3. The antenna will be of the rhombic type and terminated at one end making it unidirectional to the East.
4. It is requested that this Sub-Commission be informed as to the exact date the circuit will open.

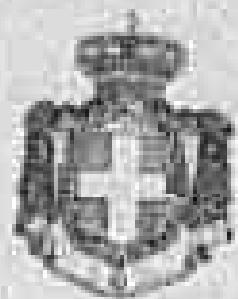

SUBJECT: Italian Diplomatic Pouch in Switzerland.

TO : Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Italian Government.

1. Reference your memorandum 6/1396/630 of 18 May regarding the above subject.

2. Allied Force Headquarters have written as follows:

"1. It would appear that the British Legation in Berne is not in receipt of instructions to assume responsibility for accepting and forwarding sealed diplomatic bags to Rome. However various Italian pouches are handled by the American Embassy in Rome and it is assumed that a return of similar pouches from Berne is authorized through American channels.

2. Therefore will you please ask the Italian Government whether it be the established practice for the British Legation in Berne to forward these pouches and also to verify through the American Embassy in Rome that authorization exists for transfer through American Diplomatic channels."

3. It would therefore be appreciated if you would answer the questions raised by AFHQ in para 2 quoted above.

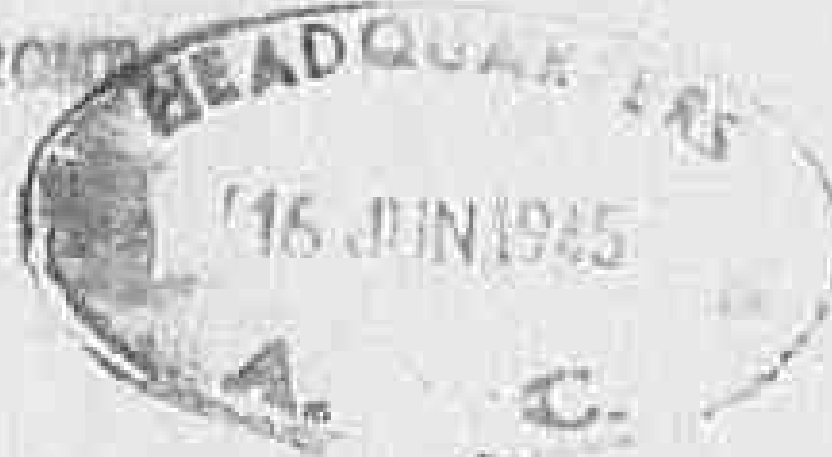

1. Reference the attached correspondence, this office has made an exhaustive check with Cipher Control Mission's records, Signal Center Allied Commission, Cables & Wireless' records and RCA records, and find that messages numbers 41, 47, 52, 53, and 62 passed through our Signal Center and was cleared to Cables & Wireless and RCA. All except 62 were cleared to Cables & Wireless. Our receipt times show: nr 41 191750, C&W; nr 47 011645 Mar, C&W; nr 52 111440 Mar, C&W; nr 53 151300 Mar, C&W; nr 62 231410 Mar, RCA. Cables & Wireless and RCA assures that the above messages were cleared to the addressee.

2. There is no record of the other messages mentioned in the original correspondence. It is believed that there is no such record because of the handling that this traffic has received heretofore by being typed in the Cable Section. At the present moment, there is no sure method of doing cross reference between Allied Commission reference number and the Italian Ministry number.

3. In view of the above, it is requested that the handling of Italian Ministry traffic as outlined in previous correspondence from this office, be favorably considered.

1. Reference is made to your C.120.2.CS of 11 January 45.
2. Comment by the Chief Signal Officer this Headquarters which has been concurred in by G-2 and the Political Advisors here is as follows

"ALLIED authorities are in the process of re-establishing for the ITALIAN Government certain commercial radio circuits, the operation of which involves ITALIAN nationals. These circuits are located in friendly territory and are in the nature of an experiment, the results of which have not yet been fully evaluated. Considerations of security demand a more cautious attitude when a recently enemy country, such as BULGARIA, is involved. Complete security of the circuit requested cannot be guaranteed in this instance. For this reason, if for no other, request for ROME-SOFIA circuit should be refused.

"To provide official communications for the ITALIAN Government between ITALY and BULGARIA, AFHQ military circuits, both BRITISH and U.S., have been made available. A check of the use made of these facilities to date reveals that they have by no means been exhausted; hence the actual necessity for the establishment of additional radio communications to BULGARIA by the ITALIAN Government is not evident at this time."

3. In the circumstances and for the reasons given above it will be appreciated that permission cannot at present be given to the re-establishment of the proposed circuit.
