Procedure for Movement of Goods by Sea.

Transportation Sub-Commission, Movements Division, who will arrange shipment either in Schooners allocated to C2-GR-14 or in vessels set up through G-4 (Nav. & Tr.) Allied Force Headquarters. Each individual shipment is to be covered by a separate bid.
3. Bid Form SB 2. will be completed by the bidders as detailed below :-
 - (a) Commodity - C.I.T. FORM 500 (New & finished), WATERS and their raw materials.
 - (b) Bidders - Monopoli dello Stato, Democrazia Industriale Piemontese.
 - (c) Procedure - Bid Form SB 2, in duplicate will be submitted direct to Movements Division, Transportation Sub-Commission.
 - (d) Commodity - Rationed foodstuffs, whether imported or locally produced. All supplies and goods imported from ~~Italy~~ ^{Germany} sources.

- (d) Special Procedure for Regulating Bids. - In order that there will be no unnecessary overbidding for schooner shipping and so that shipping can be planned ahead, GRHALS who desire to ship by schooner in bids of under 300 tons will advise the actual tonnage lift required to the High Commissioner for Food who will consolidate and pass to Movement Division, Transportation Sub-Commission. RE-ORGANIZATION OF TRANSPORTATION SUB-COMMISSION, AC

1. With effect from the date of this memorandum, the Transportation Sub-Commission, AC, will be composed of a Director, Deputy Director, Planning Staff, and five divisions - Administration, Movements, Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouse. Their duties are set out in the following paragraphs. It is emphasized, however, that the divisions are in all cases within the general framework of the Transportation Sub-Commission's responsibility and subject to any changes in policy that may be laid down by higher authority.

2. The Planning Staff will be responsible for all forward planning on transportation questions; it will advise and work closely with the Priorities Board (see Executive Order Number 14) and with the Movements Division.

3. The Administration Division will cover all internal administration, keeping of personnel records, assignments and transfers of personnel and general secretarial work. Its Accounting Branch will be responsible for accounting for all stores handled at AC warehouses, keeping records, etc. Its Statistical Branch will keep records of all movements by rail, road, sea and other means.

4. The Movements Division will ensure that the policy laid down by the Priorities Board is carried out; it will determine, in accordance with the bids made to it, what traffic is to be carried by rail, road, sea, including coastal, inland water transport, or other means, and how best this work can be coordinated with military movements. For this purpose it will have Rail, Road and Shipping Branches. The Movements Division will make out and circulate programs and be responsible for seeing that they are fulfilled or for notifying those concerned of changes of program. The Movements Division will not, however, be responsible for the technical aspect of the carrying agency's work which is the concern of the Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouse Divisions referred to below, and of the Shipping Sub-Commission.

5. The Rail Division will be responsible for the technical report of the Italian Railways' work, for advising the Movements Division what can be carried by rail, of any changes in capacity, and for seeing that the program laid down is carried out in the best way possible. It will also plan and assist with the repair and reconstruction of all rail facilities including trucks, locomotives, rolling stock,

The Movement Division will make out and circulate programs and to respond to requests for advice that they are fulfilled or for notifying those concerned of changes of program. The Movement Division will not, however, be responsible for the technical aspect of the carrying agency's work which is the concern of the Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouse Divisions referred to below, and of the Shipping Sub-Committee.

5. The Rail Division will be responsible for the technical aspect of the Italian Railway's work, for advising the Movement Division what can be carried by rail, of any changes in capacity, and for seeing that the program laid down is carried out in the best way possible. It will also plan and assist with the repair and reconstruction of all rail facilities including track, locomotives, rolling stock, stations, buildings, etc. It will work in close contact with the DMPS and the Italian State Railways.

6. The Road Division will be responsible for technical questions on all operations by road, for advising the Movement Division what can be carried by road, of any changes in capacity, and for seeing that the program laid down is carried out in the best way possible. It will also plan and assist with the repair and provision of road vehicles. It will be responsible for the raising of new road transport units. It will assist and render technical advice to the Italian road organizations.

7. The Port and Warehouse Division will be responsible for the technical aspect of port, warehouses and inland and coastal water

transport work and for border that all installations are worked in the best way possible. The responsibility for warehouses will extend only to those warehouses which are used as incidental to transportation, i.e., at ports and at certain limited points in the interior. The Port and Warehouse Division will advise the Movement Division of port capacity for loading and discharging ships, and of any change in capacity. It will plan and assist with the repair and construction of all facilities at ports, warehouses, and in connection with coastal and inland water transport. The division will work in close contact with the Shipping Sub-Commission.

8. When rail, road, port, shipping and other facilities are controlled by a military formation, the Movement Division will request an allotment of capacity from the competent military authority.

4. A certain amount of paper work and record keeping is necessary for the Control Office to properly function. Therefore, emergency requests should be restricted to honest emergencies and not include lack of foresight in getting application filed in reasonable time.

In regions the procedure followed will be, as far as possible, to have correspondents accredited by PR Branch and to work Relations in advance of their visits.

occasions may arise, however, when correspondents visit regions without having been to HQ, or when correspondents not generally accredited to HQ (e.g. war correspondents in operational areas) desire to obtain information of HQ or AM? activities. In such cases information should not be withheld by any red-tape considerations: Regional and Provincial Commissioners, SOA and OAOs must, however, ensure that the correspondent holds proper credentials, and they are asked to all such cases to inform PR Branch briefly but immediately of the interview and information given. This ensures (a) that the source of information is known (b) that the correspondent's release can be properly checked if censorship questions arise and (c) that no one correspondent is favoured to the exclusion of others.

8. Since it is highly desirable to change the somewhat critical picture of HQ which has characterized some parts of the Allied Press, it follows that all possible courtesy and consideration should be extended to correspondents. In the event of a major difference of opinion concerning the handling of any news that may affect the operations of the Allied Control Commission in any area, PR Branch should be consulted.

10. It is intended that members of the PR Branch shall visit Regions as frequently as possible in order to keep themselves fully acquainted with Regional problems and developments, and to carry out as far as possible the wishes of Regional Commissioners and their staffs in regard to publicity. Members of the PR Branch will also attend Regional Conferences whenever possible. It is emphasized in this connection that Regional Commissioners should unhesitatingly call on the services of PR Branch for any advice or information they may require on matters of publicity. This Branch will gladly despatch or assign an officer to Regions within limitations of available staff whenever special circumstances so require.

11. The control of newspapers, newsprint, applications for, or withdrawals of, publishing licenses, and all correlated matters in the Italian theatre of operations, fall under the Central and Regional Allied Publications Boards (The Central Board meets fortnightly on Mondays in Naples; the Regional Boards meet weekly on Mondays in Naples, Palermo, Cagliari, Bari and Genoa). All questions concerning newspapers and other publications in Italy will normally be referred to these Boards. The Director of Public Relations is a member of the Central Board; urgent enquiries or complaints may therefore be channelled through PR Branch if required and requests for AGO action by the APB will normally be made through PR Branch.

12. It will be generally agreed that it is essential to maintain the confidence, as well as the interest, of the Allied Nations in the work of the AGO, whose example is bound to be of great value in future operations of a similar kind. PR Branch will use every endeavour to ensure that the news issued and the record kept, are comprehensive, accurate, and well presented. In this endeavour it invites the cooperation of all concerned.

TO : IGOs (thru AGC) England, 3, 4, 5.

1. The Legal Subcommission is anxious to arrange for a systematic supply of information to the Public Relations Officer to form a basis on which the PGO can launch a campaign of deterrent publicity against black market activities through the newspapers and PWs. For this purpose the IGO asked for the following return from all Regional Legal Divisions:

(a) Weekly summaries of the number of cases tried for black market violations, the number of convictions and the length of the average sentence and amount of goods confiscated;

(b) Particulars of outstanding cases of big violators whose crimes are more sensational and whose capture and subsequent conviction reflects credit on the law enforcement machinery of the Allied Control Commission.

2. While I am anxious to give all possible assistance to the PGO on this important matter, it is not my duty to add to the work of legal divisions by calling for additional returns, but I ask you to treat this matter as important and to make from time to time such returns as may be possible without placing an undue strain on your existing facilities and staff. If you cannot make the returns under (a) please do so under (b).

- 5. P.W.S. has at its disposal a mobile loudspeaking unit in addition of course to broadcast facilities and they are anxious to arrange for propaganda to combat crime and disorder in various parts of Italy. Will RUCs and GIs army please transmit to the PWO particulars of any special crime problems with which they are faced in any particular areas (e.g. Black Market in Naples, wire cutting in army areas, breach of public regulations in Foggia) so that P.W.S. can arrange for suitable propaganda to combat the most prevalent crimes in particular localities. The P.W.S. will then arrange with P.W.A. for appropriate propaganda in the particular locality.

6. Generally, in publicity matters, RLOs & SLOs Army will deal direct with the P.R.C., but on no account will cinematograph or sound recordings of actual court proceedings be permitted.

1. Reference 16052/G-1 dated 7th February, 1944. It is requested that permission be granted for sub-commissions (or for this sub-commission) to correspond direct with technical branches of military Headquarters on technical matters.

2. It is laid down in Para. 2(c) that all contact with military formations will be made through the Regional Control and Military Government section, but it would be very convenient to the work of this sub-commission if technical matters could be dealt with direct. We get a good deal of such correspondence over matters of telephone and telegraph installations, not raising matters of policy.

3. This relaxation will correspond to the permission granted in Para. 7(c) for direct correspondence to be made with officers of Regions and ARM Armies on technical detail, although this correspondence if raising any question of policy will take place through the RCMG section.
