3. Newsprint and printing paper were and remain under the control of the Allied Publications Board (APB). At present negotiations are pending between APB and the Italian Authority with a view to handing over the control of these materials in liberated Italy to a competent Italian Agency. A decision in this matter is expected in the near future.

4. However, until the time arrives when the new system is put into operation, the freezing and releasing of printing paper and newsprint rests as heretofore within the jurisdiction of APB, and these materials are not subject in any way to the terms of the a/m. directive.

TO :- Distribution below.

This H.Q. has been informed that P.O.L. has been drawn on behalf of vehicles of this Commission from C.I.P.

It is intended that C.I.P. shall supply W.D. vehicles when no W.D. source of supply is available, but this should be avoided whenever possible.

P.O.L. supplies are laid down by C.I.P. at selected points in such quantities as are necessary to meet the known demand, which normally consists of allocations made by Petrol Section A.P.H.Q. for civilian purposes.

It is therefore essential that except in emergency this formation should only draw from C.I.P. stocks when previous warning of the demand has been given in time to allow C.I.P. to make the necessary increase in demand.

All Regions etc. who expect to draw from C.I.P. stocks will give C.I.P. notice of the anticipated demand and will forward copy of such demand to this H.Q.

Any Region etc. which is at present operating such an arrangement with C.I.P. is requested to inform this H.Q. of the amount of the demand or in the case of Sicily Region to confirm that figures given in cable S1625 of 24 June 1944 are unaltered.

No officer of this Headquarters will, without approval from G-1 (B), in the case of British officers, or from G-1 (A), in the case of American officers, and from the appropriate section, branch or sub-commission, in all cases, visit the offices of a higher formation for the discussion of personal affairs, such as transfer, reassignment, release, assignment to AC, etc.

2. The provisions of this directive apply both to assigned and attached officers, and will be considered to include contacts with Hq, AAI, and G-5, AFHQ.

Discipline, Supervision, and Control of Allied

1. The Chief of Staff has ruled that the Regional Commissioner will be responsible for the discipline of all A.C. Officers in the Region and for the general supervision and control of their work.

2. This responsibility is delegated to Zone Commissioners in respect of all A.C. Officers whose activities are confined more or less to the Zone concerned. Officers with wider spheres of action will come under Region HQ.

3. The ruling does NOT apply, of course, to HQ A.C. Officers visiting the Region on duty.

4. Officers on duty in this Region, other than HQ A.C. Officers on official visits, will conform to the following rules:

a. They will report to the Regional Commissioner on their arrival in the Region. If, of necessity, they go direct to a distant Zone, they will report to the Zone Commissioner. Similarly they will report to the Regional or Zone Commissioner on their departure.

b. Changes of location of such officers will normally take place on Regional Movement Orders. If HQ A.C. Movement orders are received direct by the officer, he will, of course, carry out the order promptly, but before doing so, he must inform his Zone Commissioner, who will inform Regional Headquarters.

c. Presumably all communications to such officers on important policy matters will be routed through Regional HQ, but if the officer receives communication on such matters direct, he will supply a copy promptly to the Zone Commissioner for the transmission to this HQ.

d. The Officer will supply the Zone Commissioner with one copy of every message or letter on important policy which he dispatches, and will keep in general contact with the Zone Commissioner.

e. The Officer may sign his letters as a member of his Sub-Commission if this has been his practice. If he requires the wider

d. The Officer will supply the Zone Commissioner with one copy of every message or letter on important policy which he dispatches, and will keep in general contact with the Zone Commissioner.

e. The Officer may sign his letters as a member of his Sub-Commission if this has been his practice. If he requires the wider authority conferred by signing for the Zone Commissioner or for the Regional Commissioner, he must consult the Commissioner concerned before doing so.

f. Zone Commissioners will be responsible for coordinating the work of such officers with the other activities of the Zone and such officers will be careful not to take any steps, technical or otherwise, which may have effects outside the spheres of his own activities without obtaining the prior approval of Zone Commissioner.

5. It is NOT desired to interfere in any way with an AC officer in carrying out his normal duties. The job is the important thing. But an AC officer working in the Region must realize that, unless the Regional Commissioner and Zone Commissioners are kept constantly and promptly advised on all important matters, they will be unable to exercise supervision and control in accordance with the Chief of Staff's instruction or, for that matter, to help the officer in his job by use of their wider authority and more ample resources.

6. In short, all AC officers working in this Region are to be built into the Regional team, with all the responsibilities and whatever advantages that may entail.

TO : All Sub-Commissions, Branches, this HQ.
(ATTN: Authorizing Officer for Civilian Payrolls)

1. The manner in which payrolls are at present prepared is highly unsatisfactory, and a great amount of unnecessary work and loss of time is entailed in consequence.

2. In order that the present standard may be improved the following instructions are issued for strict compliance by the officers responsible for the preparation of payrolls:

(a) Employees on a daily rate will not be paid for Sundays, unless they work on those days.

(b) Employees on a monthly rate will be paid half of that rate (if a full month is worked) on each payroll. Payrolls will be submitted for 13-day periods, the working month being 26 days. In cases where overtime pay is due, the monthly rate should be divided by twenty-six (26) to determine the daily rate.

(c) It is of the greatest importance that the exact nature of the work of each employee be entered on payrolls, and the function as shown must coincide with one of the official grades.

(d) In a great many cases employees are shown as "Secretary", or "Executive Secretary". It is emphasized that no such grade exists in AMC/ACC (officers do not have "Secretaries") and it is requested that the function of employees who have been so described without be accurately stated, e.g. typist, clerk.

I ---- UNAUTHORIZED FIRING OF WEAPONS

Paragraph 3, Section III, AFHQ Circular Number 22, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"3. Instructions to all convoy commanders moving armed troops over land routes in this theater will include a statement as follows:

'The organizational commander or convoy commander will be held responsible that there is no firing of weapons of any type by the personnel in the unit or convoy, at wires, poles, insulators, or other objects, during the march'."

II --- OFFICIAL MAIL

Paragraph 3a, AFHQ Circular Number 18, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"3. Air Dispatch Letter Service

a. Definition: The AFHQ-ADLS is a service established by this headquarters to provide fast safe delivery of all official dispatches warranting a No. One Air Priority to major headquarters within this theater. OFFICIAL DISPATCHES for ADLS transmission are defined as those instructions, reports, orders, documents, including their inclosures such as photographs, marked or special maps or other intelligence, submitted for transmission by Signal Means. They do not include printed matter such as blank forms, texts, regulations, circulars, or maps in bulk, captured material or documents, or supplies of any kind. AIR FREIGHT, U.S. ARMY POSTAL SERVICE AND BRITISH POSTAL SERVICE are provided and designated for such items. Requests for air shipment of Classified and Unclassified items contested by A.D.L.S. receiving office and unrated for transmission by postal services will be submitted to the appropriate Screening Agency (G-4 Mov & Tr for this Headquarters) for obtaining Priority for air shipment. Classified or Unclassified items suited for postal transmission and contested by A.D.L.S. will be directed to postal channels.

ADLS operates in close conjunction with the AIR FORCES and with Motor Dispatch Letter services of subordinate units. ADLS FIELD OFFICES functioning directly under this headquarters will be established on main route airfields to receive and deliver dispatches to Air Couriers. Delivery or collection of dispatches to units in the vicinity is not the responsibility of FIELD OFFICES which act only as segregation and collecting points. They rely on unit IDLS

to contact them for forward transmission of outgoing dispatches and collection of incoming dispatches. The AFHQ-ADLS must not be confused with Army Courier Service (ACS) which is operated by the War Department or with regular air mail service operated by the Army Postal Service (APO). AFHQ-ADLS emphasizes tactical messenger service to forward elements."

EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO UNITED STATES

OR BRITISH NATIONALS

PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED BY OFFICERS

OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

1. Having regard to the relatively low rate of relief payments being made by Italian organizations in territory coming under Allied Military Government and Allied Control Commission jurisdiction, officers of the Commission are hereby authorized to accord emergency financial assistance in the form of advances to United States or British nationals who are in need thereof, within the limits imposed and providing the conditions set out herein are fulfilled.

2. Applicants for emergency financial assistance will complete, in quintuplicate, Section (A) of a REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO U.S./BRITISH NATIONALS (Form F/10A Appendix A) for U.S. nationals or Form F/10B (Appendix B for British nationals). These forms will be presented by the applicants, together with the documents substantiating their nationality and identity, to the officer of the Commission concerned. Each copy of the REQUEST must be signed by the applicant and care must be taken to see that all of the particulars called for on the forms are duly filled in.

3. In the case of U.S. nationals, officers of the Commission may approve advances only to persons submitting one of the following documents:

- (a) A U.S. Passport valid on 30 June 1941.
- (b) A U.S. Certificate of Registration valid on 30 June 1941.
- (c) A letter from a U.S. diplomatic or consular officer informing the individual that his or her application for registration has been approved by the State Department for a period extending beyond 30 June 1941, or
- (d) Evidence that payments have in the past been made by Swiss diplomatic representatives for the State Department.

4. In the case of British nationals, officers of the Commission may approve advances only if the applicant submits an Empire passport valid on 11 June 1940.

It is noted that the documents substantiating the above are not required in the case of British nationals.

3. In the case of U.S. nationals, officers of the Commission may approve ²² advances only to persons submitting one of the following documents:
 - (a) A U.S. Passport valid on 30 June 1941.
 - (b) A U.S. Certificate of Registration valid on 30 June 1941.
 - (c) A letter from a U.S. diplomatic or consular officer informing the individual that his or her application for registration has been approved by the State Department for a period extending beyond 30 June 1941, or
 - (d) Evidence that payments have in the past been made by Swiss diplomatic representatives for the State Department.
4. In the case of British nationals, officers of the Commission may approve advances only if the applicant submits an Empire passport valid on 11 June 1940.
5. If the officer of the Commission is satisfied that the documents substantiating the nationality of the applicant, as defined in paras 3 and 4 above, and the documents evidencing his or her identity are in order, he will complete section (B) on all five copies of the REQUEST, fixing the amount which may be advanced within the limits prescribed hereinafter.
6. If the applicant is unable to produce the documents specified in para 3 above, all five copies of the REQUEST together with pertinent supporting documents will be transmitted through the Regional Commissioner to the nearest American Consul General for a decision as to nationality. The American Consul General will indicate on all copies of the REQUEST his opinion as to citizenship status and the interviewing officer will be guided accordingly. In the case of British applicants, doubtful cases should be forwarded to the Finance Sub-Commission who will refer the documents to the appropriate authorities for a decision. An exception is made in that Military authorities dealing with British Prisoners of War may, after interrogation, certify the nationality of applicants claiming British nationality who do not possess British Empire passports valid on 11 June 1940.

7. The various copies of the REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE will be disposed of in accordance with the instructions printed at the foot thereof.

8. It should be noted that retroactive payments are not authorized; financial assistance commences as of the date of application. It is emphasized that the rates of payment authorized in para. 10 are maximum and it is expected that wherever possible, the actual sums advanced will be less than the permitted maximum and such advances should in no event be more than enough to provide for minimum essential needs.

9. In all cases the advances will be made in lire, but the obligations are fixed in terms of legal tender dollars of the United States in the case of U.S. nationals, and in terms of legal tender sterling of the United Kingdom in the case of British nationals. The advances to U.S. nationals may be repaid either in legal tender dollars, or in lire equivalent to the dollar amount, calculated at the rate of exchange prevailing on the date of repayment. Advances to British nationals, however, may be repaid either in legal tender sterling or in lire equivalent to the sterling amount, calculated at the rate of exchange prevailing on the date on which the advance was granted. A RECEIPT VOUCHER (Form F/1) will be made out in the usual manner in support of any LIRE repayments received by officers of the Commission, with a reference thereon to the approved REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; Sub-accountants will prepare and submit three certified true copies of this voucher to the Finance Sub-Commission at A.C.C. Headquarters.

10. Until further notice, payments will be limited to a maximum of lire 4,000 (four thousand lire) per month per U.S. or British national and to not more than lire 12,000 (twelve thousand lire) per month per household. In considering applications for advances submitted by U.S. nationals, officers of the Commission will deduct from the above maximum the total sums received as remittances from abroad by the applicant or his household during the month immediately preceding the date of the application. The applicants certificate should be accepted as prima facie evidence. Where the amount of the remittances received exceeds the above limits no advance will be made. 15. Advances will be shown in the books and accounts of the Allied Financial Agency under "ADVANCES - To Allied Nationals"; separate accounts will be maintained by the Allied Financial Agency in sub-ledgers for each individual to whom payments are made.

16. Applicants should be informed that the financial assistance provided must not be considered as public bounty but as loans from public funds to U.S. and British nationals finding themselves in an abnormal position by reasons of the war. It is accordingly expected that, as already indicated, all sums advanced will eventually be repaid. However, the ability to repay is not to be considered as an essential condition to financial assistance and U.S. or British nationals able to qualify therefor should in no event be refused payment simply because they cannot foresee a time when they will be able to repay the sums advanced.

17. Claimants should be informed that remittances may be received from the United States and the United Kingdom through the Banco di Sicilia and the Banco di Napoli and they should be invited to contact their banks or relatives in those countries through the civilian mails requesting them to remit funds. British subjects who have money, or other assets in the United Kingdom, at present blocked by the Custodian of Enemy Property may apply to the Foreign Office for the release thereof. A standard form of application is in course of preparation and will be available shortly.

INSTRUCTIONS TO FINANCE OFFICERS IN REGIONS
TRANSFERRED TO THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

1. (a) The instrument of surrender, between the Italian Government and the United Nations reserves very broad authority to enable the Finance Sub-Commission to carry out its functions.

(b) Even after the Italian Government takes over legal responsibility for new areas, it may not be able at that time to function effectively throughout such areas. Consequently, it may be necessary for Finance Sub-Commission personnel in the field as well as at Headquarters to perform activities in the same manner as they have been performing them under Allied Military Government conditions. Gradually, as the Italian government can more effectively administer the area, certain of the functions performed by financial personnel of Allied Military Government will be performed by the Italian Government.

(c) Further instructions will be issued from time to time indicating the changes in procedures to be followed, as a result of arrangements worked out between Headquarters of the Finance Sub-Commission and the Italian Ministries of Finance and Treasury.

2. Allied Financial Agency

The functions of Allied Financial Agency in Allied Military Government territory will remain unchanged from those of Allied Military Financial Agency. In Italian Government territory, Allied Financial Agency will continue existing procedures in furnishing funds to Allied military formations and for the administrative expenses of the Allied Control Commission, for supplying funds to the Sub-Commissions of the Commission and in receiving the proceeds of sales of Allied Control Commission imports sold locally. 3. Budgets, Revenue and Expenditure Control

(a) When territory is transferred from Allied Military Government to Italian Government jurisdiction, the change is facilitated by the existence of approved budgets on the SB or IGB forms for all State and parastatal offices, provinces and communes. As AMG budget procedure was modelled on the Italian system no break in the continuity of control will occur, and as new provinces are turned over to the Italian Government the information will be incorporated into the Italian Government budget in force for the area. From the date of the transfer of territory no cash advances or authorizations of credit of any kind may be made by Finance Officers in the field. All financing of State and local government functions will be the direct responsibility of the Italian Government. The Combined Chiefs of Staff require that sufficient control and scrutiny of Italian Governmental expenditures be maintained so that the Allied Control Commission is satisfied that the amounts of such expenditure are reasonable and appropriate. Accordingly, arrangements have been made with the Italian Government to submit current and past revenue and expenditure data, with a break-down by provinces, showing the purpose of all expenditures, including military expenditure, public debt, salaries, etc., and the source of revenue.

(b) Budgets have been prepared and are in operation for all divisions of the State Government for the current financial year (1st July, 1944 to 30th June, 1945),

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and these budgets will be adjusted from time to time as new areas are brought under Italian jurisdiction. Control over expenditures has been strengthened by the re-establishment of the Corte dei Conti, which maintains close liaison with, and regularly reports all its operations to, the Finance Sub-Commission. Each Italian Ministry is required to report detailed figures of expenditures authorized and disbursements made. Verification of these figures is obtained from the monthly returns from the Treasury section of the Bank of Italy and the Ufficio di Collegamento. The budgets of communes and provinces cover the current calendar year, and with the re-establishment of the Central Commission for Local Finance, the proper normal Italian controls are in operation. General control over all local government expenditures is obtained through periodic reports from the Ministries of Treasury and Interior.

(c) Finance Sub-Commission Headquarters will review the material submitted to it by the Italian Government. Headquarters in certain instances may ask Finance Officers in the field to provide additional statistics and to check certain parts of such data, or otherwise to investigate governmental expenditure and revenue problems in the areas to which they are assigned.

(d) In view of the inflationary situation that exists and the need for reducing the deficit in Italian State and local budgets, it is the function of the Finance Sub-Commission and Finance Officers in the field to study the governmental expenditures and revenue situation constantly with a view to ascertaining:-

- (i) What expenditure can be reduced or eliminated;
- (ii) What changes in existing budgetary control should be made by Italian State or local government;
- (iii) What changes should be made in tax laws and revenue administration.

4.

Customs

(a) Italian customs activity will be resumed in all areas not specifically reserved to Allied Naval or military operations, and to the latter as and when they are released. The Finance Officers will maintain liaison between Army and Navy operations Officers and the Italian Customs service to the end that a continuous customs barrier may be maintained on the perimeter of reserved areas.

(b) Close contact with the principal Italian Customs Officer of the Region will be maintained.

(c) Failure of personnel of the P. Guardia di Finanza or of the Capitaneria di Porto properly to perform customs related functions should be immediately reported.

(d) The principal customs offices will be visited from time to time and a report submitted on any irregular or unusual features.

(e) The Italian Customs service will function in accordance with the existing Customs laws and regulations except as regards the levying and collection of Customs Import and Export duties and Licence Fees, which, with the exception of petroleum for which duty-inclusive retail prices have been fixed, are to be treated

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(d) The principal customs offices will be visited from time to time and a report submitted on any irregular or unusual features.

(e) The Italian Customs service will function in accordance with the existing Customs laws and regulations except as regards the levying and collection of Customs Import and Export duties and Licence Fees, which, with the exception of Petroleum, for which duty-inclusive retail prices have been fixed, are to be treated as temporarily suspended. A directive on this subject will shortly be issued.

(f) Internal taxes, e.g. the Imposte Fabbricazioni (Manufacturing Taxes), are not suspended and remain chargeable on all importations for civilian use. The Imposte sull'Entrata is chargeable on all imports or export commercial transactions subject thereto under existing Italian law.

5.

Financial Institutions

(a) The function of supervising social and private insurance institutions, post office financial services, stock exchanges, banks, and all other financial and credit institutions is primarily the responsibility of the Italian Government. Finance officers in the field will give every assistance possible to aid the government supervisory agencies, including the Banca d'Italia, performing their tasks efficiently.

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(b) Finance officers will keep Headquarters advised of important financial developments in their areas, will make suggestions and recommendations for the formulation of policy, and will call to the attention of Headquarters any matters which should be discussed with the Italian central government.

(c) As impartial representatives in the field, Finance officers will perform a vital function in observing and reporting how the broad financial directives of the central government (anti-inflation program - prohibition of financing of speculative activity, credits to be made available to necessary productive enterprises, etc.) are applied in the provinces.

(d) The accounts and safe deposit boxes which have been blocked are to remain under such restrictions, subject to licensing through the appropriate Italian governmental channels.

(e) Information as to any additional persons or institutions to be blocked should be furnished to Headquarters, Finance Sub-Commission for transmittal to the Italian government for appropriate action.

(f) The administration by the Italian government of the blocking program will be diligently observed. Any violation of the general principle that the use of funds is to be withheld from dangerous fascist elements will be reported to Headquarters, Finance Sub-Commission, at once.

6. Foreign Exchange and Trading with the Enemy

The Italian Government will maintain a system of foreign exchange control and will control all trade communications with any area other than Italian areas under Allied Control. Violation of such Italian control or laxness in the enforcement of such controls will be reported by Finance Officers in the field to Headquarters in order that appropriate representations may be made to the Italian authorities.

7. Financial and Economic Intelligence

Finance Officers in the field will obtain and furnish to Headquarters all categories of financial and economic intelligence that will be of assistance to Headquarters in dealing with its varied functions. Headquarters will from time to time request Finance Officers in the field to make certain studies and obtain certain financial or economic information or intelligence.

8. General

Finance Officers in the field will be the means for obtaining relevant data and information on subjects of interest to the Finance Sub-Commission, of checking to see that programs issued by the Finance Sub-Commission and agreed to by the Italian authorities are carried out, and to report whether Italian personnel are properly discharging their functions in the field of finance or are unfit to carry on such activities.
