SUBJECT: Official Travel by Privately Owned Conveyance Overseas
TO : Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations, MTOUSA

1. Military personnel who travel by privately owned conveyance in a foreign theater, on official business and under competent orders, are entitled to reimbursement at the rate of 3¢ per mile under the provisions of Section 12, Pay Readjustment Act 1942.
2. It is not required that orders specify "travel by privately owned conveyance authorized" (IPA), except for the purpose of authorizing detached service under the provisions of paragraph 1 of (3) AR 605-130.
3. Distances will be computed from any standard road map, highway guide or railway mileage table that may be available. In the absence thereof, speedometer readings are acceptable. Complete citation to the sources of data used to compute such distances will be stated on the voucher.
4. The above information is based on AGWAR cable WCL-38661, dated 24 August 1946 and will be embodied in a MTOUSA Circular to be published at a later date.

SUBJECT : Travel from Italy to Germany.

1. With effect 16 September 1946 applications in respect of all nationals desiring to travel to Germany will be handled by the American and British Embassies in Rome.

2. Applications for the United States zone of Germany will be dealt with by the Military Attaché's office of the American Embassy, and for the British zone by the Travel Section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy; applications for the French zone of Germany, as in the past are dealt with by the Commandement Militaire Prévisto, (Comandato Militaire) at Baden Baden. However, if a person desires to visit the United States zone, or the British and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case for their respective zone clearance.

3. It is the policy of the occupying powers to restrict travel into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel to Germany are specifically not permitted at the present time.

- (a) Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the body or visit the grave of a relative killed in Germany.
(visits by French nationals to zones in the French zone are now allowed by the French authorities).
- (b) Travel to repossess or locate property located by the French, (Reparations, Institutions in the French zone of the British and United States Zones of Germany) have been established to arrange for the repatriation and location of property located by the Germans. The work of these institutions cannot be accomplished if individuals are allowed to enter Germany to locate and remove such property on their own account. All necessary descriptive details should be forwarded by the Government concerned to the Reparations, Institutions and Deliveries Section of the Control Command in Council of the zone concerned).
- (c) Travel to Germany of businessmen, except those travelling under a scheme of sponsorship arranged by the Government of the occupying powers of the zone to which they are proceeding. (The policy to be adopted with regard to private trading is still under review, and, pending a decision, journeys of this nature cannot be approved).
4. All other applications, other than Allied Military personnel travelling on duty, should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and in the cases of approval the necessary Military entry permit will be issued.
5. The categories of travel for travelling Germany are of a far more lenient nature, though transit of Germany is only allowed for essential journeys and when it is necessary to obtain food or accommodation requirements are desired in

3. It is the policy of the competing powers to restrict the level into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel to Germany are specifically not permitted at the present time.

- (a) Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the body or visit the grave of a relative killed in Germany.
(Visits by French nationals to graves in the French zone are now allowed by the French authorities).
- (b) Travel to represent or locate property looted by the Germans, (Reparations, restitution and delivery of the Section of the French, British and United States Control Commissions have been established to arrange for the restitution and location of property looted by the Germans. The work of these sections cannot be accomplished if individuals are allowed to enter Germany to locate and retrieve such property on their own account. All necessary descriptive detail should be forwarded by the Government concerned to the Reparations, Restitutions and Deliveries Section of the Control Commission Council of the zone concerned).
- (c) Travel to Germany of businessmen, except those travelling under a scheme of sponsorship arranged by the Government of the occupying powers of the zone to which they are proceeding. (The policy to be adopted with regard to private trading is still under review, and, pending a decision, journals of this nature must be approved).
- All other applications, other than Allied Military personnel travelling on duty, should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and in the cases of approval the necessary Military entry permit will be issued.

5. The categories of travel for transiting Germany are of a far more lenient nature, though transit of Germany is only allowed for essential journeys and when petrol, oil, lubricants, transport, food or accommodation requirements are desired in Germany; in all cases the valid passport or visa for the country of destination is also required before an application can be considered.

6. Here again all applications complying with the above requirements should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and the issue of a Military entry permit for the approved cases.

7. The above is passed for information, and attention is drawn to the necessity of all applicants being in possession of passports validated for travel in Germany.

SUBJECT: Travel between Italy and Austria.

1. This Division's letter CU. 339-506/13-3 dated 12 July 1946 is cancelled with effect 16 September 1946 from which date the following procedure will be in force for travel between Italy and Austria.
2. Travel from Italy to Austria:
All persons desiring to go to or transit Austria, with the exception of the following two categories, must make application to the Austrian Political Representative, Viale Venezia 113, 1010, for an Austrian visa.
(a) American, British, French and Russian nationals.
(b) Any national sponsored by one of the four occupying powers to go into its zone.
The Military Attaché of the American Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above, desiring to go to the U.S. Zone of Austria and the travel section of the American Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above desiring to go to the British Zone of Austria; applications for the French Zone of Austria, as in the past are dealt with by the Consulate Militaire Francoise, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Guidoni, Rome. However if a person desires to visit the United States and France at the British and French Zones, the British or British Embassy will make application for the French visa also. ^{18/2}
as they refer the case for their respective visa clearance.

3. Travel from Austria to Italy.
All applications other than American, British or Polish Service personnel, must make application to the Italian Consulate in Vienna, or to his representative in Washington, for an Italian entry visa. American, British and Polish service personnel are the only exceptions from Italian visas and may enter Italy on valid travel orders.
It is pointed out that before it is possible to leave Austria, an exit permit is required by all nationals except American, British, French or Russian; this is obtained by making application to the local Austrian Police Headquarters.

4. The above is passed for information and it is pointed out that the Public Safety Sub-Ordination, Allied Conscription, and 3-2 (CI) A.P.M., will no longer be concerned with applications for visas or permits for travel between Italy and Austria.

2. Travel from Italy to Austria:
 All persons desiring to go to or transit Austria, with the exception of the following two categories, will require a visa from the Austrian Political Representative, Viale Carlo D'Amico, 103, Roma, for an Austrian visa.
- (a) American, British, French and Russian nationals.
 - (b) Any national represented by one of the four occupying powers to go into the zone.
- The Military Section of the Italian Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above, desiring to go to the U.S. Zone of Austria and the travel section of the Italian Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above desiring to go to the British Zone of Austria; applications for the French Zone of Austria, as in the past are dealt with by the Communications Intelligence Service, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Cavour, Rome. However if a person desires to visit the United States and France & the Italian and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the passport and clearance *18/2* as they enter the zone for their respective zone clearance.

3. Travel from Austria to Italy.
 All applications other than American, British or Polish Service personnel, must make application to the Italian Consulate in Vienna, or to his representative in the United States, for an Italian entry visa. American, British and Polish service personnel are the only exemptions from Italian visas and may enter Italy on valid travel orders.
 It is pointed out that before it is possible to leave Austria, an exit permit is required by all nationals except American, British, French or Russian; this is obtained by making application to the local Austrian Police Headquarters.

The above is passed for information and it is pointed out that the Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, and G-2 (SI) A.P.S.I., will no longer be concerned with applications for visas or permits for travel between Italy and Austria.

Subject: Civilians Travelling in U.D. Transport.

See distribution below.

1. G.O. 345/45 specifically forbids the conveyance of civilians in vehicles owned or hired by the U.D. except when such civilians are :-

- a) Government officials or
- b) Travelling on official business directly connected with military matters
- c) Civilians employees of the U.D. or
- d) Accredited British cons-followers whether of officer status or not eg. WSA, CWM, SSAA, WWS etc.

This prohibition includes transport of civilians in transport for social purposes.

2. All civilians enumerated in para 1 travelling in vehicles owned or hired by the U.D. will be in possession of a pass as shown at Appendix 'A' to this instruction, and all other civilians so travelling will be required to sign an identity certificate as shown at Appendix 'B'.

3. In the case of civilians other than those enumerated in para 1 travelling in U.D. transport the drivers of such transport will be in possession of an authority as shown at Appendix 'C' to this instruction.

4. Proforma as at Appendices 'A', 'B' & 'C' may be obtained from the U.D.O. (B) on application by Vice Presidents, Heads of Section etc. showing the number of civilians to be carried, the purpose for which transport is required, the route to be followed and that conveyance by civilian transport agencies is in the circumstances impracticable.

5. Any abuse of this concession will result in its immediate withdrawal.

2. All civilians enumerated in para 1 travelling in vehicles owned or hired by the W.D. will be in possession of a pass as shown at Appendix 'A' to this instruction, and all other civilians so travelling will be required to sign an indemnity certificate as shown at Appendix 'B'.

3. In the case of civilians other than those enumerated in para 1 travelling in W.D. transport the drivers of such transport will be in possession of an authority as shown at Appendix 'C' to this instruction.

4. Preference as at Appendixes 'A', 'B' & 'C' may be obtained from the G.H.O. (B) on Application by Vice President, Heads of Section etc. stating the number of civilians to be carried, the purpose for which transport is required, the route to be followed and best conveyance by civilian transport is in the circumstances practicable.

5. Any abuse of this concession will result in its withdrawal.

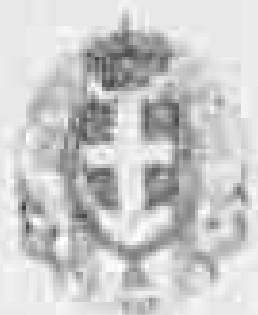

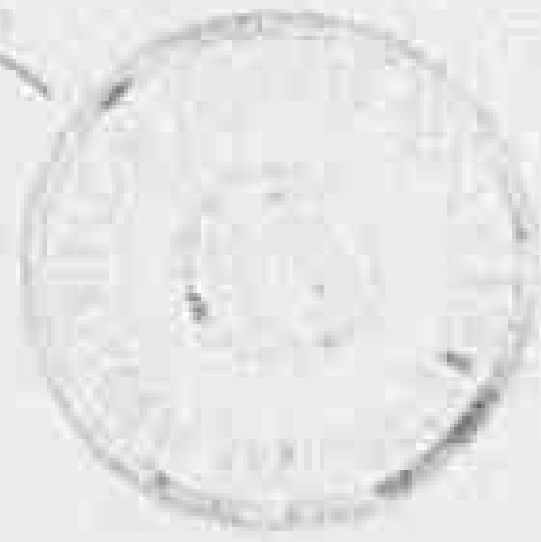

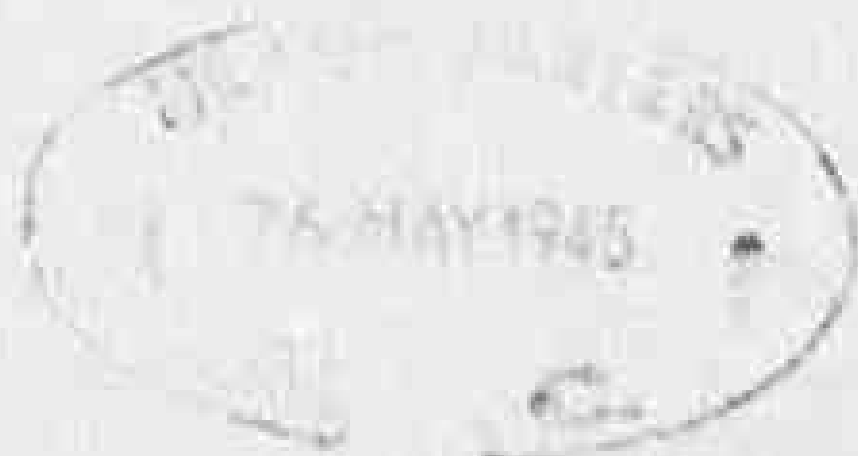

1. Prior to the war all maintenance of the State telephone and telegraph lines by the various Circoli was done by individual linemen located at strategic points travelling on freight trains to the point of trouble and effecting repairs, returning the same way.
2. At the present time the only alternative is to walk or ride bicycle, but shoes and tyres are scarce, and the method is entirely too slow. In fact the method is practically impossible due to the distances covered. Motor transport is not available.
3. With the release for civil communications of all the Provinces of Tuscany except Apuania the problem rapidly increases as more lines are put in service. Maintenance is greater than before due to the deteriorated condition of the plant during the fighting, and the necessity for using recovered material for repairs.
4. It is requested that consideration be given to issuing some kind of permit to Circolo repairmen to travel by freight train, with his bicycle, if necessary. Each permit should allow the bearer to travel to the limits of his maintenance area only.
5. If such system is possible this office will furnish the names and other information required for a minimum number of linemen in those areas through which train service is available.

1. It is requested that the authority to issue passes given under para 8 (h) to the M.R.S. be extended to this Sub-Commission for the specific purpose of postal messengers movement.
2. The military authorities have in the past agreed to the establishment of civil postal services well into Army territory, for the exact purpose of preventing movement of civilians in order to obtain news.
3. The services themselves however require a limited amount of movement of mail escort personnel. Great difficulty is encountered in getting departmental employees the necessary passes in time to keep regular scheduled journeys, generally by M.R.S. train.
