This revised Executive Memorandum No. 37 is issued in the light of experience gained in the working of the original memorandum No. 67 of 5 July 1944, which is hereby abrogated. The policy and the principle of operation remain the same.

Our object is to remove from territory, immediately on liberation, all leading fascists from important posts, especially those collaborationists put in office by the Republican Fascist Government. This memorandum is intended as a guide for such an initial purge.

It will be followed by a more detailed purge under CO 37 and ultimately by the procedure under CO 153, i.e. via enabling decrees and therefore this directive is not concerned with minor posts or insignificant officials; they can be dealt with later. The Allies must decide, how far I propose by quickly removing the leading fascists from the important posts.

Every official will have been "hired" in office by the Republican Fascist Govt and others will have taken the oath of allegiance to the Fascist Government; on the other hand, others will be career officials who have considered it their duty to stick to their posts in the interests of the civil administration; others, again, remain at their posts at great peril (it is understood from reliable reports) and have refused to take the oath of allegiance. Wholesale dismissals are, therefore, to be avoided as much injustice may be done quite apart from rendering it difficult to carry on the administration.

It is safe to assume that the worst fascists will be removed by CO 37 before arrival of the Allies; the remainder of those in office will be dealt with in accordance with this directive.

Two lists attached to the original memorandum have been brought up-to-date and set out in a more convenient form.

Appendix 'A' to this memorandum contains a list of important Italian governmental and ministerial officers which should be checked of fascist personnel as quickly as possible. Other officials of lower rank who are well known and too numerous to list individually in this stage should not be considered.

Appendix 'B' contains a list of mainly fascist officials and serves as a guide to the type of fascist posts which are particularly abominable.

If one or two lists still normally be used together. Thus if it is found that a man who occupied one of the offices in Appendix 'A' and also has had one of the appointments contained in Appendix 'B' he should be removed at once.

If there is any doubt as to the fascist background of any person holding an office included in Appendix 'A' he may be required to complete a Schedule 'B' form. The Provincial Commissioner may, if he considers it desirable, consult the Director of CIN or any authority case. No attention will be paid to any such recommendations.

Persons suspended under this memorandum, except those in paragraphs 8 and 9, will be paid on the same basis as persons suspended under CO 153. Commodity

all corporations, of which have been dissolved by decree thereof, are deemed no longer
to exist; so that any of those in such organisations will probably have fled, but
if any such are found attempting to hold any office or to exercise any executive
functions in connection therewith, they will be removed from office.

 5. Was during the Fascist regime, a member of:
the Central Government, the Senate, the Chamber of Deputies, the National Council, the Grand Council, the Tribunali Speciali, the Tribunali Straordinari Provinciali.
 6. Conducted public advocacy of Fascism either over the radio, in the press, or otherwise. In whatever capacity, author, speaker, editor, director, or promoter.
 7. Was decorated or promoted or otherwise rewarded for political services by the Republican, Nazi or German Governments.
 8. Has taken the oath of allegiance to the Fascist Republican Government.

NOTE: All expressions referring to any Fascist organization include the equivalent Reparidicar Fascist organization.

SUBJECT: Recruitment of U. S. Army Officers of the Allied Commission for Employment with the Foreign Economic Administration and State Department.

TO : U. S. Army Officers assigned to 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission, (Overhead).

1. There is in the process of development a procedure which will enable U. S. Army officers who have evidenced their desire to do so, and who are found to be qualified, to be relieved from active duty from the Army of the United States and immediately re-employed in this headquarters for a position with the appropriate U. S. Government civilian agency.

2. The purpose of this letter is to advise you that there will be a limited number of civilian employment opportunities open and to afford you a chance to be considered for one of them in the event your qualifications are related to one of the positions to be filled.

3. The U. S. Government employees who will fill these assignments will be recruited from either or both of the two following sources:

- a. Present Army officer (U.S.) personnel of the Allied Commission.
- b. Civilians recruited in the United States.

The former source will be given initial preference.

4. The employing agencies will be the Foreign Economic Administration and the Auxiliary Foreign Service of the State Department. The Foreign Economic Administration is a war agency created by the President to bring together in one organization all United States foreign economic functions. Included in the work of this Administration are the responsibility for administering the Lend-Lease program and the conducting of the United States economic warfare activities. Employment with the FEA in this theater will be of indefinite duration but will continue for as long after the termination of European hostilities as a need exists for independent agency representation in Italy. When the FEA Italian assignment has been completed, personnel will be eligible to be considered for other foreign assignments or work in Washington, D. C. "The State Department will employ suitably qualified officers in the Auxiliary Foreign Service of the United States. Officers accepted in this service will continue to serve in the Allied Commission in Italy as long as they are needed and will then be subject to appointment at a diplomatic or consular post where their services may be needed."

5. All officers are eligible to apply for these positions, however, all applications from officers thirty-one years of age or under will have to be forwarded to the War Department for special consideration. All Army officers (U.S.) who are relieved from active duty for these positions will be considered as having served honorably and will be eligible for all pay and allowances accorded after honorable separation from the service, except for accumulated leave.

6. If you are interested in receiving consideration for any civilian position for which you might be found qualified, will you immediately so indicate, designating the agency in which you are primarily interested. In the event a favorable return is received from you, you will be advised as soon as possible whether any position exists for which you might be considered. At the same time you will be furnished with full particulars regarding any specific position for which you appear to be qualified. If, after receipt of this advice, you indicate your desire to be recommended for appointment to the position in question, subject to a favorable interview, your case will be promptly referred through AFHQ to Washington for consideration and action.

Vice Presidents will impress upon the Directors of their Sub-Commissions, and Directors of independent Sub-Commissions upon their officers, the necessity of implementing the policy of the CCS directive defining the new relations of the Allied Commission with the Italian Government, especially with respect to the following paragraph:

"The Staff of Allied Commission Headquarters should occupy itself primarily with consultation and advice to the Italian Government at high levels."

2. Experience during the last six months has shown that whereas officers in the field have been careful to avoid executive action or speech with officials of the Provincial governments, there has been a tendency at HQ for officers in the Sub-Commissions to forget that the dropping of the "G" from A.C.C. was intended to convert the relations between the Allied Commission and the Italian Government to those of adviser (and provider of supplies) on the one hand and of a sovereign government on the other. I have heard reports of discussions and conferences which lead me to think that more forceful measures than advice have been used to persuade - if indeed not to compel - the Italian Government to accept the views of the Allied Commission and come into line. In some instances these measures have been taken by subordinate officers of Sub-Commissions speaking perhaps to subordinate officials of the Italian Government. But the effect has been the same - and is unfortunate. The Italians presume that every member of the Commission speaks with the authority of the Chief Commissioner and they suffer, in their estimation, from a multiplicity of masters, and the application of conflicting policies of "advice" and "control".

3. In future, therefore, Vice Presidents and Directors of Sub-Commissions will ensure that such formal advice as it may be necessary to convey to the Italian Government is given by Vice Presidents or their Deputies or by Directors of Sub-Commissions, to Ministers or Under-Secretaries. At lower levels officers should refrain from giving formal advice and should restrict their functions to verbal consultation and discussion, expressing informally and unofficially any advice which they may feel should be given and would have the complete approval of their Director or Vice President. Generally speaking, in all their dealings with members of the Italian Government on matters affecting Italian Government territory, officers must act with diplomacy and tact rather than as mentors or

1. ~~Installations:~~

a. Motor Parks not within a guarded building will be surrounded by barbed wire fencing with one entrance and one exit which will be guarded by military personnel. Specific Orders preventing unauthorized persons from entering or leaving the park will be issued.

b. Ration Rooms whether they are within a mess hall or warehouse will be fenced with ordinary chicken wire whenever a probable means of entry other than a door is noticed. Door will be kept locked when room is not occupied by military personnel and only one key should be in the possession of the responsible military representative.

c. Supply Rooms (same as above)

2. Guard Towers:

a. Guard towers will be erected in the case of extremely large motor parks where lack of sufficient military guards prevails or where large quantities of supplies are stored under canvas.

3. Guards:

a. Motor parks or garages will have guards posted 24 hours per day. During the daylight hours dispatcher may be utilized as guard provided that the motor park has only one means of entrance.

b. Ration rooms and warehouses will be guarded constantly. Guard may be a Charge of Quarters who will make tours of the premises at irregular and frequent intervals during hours of darkness.

4. Entrances and Exits:

a. Entrances and exits of all installations will have guards posted whenever practicable. If not practicable due to lack of personnel, entrances and exits will be kept locked at all times and opened only after identification of authorized personnel.

b. Office furniture such as typewriters and adding machines will be placed under lock and key upon leaving the respective office where the item is in use. Guards at exits will be instructed to examine all parcels that appear large enough to cover equipment of this type.

SOP Supply Security Control (cont'd)

c. In addition to General Orders, Special Orders will be issued from time to time depending upon the necessity, locality and situation.

5. Flood lights:

a. Flood lights will be utilized on all open car parks, entrances and exits which are in function during the night. Lights will be erected high enough so that the maximum exposed area will be illuminated.

6. Traffic Control:

a. In car parks, motor pools, supply installations and exposed supply dumps, one way traffic will be maintained wherever practicable. This will be in coordination with the entrance and exit instructions, thereby prohibiting any vehicle from exiting without surveillance from the appointed guard.

7. Pass System:

a. Pass system will be initiated in any military installation where a group of more than 15 laborers is employed. Passes should bear the name printed and the signature of both the laborer and officer authorizing the barrier entrance to the installation.

8. Guards and Laborers:

a. Guards will be checked at frequent intervals to satisfy the responsible officer that guards are fully aware of their responsibilities. Laborers who physically handle U. S. supplies must be cautioned and checked for all possible means of pilferage. A physical search prior to daily departure of each laborer will be made by an officer or the commander of the unit. Vehicles will be checked for loads, and guards will be mounted on trucks. Vehicles will be checked for loads, and guards will be mounted on the rear of each truck whenever possible.

9. Checks and Tallies:

a. A single debit and credit system will be maintained on all items stocked in warehouses and a daily or weekly running inventory should be made wherever practicable.

10. Vehicle Movement of Supplies:

c. Supplies will be moved in small convoys. When moving rations or other supplies from a warehouse, the following will apply:

- (1) A checker will be posted at the tail gate of the vehicle in order to prevent loss while loading.
- (2) A checker within the depot will check off items prior to their loading and a signature will be obtained as an acknowledgement that the items listed thereon were received and were all in apparent good condition.

SOP Supply Control (cont'd)

- (3) Armed guard will travel on rear of the truck to prevent pilferage while in transit.
- (4) The consignee will check all loads received by him during the unloading and will report all shortages, damages and damages immediately to the consigner.

11. Showdown Inspection of Troops.

a. Inspection will not only be made physically, but whenever possible, the Enlisted Men's Form #2 will be used as a basis for determining unauthorized items of government property in the hands of troops. Disciplinary action will be taken upon the initiation of a Statement of Charges for loss of property.

12. Illegal Disposition of Government Property.

a. The following is extracted from Provost Marshal General Security Instructions for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"15. Illegal Disposition of Government Property.

a. Articles of War 84 and 91 prohibit the sale, wrongful disposition, misappropriation or diversion of United States government property to unauthorized persons. In this connection, particular attention is directed to the fact that abandonment, misappropriation or barter in any way of Army rations, gasoline and oils, captured material, clothing and equipment and Army Exchange supplies of all types fall under the provisions of these articles and Army Regulations.

b. All military personnel who observe any act of abandonment, pilferage or illegal diversion of United States government property will, without delay, notify head the offender, obtain the name, grade, organization and serial number of the offender. They will also obtain similar information concerning witnesses, if any, and submit a detailed report of the incident to the appropriate commander having courts-martial jurisdiction. If reprobation is not possible, all information available will be obtained, and a similar detailed report of the incident will be made. The information obtained from military offenders will be checked against their War Department Identification Cards and Tags. When there is no doubt as to the veracity of information given, the individual will be turned over to the Military Police.

c. Negligence on the part of any United States military personnel in reporting crimes of this nature will be considered dereliction of duty and will be punished accordingly.

d. All commanders having courts-martial jurisdiction will issue such additional instructions as may be necessary to enforce compliance with the foregoing and will take strict disciplinary action in all cases."

REPATRIATION OF ITALIAN NATIONALS TO ITALY.

1. This Memorandum sets out the classes into which Italian Nationals held as Prisoners of War and Internees are divided, and the procedure which must be followed in making application for their repatriation.

2. There are two main classes:

- (a) Italian Prisoners of War i.e. Members of the Italian Forces in Allied hands and Italian Merchant Seamen who have been interned by any of the Allied nations.
- (b) Civilians and groups of civilians living or interned outside Italy.

ITALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR AND MERCHANT SEAMEN.

3. WAR MATERIALS DISPOSAL AND ITALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR SUB COMMISSION is responsible for the handling of all questions concerning the repatriation of Italian Prisoners of War and Italian Merchant Seamen.

4. The following are the categories in which Prisoners of War or Merchant Seamen may be repatriated.

(a) Entitled Repatriates.

Sick, wounded, those who are 30 years of age or over, those who are over 50 years of age and have been two years in captivity. These Prisoners of War are now available and will be demobilized on arrival in Italy.

(b) Compassionate cases.

Cases where Prisoners of War are required to take care of a family who have no other means of support, on conditions similar to those under which an Allied soldier would be posted home. Such cases are comparable to those of men of military age exempted from service, and will be demobilized on arrival in Italy.

(c) Priority workers.

Procedure which must be followed in making application for their repatriation.

2. There are two main classes:

- (a) Italian Prisoners of War i.e. members of the Italian Forces in Allied hands and Italian Merchant Seamen who have been interned by any of the Allied nations.
- (b) Civilians and groups of civilians living or interned outside Italy.

ITALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR AND MERCHANT SEAMEN.

3. WAR MATERIALS DISPOSAL AND ITALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR SUB COMMISSION is responsible for the handling of all questions concerning the repatriation of Italian Prisoners of War and Italian merchant Seamen.

4. The following are the categories in which Prisoners of War or Merchant Seamen may be repatriated.

(a) Entitled Repatriates.

Sick, wounded, those who are 60 years of age or over, those who are over 50 years of age and have been two years in captivity. These Prisoners of War are now being repatriated automatically as shipping becomes available and will be demobilized on arrival in Italy.

(b) Compassionate cases.

Cases where Prisoners of War are required to take care of a family who have no other means of support, on conditions similar to those under which an Allied soldier would be posted home. Such cases are comparable to those of men of military age exempted from service, and will be demobilized on arrival in Italy.

(c) Priority workers.

Workers who are required by a U.S. or British agency or by an Italian Government agency for important work as a direct contribution to the Allied War effort. Such cases are comparable to those of men of military age exempted from service as key workers, and will be demobilized on arrival in Italy.

(d) Effective Members of the Italian Armed Forces.

Prisoners of War who are required for active service with the Italian Armed Forces, Approval must first be obtained from the Service Sub-Commission concerned.

PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED IN DEALING WITH ITALIAN
PRISONERS OF WAR AND MERCHANT SEAMEN.

5. All applications and enquiries regarding repatriation within classes 4 (a) and (b) will be forwarded direct to the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War, Corso Vittorio Emanuele 120, Rome.

6. Requests will only be submitted under 4 (c) when responsibility is accepted by the Director of the Sub-Commission, Regional Commissioner or the Italian Government agency, submitting the case that the Prisoner of War concerned will fill and is qualified to fill the appointment for which he has been requested. Requests under 4 (c) made by an Italian Government agency will in the first place be submitted to the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War.

7. All requests for repatriation under 4 (d) will be initiated by the Service Ministry concerned to the appropriate Service Sub-Commission. The requests will give full particulars of the personnel required and their proposed employment in the Armed Forces. After approval by the Service Sub-Commission concerned the requests will be returned to the Service Ministry for submission to the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War. Prisoners of War will not be absorbed into the Armed Forces in ITALY by any other means.

8. The Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War will check and collate all applications and requests made to him and will forward them to War Materiale Disposal and Italian Prisoners of War Sub-Commission which will, if it approves, make formal application to higher authority.

9. In all cases under the above conditions repatriated Italian Prisoners of War of military age will only be demobilized or released from service for other duties provided the Service Ministry concerned does not require their retention in the Armed Forces.

CIVILIANS LIVING OR INTERNED OUTSIDE ITALY.

10. The DISPLACED PERSONS AND REPATRIATION SUB-COMMISSION will be responsible for the handling of all applications for the repatriation of civilians and groups of civilians living or interned outside ITALY.

11. The following are the conditions on which applications may be made for repatriation of civilians to ITALY.

(a) Compensation cases.

CIVILIANS LIVING OR INTERNED OUTSIDE ITALY.

10. The DISPLACED PERSONS AND REPARATION SUB-COMMISSION will be responsible for the handling of all applications for the repatriation of civilians and groups of civilians living or interned outside ITALY.

11. The following are the conditions on which applications may be made for repatriation of civilians to ITALY:

(a) Compassionate cases.

Cases where civilians are required to return to ITALY to take care of a family who have no other means of support. All cases on compassionate grounds will however be considered on their merits.

(b) Priority workers.

Cases where civilians are necessary to the war effort and will be a direct contribution thereto.

12. All requests from Sub-Commissioners or Regional Commissioners for repatriation of civilians or groups of civilians under para 11 (a) and (b) will be forwarded direct to DISPLACED PERSONS AND REPATRIATION SUB-COMMISSION who will be responsible for screening all applications and approving them prior to forwarding them to higher authority. Directors of Sub-Commissioners and Regional Commissioners will be responsible for insuring that the applications they submit are warranted by the circumstances and facts put before them. In applications under 11 (b) the civilian for whom the application is made must be qualified to hold the appointment for which he is asked and will fill the appointment after repatriation.

1. It is the responsibility of the Supreme Allied Commander to provide for the civil population of liberated territory that will be necessary to prevent disease and unrest. It is his policy to make the maximum use of local resources in providing for the essential civilian requirements.

2. The duty of all ranks of the Armed Forces in the discharge of the Supreme Allied Commander's responsibility to the civil population should be constantly present in their minds. All ranks must, even in the course of active operations, reward them always that whenever it is possible to achieve a military object by a choice of means which does least the essential needs of the civil economy is the method to be preferred and adopted. Care must be taken by the responsible commander that, except in definite emergencies, no further securing a privilege that is essential to the civil economy nor dismantles, destroys, by blockade or incision, the equipment therein. Except to prevent damage or destruction, or to meet the immediate operational needs, raw materials essential to civil economy will not be purchased, requisitioned or removed except by the procedures set forth in Section III, AMG Administrative Memorandum Number 44, 1944.

3. a. In the detailed planning for the occupation of an area, the military authority responsible for such planning, and the Allied Commission, will consult as to the anticipated military and civil requirements in that area affecting local resources. The military authority will elaborate his plan so far as practicable to include any proposals agreed as the result of such consultation. Any such agreement must of necessity be tentative and adjustments made dependent upon the physical condition of the area when occupied and upon the military situation. So far as practicable the area at should include definite facilities reserved by the military and definite facilities reserved for essential civil requirements. Facilities not so defined will not initially be reserved for either military or civil exploitation but are subject to seizure, notwithstanding the need is recognized.

b. In actions of the country for which no definite military operational plan is considered necessary, instructions defining military requirements and those civil requirements for which the military assume responsibility will be issued by the military authority responsible for planning for the area as a civil, if so directed by allied Commission.

c. In the case of property to be used by the military which Allied Commission has stated to be essential to the civil economy, the probable course of development by the military and the estimated period of occupancy will be stated in the plan.

d. In the immediate execution of operational plans the decision of the Army or equivalent commander in operational command will prevail. However, when

Allied Commission is of the opinion that the use of the facility during military tenancy will cause undue harm to the civil economy, and local agreement cannot be reached, Allied Commission may, without interrupting the operational plan or its immediate execution, inform the Army or equivalent commander that an appeal will be made, and submit such an appeal as indicated in paragraph 4 below.

c. In the further execution of a plan in Army or equivalent areas, or in routine functioning within or without Army areas, in the event there is a conflict between military interests and an interest which Allied Commission considers essential to the civil economy with respect to:

(1) The equitable allocation of factories, warehouses, and other commercial and industrial facilities including mines and space, and

(2) The control of their use and operation, the procedures set forth in paragraph 4 will be followed.

d. a. The Allied Commission may present its case and recommend action to the responsible Area, District, Base Section or Army Commander, or other responsible military authority, whether urgent operational need has been advanced by the military authority or not. Allied Commission will accompany their case with a complete and factual justification.

b. The responsible military authority to which the case is referred will consider the case and every effort will be made to reach a solution satisfactory to Allied Commission and the military commander. In the event a satisfactory solution cannot be found, the military commander will return the request to Allied Commission with a written statement as to the extent to which he can meet Allied Commission's desires and as to the conditions which he cannot accept.

c. Allied Commission then may submit the matter to an investigating sub-committee appointed by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee of the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board, through AFLRS. The investigating sub-committee will investigate the case in detail and attempt to find some solution agreeable to all parties concerned.

d. If no such solution can be found, the sub-committee will submit the case to the ICC (Industrial Co-ordination Committee) with recommendations.

e. The ICC will then adjudicate and make its award. If no protest is received by AFLRS from an interested party within 48 hours after the award, such award will become effective. In the event of a protest, the latter will be referred to the AFLR(I) Board, the decisions of which will be binding upon all parties.

f. a. Except in the immediate execution of operational plans as stated in paragraph 3d above, the military will not exercise initial control of a facility concerning which Allied Commission has initiated a request for adjudication, until definite action has been taken in accordance with these instructions.

b. When a plant, mine or other commercial facility has been de-requisitioned to permit or its producing materials or services essential to civil economy, all machinery, fixtures, equipment and plant essential to such production, except that which may have been installed by the using Service, shall be exempt from subsequent requisition unless the facility itself is again requisitioned. Surplus materials, as declared under the provisions of Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, are subject to allocation as set forth in that memorandum.

c. Plants, mines or other commercial facilities which may be declared not subject to requisition or which have been de-requisitioned under the provisions of this memorandum will be adequately posted by the local district, base section, or army commander, or other responsible military commander, to prevent unauthorized entry or removal of protected equipment, fixtures, machinery and materials.

d. When considering matters of requisitioning and de-requisitioning, military authorities will show special leniency with respect to facilities of the monopoly industries of the Italian Government such as those engaged in the manufacture of matches, the processing of tobacco and the extraction of salt. These are of special importance in providing essential revenue to the Italian Government.
