of an article of the *L'Espresso* (Italian morning newspaper) of Sunday the 12th August 45 on telephone rates.

BOYCOTT THE TELEPHONE!

We have been informed that, notwithstanding the general protests, the "Teti" Coy. has already initiated the distribution of the tri-monthly bills, which have been calculated on the basis of the so much discussed new rates.

In our article of 8th inst., we have pointed out ~~that~~ the irrationality of the said rates, especially owing to the enormous disproportion existing between the 2 Lire rate for each additional telephone call and the fixed tariff.

We have also observed that, as a consequence of such a disproportion, for a number even small of additional communications, the lower categories are going to be taxed more than the higher classes, that is what proves the absurdity of the new tariff.

We therefore ask that, as soon as possible, be made opportune modifications to those rates, and we repeat our recommendation to the subscribers, to abstain from carrying out additional conversations, aiming to a double scope: to reduce to the minimum their expenses, and to cause a sensible loss of money to the Company, because of the reduction of the additional communications. It is to be hoped that the Company be in that way forced to effect the requested modifications.

So far as the bills which are being distributed are concerned, the Azienda di Stato per i Servizi Telefonici, which has got, in accordance with law dispositions and and with the various conventions stipulated with the Concessionary Companies, the right and the duty of defending the interests of the State and of the subscribers, should order the Teti:

a) to apply the tariff of the superior category, whenever it results to be more favourable to the subscriber;

b) not to allow that the total amount of money to be paid by the subscriber be more than the double of the fixed tariff, and therefore the amount of the new tariff in case of a forfeit taxation.

But have we really any hope in an efficacious action of the Azienda di Stato per i Servizi Telefonici, after having been asleep for 20 years?



Reference your A.G/4139/1/L of 8th June 1945 and my T.92.6/38 of 10th June 1945.

1. Further consideration of this matter suggests that it would be undesirable to attempt to reproduce the full text of the decrees governing postal, telegraph and telephone rates in the form of a Regional Order. The decrees themselves are very lengthy and cover all facilities provided by the Post Office in peace time, many of which are suspended in Italy at the present time.

2. From a telegram received from 8th Army it would appear that certain postal services have been allowed to continue in operation in Venezia Giulia, presumably at the existing rates which undoubtedly are lower than those established by the latest Italian decrees.

3. It would appear that sufficient legal backing for an increase in the rates could be afforded by a Regional Order to the effect that these rates shall be in accordance with bollettini to be published by the Post Office, Provincial Director of Trieste with the authority of A.M.C. The schedules could be printed in Trieste and contain only such extracts from the Italian decrees as may be applicable to services in operation.

4. It will not be possible to avoid indicating in the bollettini that the rates quoted apply not only within Venezia Giulia but also to Italy.

5. It is suggested that paragraph of the Draft directive should be amended as follows:-

It is desirable that the rates of services in operation or to be reintroduced in Venezia Giulia should be in conformity with the rest of Italy, but it would be difficult to reproduce these lengthy decrees in a Regional Order and in any case a number of the services mentioned therein are not likely to be introduced. A Regional Order should therefore be issued to the effect that Postal and Telecommunications rates, limitations, conditions and indemnities in Venezia Giulia will be in accordance with Bollettini to be issued by the Post Office Provincial Director for Trieste under the authority of AMG. These Bollettini can be printed locally and include relevant extracts from the decrees in respect of services which may from time to time be authorised".

6. The Internal Postal and Telegraph rates are covered in a Ministerial Bollettino supplement (copy attached) which could be amended as a draft for the relative Venezia Giulia Bollettino. In other cases the Gazzette Ufficiali would have to be used for the preparation of draft Bollettini.

Subject: Stamp supplies for Venezia Giulia

To : Executive Commissioner.

1. In an earlier endorsement (of which a copy unfortunately has not been retained) the question of postage stamps for use in Venezia Giulia was discussed and the recommendation of this Sub-Commission was that ordinary Italian stamps should be used, although reference was made to the existence of stocks of "M.G. Italy" stamps in the hands of A.F.I. at Naples.
2. It is not known what stamps are actually in use in the region concerned but probably they are of republican Fascist design. Strong exception was taken by C.M.L. in North Italy to the continued use of such stamps there and the very big task of printing and distributing Italian Government stamps for the North of Italy has had to be undertaken.
3. It is essential to know whether similar arrangements must be made for the portion of Venezia Giulia under our control, and also what stamps will be used in territory under Hugo Slavicek control, especially as mail services between the two areas are to be continued.
4. Because of the prospective closing of its Naples Office A.F.I. is anxious to proceed with the destruction of the Military Government (Italy) stamps at Naples if it is certain that these will not be required.

SUBJECT: Postage, Telephone and Telegraph Rates.
TO : Economic Section.

1. The present rates for above services are all covered by Decrees which become operative in each Province of A.M.G. territory when Gazette containing such decrees is delivered by A.M.G. to the Prefect.

2. As services are inter provincial it is obviously impractical that decrees become operative at different dates and it is therefore proposed that application date for all decrees in question shall be July 1st, 1945, with the exception of Decree covering Foreign Postage which is already being applied.

1. References discussion (Mr. K.E. Stauffer- Lt. Col. Routh) of 19 May 45, when it was recognized that the price control regulations do not cover postage rates.

2. As agreed, therefore, the postage rates in the North are being increased to conform with those charged in the South.

3. The external rates of postage in the South of Italy have been fixed at:-

Letters, 20 grammes	5 lire
Each additional 20 grammes	5 "
Postcards	5 "
Registration fee	10 "

under Article 34 of the Universal Postal Convention, which prescribes that the prepaid rate of postage for the conveyance of correspondence throughout the entire extent of the Union shall be:-

Letters, 20 grammes	20 centimes gold
Each additional 20 grammes	12 " "

Postcards

12 " "

Under II of the Final Protocol of the Convention, each country has the right to increase up to 40% or to reduce by as much as 20% the postage rates prescribed by Article 34, and is empowered to round up or down its rates to suit its currency.

4. The value of the franc gold, in lire, has been taken as 33 lire.

5. It will be observed, that the external rates of postage in the South of Italy are the minimum allowed under Article 34 of the Universal Postal Convention, and that the Italian Postal Administration has taken full advantage of its right, under II of the Final Protocol of the Convention, to reduce by 20% the postage rates prescribed by Article 34, and to round down its rates to suit its currency.

6. The rates of postage in the North of Italy are:-

Each additional 20 grammes	75 "
Registration fee	1.50 "

These rates are only one quarter of the minimum rates prescribed by the International regulations, and external postal services from the North cannot, therefore, be started until they are raised to the level of those in the South.

SUBJ CT: Postage rates and Postal Carte Valori in North of Italy.

TO : Under Secretary of State for P.P.TT.

1. A General Order is to be issued to the effect that any postal services allowed to continue or re-established in the territory north of the northern boundaries of the Provinces of Ravenna, Florence, Pistoia, Lucca and Apuania shall for the present operate at the postage rates in force immediately prior to liberation.

2. Republican Fascist Postage stamps and carte valori will be valid until proper arrangements can be made for normal supplies of Italian Government stamps.

3. The rate of postage and the kind of stamps used in Bologna for postcards posted in that city for the new service will be affected by this decision.

4. Please advise all Directorates in Provinces open for postal services that any postal items which may be received from Provinces in the North bearing Fascist Republican stamps or prepaid at rates lower than those which apply in the south should not be taxed on that account.

5. Further information on the rates and services in the north and on the progress of proposals for communications between the two areas will be sent to you when available.

Subject : Postal, Telegraph and Telephone Rates.

To : Regional Commissioners, Umbria-Marche, Toscana, Emilia, Liguria,
Emontone, Lombardia and Venezia Regions

S.C.A.O. 5th and 3th Armies, IV Corps.

1. This directive modifies Executive Memorandum No 35.
2. In view of the rapid advance in the north it will no doubt be found desirable in agreement with the Security authorities to leave in operation certain civil postal and telecommunications services which may be functioning in the liberated territory.
3. In accordance with the policy detailed in AC/4010/9/L of 30th April 1945 "Economic Decrees" any such service in territory north of the provinces of Ravenna, Florence, Pistoia, Lucca and Apuania should operate for the present at the rates and charges in force prior to liberation.
4. A Special Order has, therefore, been issued to exclude from implementation in the north the decrees affecting postal and telecommunications rates and charges in the south.
5. Postage stamps and other Postal Carte Valori issued by the Republican Fascist Government will continue to be used until such time as a ^{new} ~~proper~~ distribution of Italian Government stamps and forms can be arranged. Local ^{or} *provinces* overprinting of stamps will be forbidden.
6. Postal services between the areas north and south of the economic line will be arranged as soon as the Security authorities agree and the necessary transport can be arranged. In the first instance such services will be limited to unregistered postcards and letters up to 40 grammes.
7. No foreign mails services will be allowed to operate from the north

7. No foreign mails services will be allowed to operate from the north without prior authority from Communications Sub-Commission. Such services involve special consideration as regards postage stamps, postage
