


Reference your P.47.212/C3 dated 21 June 45.

1. We understand, from information supplied through H.L. Embassy in Belgrade, that civil mails for Yugoslavia may be accepted by sea at Split, and that Split 2 is designated as the Yugoslav office of exchange. You may wish to confirm this with the Yugoslav Administration.

2. We have already arranged with C-4(Mov & Tn) for civil mails for Yugoslavia to be forwarded by ships sailing from Bari to Split with 'Jugaid' supplies. As these ships are carrying civil supplies I see no reason why facilities should not be accorded to the Italian Post Office to load the proposed mails under their own arrangements and no doubt you will approach C-5 in that connection. In the meantime, mails for Split 2 may be disposed of through the British APO at Bari, but we should require advance notification of the commencing date.



SUBJECT: Foreign Mail Services to Switzerland.

TO : Director, Communications Sub-Commission,

1. Reference your P.47.225/CS of 22 June 1945, above subject.
2. Since it is anticipated that all censorship of external mails will be turned over to the Italian government on or about 5 July 1945, the reasons for concentrating S.P.S. mail at Rome will no longer prevail. Accordingly the censorship of such mails may be accomplished at all of the external stations.
3. It is not planned to open an external station at Milan and it would therefore be desirable that Genoa be designated as the inward Office of Exchange.
4. Before proceeding with the above plan it would be prudent to await final authorization regarding the transfer of censorship activities to the Italian government.



Italian and French North Africa. P/641.

(Communications Sub Commission), CMF. 234 14 Jun 45.

1. Difficulty is being experienced in the transmission of Italian civil mails for Lisbon, Madrid, Tangier and Tetuan handed over to the British Army Postal Service. Formerly, these mails were forwarded to Algiers, where the British A.P.O. forwarded them to Gibraltar, in accordance with the labelling, air services normally being used in the absence of any but the most infrequent sea services. Sailings from Naples have never been reliable.
2. It is not now possible to accord these mails onward air conveyance from Algiers, and we have approached the P.T.T. in French North Africa through the British Postal Officer in Algiers, with a view to arranging onward conveyance from Algiers overland to Tangiers, and thence by sea in the case of the mails for Lisbon and Madrid. The P.T.T. in Algiers are unwilling to commit themselves in any way without direct representation from us, but, in my opinion, this is a matter which should be settled directly between the Allied Commission and the P.T.T. in Algiers in accordance with TAM 593 (para. 2).
3. You may wish to explore the possibility of alternative routing of the mails concerned via Marseilles and thence overland, as, in existing conditions, that route would seem on the face of it to be more advantageous than the Algiers route.

SUBJECT: Italian External Mail Services.

TO : G-5, ANTR,

Reference your 311.1 of 23 June 45.

1. The authority under TAM 593 is at present being acted upon only in so far as it permits proposals to be pursued for the extension of the existing letter and postcard service to non-enemy countries, not up present included in the service.

2. Before the Italian Postal Administration can be given a free hand to initiate action as proposed in para 2 of 311.1 of 23 June and para 2 of TAM 593 it is necessary to settle certain details, the most important of which are:-

- (a) What are to be the future arrangements for the carriage etc., of Italian external mail (G-5, 311.1 of 20 June and P. 47.223/CS of 22 June refer).
- (b) What censorship regulations and (for printed papers) what licensing arrangements will apply. Civil Censorship is being consulted on this.



4. You will of course keep in close touch with the development of postal services advising this Headquarters in order that we may inform CCS of "details of service and restrictions thereon as additional services are put into effect".

From the re-establishment of Foreign letter mail services to and from Italy in February 1944 up to the present time the arrangement has been for the Italian civil Post Office to hand its outgoing overseas despatches to the British and American Army Post Offices for forwarding with army mails, while the incoming letter mails were similarly received through Army channels and handed to the civil Post Office at Naples.
2. A somewhat different arrangement was introduced for the special G.I.F.T. parcel service from the United States - the only type of postal service introduced up to the present -. In this case the parcel bags are not handled by the Army Post Office, but special arrangements for a instance in the matter of road transport by the Naples Port Battalion were made to overcome the transportation difficulties which made the Italian Post Office hesitate to agree the commencement of a service which was being urged by the U.S. Government.
3. In recent signals from QCS there is the message of an intention to expect the civil Post Office soon to undertake its normal peaceful responsibilities in the matter of arranging for the conveyance and treatment of foreign mail traffic. This has already caused the British Army Postal Directorate to enquire of C.G., AFHQ, whether it can now be relieved of the responsibility of handling civil foreign mails.
4. In normal times the civil Post Office has its own premises in the principal ports; can hire its own labour for loading and unloading; and arrange for road transport to be available on call at any time, day or night. The weight is likely to increase considerably in the near future in view of the opening of services to the northern provinces and the agitation which may be anticipated now that hostilities are over for the restoration of commercial and printed paper services, services which are still suspended.





Subject: Foreign Mail Despatches.

To : Communications sub Commission H.Q. A.C.

1. Reference your P. 17.193.Cs of 10 June, the position
is noted.

2. Direct vouching from Genoa can start as soon as de-
cision is given. In the meantime, foreign mail is being sorted
and forwarded to Naples.

3. The A.C.C.O does not desire to exercise any control
over the formation of the despatches except to reserve the
right to make snap checks as and when desired. This has, of
course, been agreed to.

4. Arrangements have already been made in agreement with
the A.C.C.O for correspondence due to circulate to Bari and
Rome to be forwarded from Genoa uncensored.

5. The foreign mail services have already been announced
in Genoa Province and are being announced in Turin Province
to day. As soon as stamps are available the services will com-
mence in other provinces. It is difficult to estimate how much
foreign mail from Lombardia, Piemonte and Liguria will be dealt
with here but after consultation, it is proposed that once

weekly despatches should be made.

6. On the assumption that the foreign mail may have to be carried all the way to Naples by civil means, it is proposed that ~~Airborne~~ ^{POW} despatches be sent one day and civil another. This would stagger the load on the truck to Livorno.



Subject: Conveyance of Foreign Mails to and from Italy

To : G-S : A.F.H.Q.

Referred your 311.1 of 20th June 1945.

1. The questions raised by the British Army Postal Directorate are presumably based on paragraph 2 of G.O.V.366 and Tm 593, on which authority for action has not yet been passed to this Commission. It is not clear moreover that, that paragraph can be applied in full in Italy until such time as the Northern Regions pass under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government.
2. It is not practicable, nor would it be desirable, to adopt different procedures for the treatment of foreign mails in Military Government and Italian Government territory and unless the conveyance of the Italian external mail is causing undue inconvenience to the Army Post Offices it seems preferable to leave matters as they stand until all the mainland ports are in Italian Government territory.
3. It will be very difficult for the Italian Post Office to operate normal civil postal procedure for the receipt and despatch of mails in ports under military control especially in places such as Naples where the Port Post Offices are mainly destroyed and the provision of alternative accommodation within the Port has hitherto been refused.
4. As part of the planning directed in your 311.1 of 17th June the question of the possibility of the Italian Government making direct arrangements for the conveyance of foreign mails is being studied and Transportation Sub-Commission will be consulted on this matter.
5. In the meantime would you please ascertain whether the British Army Postal Directorate, in its anxiety to see the Italian Civil Postal Administration functioning normally, is willing to evacuate the half of the Naples Sorting Office occupied by the British Base APO. The continued requisitioning of these premises is one of the greatest obstacles to the proper functioning of this most important Postal Distribution Centre.



2. However, the general authorization will NOT necessarily mean the immediate actual resumption of all services, but that henceforth all administrative problems within these services, such as convenient resumption dates, rates, conveyance charges, contents, et cetera, will be a matter for coordination and agreement between the postal authorities and the various civilian agencies in one country with their counterparts in other countries without reference to you and the Combined Chiefs of Staff, but the Combined Chiefs of Staff must be informed of details of service and restrictions thereon as additional services are put into effect.

SUBJECT: Conveyance of Civil Mails

1. The British Army Postal Directorate refers to recent signals expanding the scope of Postal Services between Italy and elsewhere and enquire whether the inference may be made that the respective countries make their own arrangements for conveyance.

2. They remark that apart from the N American service they are the sole carriers of mail and are responsible also for its unloading at port of destination.

3. As the reason for this responsibility has passed they ask that the Italian Postal Administration could be informed that :


a) They must now make other arrangements for the conveyance of the mails entrusted at present to the British APS for disposal - the British APS being relieved of all responsibility for the handling of civil mails.

b) They be afforded the necessary facilities for loading the mails themselves, i.e., supplied with the necessary shipping information and permitted the use of the appropriate port facilities.

1. Reference is made to Communications Sub-Commission letter (P.47.190) of 7 June 1945, above subject.

2. Attached is a copy of a letter showing the manner and schedules of despatches of mails within Venezia Region. All mails from this Region for Verona and points west are despatched to Verona on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays; arriving at Verona by noon the esunday.

3. Mails for Rome are despatched to Ferrara from Rovigo on odd numbered days of the month. From that point they are despatched to Forlì on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays by means of Emilia Region transport.

4. However, at the present time there exists only a once-a-week train service from Forlì to Rome which leaves Forlì at 1920 hours, arriving in Rome the following day at 1025 hours.

5. In view of the foregoing will you state whether in your opinion considering the transportation facilities and schedules of same between Verona and Genoa, whether better service could be obtained by routing foreign mails to Genoa. It is assumed that such mails would go by sea direct from Genoa. If such is the case, this method of routing might provide quicker service considering the additional time consumed in transporting the foreign mails between Rome and Naples for onward despatch by sea.

1. It was intended to pursue the question of extending the Italian postcard and letter service to Albania as soon as some indication was obtained that Allied countries were commencing such services.
2. The G.P.O. recently made enquiries on this subject and the enclosed copy of a letter sent in reply by the British Army Postal Directorate shows the latest known position in that case.
3. Under the latest authority the Italian Ministry of Posts and Telegraphs can be asked to seek the agreement of the Albanian postal Administration to the receipt of such correspondence. It is desirable, however, first to ascertain whether the British Army Postal Directorate would accept a mail from Bari to Tirana for conveyance as proposed in the case of the mail from the U.K.

1. All normal postal services as laid down in Universal Postal Convention except to Japan, Japanese occupied territories, Germany, Austria and Hungary.

Provisions

Parcel post limit 11lbs for overseas.

Printed Papers 500 grammes except where heavier limit already authorised.

Business communications limited to ascertaining facts and exchanging information.

Transactional limited to protection and maintenance of property. Support remittances. No change where commercial already authorised.

Adequate censorship by indigenous government.

2. Postal authorities and civilian agencies may correspond with their counterparts in other countries on all administrative problems within the services e.g. resumption dates, rates, conveyance charges, contents combined. Chiefs of staffs must be informed of details of service and restrictions imposed.

Note: This information was transmitted to this Headquarters in G-5 311.1 of 17th June which states:

"It is desired that no action other than planning be taken until permission to do so has been received from this Headquarters."

Further instructions upon the basis of which you will be able to take action will be forthcoming in the near future".

On 20th June, in telephone conversation with Col. Scudder Major Byles G-5 authorised action to be taken only as regards the extension of personal letters and postcards.




1. The preference for sending a letter by a person travelling directly to destination instead of using the normal postal service is particularly in keeping with the Italian outlook and it is thought that this is a factor which must be reckoned with between Italy and Malta. Even if exceptional cases of delay could be eliminated the best service that could be given (involving normal postal transit times under present transport conditions to a censorship station in Italy) would still make direct conveyance by hand attractive.

2. The information given by the Postal Censor Malta is not very helpful as it omits any details of the places of posting of the items which suffered excessive delay. The Rangoon Censor station is however, being asked to comment on the transit times of correspondence for Malta handed to it by the civil Post Office and to draw attention to any instances where excessive delay is noticed.


1. Commencing forthwith the postal service from Italy to Holland (at present limited to non-illustrated postcards), may be extended to include non-illustrated postcards and letters up to 20 grammes in weight.
2. A similar service of non-illustrated postcards and letters up to 20 grammes in weight may now be introduced to Denmark and Norway.
3. Registration is permitted to Holland, but not at present to Denmark and Norway.
4. For all three countries mentioned above, the correspondence is confined to personal communications. Business correspondence is not permitted.
5. Offices of Exchange should be instructed to add Denmark and Norway to the list of countries shown on the Circulation Chart as due to circulate to London Foreign Section.

With reference to P. 47.190, 192 and 193 of 7th and 10 June 1945.

1. Neither the American nor the British Army Postal Directorates can agree to foreign despatches being handed over at Genoa.

2. This means that if the despatches are established they will have to be conveyed by civil post channels to Naples. The entries in the last column ("Sacchi da consegnarsi a ") of the Circulation Chart enclosed with my P. 47.193/CS of 10th June should, therefore, be amplified with the words "a Napoli".

3. It is considered, however, that if the mails are reasonably well warranted on the basis of the correspondence being posted in Liguria, Piemonte and Lombardia, they should be established.

4. There would, however, be no advantage in Venesia and Emilia Regions diverting the foreign correspondence from Rome to Genoa and it would be advisable for those Regions to leave the Foreign Circulation based on Rome for the present.





We are unwilling, at this stage, to place further burdens on the British military mail services from North to South and would prefer, if possible, for the mails for Cairo, Tripoli, Tunis and London Foreign Section to be passed through civil postal channels from Genoa to Naples for direct handing over to 15 Base APO.
2. The only conveyance we could offer from Genoa to Naples would be by rail, with second class military mails, and it is doubtful whether the time of transmission would compare at all unfavourably with civil postal means.







1. Enclosed for your guidance is a statement showing the proposed foreign circulation and formation of despatches at Genoa.
2. In P.47.192.C3 of 10th June (copy to you) the British and American Postal Directors have been asked whether the despatches may be handed over direct to their offices in Genoa.
3. Pending a decision on this point and also until you can ascertain whether the proposed direct mails are warranted on a once or twice weekly basis it will be advisable to send the foreign correspondence concerned, after censorship, in "country" bundles in an enclosure bag to Naples Ferrovia labelled "correspondence per L'estero già censurata".
4. Please discuss with the local censorship officer the question how the foreign correspondence should be sorted before despatch to his station and what supervision and control he wishes to exercise over the formation of the despatches when these commence.
5. Care will no doubt be taken to see that the correspondence due to circulate to Bari and Rome for censorship is not delayed by being sent to the local censor station if this can be avoided.





1. From the wording of recent Communications Memoranda issued by SHAEF it would appear that in view of the alteration in conditions in Europe the policy now being adopted is to authorise the restoration of postal communications from any liberated country to the entire world except Germany, Austria, Japan and Japanese occupied territory. Such authorisation is apparently being given on the basis of the outward facilities which can be granted from the country concerned having regard to the weight limits and censorship requirements applicable without too close a regard to exceptional requirements in countries outside the SHAEF area or to the details of the actual disposal of the correspondence.

2. The following circulars illustrate the points made in the above paragraph

- (a) GBL/CEN/311.7-3 of 21 May 1945 Belgium Memo 13
GBL/CEN/311.7-3 of 24 May 1945 Netherlands Memo 11
GBL/CEN/311.7-3 of 27 May 1945 Denmark Memo 1

It will be seen that all of these authorise a service from the countries concerned to Italy which is wider in scope than the present external service from Italy.

3. In these circumstances it is considered that the time has come when a general authority should be sought from CCS for the extension of the Italian Postcard and 40 gram Letter Service to the entire world except Germany, Austria, Japan and Japanese occupied territory. The fact that the outward services from one or two of the liberated countries may for the moment be operating on a slightly lower weight limit is considered to be immaterial as such limits would probably be raised before the mails from Italy arrive by the surface routes used. Details of circulation and the physical practicability of the services could be explored directly by this Headquarters if such a "blanket" authority can be given. The liberated countries in Europe to which the Italian service has not yet been authorised are:-

1. If the Civil Post Office in U.K. decides to take up closed mails for Albania it is recommended that they be routed via British Army Post Office, Naples. Provided the weight of these mails is kept to a reasonably low figure I anticipate no difficulty in disposing of them by the weekly air service from Bari to Tirana (there are as yet no known sea outlets).
2. I should make it clear, however, that no intimation has yet been given through official channels of the existence of internal postal services in Albania or of the willingness of the Albanian Post Office to accept external mails.

1. The Foreign Office now advise that the postal service from the United Kingdom to Jugoslavia had not in fact been resumed on the 11 May. This service could not be started until the Jugoslav Postal Administration had designated an office of exchange as had been previously requested by the General Post Office.

2. The Jugoslav Government have now designated Belgrade 2 as the office of exchange and it is presumed, therefore, that negotiations on this point have been satisfactorily completed and that the postal service will be duly resumed.

3. The Jugoslav Government intend to send out their first mail on 1st June and HM Embassy, Belgrade, have arranged with RAF Staging Post at ZEMUN to accept mail bags for/and transmit to Italy.



1. The Italian Postal Administration and Civil Censorship have been instructed in P.47.183.CS of the 2nd June to revert to the "via London" routing of the Rome to Geneva mail.

2. It should be pointed out however that from the very commencement of the Foreign Services from Italy in February 1945, correspondence for Switzerland has been due to circulate from the Italian Civil Post Office to the S.P.S. Section for censorship in this country. The correspondence being disposed of by that section to the U.K. possibly for re-examination.

3. In September 1944 the S.P.S. Section was transferred to Rome and the relative instruction AAI/1146/G/1 (c) specifically indicates that items for Switzerland should be sent to Rome for censorship and gives instructions for direct mails to be established. Information as to the addressing of this and other S.P.S. mails was sought from G-5.A.F.H.Q. in P.16/15:150 of the 4th September. Letter G-5:311.1 of the 14th September 1944 indicates that the routing of the mail should be to Bureau de Postes, Geneva, via London, until further notice, and this was confirmed in G-5.311 of the 30th September 1944.

4. Our P.47.120.CS of the 4th May 1945 to G-5 asked whether the Rome Geneva mail might now be sent via Marseilles, and an affirmative answer was given in G-5.311.1 of 14 May 1945. 5. If it is still essential from an Allied point of view that civil mail from Italy to Switzerland, already censored in this country, should be diverted via London, then it is considered that there is an onus on the

Allies to reduce as much as possible the delay caused by such a postally unnatural routing, and that authority should be given for the mail to be carried without cost to the Italian Government by military air services to and from Great Britain. The despatch has consisted of one bag averaging about 10 Kilogrammes per week, but the weight of correspondence will, of course, increase considerably as the service from the northern Provinces becomes effective.


6. When Genoa is opened as a censorship and Office of Exchange station for Italian external mails, the question of routing mails from Switzerland, and possibly France, direct by land routes will arise. The Swiss Postal Administration raised this question early this month as regards its despatch to Rome; but was told to defer any alteration of that mail in view of the present state of postal communications from North to South. Now that the North Western Provinces of Italy are being opened to the external service, however, it will be desirable to provide for direct routing between the North of Italy and France and Italy unless there is good reason to the contrary.

With reference to the circular telegram No. 474174/474176 of the 27th inst., we hereunder give a list of instructions to which the above addressee Offices must comply with, concerning censorship, the actuation and the regulations for the making up of foreign despatches.

I. - Censorship.

a) - The Office of Rome Ferrovia and of Naples Ferrovia will sort all the foreign correspondence in labelled bundles for the countries of destination, and will pass it, so labelled, to the respective censorship offices; these will then return same in similar labelled bundles ready for their successive despatch.

b) - The Bari Ferrovia Office will pass the correspondence for Greece (including the Isle of Crete) to the transatlantic Postal Section for the censoring of same.

c) - All three Offices will have to take great care that the handling of the censored correspondence, the custody of same before being despatched, the making up of the despatches be done in absolutely separate premises from those where the non censored correspondence is handled.

B) - Actuation of despatches.

a) - The Office of Rome Ferrovia will actuate, beginning on the 2nd May and until further notice, every Wednesday and Saturday, a despatch for Marseilles in which must be included the correspondence for France; the label must bear the wording, in capital letters, "FROM ROME TO MARSEILLES (CIVIL MAIL)".

The despatches will be sent to Naples for their subsequent forwarding by the Naples Ferrovia Office, with separate list, through the Base Post Office of the British Army which will deliver same to the American Army Office.

c) - The Rome Ferrovia Office from the 3rd May, and on every Monday and Thursday, will also make up the despatches for:- CAIRO, TRIPOLI, LONDON, NEW YORK, OTTAWA, TUNIS, in which it must include, appropriately labelled, the civil correspondence for the States given in the enclosed list.

The despatches which must be made up in compliance to the regulations which govern the making up of the foreign despatches, will be forwarded to Naples on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, respectively, with trains Nos. 83 and 783, with duplicate lists.

f) - The Naples Ferrovia Office, will actuate from the 2nd May and every Wednesday and Saturday, a despatch for Marseilles in accordance to the regulations indicated at "d".

g) - The Bari Ferrovia Office will actuate from the 2nd May and every Wednesday and Saturday a despatch for Athens the label of which must bear, very clearly written or in capital letters, the wording:- "FROM BARI TO ATHENS "CIVIL MAIL)" which will be delivered, with respective accompanying lists, to the British A.P.O. for its successive despatch.

The label for the despatches to be made on the dates indicated; as for those already in course, must bear the indication of the weight of the despatch, the letter "F" when the bag contains the "feuille d'avis", the progressive number of the despatch followed by the number of bags forming the despatch (As per ex:- 10/2; 10th despatch formed of two bags).

All the despatches of new actuation, as those already in course, must be progressively numbered.

Correspondence for France will be included in the despatches of the Rome Ferrovia and Naples ferrovia Offices, for Marseilles, progressively numbered and made up ~~xxxx~~ every wednesday and Saturday, from May 2nd. Correspondence for Belgium will be inserted in the ~~xxxx~~ actual despatches of Naples Ferrovia and in those that Rome Ferrovia will make up for London, who will assure their further forwarding. Correspondence for Greece will be included ~~xxxx~~, progressively numbered, in the Bari Ferrovia despatches for Athens, which are made up every friday and saturday from May 2nd. Furthermore Rome Ferrovia, from May 5th will make up despatches, every monday and thursday, numbered progressively, for Tripoli, Cairo, London, New York, Ottawa and Tunis. Correspondence for Bulgaria and Roumania will be forwarded, by Naples and Rome Ferrovia to Cairo.

1. A copy is enclosed of a telegram received by the Italian Postal Administration from the British Post Office.

2. The position with regard to Albania is exactly the same as for Yugoslavia i.e. civil service from Italy has not yet commenced and enquiries as to type of service to be permitted are with G-5.

3. In any event so long as civil despatches from Italy are disposed of through A.P.O. channels it seems undesirable for the U.K. to use the Italian civil Post Office for transit purposes.

4. It is suggested therefore that if you could dispose of closed mails from U.K. to Albania a reply similar to your F 72774 should be sent.

1. The British Postal Administration was advised on 8th May (through the Army Post Office) to make up closed mails for Yugo-Slavia for transmission by the Army Post Office. So long as civilian mails from Italy are despatched by the Army Post Office there is no advantage in the British Administration sending correspondence to your administration for transit. It is no necessary to reply to the telegram from Postgen London.

2. You may wish to note that proposals for the resumption of a civil mail service from Italy to Albania and Yugo-Slavia are already under consideration.

Your letter P.47.89.CS of 14th April, 1945.

Postal Authorities at this end advise me that they have no objection to mails in future being sent in single bags addressed to Civil Censor (or P.O.W. Censor) instead of in double bags as heretofore.

In Tripoli both the postal services and this Department function in the same range of offices and, with the co-operation which obtains, it has proved simple and satisfactory for bags addressed to Civil Censor to be opened in this Department in the presence of Post Office officials.

Your later letter P.47.110/CS of 30th April would appear to cancel your above proposal but I venture the opinion that although Italian Censureships are taking over censorship of outward mails it would be an advantage for bags to Tripoli to continue to be addressed to Civil Censor to enable the checking of contents to be continued in this department and permit withdrawal of any special letters which, for local reasons, it may be considered desirable to be re-examined here.
