forward, replacing them with new officers whose integration into the regional team must start from scratch. This is particularly true of the heads of special divisions. Even as things stand now, heads of (and sole members of) two of our specialist divisions are "assigned" to northern Regions and heads of two very important others (Public Safety and Transportation) "assigned" for Austria.

I submit this letter in the hope that the product of your further labors with the sub-commissions during the next two weeks may offer a less vulnerable target to be "shot at" at the promised round-table of regional administrators to be held in a fortnight.

I am confident that it will receive sympathetic ²⁷⁹ consideration and favorable action.

I am leaving Rome tomorrow morning for my West Headquarters (Florence). I have committed myself to

I am in receipt of your letter of 3 October 44. Your point about the exercising of control over the functions of the officers in your Region is no new one and can be solved, I hope, satisfactorily.

It is inevitable that specialist officers receive instructions on technical matters direct from their corresponding sub-Commissions at this HQ and in this respect the situation is little different from the chain of command at a military formation HQ., where branches of Services, Medical, Signal, etc., receive technical instructions through their own technical command channels, whilst being subject to the general orders of the Commander. Your position is similar and there can be no departure from the principle that a Regional Commissioner is in command of all officers assigned to his Region and is responsible for carrying out policy.

Broadly speaking, I think it is unnecessary to make any change in channels of correspondence; you can best keep yourself informed by regular coordinating conferences, the use of float files, etc.

In conclusion I would like to refer to your letter of 31 August in the last paragraph of which you speak of "attached" officers. This term must not be allowed to degenerate into "independent". Any officer assigned or "attached" to you is under your general supervision and control.

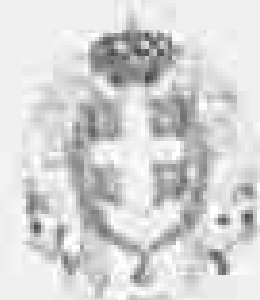

Dear Colonel Henderson:

I have your letter of 2 June in re a postal officer for Region V and advise that I saw the previous letter in this matter and directed the adjutant to reply that all Region V was operating in AMG territory and all but one province - Foggia - was under 8th Army control, wherein no civilian postal service is permitted, and that for the time being no special postal officer is required.

However, if it is the plan to have a postal officer set up in the region to make his survey and plans for operation when the provinces will be returned to Italian control, I shall be glad to have an officer of the postal section to report to the Provincial Commissioner, Foggia, which will be the first province wherein civilian postal service will be operated when authorized, provided the assignment of a postal officer will be an additional officer to the Regional communications Division and not chargeable to our already reduced allotment.
