1. The above-mentioned N.C.O. has been my Chief Clerk since the formation of this Headquarters at Brindisi in September, 1943.

2. Copies of correspondence are attached showing that it was recommended Sgt. Jellyman be promoted Warrant Officer Class II.

3. I raised the question of what W.E. Sgt.Jellyman would be carried on in November, 1943 and was informed that he was on the X (IV) List and would be subsequently posted to the new establishment. I later received a further statement that the new W.E. had been approved and that all personnel would be posted to it.

On arrival at Salerno I was informed that the W.E. only allowed for one R.Signals Draughtsman and no R.Signals clerks.

4. As the work of this Sub-Commission is definitely technical and only suitable for a R.Signals Chief Clerk, is it possible for an amendment to be made to the War Establishment to conform with that of other Headquarters which always allow for R.Signals personnel?

1. Sgt. Jellyman served as Chief Clerk to the Communications Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission for over two years, up to November 1945 when he returned to United Kingdom on leave and was not permitted to return owing to the proximity of his due date of release from the Army.
2. His work in this Sub-Commission consisted of the supervision of a staff of about ten interpreters clerks and typists including Italian male and female civilians. The Office was organized from its inception by Sgt. Jellyman and the civilian staff was selected and trained by him. The work was made more difficult by the fact that it was of a technical nature and involved a knowledge of Italian.
3. During the period Sgt. Jellyman showed real intelligence initiative and capacity for control of the staff in the execution of his duties and he can be strongly recommended for similar work.
4. I can personally confirm that the following named Officers, who have now left the Allied Commission Italy, but all of whom worked with Sgt. Jellyman, would also be readily prepared to recommend him for the present position on their knowledge of his work in this Sub-Commission.
