1. Information has now been received that the derequisition of the above building and return of the keys thereof was irregular, the premises still being required by Allied troops. As soon as this improper requisition was discovered the position was rectified by the issue of an ante-dated requisition order.

2. The premises are being used as a hotel to accommodate Italian-born wives of British soldiers in transit to Great Britain, and it is regretted that there appears to be little prospect of obtaining the release of these premises at present.

1. This is another example of failure on the part of USAAF billeting Office in Naples to observe correct procedure.
2. As you are aware this HQ was given authority by the Accn Committee to inspect all accn put before the committee by USAAF for derequisitioning action, and no premises were to be derequisitioned unless agreed by this HQ to be of no use.
3. In accordance with this authority, the Casina Sportiva, Posillipo, was inspected and the committee was informed that it would be taken over by this HQ. When originally inspected the building was unlocked.
4. On a later visit the building was found to be locked, and in order that essential RE work could be carried out, an entrance had to be forced.
5. It now appears that, contrary to instructions issued by the Accn Committee, the USAAF billeting office derequisitioned the building in favour of the owners, instead of in favour of the Town Major Naples, and handed over the keys of the building to the owners. The matter was regularised by the issue of an ante-dated requisition note by Town Major Naples.
6. The premises are used to accommodate Italian born ³²⁶wives of British Soldiers in transit to UK, and not as a Club as appears to be the impression of the Italian Authorities. The hotel is in full operation and accommodates normally up to 40 - 50 wives. A considerable amount of RE work has been done, and it is not considered that the position can be reviewed.

Subject: Caserta Post Office : Request for Use of Huts at
 Caserta Station as temporary Station Sorting Office.

To : G15 - A.P.H.Q.

1. The Station Sorting Office at Caserta having been destroyed during the war, the Civil Post Office has had to use certain rooms at the Central Post Office which are unsuitable both as regards size and situation for the outward sorting the work in connection with the despatch transfer and arrival of mails. This work is normally performed in premises on or adjacent to a railway station.

2. To avoid the expense entailed in erecting a temporary Station Sorting Office for use while the proper office is ~~being~~ being rebuilt the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications requests that it be permitted to use for this purpose two army huts which it states are in position at the station and are at present unused.

3. It is indicated that a request made locally by the Post Office Provincial Director has not been agreed to. The reason for the refusal is however not indicated. It would therefore be appreciated if some action could be taken to obtain this facility for the Post Office if at all possible.

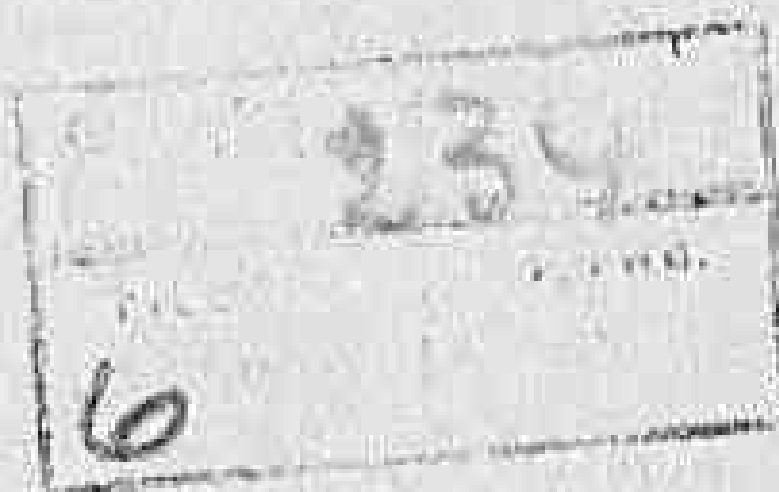
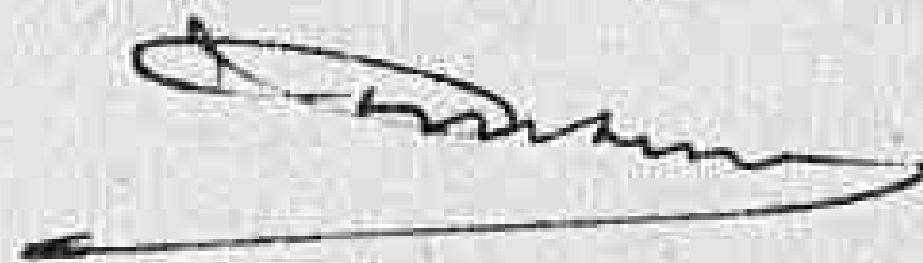

Subject: Caserta Ferrovia Post Office.

Awaiting the commencement and the completion of the works for the reconstruction of the Ferrovia building at Caserta Station, that Provincial Director asked the local Allied ~~my~~ Command to obtain two huts which are at present unused to locate, temporarily, the Ferrovia Post Office, which at present is working in the premises of the building of Poste Centrali with discomfort owing the lack of space and with consequent necessity of a laborious transport of despatches from the Railway Station to the Centre, and vice versa.

As the pressure of your Provincial Director has had a negative result, we beg your Allied Commission to press the competent authorities of the Allied Command to concede these two huts, pointing out to ~~them~~ the use which will be made of them, and drawing to their attention that, in case of refusal, the construction of a pavilion must be provided, which will require a long time and only be temporary and for which an expense of 25000 lire is foreseen.

Trusting in your favourable interest, we thank you in advance.

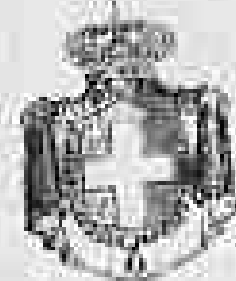

Subject: Casina Circolo Assistenza - P.T. Posillipo.

The premises of Posillipo, Discesa San Pietro, belonging to this Administration, which were previously used as a sporting club for the P.T. service personnel immediately after the liberation of Naples were requisitioned by the American Military Authorities. On 9th November 1945, these premises were derequisitioned and handed over to the President of the Aid and Recreational Club of that town. But on the 23rd of the same month about 12 o'clock some British Officers entered the Casina and after having asked Miss. Siniscalchi who was there on duty, to which service the building was assigned announced that they would requisition it again for use of British Troops. In fact, returning after a few hours and finding the door closed, because the above mentioned Miss. Siniscalchi had hastened to report to the Provincial Directorate what had happened, the said Officers applied a chain to the entrance door and a notice announcing the effective requisition. From the Segreteria of the Zone Commissioner where an official had gone to complain we have been notified verbally that such requisition must be considered abusive and illegal, as it is forbidden to make new requisitions and furthermore to requisition property already derequisitioned. The Naples P.T. interested contemporaneously the Prefettura and Major Green who promised to take an interest for the derequisitioning of the building. Also the intervention of the British Information Bureau was asked but all that was done to obtain the derequisition has had negative results. In the meantime to show their rights the British Military, without using the key to the building which is kept by the Provincial Directorate having broken a window pane, have entered the Casina from a veranda, and have already started important works using a squad of 20 workmen who have transported to that place a considerable amount of timber and iron. As those premises must be used by our Administration on purely charitable purposes as a kindergarten for P.T. children was going to be established, we beg your Commission to examine the possibility of freeing the Casina.

With reference to your 90843 G-12 of 1 Dec. 1945.

1. It would appear that your Naples Directorate has not informed you of all the facts of the case.

2. The building was originally requisitioned by the American Authorities, not soon after the liberation of Naples, but following the transfer of the Genti Correnti Dept. (which was outmanned in the Casina Sportiva) to the Central Post Office. (about July 1944).

3. During a recent visit to Naples by Major Green, on Saturday morning 14th November, he was approached by Sig. de Benedictis and the representative of the Sindacato and told the story of the alleged abusive seizure of the premises after derequisition. He advised them to consult the AMG Commissioner (who is also a member of the Accommodation Committee) but also promised that if he could find time he would visit the premises and try to ascertain who was responsible for the seizure of the premises - a fact which they stated was not apparent from the notice affixed to the door. When he visited the premises that afternoon he found that the premises were locked and that the notice clearly indicated that the requisition was by the British Town Major.

4. As a result of this the attached letter was written to Col. Pennyquick so that he could raise the matter at the next meeting of the Accommodation Committee, and a copy of the

letter was sent to the Provincial Directorate. Before leaving Naples Major Green (w the Acting Provincial Director and told him what action had been taken and advised him to keep in touch with the AIG Commissioner on the subject. It is not clear from your letter whether this advice was acted upon.

5. Further enquiries will be made in the matter.

1. Representatives of the Sindacato of Post Office workers have appealed for the derequisitioning of their Casina Sportiva building in S. Pietro due Frati which they wish to use as a child welfare centre for the children (including orphans) of Post Office workers.

2. The building was previously under requisition and in use as an American Officer's Club (AGO 3) but is now not occupied but bears a notice indicating that it is under requisition by the British Town Major.

3. In view of the number of premises in Naples already in use for amenities for the troops and the general lack of premises for civilian welfare purposes it is suggested that the question of the release of this building be raised with the Accommodation Committee.

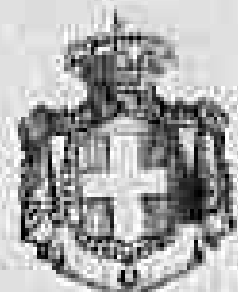

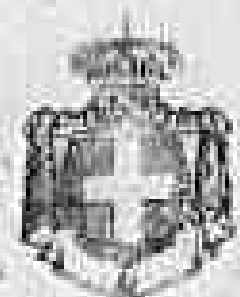

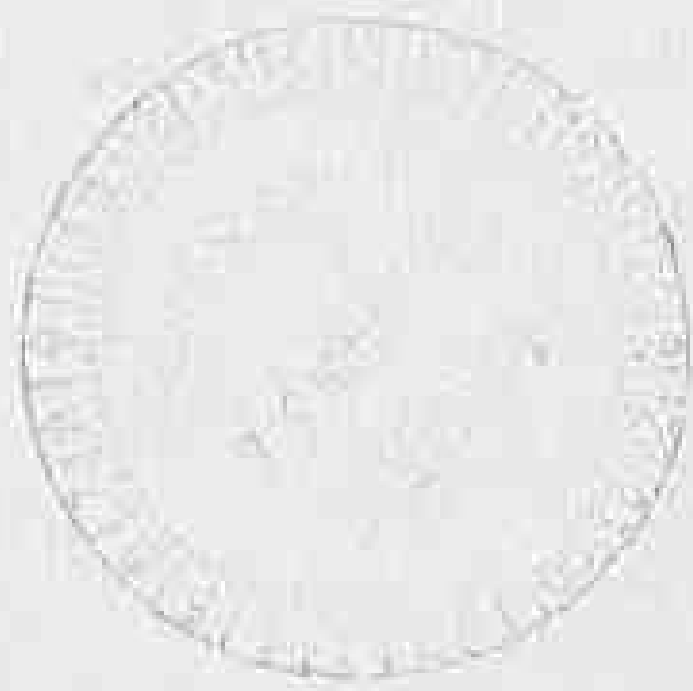

Reference your letter of 8 October 1945 concerning the A/M which came to hand yesterday.

I regret to state you have been badly misinformed and as this misinformation reflects rather seriously not only on my ability but veracity. I should like to say what I can to produce the facts in the case.

I can only account for this with two reasons (1) Desire by Italian Officials (the Provincial Director of Posts and Telegraphs and/or the Genio Civile) to avoid the responsibility for an unfortunate incident and from American Officers by a change in situation brought about by a change in personnel caused either by redeployment or relocation. The time factor is important as my contact with this case dates back to some time in August.

The facts, I know, in the case are as follows :

(a) The Provincial Director of Posts and Telegraphs Livorno made a request to the Ministry of Communications (which was forwarded to me by way of the Sub Commission) to obtain permission for the Genio Civile to survey the Post Office Apt. at 38 Via S. Francesco with a view to repairing the same. (Reference one of the two Post Office files AMG Livorno - date 15/8/45 - approx.)

(b) Permission was granted for two Agents of the Genio Civile by the C.O. of the Unit in the Building (Major Rice?) which was, I believe, a transportation Corp Unit. Reference same file a few days later the permit was sent immediately to the Provincial Director of Posts Livorno.

(c) Entry to the Building was granted. Shortly after entry these men were requested to leave as they were found examining personal property not the Building.

Reference Major Rice or the Lt. Col. in charge of Real Estate Section P.B.S. if same office as in 15/9/45. The Lt. Col. advised me personally of part of the facts in this case and I saw his letter to the Provincial Director of Posts Livorno on this subject. The Real Estate Section of P.B.S. must have a copy of that letter, the chances are the Provincial Director of Posts has destroyed his copy.

As to para. 2 - 3 and 4 of your letter I can only say any request to the Genio Civile to survey the Directorate at Via Cairoli were made either after I left or unknown to me.

I believe a check on the references I have quoted will bear out the accuracy of my statement.

I would greatly appreciate it if you would look further into this matter as your letter must raise considerable doubt in the mind of the Director of Sub Commission as to my work. I feel sure Major Rieley, Liaison Officer of Sub Commission, will see the files.

I regret to state that the information reflects rather seriously not only on my ability to produce the facts in the case. I should like to do what I can to produce the facts in the case.

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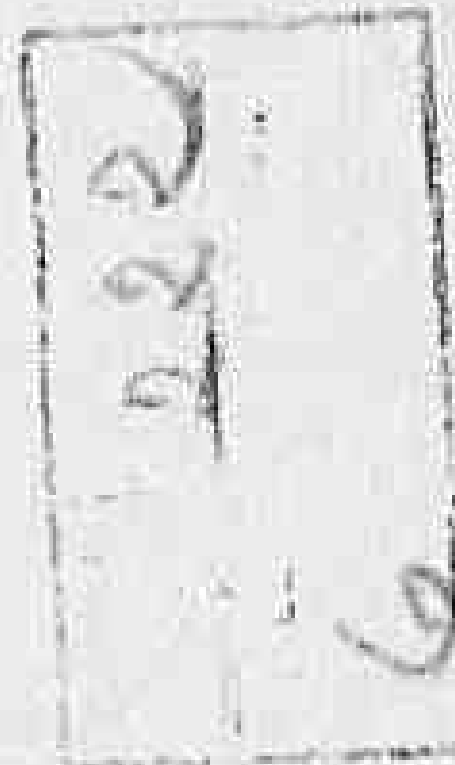

1. Reference is to attached communication from the Prime Minister to the Chief Commissioner.

2. We have received no request from the Italian State Railways in respect of the derequisitioning of any existing accommodations at the Florence Station, but we do know that the position there is extremely difficult not only for the operation of the railway, but for dealing with civilian mail traffic.

3. We keep in constant touch with Communications Sub-Commission because railway transport at the present time offers a satisfactory means for moving the growing quantity of civilian mail and attached hereto is a copy of a letter written by Communications Sub-Commission to G-5 AFHQ complaining of the occupation of the various postal offices at Florence Station by Allied troops.

4. Florence is an important station situated on the main route to the North and with two junction lines from Leghorn. We are repairing the line between Chiusi and Empoli via Siena, and between Arezzo and Florence, the latter being the previous main line connection with the North.

5. Both of these lines will be due for opening before the early Spring and we are in fact, giving priority attention to their reconstruction.

6. Attached hereto are maps (which please return) showing the occupation of the Florence Station by Allied troops. The area shaded in red is used by the Italian State Railways for the Post Office, whilst the area in blue which you will note includes the essential Booking Offices, Waiting Rooms, etc., is used under requisition by the Allies.

7. With the continued growth of civilian passenger services, we are most anxious that railway station premises should be as free as possible from requisitioning and at the moment we are engaged in correspondence with AFHQ, in order to ensure that Rome Terminal can be more worthy as the Main Station of the capital city.

8. Any help that can be given in ensuring that railway station premises are derequisitioned would be of great assistance to the Italian State Railways in their management of passengers and the more satisfactory operation of trains.

9. It is our information that when the University school at Florence closes, New Zealand forces are hoping to move into Florence for winter quarters and undoubtedly, the station will be considered suitable premises for such a move unless action is taken to the contrary.

1. According to the latest information I have received from Allied Force Headquarters (in response to my request that the premises at 61 Via Medina Naples should be made available for the Italian Censorship) ~~the~~ the accommodation will become available for reallocation this week.

2. I have written to the A.M.G. Zone Commissioner Naples asking him to arrange with the Peninsular Base Section for the premises to be reserved for the Italian Censorship. Your Naples Provincial Director should keep in touch with the Zone Commissioner on this matter.

3. As to the question of the need for speed in effecting the transfer of the censorship to these premises when available and in carrying out any minor work necessary to the lighting arrangements etc. I do not feel called upon to intervene. The matter is one affecting the improvement of services to the Italian people and it should be possible to settle the matter speedily and amicably by direct contact between the Ministries concerned.

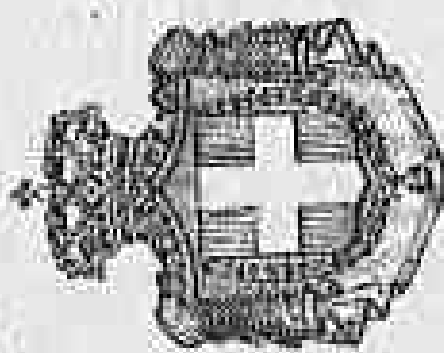

Will you please examine the premises of the Naples Censorship Office, which would be used for the transfer of the Naples Censorship Office to intervene with the purpose to hasten the transfer of the Naples Censorship office to via Medina 61.

Subject: Foreign Military Censorship Office.

As you are aware, the Foreign Military Censorship Office is presently since some time has been accommodated for its necessities in the PO of Corso Novara 2.

This state of affairs, besides crowding up considerably, owing to lack of space, the services of the Ferrovia Office, causes a serious financial expense to our Admin, which is compelled to rent 3 dirty rooms, against payment of 1500 Lire, which are assigned to the Technical section and the Railways Cashier Office.

To eliminate such inconveniences, through Major Green's kindly interest, the Censorship Office should be transferred in the via Medina premises, already being used by the special Allied Censorship Office, derequisitioned on oct 2nd, according to the information issued in letter 8538/1 of the Naples Ferrovia Director.

The Director of the Censorship, however, although he agrees that those premises are suitable for his office, refuses for the time being to the transfer, stating that some electric works are necessary as well as repairs to the doors and windows of the same premises.

As these premises of via Medina were occupied by the Allied, which, owing to the large amount of means at their disposal, would not hesitate to undertake these works if necessary, I suspect that the statement of the above official is only a question of cautiousness and to delay, for his own personal reasons the transfer of the dependant office.

Therefore, to avoid that these premises, at present free be requisitioned for other use, I beg you to interest the Prefettura, from who Censorship depends, to issue precise instructions for the immediate transfer to via Medina.

I also draw your attention to the fact that the Censorship Office is unduly, using furniture belonging to the Postal Administration, of which we had better ask to be returned as it is necessary, for the development of the service.

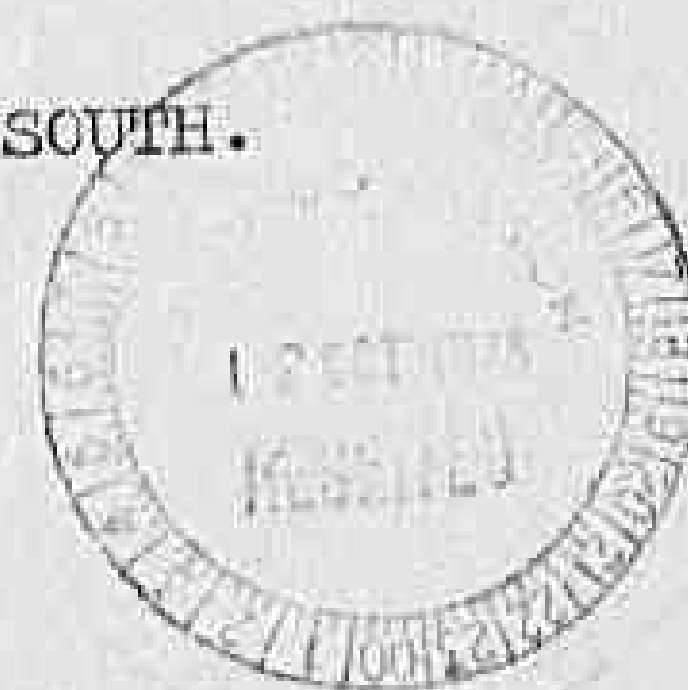

Subject: Post Office Premises.

To : The Minister Posts and Telecommunications.

1. Mainly in connection with the proposed extension of the U.S. parcel service I recently made an inspection of certain main Post Office buildings in the North and furnish the following observations for your information.

2. Genoa. The Ferrovia Office is, I think, the worst office of its kind for a city of this importance. It is small, dark, and must have been totally inadequate for the work dealt with there in peacetime. I visited the Capo of the Sezione Lavori of the Ferrovia and obtained from him a promise to do everything possible to have the minor repairs and redecoration of these premises carried out urgently.

The Post Office fortunately escaped serious damage and is modern and spacious. It will be necessary to arrange locally with the Post authorities for easy access to this building if the parcel work is dealt with here. The Director of this Office - Sig. Viviani - seemed to me a very capable official.

3. Milan. The Parcel section of the Ferrovia office is in good order and the Director Bartolo Annetta is keen and confident of their ability to handle the distribution of parcels for Lombardia.

4. Bologna. I was in this city too late in the evening to visit the Director or the military authorities but inspection of the damaged Ferrovia Office revealed that the parcel section is no longer in use as a feeding centre. I assume that the local representations which you have made to obtain release of these premises have been successful.

5. Florence. Strong representations have been made to Allied Force Headquarters asking: -

- (1) For the derequisitioning of the parcel office.
- (2) The replacement and repair of Parcel sorting fittings.
- (3) The restoration of direct access from the sorting office to the railway station.

Subject: Florence Railway Station. Post Office Accommodation.

To : G-5 : A.P.H.Q.

1. The parcel post section and the two floors above this section of the Post Office Station Sorting Office at Florence are at the present time being used as billets for students of the U.S. Army University Centre. So far as can be ascertained there is no formal and specific requisition applicable to this office and the occupancy is apparently based on a general requisition on part of Florence Station. The Post Office does not hold a copy of this requisition form.

2. In connection with the proposed extension of the foreign parcel and letter services it is essential that the Post Office should be given possession of the parcel sorting office as there is no other suitable accommodation in which the work could be performed. From local enquiries it is understood that the requirements of the U.T.C. for billeting purposes are likely to be reduced materially in the near future and it is therefore requested that the release of these premises should be arranged at an early date and that they should be protected against further requisitioning for non-postal purposes.

3. It is also very desirable in view of the forthcoming restriction of full postal services that the Post Office should soon be allowed to use its direct access from the sorting office to the station platforms.

4. Incidentally it should be mentioned that, although the parcel sorting office - one of the most modern and best equipped offices of its kind in Italy - had been used for quarters for Allied troops for many months, the wooden parcel sorting fixtures were left in position until about two months ago when the building was taken over for U.T.C. purposes. At this stage these fittings are stated to have been torn down in quite ruthless fashion and extensively damaged. The woodwork was recovered by the Post Office from outside the building and transported to the Central Post Office for safe keeping. In fact that this action occurred in Italian Government Territory and can hardly be justified on the grounds of operational necessity it is felt that on vacating the premises the Army should make arrangements for the repair and replacement of these fixtures.

(1.) Last week your letter was handed to me for investigation.

(2.) Contact with the Genio Civile of Livorno discloses the fact that he was requested by the Postal Authorities to make an examination of the Main Post Office and Telephone exchange Building of Livorno, situated on Via Cairoli, to determine the extent of damages and prepare an estimate of the cost of repairs.

(3.) Said building is at present occupied by the Main P.B.S. P.X. and is used not only as a sales room but also as a warehouse. Hence, when employees of the Genio Civile attempted to examine certain parts of the structure they were denied access.

✓ (4.) I have now made arrangements with the P.X. officials to permit engineers from the Genio Civile's office to examine all parts of the building and as soon as survey of damages is completed and cost estimates prepared, a request for approval of project will be presented through usual channels.

(5.) Permit me to inform you that the Postal Department also owns a building on Via S. Francesco. However, no request was ever made to the Genio Civile for an estimate on the repairs to this structure. Said structure was an apartment house and used to house Postal employees. It is at present occupied by an American Infantry unit. Access to same ³⁸⁸⁴ now and has been at all times, free.

(6.) No studies re the repairs to Apartment House on Via S. Francesco, owned by Postal Department, are contemplated at this time.

1. In connection with the representations made by your Ministry concerning accommodation difficulties in Naples, I visited that city during the week ended 1st September and the following observations are furnished for your information and such action as you may deem appropriate.

2. Naples Central Post Office. It was observed that certain accommodation on upper floors of this building has been allocated to uses not connected with the services of the Administration (Sindacato Giornalisti, UNRRA, etc.). Although such allocation of space in this building has no doubt been made with praiseworthy objects it has the unfortunate result of making control of working staff more difficult through the presence in the building of people not on official Post Office duty, and also renders it difficult to advance arguments that the release of the requisitioned part of the premises is necessary for Post Office purposes. Nevertheless the military authorities were pressed to agree to release at least part of the accommodation on the first floor of the building. It is thought that about 15 rooms will be derequisitioned shortly which should provide space for a better arrangement of the offices of the Directorate and permit the development of a scheme for the provision of accommodation for Italcable.

3. Naples Ferrovia Sorting Office. One wing of this building (about 40% of the total floor space) is occupied by the British Army Base Post Office. Allied Force Headquarters is unable to agree to derequisition this accommodation at present. As an alternative, proposals were made to the British Army Postal Directorate to obtain for your services the sole use of a large Romney hut which has a floor space equivalent to the ground floor of the requisitioned portion of the Ferrovia Office. This hut stands on the station premises adjacent to the

sorting office and if, as I hope, its use will be granted to your Administration, the parcel mail arrivals from the U.S.A. can be delivered there and sorted out for Naples, Rome and Palermo and thus avoid the great confusion and difficulty which at present arise through the delivery of all the parcel bags at the Central Post Office. It is thought that an arrival of about 10,000 bags could be accommodated in the hut.

As regards the portion of the sorting office in possession of your Administration, it can only be stated that it is very discouraging to find that in the past twelve months little or nothing has been done to put the place into a condition in which efficient working is possible and in which the best use is made of the floor space. The office is very much darker and dismal than it need be for lack of cleaning and decorating ceilings and walls. The electric lighting is still totally inadequate. Much floor space is wasted through antiquated methods of sorting on flat tables instead of upright box fittings. There is still a complete lack of suitable fittings for sorting newspapers and large letters and also a serious shortage of bag racks. The goods lift has not yet been put in working order.

In view of the importance of the Naples Sorting Office in the Italian Postal system, I would strongly advise that yourself and the Director General should take an early opportunity of visiting that Office and seeing the conditions there, if you have not already done so.

I had not time to make a thorough inspection of the sorting work, but it is evident that a complete revision of staff and adjustment of duties to the requirements of the work is badly needed. For instance, the Foreign Section ceases work at 15.00 hours with the result that none of the foreign correspondence, included in the collection from the City letter boxes, is divided for censorship until the following day.

4. Censorship. The Zone Commissioner, Naples A.M.O. was asked to investigate the possibility of obtaining for Censorship the second floor of 61 Via Medina which was previously occupied by the Prisoner of War Censorship. It is estimated that there is sufficient accommodation available in that building to provide for all the Italian Foreign mail censorship work performed at the Ferrovia Office and in the Questura building.

5. Naples Port. It was not possible to obtain an agreement to the Post Office being allowed to occupy premises within the Military Port.

Conditions for the receipt of parcel mails at the

3.

Civil port (Vigliena) are very bad. I saw the Port Commandant (Col. Sarti) who promised that electric lighting would be available in a few days. He did not consider very favourably the suggestion that a large hut should be constructed at Vigliena for Post Office purposes because, he stated, it was not the Italian Government's intention to develop that part of the port but rather to try to obtain control of other more central sections of the port as soon as possible. He promised, however, to reconsider the matter and discuss it with the Provincial Director.

6. S.S. Apostoli premises. These were inspected and appear to offer useful accommodation which could be utilised if no more suitable building becomes available. The access to the building is through comparatively narrow streets, however, and much difficulty would probably arise if the bulk arrivals had to be transported directly from the Port to these premises by a convoy of lorries.

7. Motor Vehicles. The Provincial Director stated that he had not yet received instructions from your Ministry concerning the employment of the six Dodge Motor vehicles assigned to the Naples Directorate.

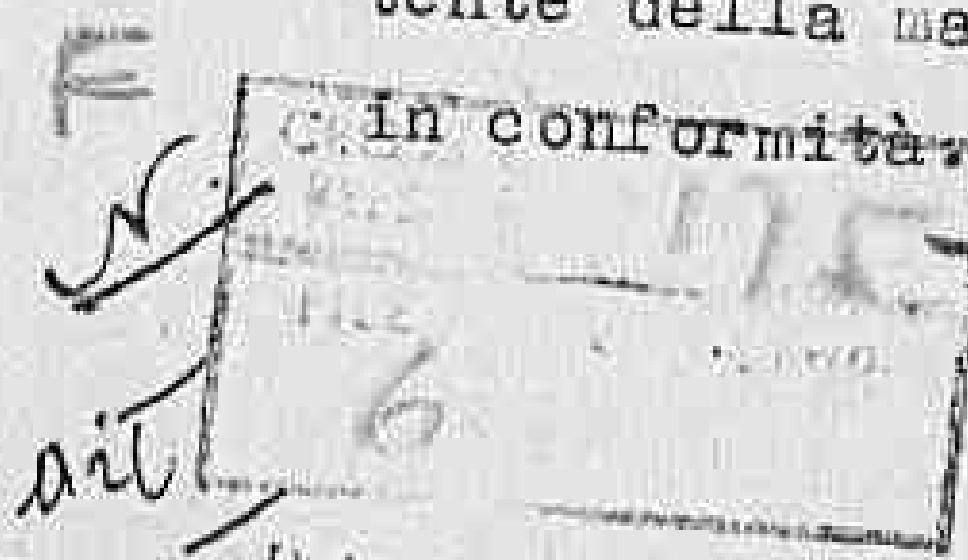

Reference your 821268/D.G. dated 15th May and 852233/1341/852234 dated 25th May we have obtained the following information:

1. The building at 10 Via S. Giovanni received a bomb hit which demolished the end of the N.W. wing. An explosion inside blew out the west wall. The rubble caused by the explosion has been removed but no repairs done and no alterations made to the building.

2. At 38 Via S. Francesco there has been some bomb damage but no repairs have been done. An insurance building next door is undergoing extensive repairs, and possibly this work was mistakenly reported as being on the Post Office building.

3. As far as the Post Office and Telegraphs building is concerned the only structural change is a door cut through the wall to connect 2 rooms on the North side of the building. Debris and rubble was cleared out of the 2 lower floors and the main staircase up to the second floor was repaired. Water pipes on the first and second floor were repaired; 4 damaged windows on the second floor were removed and left open. All tables benches and chairs in the building are of temporary wooden construction.

4. Any openings in all the buildings in question ⁸²⁵² closed with wood and tarred paper and destroyed windows replaced with cello-glass.

5. As far as the question of derequisitioning is concerned the Posts and Telegraphs Building the building is occupied by the American Army Exchange Service, and will be required by them for many months. The two economical houses are occupied by troops for whom there is no alternative accommodation.

Reference to the above mentioned letter, we notify that following are the changes which have been made in the premises of the Post Office building:

Ground-floor:

Removal of the American letter box (450 boxes)

Removal of all the windows from the mail and packages office

Transformation of the big central window in a door.

Removal of several glass-doors in communication between various rooms

Several doors have been made to access to the rooms of the ground floor; in the ground floor there were the different offices, but actually all the ground floor is intercommunicating.

In the telegram hall the big bench in wood has been removed.

All the glasses from the windows of the telegram department have been removed.

First floor:

In the postal money-order hall all the windows have been removed.

Several glass windows have been removed

In the archives of the accounting office all the wooden bookcase which covered the wall of the whole office have been removed.

The documents were put on the yard and subsequently taken away.

In some of the rooms a provisional tarred roof has been made in order to avoid the rain reaching the rooms.

Third floor:

The wooden floor of the telegram hall has been removed

A part of the boxes for the mechanic transportation of telegrams has been removed.

1. The three (3) building referred to in the basic letter have been occupied for several months. Each of the building received considerable bomb damage which reduced many rooms and sections to rubble. Where necessary this rubble and debris was removed and the openings closed with temporary coverings of tar paper, wood and in the case of destroyed windows, with cello-glass.

2. In the Post and Telegraph building the only structural change made was a door cut through the wall to connect two rooms on the north side of the building. Debris and rubble was cleaned out of the two (2) lower floors, the windows were repaired and the main stairway repaired up to the second floor. The water piping and latrines were restored to use on the first and second floors, and the water piping above the second floor was turned off due to numerous leaks. All tables, benches, and shelves in the building are of temporary wooden construction and in no way effect the permanent building. On the second floor four (4) damaged "teller" windows were removed and the entrance-ways left open.

3. The building at 10 Via S. Giovanni received a bomb hit which demolished the end of the northeast wing and a breezy train in a room blew out a portion of the west wall of the west wall of the building. The rubble made by these explosions has been removed but no reconstruction has been done. Two outside air raid shelters in the court have removed. There have been no other alterations made to the building.

4. At 38 Via S. Francesco no alterations have been made to the building although there is some bomb damage. An insurance building next to it is undergoing extensive repairs by an Italian civilian contractor. It is possible that the work being done on this building was mistakenly reported as being on the Post Office building.

5. There are no structural changes contemplated for construction in any of the three buildings in question.

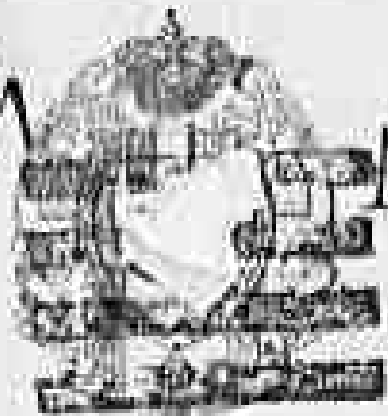

This fact is cause of considerable ^{inconvenience} ~~disense~~ for the inhabitants of the zone, who, in order to effect their postal operations must go into other receiving offices of the City, causing also more congestion of same, which are already over crowded, with serious prejudice to the regular functioning of the services.

These needs of public interest suggest the return of the receiving offices to the old premises. Therefore this Ministry kindly requests your S/C to favourably examine if it is possible to derequisition them; having also in view that the same premises are located outside of the harbour area.

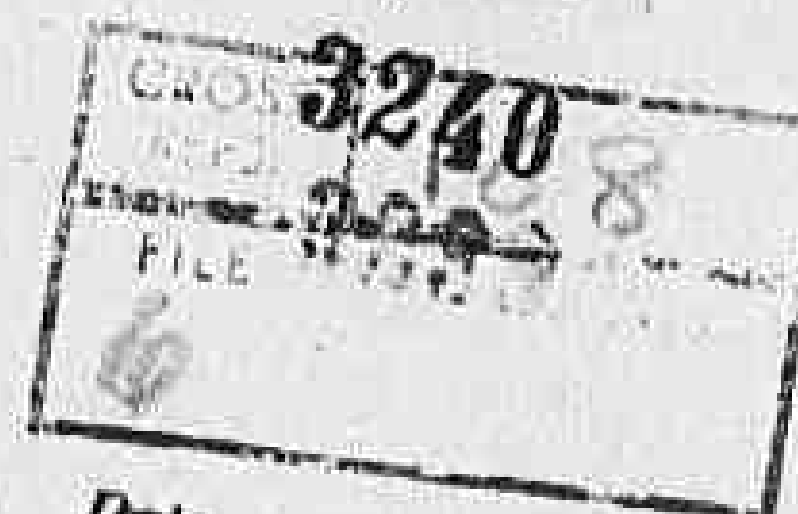

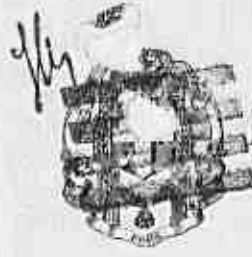
