ESTABLISHMENTS BRANCH

22. Return to U.K. of Long Service Personnel.

Reference A.C.C. R.D. No. 12 dated 13 March 1944.

- (a) With effect from 9 June 1944 the qualifying date for eligibility to return to U.K. will be that on which five years unbroken service overseas is completed. The 1st January 1944 will no longer be the qualifying date for the purposes of such calculation.
- (b) The same principles will apply in calculating overseas service as is laid down in para (b) of the above quoted Routine Order.
- (c) Particulars of Officers and C.Rs. whose names were not submitted under A.C.C. R.D. 15 and those who have since qualified for return to U.K. by reason of long service abroad, will be forwarded to G-4 (British) at an early date, in order that G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon can be notified accordingly.
- (d) Particulars should, in future, be notified as and when they become eligible.

25. Status of Civilians and Camp Followers.

- (a) The undermentioned Camp Followers have the status of officers and can be admitted to Officers' clubs, Transit Messes etc.
 - (i) All CWW personnel.
 - (ii) RACS workers who hold the rank of officer in that organisation. They will be in possession of identity cards showing their status.

ESTABLISHMENTS BRANCH22. Return to U.K. of Long Service Personnel.

Reference A.C.C. R.O. No. 15 dated 15 March 1944.

- (a) With effect from 2 June 1944 the qualifying date for eligibility to return to U.K. will be that on which five years unbroken service overseas is completed. The 1st January 1944 will no longer be the qualifying date for the purposes of such calculation.
- (b) The same principles will apply in calculating overseas service as is laid down in para (b) of the above quoted Routine Order.
- (c) Particulars of Officers and O.Rs. whose names were not submitted under A.C.C. R.O. 15 and those who have since qualified for return to U.K. by reason of long service abroad, will be forwarded to G-1 (British) at an early date, in order that G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon can be notified accordingly.
- (d) Particulars should, in future, be notified on and when personnel become eligible.

23. Status of Civilians and Camp Followers.

- (a) The undermentioned Camp Followers have the status of officers and can be admitted to Officers' clubs, Transit Messes etc.
- (i) All CWM personnel.
 - (ii) HROS workers who hold the rank of officer in that organization. They will be in possession of identity cards showing their status.
 - (iii) Members of Corps of Messengers.
 - (iv) EMEA Artists.
 - (v) Certain personnel of film production units who are granted temporary status of officers by G-1 (B), A.F.H.Q. while in this theatre.
 - (vi) All civilian members employed on the staffs of the British Minister, British Consulates and MOW.
- (b) British female civilians on the staff of Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government with the status equivalent to that of officers may also be admitted to Officers' clubs, Transit Messes, etc.
