With reference to 383.7-15 of 20th July 1945,
referred to this Sub-Commission for observations.

1. The Governments of the United States and Great Britain agreed with the German and former Italian Governments that the I International Prisoner of War Convention signed at Geneva on 27th July 1929 shall be considered as applicable to civilian internees insofar as its provisions can be applied to civilians.

2. There has been no question up to now of the Italian Postal Administration refusing to deliver unpaid internee mail through ordinary postal channels in the same way as incoming Prisoner of War mail, and it has been confirmed that no such question would arise in this case.

3. The early establishment of a means of communication between internees and their relatives is usually one of the first preoccupations of those responsible for the welfare of internees and it is thought that a simple enquiry to the holding authorities would reveal that in this case some scheme for communications is actually commenced or contemplated through Red Cross or other channels.

Subject: Correspondence for Internee Camps Padula and Terni
 To : Under Secretary of State for Posts and Telecommunications.

With reference to your 2456/3 of 17th April.

1. I have just had an opportunity of scrutinising the envelopes of a considerable number of letters delivered at "A" Camp about 4 weeks after the dates of posting in all parts of Southern and Central Italy.
2. None of these envelopes bears any indication of misaddressing to Salerno nor is it clear that the whole of the delay occurred in course of post.
3. It would afford a useful indication whether the delay is occurring before or after civil postal treatment if arrangements could be made at Naples Ferrovia Office to date-stamp for about two weeks letters for the two camps concerned immediately before they are handed over to the Censorship Detachment.
4. If you will notify me of the date on which such an arrangement comes into operation I will ask the Camp Commandants to have observation made as to the date of arrival of the letters concerned.

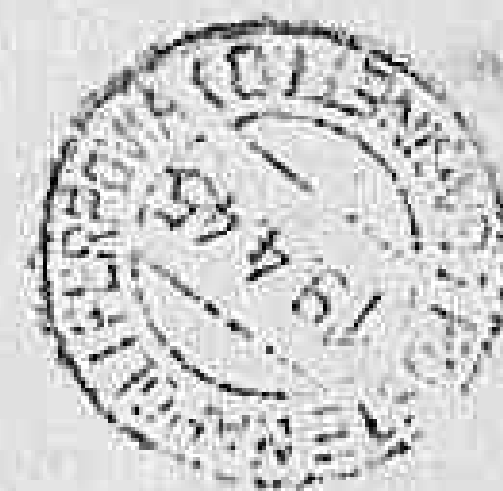

Reference your 473901 of 9th April 1945.

1. I should be glad to have in due course a copy of the report and statements furnished by your Naples Office in connection with the scrutiny of transit times of correspondence for the Internee Camps; also details of the numbers of such letters sent directly to Termi and Salerno for Padula.

2. It will be seen from the attached envelope that despite the attention which you have directed to this matter, the most extraordinary mistreatment occurs. This registered letter for Camp "A" at Padula was evidently sent by Rome to Salerno; retained by that office for at least two days; and then sent back to Rome and returned to sender.

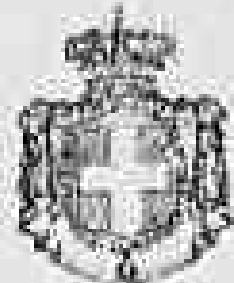

1. Example (a) which you quote gives two clear cases where delay is not attributable to the Italian Civil Post Office. The letter of the 15th December which was found in a parcel handed in at the camp and sent officially to POW Censorship should not have touched the civil post at any point either on its way to or from the Censorship Detachment. Similarly the Civil Post Office is in no way concerned with the time which elapses between the writing of the other letter of the 6th of February and its Censorship on 27th February.
2. Could the envelopes of the letters referred to in example (b) be furnished for examination please?
3. As your D.A.D.A.F.S. can confirm, the public is frequently ready to make sweeping statements regarding postal delays which are often subsequently found to be due to inaccurate or incomplete addressing of the correspondence or even failure to post the letter soon after it was written, and it is advisable to see the evidence before making deductions as to the responsibility. I have, however, asked the Under Secretary of State for Posts and Telecommunications to have further checks made on the transmission times of the correspondence at the stage where it is handed over to the Censorship Detachment.
4. It should be mentioned that the new return addresses for the internee camps laid down in AG 333.7/101 CAP-O of 19th February 1943 (viz "A" Civilian Internee Camp, Padula, Italy and "R" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, Italy) are not very satisfactory from the postal point of view having regard to the fact that the correspondence is due to be circulated to Naples for censorship. It is highly probable that despite instructions to the contrary some of the letters will be sorted and circulated as addressed and the Under Secretary has also been asked to check on the extent to which such trouble is experienced.

1. Further complaints are being received of abnormal delay to correspondence addressed to internees. It is not clear at which stage such delay is occurring and, in order to clarify the position so far as the Civil Post Office is concerned, I suggest that it would be advisable to arrange that for a certain period all correspondence addressed to these camps should be specially examined at Naples Ferrovie Office prior to being transferred to the POW Censorship Detachment.
2. Particulars could be recorded of any items observed to have suffered abnormal delay up to that stage and the details could be passed to the Sezione Movimento for investigation.
3. It seems possible that the new addresses for the camps may result in the mis-sending of some letters to Terni and Padula (despite the instructions to the contrary). Will you please arrange for the Post Offices at Padula and Terni to ensure that any such mis-sent correspondence bears their office date stamp impression before it is forwarded to Naples. These Offices should also be asked to inform you of the number of such mis-sent items dealt with in a two weeks period (your telegram of the 5th March to Salerno and Terni Directorates refers).

Reference your 47347 2/2 of 23 February 1945.

1. Certain modifications which affect mail arrangements for these camps have now been announced. The following paragraphs set out the whole present position and requirements, and you will no doubt wish to issue comparable notifications accordingly.

2. Camp Designation.

Camp N° 371 (Padula) will in future be known as:
 "A" Civilian Internee Camp.
 Camp N° 2 (Terni) will be known as: "B" Civilian Internee Camp.

3. Postal Address.

This will now show the actual town of destination as follows:-

"A" Civilian Internee Camp, Padula, Italy
 "B" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, Italy.

4. Circulation of mails
 (a) Letters and postcards to internees (both camps)

All offices should forward these to Naples Ferrovia and NOT direct to Padula and Terni.

At Naples the correspondence should be transferred daily to the P.O.W. Censorship Detachment which, after Censorship, will dispose of the mail direct for transmission to the Camps by Allied Military postal services.

Correspondence FROM internees (9843 the postal services area in Italy only) will be sent officially from the Camps to the P.O.W. Censorship Detachment, and hand by the latter to the Naples Ferrovia for onward transit to the addressees.

(b) Parcels to internees. (limited to those with permits - see Bulletin N° 3/1945.

"A" Camp, Tarni. To be circulated to RMS Ferrovie.

At Naples the parcels for "A" camp should be made up into despatches containing such parcels only, the bags being addressed

A similar arrangement will apply at Rome, the bags being addressed to the "A" Camp Commandant, and being handed over to the British W.O. Rome.

1. RESCISSION. Letter this headquarters, file AG 383.7/057 GEG-O, dated 1 December 1944, subject as above, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

2. STATUS AND TREATMENT.

a. It has been agreed by the Governments of the United States and Great Britain with the German and former Italian Governments that the International Prisoner of War Convention signed at Geneva on 27 July 1929 shall be considered as applicable to civilian internees insofar as its provisions can be applied to civilians.

b. The custody of civilians arrested by the British or United States authorities, or accepted by them for internment, will be a military responsibility.

3. INTERMENT.

"3 a. All internees arrested in Italy will normally be evacuated to "R" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, (A 8739) for internment save that Italians arrested in No. 3 District or Southern District, Peninsular Base Section, may be evacuated to "A" Internee Camp, Padula, near Sala Consilina (T 4295) in cases where it would be impracticable for administrative reasons to evacuate them to Terni."

6. The escort delivering internees to an Internee Camp will carry an "arrest slip" for each internee. The "arrest slip" will be signed by the officer in charge of the FS Section or CIC Detachment making the arrest and will show when, where, why and by whom the internee was taken into custody and will indicate how he should be disposed of.

4. COMMAND.

a. Internee Camps will be under the direct command of this headquarters for general administration and of the headquarters of the district in which situated for local administration.

b. Direct communication between Commandant, Internee Camp and this headquarters is authorized on the following matters of general administration in addition to the matters specifically referred to in succeeding paragraphs of this instruction:

- (1) Welfare - assistance to internees from philanthropic organizations (including wireless, libraries and educational facilities) - (G-1(B)).
- (2) Staff - Selection and posting of British Officers and Serjeant Interpreters - (G-1(B)).
- (3) Mail and Censorship - Letters to Protecting Power or IRCC or communications with Censor Control Officers - (G-1(B)).

5. DOCUMENTATION.

a. All internees will be regarded as "temporarily detained" until the expiration of three weeks from the date of delivery to an Internee Camp, after which period an internee will only continue to be so regarded, if his release is known to be probable in the near future or if instructions to

A "Documentation will be carried out on AF W 3000 immediately upon delivery of an internee to an Internee Camp."

internee ceases to be temporarily detained. Each AFW 3000 will be endorsed "CIVILIAN INTERNEE" in red ink. AFW 3000 consists of three (3) parts, each bearing a serial number and giving detailed information of prisoners of war. This form will be adapted to meet the different information required concerning an internee.

b. Part III will be completed by the internee or at his or her dictation and Parts I and II by Commandant, Internee Camp. Parts II and III will then be forwarded to GHQ, 2d Echelon (EPW Section) and Part I retained by the Camp. Should an internee be transferred to another holding Camp, Part I will be handed to the escort for delivery to the new place of internment and the date of receipt of the internee will be stamped on the reverse of the form by the receiving unit. The counterfoils in AFW 3000 books will be completed by Commandant, Internee Camp and retained by him.

c. Notification of internment to the Protecting Power will be made by FWIP, LONDON, in the same manner as for prisoners of war.

d. Casualties in respect of internees other than those temporarily detained will be reported to GHQ, 2d Echelon on AFW 3002. Internees admitted to a civilian hospital will be regarded as remaining on the strength of the Internee Camp.

e. The death of an internee will be reported by signal to AFHQ (G-2(CI)) in addition to being reported to GHQ, 2d Echelon under the provisions of sub-paragraph c above. AFW 3314 in duplicate will be rendered to GHQ, 2d Echelon as soon as possible after burial.

6. RETURNS. Commandants of Internee Camps will render the following returns:

a. A daily return on AFW 3487 to GHQ, 2d Echelon giving the strength by nationalities at 1200 hrs each day of all internees in respect of whom documentation of AFW 3000 has been carried out.

b. A weekly return by signal to AFHQ (G-1(Br)) and to district and area of sub-area headquarters of the number of internees of each sex by nationalities held at 0700 hrs on Monday of each week.

c. A monthly return to AFHQ (G-2(CI)):

(1) Of the results of all reviews and

(2) Of all releases.

d. A monthly return to AFHQ (G-1(B)) of officers on the strength of the Camp Administrative Staff, showing personal number, rank, name, regiment and appointment held.

7. PERSONAL EFFECTS AND IMPOUNDED CURRENCY.

a. Internees, on arrest, will be permitted to pack and take with them a bag or suitcase of personal effects, spare clothing etc., which they may require during their period of internment.

b. Contents of the bag will be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms, files or such articles (except money) as could be of assistance to the internee in escaping or could be used as weapons.

c. The bag and contents (other than money) will remain in possession of the internee while in Camp. All money will be impounded on delivery of the internee to the Camp, a receipt being issued to the internee, a duplicate of which will be deposited with the impounded money.

d. In the event of the death of an internee, his or her ^{personal} effects will be disposed of in one of the following manners:

(1) If the deceased was of Italian nationality and the next of kin is resident in Allied Occupied ITALY, personal effects and any impounded currency held on his or her account will be forwarded to Headquarters, Allied Commission for onward transmission to the appropriate Italian authorities.

(2) In all other cases, personal effects and impounded currency will be forwarded to GHQ, 2d Echelon with two copies of AFW 3190 and, in the case of an internee temporarily detained, particulars of nationality and of the name and address of his or her next of kin.

8. DISCIPLINE. "Regulations for the Maintenance of Discipline among Prisoners of War 1939" will apply to internees.

9. RELEASE.

a. Civilians are only interned in cases where it is considered that they would present a security threat to the Allied cause if they remain at large. Therefore, whether the interning authority recommends internment for the duration or not, their release will be authorized where the security threat no longer exists.

b. Under no circumstances will internment be regarded as a punishment and no release will be recommended or granted merely on the ground that the internee has been confined for a long time.

c. Instructions will from time to time be issued by AFHQ (G-2(CI)) as to the constitution of the reviewing authorities at Internment Camps and as to the principles by which those authorities should be guided in considering the cases of the internees.

d. The following procedure will be adopted for releases:

- (1) Where the interning authority has expressly stated that the case of the internee will be reviewed after a specific period, the reviewing officers at the Camp will consider the case. If release is recommended as a result of the review, the Commandant will forward to G-2 ROME AFHQ, G-2 Peninsular Base Section, GSI Number 1 District, GSI Number 2 District and GSI Number 3 District of their information a list containing the names of any internees whom it is intended to release to their territory during the following week and also the address to which it is intended they should return. If the district or base section concerned has recently received information indicating that the internee would constitute a positive threat to Allied security if released, the Commandant should be informed forthwith (and a copy sent to AFHQ (G-2(CI))). In the absence of such indication being received within eight days of the despatch of the above mentioned list of names, the Commandant may authorize release. Persons whose homes lie to the north of the Rear Army Security Control Line at the date of the review, will, in the absence of specific authority, only be released if they undertake to reside at a named address to the south of the line.
- (2) Where a person has been interned for the "duration of the war" or where the period specified by the interning authority has not expired, the case may be reviewed either at the discretion of the reviewing officer or on the instructions of either the interning authority or AFHQ (G-2(CI)).

The recommendations of the Commandant will be submitted to AFHQ (G-2(CI)) and will include statements from the reviewing officer and, where relevant, from the medical officer. Copies of the recommendation will be sent either to G-2 ROME AREA, G-2 Peninsular Base Section, GSI Number 1 District, GSI Number 2 District or GSI Number 3 District according to the place of residence to which the internee would go if released. Authority for the release of persons in these categories may only be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)).

- (3) All releases of internees other than those temporarily detained will be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3002.

10. HANDING OVER OF INTERNEES TO ITALIAN AUTHORITIES. Internees may in certain circumstances be handed over on the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) to the Italian authorities for trial or for the purpose of giving evidence. In any such case a receipt will be obtained in the form shown at Appendix "A" and retained by the Commandant of the camp.

11. ESCAPES.

a. The escape of an internee will be reported immediately by the quickest available means (e.g. by telephone) to APM or DAPM of area or sub-area headquarters, confirmed by signal, and will be reported by signal to AFHQ G-1 (Br) and district headquarters.

b. Reports will include name, number, description and home address of the escaped internee and address of his or her next of kin or any other address for which it is believed the escapee may be making.

c. Escapes of internees other than those temporarily detained will also be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3002.

12. COURTS OF INQUIRY.

a. A Court of Inquiry will invariably be convened in any of the following cases:

- (1) Escape of an internee.
- (2) Serious injury to an internee.
- (3) Violent death of an internee.
- (4) Such other cases as may be considered by district commanders to be necessary.

b. A Copy of Proceedings of any Court of Inquiry convened under this instruction together with the opinions of the convening officer and higher authorities will be forwarded through the usual channels to AFHQ (G-1(Br)).

13. VISITS.

a. Internees other than those specified in sub-paragraph b below will be permitted to receive one visit per ~~month~~^{week} from their relatives. Each visit will be limited to two persons to each internee.

b. Internees temporarily detained and those in respect of whom specific instructions are issued by higher authority will not be permitted to receive visitors and on visiting days will be confined to their quarters.

c. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b above, internees will be permitted to receive visits from their legal advisers by appointment and with the approval of the Commandant of the Camp.

d. Authority may in certain cases be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)) for accredited representatives of the Italian government to visit a camp for the purpose of interrogating internees.

e. All visitors of the types mentioned above will be given a warning to read, written in the appropriate language, as to the censorship regulations in force before they are conducted into the camp.

f. Except where necessary in cases falling within sub-paragraph d above, internees will not be permitted to remain for more than half an hour with their visitors, who from the time of their entry into the camp until their departure will be kept under the strictest supervision possible, in order to prevent any evasion of censorship regulations.

g. Visits for the purpose of making an inspection or of making provision for the welfare of the internees as a whole may be paid to Internee Camps by those persons (including representatives of the Protecting Power or of the International or Italian Red Cross or Clergy) to whom passes may from time to time be issued by AFHQ (G-1(Br)). Such visitors will visit camps only by appointment and will not be affected by the provisions of sub-paragraphs e and f above.

h. The full name, address and identity card number of every visitor to a camp irrespective of the purpose of his or her visit and (where applicable) the relationship of the visitor to the internee visited will be entered in a "visitors book".

14. MARRIAGES.

a. The Allied Military Authorities have no objections to marriages taking place between internees held in British Internment Camps provided that such marriages are in all respects legal and valid.

b. The absence of any objection by the Allied Authorities to such marriages is not to be construed as in any way purporting to validate a marriage otherwise illegal or invalid.

c. Such marriages do not necessarily confer any additional privileges on the parties concerned. For example, they will only be permitted to occupy married quarters in a camp subject to such quarters being available and then at the discretion of the Camp Commandant.

d. Notification of marriages will be made to the following authorities in order that the name of the woman concerned may be altered in their records:

- (1) Headquarters which authorized internment.
- (2) AFHQ (G-2(CI)).
- (3) GHQ, 2d Echelon. (only if documentation on AFW 3000 has previously been carried out).

15. EMPLOYMENT. No internee will be employed, except on work connected with the administration, internal arrangements and maintenance of camps, unless employment is requested by him or her in writing.

16. PAY. Internees are not entitled to pay.

17. RATIONS. Prisoner of War scale of rations (scale 30 AFHQ Ration and Fuel Scales) will be issued.

18. CLOTHING.

a. The provision of clothing and necessaries is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees who are in need and are unable to provide their requirements from their own resources may, however, be supplied free from British stocks with such essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the scale detailed in Table "D", Appendix VI, War Clothing Regulations, 1943. Grade three clothing will be issued.

b. Demands for clothing will be made through normal Ordnance channels.

c. All articles of clothing will be entered in an account kept by the Commandant, Internee Camp, and issues will be supported by a receipt signed by the internee.

d. (1) The Commandant of a Camp may on application issue to internees permit forms for transmission to relatives or friends, on presentation of which the Italian civil postal authorities will accept parcels of clothing and personal effects, not exceeding 5 Kg in weight, addressed to internee camps.

(2) These permit forms will only be issued in cases where the clothing or effects required are considered necessary for the comfort of the applicant and where their receipt will release War Department clothing or necessaries.

(3) Supplies of permit forms may be obtained from Headquarters, Allied Commission (Communications Sub-Commission).

19. MEDICAL.

a. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b below, the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) will be obtained before transfer of an internee to a civil hospital for treatment which cannot be provided in the Camp Hospital. Applications for such authority will state the name of the internee and of the hospital to which his or her transfer is applied for and will be supported by a report by the Camp Medical Officer and recommendation of ADMS.

b. Where the Commandant is advised by the Camp Medical Officer that such transfer is immediately necessary in the interests of the internee's health, he may give authority for it, but in any such case will at once inform AFHQ (G-2(CI)) stating the name of the internee and of the hospital to which he or she has been transferred and the nature of his or her complaint.

20. MAIL AND CENSORSHIP.

a. Internees temporarily ~~detained~~(see paragraph 5) will not be permitted to dispatch or receive any correspondence.

b. Regulations governing the correspondence of ~~other~~ internees are as follows:

(1) Incoming correspondence. Correspondence addressed to internees will be passed to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment, APO 512, US Army, who will forward it, after examination, to the Internee Camp concerned.

(2) Outgoing correspondence.

(a) Return Address. An internee will write on the back of the envelope his number, name and description together with the following return address:

"A" Civilian Internee Camp, Padula, Italy" or
"R" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, Italy".

(b) Collection. Internees mail will be dispatched daily to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment.

(c) Restrictions. Correspondence of internees will be limited to two (2) letters, or one (1) letter and one (1) postcard, or two (2) postcards per week. The subject matter of letter will be limited to twenty-four (24) lines and of postcards to seven (7) lines. Prisoner of War Stationery will be used, viz., AFW 3058 - Letter Card, AFW 3494 - Post Card.

- (3) Incoming Parcels. The responsibility of examining parcels addressed to internees rests with the Commandant of the Internee Camp. Parcels will be opened in the presence of the addressee. Any letters found enclosed will be forwarded to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment. Articles within the terms of paragraph 7 b above will be impounded and descriptions forwarded to AFHQ (G-1(Br)) who will issue instructions for disposal.
- (4) Outgoing parcels. Parcels may not be sent by internees.

21. CANTEEN SUPPLIES.

- a. Internees are entitled to canteen supplies purchased through EFI on the following scale, subject to availability:

- b. Supplies may be demanded under the same current conditions as for prisoners of war. When preparing strength statements care should be taken to distinguish between male and female internees.

- c. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 22 below, sums accruing from NAAFI discounts will be paid into Internee Camp Welfare Funds.

- d. Canteen supplies essential for personal cleanliness may be issued free to internees who are without private resources. Such items will be purchased by Camp Commandant out of Imprest Account and the receipted bills used as supporting vouchers thereto.

22. BARRACK DAMAGES.

- a. A proportion of sums accruing from NAAFI discounts to be fixed at the discretion of the Commandant will be retained by him to cover barrack damages which cannot be recovered from individuals or groups of individuals.

Reference your 121.2 of 23 February 1945.

1. The treatment of correspondence to and from the "A" and "B" Internee Camps at the Naples Civil Post Office has been under observation for some time.
2. The outward correspondence is directly handed over after censorship by the P.W. Censorship Unit to the Naples Civil Postal Service, and there is no local evidence that it is not duly disposed of within a few hours, for delivery or forwarding as appropriate. (There is a daily despatch to Rome). Inspection has not revealed any arrears of correspondence awaiting treatment.
3. In the absence of the details essential to the proper investigation of a charge of this kind it is not known whether the complaint rests on certain items which are known to have suffered exceptional delay ³⁸¹⁵ mistreatment of some kind, or on a properly substantiated representation of generally bad service. If the latter applies, the step can be taken of making a check of the time which elapses between the dates of writing and dates of censorship; but in this connection it should be mentioned that in letter GCB/1043/796 of 20th January, G-2 (CC) Sec. A.F.H.Q. stated that "P.W. Censorship does not receive mail from P.W. Camp 317 (A) with regularity", and there may be some connection between this factor and the substance of your letter.

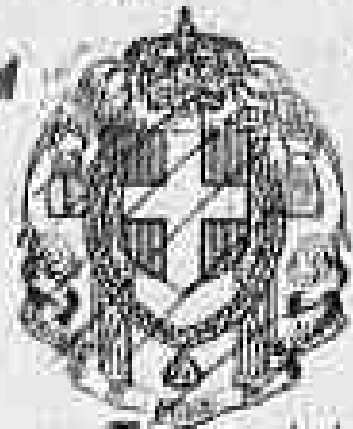

Following an apposit visit at Naples by a Superior Inspector, it results that mails for the Internees at N.2 Camp at Terni (which consists of a daily packet of about 10 letters) are transmitted from the Naples Ferrovia Office (POW Section) to the American office of War censorship in via Medina 61 (POW Censorship Det. AFO 512, US Army). Said office after having censored the letters doesn't re-deliver the correspondence to the Naples Ferrovia Office for further forwarding; but the correspondence is forwarded in labelled bundles to the 15th British Army Post Office (British Censorship Office at Naples Ferrovia) who, in its turn, directly sees to their further despatch. Consequently the "ordinaire" department at Naples Ferrovia, receiving no mail for n.2 Camp from the American Censorship of via Medina, limit themselves to form "negative" the letter bill serially numbered, for Terni C.P., which, owing to the lack of bags and envelopes, are forwarded without cover by means of messengers of the Rome-Naples motor-service.

In order that correspondence for n. 2 Internee Camp have their regular course it would be necessary that opportune instructions be given by your Commission to the Censorship office of via Medina. Meantimes we have already issued instructions that the despatch from Naples to Terni be always made up in bags, even when "negative". And we have asked Terni to justify why the missed arrival of numbered despatches of Naples Ferrovia have not been notified.

The same official has taken an interest to the treatment of correspondence for the Internees at N. 371 Camp and he has stated that it is regular.

It is found that very few letters addressed to N° 2 Camp are reaching the Naples Post Office from other Civil Post Offices in Italy, whereas there is quite a large volume of traffic for N° 371 Camp. Such letters as do arrive, however, are handed over immediately to the PW Censorship Detachment which states that it passes them to the British Base A.P.O. for onward transmission to you with military mail.

3. Before further action is taken, will you please advise me whether it is the case that some letters for the Internees are actually reaching you with the military mail and whether there are definite grounds for assuming that a larger amount of correspondence for Internees is actually being posted at Italian Post Offices.

4. The Italian Civil postal services work only as far north as the Provinces of Ancona, Perugia, Arezzo and those portions of Florence and Pisa Provinces which are south of the River Arno, and it would be interesting to know whether the relatives of the Internees in your Camp live mainly in the area open to normal Postal services.

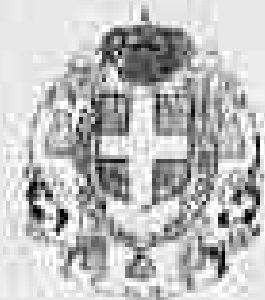

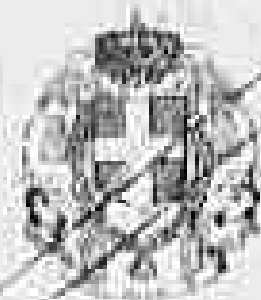

Reference is made to AAI Circular letter 3064/4/A(O) of October 10th, 1944 - para. 12(e)(iii) and (vii).

1. The detailed arrangements with the Italian postal authorities will be made by the Communications Sub-Commission.
2. Had the scheme been known of here in advance, it would have been recommended that mail posted by the internees at Terni should be despatched to the Allied Censor Control Officer at either RIMTI (adjacent to and controlling TERNI) or ROME. Unless - which is not indicated - it is intended that Censorship will be undertaken by the P.O.W. Censorship Unit at Naples, a deal of the correspondence concerned will go South to Naples unnecessarily, and have to be sent northwards again. Although perhaps the avoidable delay so occasioned is of no great moment, it could be avoided or minimised if censorship were undertaken at Rieti or Rome.
3. Censorship of correspondence posted by the internees can be applied to the extent of 100% if necessary. In the reverse direction there is very little provision for Censorship beyond "scrutiny" at the camp itself. In many of the areas in which correspondence to the internees may be posted, correspondence is not censored, and nowhere is it dealt with on anything but a snap-check basis. For the present (whilst the civil mail services do not extend beyond Terni province) all Provinces will be required to circulate letters for the camp to the ROME Post Office, where its location will be known. If desired, the items could be referred to the Rome Censorship station before onward despatch to Terni.
4. In view of the points raised in para.s 2 and 3, the issue of definite notification to the Italian postal authorities is being held in abeyance pending receipt of further instructions.

- (b) Contents of the bag will be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms, files, or such articles (except money) which could be of assistance to the internee in escaping.

(a) The provision of clothing and necessities is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees, however, who are in need, and are unable to provide their requirements from their own resources, may be supplied free from British stocks with such essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the Scale detailed in Table 'B' Appendix VI, War Clothing Regs 1943.

(b) Demands for clothing will be made by Commandant 2 Internee Camp through normal British Ordnance channels.

9. Medical.

A sick bay will be maintained within the camp. Medical and nursing personnel will, as far as possible, be found from internees.

- (c) Canteen facilities. Accounting instructions for canteen supplies will be published shortly.
- (d) All correspondence privileges accorded to PW.

(e) Postal.

The following postal facilities will be granted to internees:-

- (i) Internees may send the number of letters normally permitted for military PW (2 letters, or 1 letter and 1 postcard, or 2 postcards, weekly; both of which may NOT be posted on the same day) to addresses in that part of Allied occupied ITALY where civil postal facilities are available.
- (ii) Mail will not be accepted for destinations in enemy occupied ITALY, or anywhere overseas, other than SICILY or SARDINIA.

(iii) All such mail

- (iii) All such mail will be despatched by Commandant, Internee Camp to Allied Censor Control Officer, NAPLES.

The Commandant will deal direct with GSI(1), Adv HQ AAI on all matters concerning security policy, releases and admissions of internees, and visitors.

The recommendations of the Commandant will be submitted to AFHQ (G-2(CI)) and will include statements from the reviewing officer and, where relevant, from the medical officer. Copies of the recommendation will be sent either to G-2 ROME AREA, G-2 Peninsular Base Section, GSI Number 1 District, GSI Number 2 District or GSI Number 3 District according to the place of residence to which the internee would go if released. Authority for the release of persons in these categories may only be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)).

- (3) All releases of internees other than those temporarily detained will be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3002.

10. HANDING OVER OF INTERNEES TO ITALIAN AUTHORITIES. Internees may in certain circumstances be handed over on the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) to the Italian authorities for trial or for the purpose of giving evidence. In any such case a receipt will be obtained in the form shown at Appendix "A" and retained by the Commandant of the camp.

11. ESCAPES.

a. The escape of an internee will be reported immediately by the quickest available means (e.g. by telephone) to APM or DAPM of area or sub-area headquarters, confirmed by signal, and will be reported by signal to AFHQ G-1 (Br) and district headquarters.

b. Reports will include name, number, description and home address of the escaped internee and address of his or her next of kin or any other address for which it is believed the escapee may be making.

c. Escapes of internees other than those temporarily detained will also be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3002.

12. COURTS OF INQUIRY.

a. A Court of Inquiry will invariably be convened in any of the following cases:

- (1) Escape of an internee.
- (2) Serious injury to an internee.
- (3) Violent death of an internee.
- (4) Such other cases as may be considered by district commanders to be necessary.

b. A Copy of Proceedings of any Court of Inquiry convened under this instruction together with the opinions of the convening officer and higher authorities will be forwarded through the usual channels to AFHQ (G-1(Br)).

13. VISITS.

a. Internees other than those specified in sub-paragraph b below will be permitted to receive one visit per ~~month~~ from their relatives. Each visit will be limited to two persons to each internee.

b. Internees temporarily detained and those in respect of whom specific instructions are issued by higher authority will not be permitted to receive visitors and on visiting days will be confined to their quarters.

c. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b above, internees will be permitted to receive visits from their legal advisers by appointment and with the approval of the Commandant of the Camp.

d. Authority may in certain cases be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)) for accredited representatives of the Italian government to visit a camp for the purpose of interrogating internees.

e. All visitors of the types mentioned above will be given a warning to read, written in the appropriate language, as to the censorship regulations in force before they are conducted into the camp.

f. Except where necessary in cases falling within sub-paragraph d above, internees will not be permitted to remain for more than half an hour with their visitors, who from the time of their entry into the camp until their departure will be kept under the strictest supervision possible, in order to prevent any evasion of censorship regulations.

g. Visits for the purpose of making an inspection or of making provision for the welfare of the internees as a whole may be paid to Internee Camps by those persons (including representatives of the Protecting Power or of the International or Italian Red Cross or Clergy) to whom passes may from time to time be issued by AFHQ (G-1(Br)). Such visitors will visit camps only by appointment and will not be affected by the provisions of sub-paragraphs e and f above.

h. The full name, address and identity card number of every visitor to a camp irrespective of the purpose of his or her visit and (where applicable) the relationship of the visitor to the internee visited will be entered in a "visitors book".

14. MARRIAGES.

a. The Allied Military Authorities have no objections to marriages taking place between internees held in British Internment Camps provided that such marriages are in all respects legal and valid.

b. The absence of any objection by the Allied Authorities to such marriages is not to be construed as in any way purporting to validate a marriage otherwise illegal or invalid.

c. Such marriages do not necessarily confer any additional privileges on the parties concerned. For example, they will only be permitted to occupy married quarters in a camp subject to such quarters being available and then at the discretion of the Camp Commandant.

d. Notification of marriages will be made to the following authorities in order that the name of the woman concerned may be altered in their records:

- (1) Headquarters which authorized internment.
- (2) AFHQ (G-2(CI)).
- (3) GHQ, 2d Echelon. (only if documentation on AFW 3000 has previously been carried out).

15. EMPLOYMENT. No internee will be employed, except on work connected with the administration, internal arrangements and maintenance of camps, unless employment is requested by him or her in writing.

16. PAY. Internees are not entitled to pay.

17. RATIONS. Prisoner of War scale of rations (scale 30 AFHQ Ration and Fuel Scales) will be issued.

18. CLOTHING.

38-8

a. The provision of clothing and necessities is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees who are in need and are unable to provide their requirements from their own resources may, however, be supplied free from British stocks with such essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the scale detailed in Table "D", Appendix VI, War Clothing Regulations, 1943. Grade three clothing will be issued.

b. Demands for clothing will be made through normal Ordnance channels.

c. All articles of clothing will be entered in an account kept by the Commandant, Internee Camp, and issues will be supported by a receipt signed by the internee.

- d. (1) The Commandant of a Camp may on application issue to internees permit forms for transmission to relatives or friends, on presentation of which the Italian civil postal authorities will accept parcels of clothing and personal effects, not exceeding 5 Kg in weight, addressed to internee camps.
- (2) These permit forms will only be issued in cases where the clothing or effects required are considered necessary for the comfort of the applicant and where their receipt will release War Department clothing or necessities.
- (3) Supplies of permit forms may be obtained from Headquarters, Allied Commission (Communications Sub-Commission).

19. MEDICAL.

a. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b below, the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) will be obtained before transfer of an internee to a civil hospital for treatment which cannot be provided in the Camp Hospital. Applications for such authority will state the name of the internee and of the hospital to which his or her transfer is applied for and will be supported by a report by the Camp Medical Officer and recommendation of ADMS.

b. Where the Commandant is advised by the Camp Medical Officer that such transfer is immediately necessary in the interests of the internee's health, he may give authority for it, but in any such case will at once inform AFHQ (G-2(CI)) stating the name of the internee and of the hospital to which he or she has been transferred and the nature of his or her complaint.

20. MAIL AND CENSORSHIP.

a. Internees temporarily detained (see paragraph 5) will not be permitted to dispatch or receive any correspondence.

b. Regulations governing the correspondence of other internees are as follows:

(1) Incoming correspondence. Correspondence addressed to internees will be passed to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment, APO 512, US Army, who will forward it, after examination, to the Internee Camp concerned.

(2) Outgoing correspondence.

(a) Return Address. An internee will write on the back of the envelope his number, name and description together with the following return address:

"A" Civilian Internee Camp, Padula, Italy" or
"R" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, Italy".

(b) Collection. Internees mail will be dispatched daily to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment.

(c) Restrictions. Correspondence of internees will be limited to two (2) letters, or one (1) letter and one (1) postcard, or two (2) postcards per week. The subject matter of letter will be limited to twenty-four (24) lines and of postcards to seven (7) lines. Prisoner of War Stationery will be used, viz., AFW 3058 - Letter Card, AFW 3494 - Post Card.

- (3) Incoming Parcels. The responsibility of examining parcels addressed to internees rests with the Commandant of the Internee Camp. Parcels will be opened in the presence of the addressee. Any letters found enclosed will be forwarded to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment. Articles within the terms of paragraph 7 b above will be impounded and descriptions forwarded to AFHQ (G-1(Br)) who will issue instructions for disposal.
- (4) Outgoing parcels. Parcels may not be sent by internees.

21. CANTEEN SUPPLIES.

a. Internees are entitled to canteen supplies purchased through EFI on the following scale, subject to availability:

b. Supplies may be demanded under the same current conditions as for prisoners of war. When preparing strength statements care should be taken to distinguish between male and female internees.

c. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 22 below, sums accruing from NAAFI discounts will be paid into Internee Camp Welfare Funds.

d. Canteen supplies essential for personal cleanliness may be issued free to internees who are without private resources. Such items will be purchased by Camp Commandant out of Imprest account and the receipted bills used as supporting vouchers thereto.

22. BARRACK DAMAGES.

a. A proportion of sums accruing from NAAFI discounts to be fixed at the discretion of the Commandant will be retained by him to cover barrack damages which cannot be recovered from individuals or groups of individuals.

Reference your 121.2 of 23 February 1945.

1. The treatment of correspondence to and from the "A" and "B" Internee Camps at the Naples Civil Post Office has been under observation for some time.
2. The outward correspondence is directly handed over after censorship by the P.W. Censorship Unit to the Naples Civil Postal Service, and there is no local evidence that it is not duly disposed of within a few hours, for delivery or forwarding as appropriate. (There is a daily despatch to Rome). Inspection has not revealed any arrears of correspondence awaiting treatment.
3. In the absence of the details essential to the proper investigation of a charge of this kind it is not known whether the complaint rests on certain items which are known to have suffered exceptional delay ³⁸² by mistreatment of some kind, or on a properly substantiated representation of generally bad service. If the latter applies, the step can be taken of making a check of the time which elapses between the dates of writing and dates of censorship; but in this connection it should be mentioned that in letter GCB/1043/796 of 20th January, G-2 (OO) Sec. A.P.H.Q. stated that "P.W. Censorship does not receive mail from P.W. Camp 317 (A) with regularity", and there may be some connection between this factor and the substance of your letter.

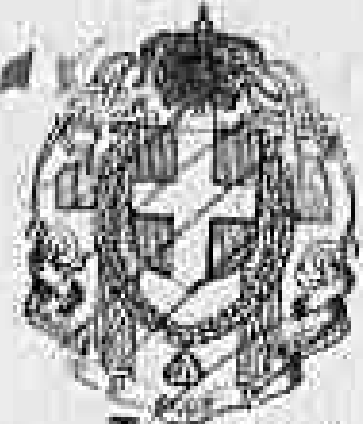

Following an apposit visit at Naples by a Superior Inspector, it results that mails for the Internees at N.2 Camp at Terni (which consists of a daily packet of about 10 letters) are transmitted from the Naples Ferrovia Office (POW Section) to the American office of War censorship in via Medina 61 (POW Censorship Det. APO 512, US Army). Said office after having censored the letters doesn't re-deliver the correspondence to the Naples Ferrovia Office for further forwarding; but the correspondence is forwarded in labelled bundles to the 15th British Army Post Office (British Censorship Office at Naples Ferrovia) who, in its turn, directly sees to their further despatch. Consequently the "ordinaire" department at Naples Ferrovia, receiving no mail for n.2 Camp from the American Censorship of via Medina, limit themselves to form "negative" the letter bill serially numbered, for Terni C.F., which, owing to the lack of bags and envelopes, are forwarded without cover by means of messengers of the Rome-Naples motor-service.

In order that correspondence for n. 2 Internee Camp have their regular course it would be necessary that opportune instructions be given by your Commission to the Censorship office of via Medina. Meantimes we have already issued instructions that the despatch from Naples to Terni be always made up in bags, even when "negative". And we have asked Terni to justify why the missed arrival of numbered despatches of Naples Ferrovia have not been notified.

The same official has taken an interest to the treatment of correspondence for the Internees at N. 371 Camp and he has stated that it is regular.

1. Following upon your recent Representations concerning the non-receipt of mails addressed to Internees at your Camp, an inspection of the arrangements has been made at Naples.

2. It is found that very few letters addressed to N° 2 Camp are reaching the Naples Post Office from other Civil Post Offices in Italy, whereas there is quite a large volume of traffic for N° 371 Camp. Such letters as do arrive, however, are handed over immediately to the PW Censorship Detachment which states that it passes them to the British Base A.P.O. for onward transmission to you with military mail.

3. Before further action is taken, will you please advise me whether it is the case that some letters for the Internees are actually reaching you with the military mail and whether there are definite grounds for assuming that a larger amount of correspondence for Internees is actually being posted at Italian Post Offices. 15806

4. The Italian Civil postal services work only as far north as the Provinces of Ancona, Perugia, Arezzo and those portions of Florence and Pisa Provinces which are south of the River Arno, and it would be interesting to know whether the relatives of the Internees in your Camp live mainly in the area open to normal Postal services.

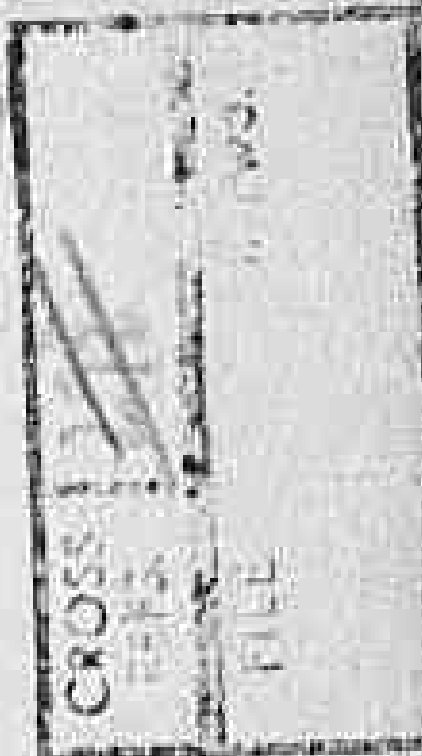

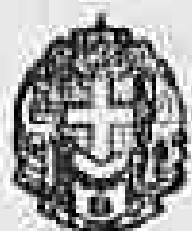

after censorship, it will be transferred to the Perugia Sorting
Office for disposal.

(b) Families writing to internees will use the address
"2 Internment Camp, c/o P/W C.D.
apc 512 U.S. Army"

and all Post Offices should circulate correspondence so addressed
to Naples, who will transfer all such items to P/W Censorship
Department. On return of the correspondence Naples Peruvia
Sorting Office will arrange for onward transmission to Terni
for delivery there to the Camp Commandant. Extreme care must
be taken to ensure that no uncensored items are included in the
despatches to Terni.

(c) Will you please instruct all concerned accordingly.
Province E.C. other than Naples will not require to know of
the location of the camp.

SUBJECT:- Civilian Internees - Postal arrangements.

TO: - R.Q. A.A.I.

Reference is made to AAI Circular letter 3064/4/A(0) of October 10th, 1944 - para. 12(e)(iii) and (vii).

1. The detailed arrangements with the Italian postal authorities will be made by the Communications Sub-Commission.

2. Had the scheme been known of here in advance, it would have been recommended that mail posted by the internees at Terni should be despatched to the Allied Censor Control Officer at either RIETI (adjacent to and controlling TERNI) or ROME. Unless - which is not indicated - it is intended that Censorship will be undertaken by the P.O.W. Censorship Unit at Naples, a deal of the correspondence concerned will go South to Naples unnecessarily, and have to be sent northwards again. Although perhaps the avoidable delay so occasioned is of no great moment, it could be avoided or minimised if censorship were undertaken at Rieti or Rome.

3. Censorship of correspondence posted by the internees can be applied to the extent of 100% if necessary. In the reverse direction there is very little provision for Censorship beyond "scrutiny" at the camp itself. In many of the areas in which correspondence to the internees may be posted, correspondence is not censored, and nowhere is it dealt with on anything but a snap-check basis. For the present (whilst the civil mail services do not extend beyond Terni province) all Provinces will be required to circulate letters for the camp to the ROME Post Office, where its location will be known. If desired, the items could be referred to the Rome Censorship station before onward despatch to Terni.

4. In view of the points raised in para.s 2 and 3, the issue of definite notification to the Italian postal authorities is being held in abeyance pending receipt of further instructions.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 60CIVILIAN INTERNEES - ADMINISTRATIONGENERAL

1. This Instruction deals with the administration of civilian internees in AAI Operational Zone.
2. Civilian internees will continue to be a military responsibility.

STATUS

3. It has been agreed by the governments of the United States and Great Britain with the German and former Italian governments that the International PW Convention signed at GENEVA on 27 July 1929 shall be considered as applicable to civilian internees in so far as its provisions can be applied to civilians.

ADM4. Evacuation

With effect from 15 Oct 44 internees will be evacuated to 2 Internee Camp, TERNI, (M.R. A 8739) through PW channels. The escort will carry an "arrest slip" for each internee: the "arrest slip" will be signed by Officer i/c F3 Section or CIG Detachment making the arrest, and will show when, where and by whom the internee was taken into custody, and will indicate how he should be disposed of.

5. Personal Effects.

- (a) Internees, on arrest, will be permitted to pack and take with them a bag or suitcase of personal effects, spare clothing, etc, which they may require during their period of internment.
- (b) Contents of the bag will be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms, files, or such articles (except money) which could be of assistance to the internee in escaping.
- (c) The bag and contents will remain in possession of the internee whilst in the camp.

6. Pay.

Internees are not entitled to pay.

7. Rations.

PW scale of rations will be issued.

8. Clothing.

CIVILIAN INTERNEES - ADMINISTRATION

GENERAL

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5. Personal Effects.

- (a) Internees, on arrest, will be permitted to pack and take with them a bag or suitcase of personal effects, spare clothing etc, which they may require during their period of internment.
- (b) Contents of the bag will be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms, files, or such articles (except money) which could be of assistance to the internee in escaping.
- (c) The bag and contents will remain in possession of the internee whilst in the camp.

6. Pay.

Internees are not entitled to pay.

7. Rations.

PW scale of rations will be issued.

8. Clothing.

- (a) The provision of clothing and necessities is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees, however, who are in need, and are unable to provide their requirements from their own resources, may be supplied free from British stocks with such essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the Scale detailed in Table 'D' Appendix VI, War Clothing Regs 1943.

/(b) Demands

- (b) Demands for clothing will be made by Commandant 2 Internee Camp through normal British Ordnance channels.
- (c) Commandant 2 Internee Camp will keep an account of all articles of clothing issued. Issues will be supported by a receipt signed by the internee. On transfer from one camp to another, articles supplied from camp stocks which are not considered essential for retention will be withdrawn, conditioned and put into stock for re-issue.

9. Medical.

Medical arrangements for internees will be made by HQ 1 District.

A sick bay will be maintained within the camp. Medical and nursing personnel will, as far as possible, be found from internees.

10. Employment.

Civilian internees will not be employed unless they make written request for employment.

CIVILIANS TEMPORARILY DETAINED

11. All civilians TEMPORARILY detained will be accorded the same treatment as PW with the following exceptions:-

- (a) They will NOT be documented as PW.
- (b) Detention will NOT be notified to Protecting Power.
- (c) They will NOT be permitted to send capture cards or be accorded any correspondence privileges.
- (d) PW allowance will NOT be applicable to them.

CIVILIANS INTERNED OTHER THAN TEMPORARILY

12. Civilians interned OTHER THAN temporarily will be accorded the same treatment as PW, including:-

- (a) Documentation.
- (b) Notification of capture to Protecting Power.
- (c) Canteen facilities. Accounting instructions for canteen supplies will be published shortly.
- (d) All correspondence privileges accorded to PW.
- (e) Postal.

The following postal facilities will be granted to internees:-

- (i) Internees may send the number of letters normally permitted for military PW (2 letters, or 1 letter and 1 postcard, or 2 postcards, weekly; both of which may NOT be posted on the same day) to addresses in that part of Allied occupied ITALY where civil postal facilities are available.

- (iv) Free postal services will be extended to internees. A supply of envelopes bearing the words:- "CIVILIAN INTERNEE MAIL FREE POSTAGE" in English and Italian will be supplied by HQ ACC to Commandant, Internee Camp, for distribution.
- (v) Families of internees may write to the latter the normal number of letters allowed in the case of military PW (see para 12(o)(i) provided they live in that part of Allied occupied ITALY, SICILY or SARDINIA where civil postal facilities exist.
- (vi) Incoming mail will be accepted post free, provided it is addressed to "2 Internee Camp, ITALY". This incoming mail will be scrutinised by Commandant in accordance with normal PW practice.
- (vii) Detailed arrangements with Italian postal authorities will be made by HQ ACC Security Branch.

COMMAND

13. 2 Internee Camp will be under command HQ AAI for general administration and of HQ 1 District for local administration.

The Commandant will deal direct with GSI(b), Adv HQ AAI on all matters concerning security policy, releases and admissions of internees, and visitors.

14. AAI Administrative Instruction No 9 - ADMINISTRATION OF CIVILIAN INTERNEES, - issued under reference 5078/A(O) dated 31 Mar 44, as amended, is hereby cancelled.
