I -- ADMINISTRATION OF PERSONNEL

Effective 27 May 1944, every American military officer and enlisted man assigned for duty with Civil Censorship Group is attached to a specific unit of 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission. (Provisional), in accordance with letter order attached hereto. All administrative matters pertaining to military personnel, including records, pay, allowances, allotments, rations, quarters, immunization, war bonds, and excluding appointments, promotions and reductions, will be referred directly to respective units of 2675th Regiment.

II -- AEME CAMPAIGN RIBBONS

American military personnel, this unit, who have not as yet received the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Ribbon, as authorized by Circular No. 2, Allied Force Headquarters, 7 Jan 43, may apply for same to units which attached.

III -- BATTLE STARS

1. Individuals who are eligible to wear the appropriate theater service ribbon may wear bronze service stars on the appropriate theater service ribbon to indicate battle participation (see Circular 62, WD, 1944).

a. Provided the individual served honorably, 1947 combat zone, as a member of a unit, or attached to a unit at some time during the period in which the unit participated in battle and was awarded credit therefor under the provisions of paragraph 12, AR 260-10; or

b. In cases of individuals not members of or attached to units, provided the individual is awarded a combat decoration or served honorably under competent orders in the combat zone at some time between the limiting dates of the battle or campaign as established by War Department General Orders (Nos 75 & 83, 1943).

2. Mere membership in a unit receiving battle credit does not entitle an individual to wear a bronze star on the theater ribbon. He must have served honorably, in the defined combat zone, as a member of a unit, or attached to a unit, at some time during the period in which the unit participated in battle and was accorded credit therefor.

3. Algeria-French Morocco Campaign.

a. Combat zone - Algeria, French Morocco, and adjacent waters.

b. Time limitations 8 - 11 November 1942.

4. Tunisian Campaign.

a. Combat zone - Tunisia and Algeria E of NS line thru Constantine, and adjacent waters.

b. Time limitation 8 November 1942 (air), 17 November 1942 (ground) to 13 May 1943.

5. Sicilian Campaign.

a. Combat zone - Sicily and adjacent waters.

b. Time limitation 14 May 1943 (air), 9 July 1943 (ground) to 17 August 1943.

6. Italian Campaign.

a. Combat zone - Italy (exclusive of Sicily and Sardinia), Corsica, and adjacent waters.

b. Time limitation 18 August 1943 (air), 9 September 1943 (ground). Final date to be announced later.

c. The 2675th Regt. ACC, (Prov), have received battle credit by authority of ltr AG 200.6/263P-0, NATOUSA, Subject: Battle Participation Awards, dated 20 Mar 44. Inasmuch as American military personnel of Civil Censorship Group are attached to said Regt, individuals of this unit assigned for duty on mainland of Italy are entitled to bronze star for Italian campaign, and steps are being taken to obtain stars for proper distribution.

7. Personnel who believe they are eligible to receive additional bronze stars (for Algerian, Tunisian, and/or Sicilian campaigns) may apply for same thru Captain Brunner.
