2. Can authority be given for the DPO "red ad" service correspondence from the Milan Delegation to be sent to Geneva (after censorship) by either (a) Mr. Tagliari - the UNR representative or (b) a special Post Office branch via Milan also by similar route, cables from all other UNR Delegations in Italy to send to Milan by UNR Committee channels for inclusion in the same service from Milan, such letters being censored at point of origin or Milan.

SUBJECT: International Red Cross: Communications between Italian Delegations and Geneva.

TO : Deputy Director, Communications Sub-Commission,
HQ ALCOM, APO 394, U. S. Army.

1. Reference your letter, subject above, File No. P.13.158.CS, of 5 June 1945, this office contacted the local representative of the IRC, Dott. K. Tschudi and the following information obtained:

a. Transmittal.

1. Incoming: No correspondence permitted to leave Geneva (THRU MAIL).

2. Outgoing: Up to a few days ago, at which time a ban was placed on the entrance to Switzerland unless a special permit is obtained, which Dr. Tschudi has not at the present time but is trying to obtain one, he, in agreement with CIC was able to carry his official mail direct from Milan to Geneva.

b. Censorship.

1. It seems that there was no censorship undertaken on the outgoing mail, either at destination or at point of arrival.

2. As Dr. Tschudi is the representative of the IRC for all of Northern Italy, all official mail from Geneva, Turin and Venice come first to him and he in turn would carry it to Geneva.

3. In view of the above it may be possible to set up a system here where all mail of this category could be concentrated here in Milan, having been already censored at

the point of origin, or, if practicable censored here, and a special bag made up by the censorship officer here and then handed over to the delegate for transmission to Geneva by IRC courier. If security does not permit this, it may be arranged where the censorship officer can hand the bag to the local postal authorities, who, in turn could forward them to Geneva through Chiasso.

4. For the present I have advised Dr. Tschudi that should he obtain permission to go to Geneva he should not carry any uncensored mail to or from Switzerland until we give him further orders. This he has agreed to do.





The Rome Delegation of the I.R.C.C. has enquired whether it is now permissible for its official communications and any "express" enquiries proper to the "rapid" service for Geneva to be forwarded through Allied Commission channels to the Milan Delegation for onward transmission by I.R.C.C. courier to Geneva. It is stated that both the Genoa and Milan Delegations have means of sending such messages direct to Geneva.

2. Before the question is referred to A.S.C., please investigate and report on the present position as regards censoring and transmission of correspondence between the Northern Italian Delegations and Geneva, with particular regard to the class of correspondence mentioned in para 1.







1. Instruct by telegraph all Provincial Directorates to cease, immediately the sale of 15 lire message forms, at all the post offices and ricevitorie.
2. Call in and concentrate in Rome at the Central Store of Carte Vlori all the unsold message forms to be put at our disposal, in order to establish within 30 May 1945 the account due to the I.R.C.C.
3. Continue the home by home delivery of the incoming messages, when the addressees live in provinces opened to regular postal services.
4. Accept in the above provinces, the reply-messages, which will, as previously, be forwarded to our Delegations of central, southern and insular Italy respectively through the concentration points of Rome, Naples and Palermo Ferrovia P.O.


I am sorry that I was not able to arrange for the parcels of books to be sent by air as it was not considered that the case was one of sufficient urgency to justify that method of conveyance.

We thank you very much for the information you kindly sent us in your letter dated the 23.3.45 ref. P.13.135/Cs, regarding the message service to Somalia.

We take the occasion of bringing to your notice that the above message service is exclusively reserved to free civilians separated by a war front and not for P.O.W. and Civil Internees. In the abovementioned case, as no war front exists now between Somalia and Italy and that civil postal services are now operating between the two Countries we understand that it is natural that free civilians should correspond through ordinary channels.






2. It is therefore considered preferable to leave it to the Ministry to pursue the question of any failures directly with the Offices at fault, in the same way as is done in Italian Government territory.





1. The representative of the Italian Red Cross has presented the enclosed messages to Italian P.O.W. in the U.S. with a request that if at all possible they should be sent by Air to the U.S.

2. As the messages have been obtained at the request of the U.S. Army authorities (see attached letter) and are for P.O.W. who are stated not to have had mail from relatives for six months, it would be appreciated if they could be passed exceptionally for air transmission after censorship.

3. The enclosed messages do not cover all the names on the lists furnished by the U.S. authorities and I understand that there are likely to be one or two further batches when the enquiries are complete.

4. It is not understood why these prisoners have been without news for so long unless the relatives are not in possession of the correct address of the prisoners. I have suggested to the Italian Red Cross that any future cases where they are called upon to undertake exceptional enquiries because of some breakdown in the normal postal service they should take the opportunity to verify that the relative is clearly and correctly addressing his correspondence to the P.O.W. and that the actual message to the P.O.W. bears a clear and correct postal address for return correspondence.



Therefore the Prov. Directions in Sicily and Sardinia will address their requisitions only to the above Store.

In this sense are modified sub-paras A) and B) of para. III and last period of para. IV of the circular printed published in paragraph 81 of the Part 2nd of Bulletin N. 4 of 16 September.

The Palermo Store will however continue to distribute the forms on hand till it has exhausted them, and it will pass on figurative charge to the Rome Central Store the 90.000 message forms handed over, shortly ago, by the local Delegation of the I.R.C..

The Central Store Rome will also assume in figurative charge 171.000 message forms marked "I.R.C.C. Delegation for Southern Italy" which the Carte Valori Store of Naples is authorised to fetch at once at the local tipography Richter, for distribution to Prov. Directions in Southern Italy, on instruction of the Central Store of Rome.

1. I have the honor to inform you that the civil postal communications, and to inform you that the civil postal communications, which has now come to discussions between Red Cross Postal Service, and the Victoria Legionary between
Somalia (Italian Somaliland) and mixed occupied Italy.
2. The two cross border message service, and other similar schemes, are only intended to operate when no other means of postal communication available.
- Postal communications between Somalia and Italian

occupied Italy both by sea, and from Mogadishu to the
Mediterranean, by air.
3. In the continuation of the services rendered to the British
military administration, Somalia which now provides the postal

6. I have, therefore, to request that you will favor us to have
published the fact that payments in Somalia to Belgian prisoners
of war "civilian internees", and such correspondents should
use the normal postal channels for correspondence in Somalia.
7. The views of the civil administration are supported by the
Mariani delegate of the International Red Cross Committee.
8. The Red Cross Postal Service, and other civilian services, will
of course, continue to operate between Somalia and mixed occupied
Italy.

I have the honor to refer to the subject of civil postal communications, and to inform you that the Chinese Communists, communists, communists that the two main cities in occupied territories, the Red Army, before, and the National People's Government between Nanking (Tsinling, sommily) and allied occupied areas.

2. The new postal message service, and other similar schemes, are only intended to operate when no other forms of postal communication be available. 7. The views of the Chinese administration are supported by the National Committee of the International Red Cross Conference.

8. We fed postal message, and other similar services, will of course, continue to operate between soviet and soviet occupied areas.

1. No American Red Cross Message scheme - comparable with the IRCC and Vatican schemes - had come under notice.
2. I have consulted Mr. U. Morley, Supervisor of Communications for the American Red Cross in this country and he confirms that this organisation is not operating any postal message scheme for the benefit of the Italians.
3. He states that the A.R.C. does operate a 25-word postal message scheme for communication between U.S. service personnel in this country and relatives in enemy occupied territory, such messages being forwarded to A.R.C. Headquarters in Washington through Army channels.
4. As the scheme mentioned in 3 is in the nature of an Army welfare service, comment by this Commission is presumably not called for.

1. A proposed revision in the procedure for handling International Red Cross messages to the Balkans is herein set forth for your approval.

2. The messages will be routed by the Italian post-offices to Rome and Naples. At each of these cities the messages will be turned over to the International Red Cross for verification that existing regulations governing their use have been complied with. The International Red Cross will then hand the messages that are in order to the Italian post-office in bundles addressed to the ACCO, Transadriatic Mail Section, Bari, where they will be censored. After censorship, all the messages to be handed over to the Balkan Military Mission at Bari for delivery.

3. From the censorship standpoint there are two distinct advantages to the proposed scheme: (1) the messages will be censored by Transadriatic Mail Section, which has the personnel required to handle the Balkan languages; (2) the messages will be handed directly from our censorship station to the Military Mission, without being touched by outside persons between these two points.

4. From a postal viewpoint, it will mean that the messages will travel between Rome (Naples) and Bari only once.

5. Both the Chief Postal Officer and the International Red Cross representatives are in favor of the proposed scheme.

6. In reverse, International Red Cross messages from Yugoslavia will be censored at Bari before being turned over to the post-office for onward transmittal.

In view of rapidly changing conditions on the Continent it has been decided that lists of enemy and enemy-occupied territories to which the Thomas Cook and Red Cross Postal Message Schemes operate shall no longer be maintained at Post Offices.

Persons making inquiries about these schemes should in the case of the Thomas Cook Scheme henceforth be referred to Messrs. Thomas Cook and Son Ltd., Berkeley Street, London, W.1, and in the case of the Red Cross Postal Message Scheme to the nearest Citizens' Advice Bureau authorised to accept the messages (which is shown on public notice P 2244E displayed at all Post Offices).

A revised edition of Postal supplement No. 10 is issued with this circular and copies printed on superior paper for counter use should be filed in the counter compendium. Copies of the existing supplement should be made waste. (P.O.C. 21.2.45)





EXTRACT from POST OFFICE CIRCULAR of 20 December 1944

G.G.

DF 994 Free postage concession for postal packets sent to or by the Agence Centrale des Prisonniers de Guerre, Geneve

It has been agreed to extend the free postage facilities already accorded to postal packets sent to or by prisoners of war, civilian internees and prisoners of war information bureaux to cover postal packets sent to or by the Agence Centrale des Prisonniers de Guerre of the International Red Cross Committee, Geneva, for the purpose of obtaining information concerning, or sending relief to, all victims of the war, whether military or civil.

The concession of free postage however does not apply to air mail correspondence.

The Agence Centrale have issued inquiry cards for completion and return by refugees and evacuees in various countries. Such cards forwarded by the Agence Centrale or returned to them on completion should, when received or sent by surface route, ~~be~~ be delivered or forwarded ~~without surcharge~~, as in the case of prisoner of war surface correspondence sent by or addressed to the Agence Centrale.

Notwithstanding that there is at present no parcel post to Switzerland, it may be possible to arrange for the despatch of "relief" parcels to the Agence Centrale free of postage provided that the senders comply with Export Licensing, Censorship and Currency Control regulations. Anyone who makes inquiry should be informed accordingly and advised as a first step to approach the Board of Trade, Export Licensing Department, 4, Fenchurch Avenue, London, E.C. 3. For the present, specific instructions will be given to the offices concerned regarding the acceptance and disposal of such parcels as may be authorised for despatch.

1. M. Gatson de Reynier of the International Y.M.C.A. called at this HQ and stated that he has been instructed by General Guillon of that Association to buy books in Rome for despatch to POW camps in various parts of the world.

2. The books, which are contained in 427 cases and 268 parcels addressed as shewn in the attached list, are at present in the premises of the Italian Red Cross at 6 Via Puglie, Rome.

3. M. de Reynier requests that the cases and parcels should be conveyed to destination by Allied means.

4. So far as this Sub-Commission is concerned no objection is seen to the request being granted but the consignment is, of course, altogether outside the scope of any civil mail service.

5. In the enclosed letter an assurance is given regarding the unobjectionable nature of the books and a "snap" check censorship before the boxes are fastened can be arranged.

6. It is understood that, if necessary, arrangements could be made for the Naples Delegation of the Italian Red Cross to take the packages into store at Naples pending shipment as was done in the case of the smaller consignment dealt with earlier this year on behalf of the Italian Red Cross (G-5 III.I6-2 of 30 July 1944). In view, however, of the number of the packages and the diversity of the addressees it may be considered preferable to have them conveyed entirely under military arrangements from Rome onwards.







Committee has given information that the message forms despatched from Postal Offices in various liberated Provinces such as Ancona, Apennia, Cosenza, Ascoli Piceno, Firenze Grosseto, Livorno, Lucca, Macerata, Perugia, Toscana, Pisa, Pistoia, Siena and Terri, which are under control of this Allied Commission, are forwarded to the Delegation of Naples instead of home, in contradiction to what was dispensed in the two last para - N° VII of the Ministerial Circular N° P35C27/ IPS of 5-9-1944, reproduced on page N° 186, para.81, of Bulletin N° 4, 2nd part of 16th Sept.

This Ministry has already provided to draw the attention of the Postal Offices that depend from the P.T. Direction of the Provinces under control of the Italian Government, to the matter.

We ask this Commission to issue the above mentioned necessary instructions to the other P.T. Directions under control of the Commission.


