MEMORANDUM:

TO : Major Spann, Allied Regional Commission.

1. Attached is a report on Communications in Sardinia prepared by the Italian Army Command in Sardinia.
2. Communications on the island are actually supervised by five agencies; TSTI (civil), Italian Army, Italian Air Corps, Italian Navy and Artillery Command (DICA). The wire system used by these agencies are made up of lines constructed by the agency. There have been so many lines requisitioned from TSTI that at this time TSTI has only a skeleton system with which to cover the island for civilian administration and personal calls.

3. The Allied Garrison of Sardinia has requisitioned the following lines and the Allied Garrison communication system is being constructed around these circuits:

La rete urbana di Cagliari, Porto Torres, Alghero ed Ibbia, danneggiata dalle incursioni aeree, sono in corso di sistemazione.

La vasta rete militare, che risulta dal grafico allegato, è in perfetta efficienza ed integrata con la rete civile assicura i collegamenti su vasta scala fra le varie località dell'isola.

Le comunicazioni telefoniche fra l'Isola ed il Continente attualmente interrotte erano assicurate dal cavo sottomarino Olbia-Fiumici ne della Azienda telefonica di Stato.

2-COMUNICAZIONI TELEGRAFICHE

La rete telegrafica civile dell'Isola gestita dal Circolo delle Costruzioni Telegrafiche e Telefoniche, collega con circuiti diretti i principali centri dell'Isola, diramandosi con circuiti omnibus fino ai più piccoli comuni.

Le comunicazioni Telegrafiche con il Continente si svolgono attraverso i cavi Olbia-Fiumicino e Cagliari - Palermo, quest'ultimo in corso di riattivazione da parte del Comando Alleato, consente un intenso traffico, essendo a sistema eolere, stazionario quadruplica con 4 settori Baudot. Le apparecchiature di Cagliari sono in perfetto ordine e pronte ad entrare in servizio.

3-COMUNICAZIONI RADIO

Non esiste nell'Isola una rete civile di collegamenti radio. La rete militare è stata soppressa a seguito ordine superiore. Il servizio radio militare con il Continente era assicurato dalle seguenti stazioni:

1. - COMUNICAZIONI TELEGRAFICHE

a-) Esterno: Le comunicazioni telegrafiche con l'esterno dell'Isola erano assicurate anteguerra da tre cavi telegrafici con il Continente e da uno con la Sicilia.-

Dei 3 cavi con il Continente, uno serviva per le trasmissioni "Theasthone" (diramazione esterna circolare ministeriale), uno passante per la Maddalena era in uso per la R. Marina ed il terzo, con una scaglionata quadruplici "Baudot", era utilizzato per la trasmissione dei telegrammi di Stato e privati (due settori Cagliari e due settori Sassari).- Il cavo con la Sicilia era in esercizio sul tratto Palermo-Cagliari per il servizio della R. Marina e le comunicazioni private.-

I tre cavi con Roma sono attualmente interrotti.-

Il cavo con la Sicilia, in buone condizioni; è utilizzato per le comunicazioni "Morse" della Marina tra Palermo e Cagliari S. Bar-
tolomeo.-

Sono quasi ultimati i lavori per portare la Terminale Sarda a S. Gavino, attuale sede della Centrale Telegrafica di Cagliari.-

b-) Interno: Le comunicazioni interne dell'Isola sono assicurate attraverso le Centrali Provinciali di Cagliari, Sassari, Nuoro, cui facevano capo tutti gli uffici delle tre provincie.-

Dopo il bombardamento di Cagliari e la quasi totale distruzione delle linee, nelle immediate adiacenze della Centrale, la maggior parte dei circuiti della provincia sono stati trasferiti a S. Gavino dove è stato portato a termine l'impianto della Centrale Telegrafica di Cagliari.-

A detta Centrale sono allacciati molti uffici direttamente e molti altri attraverso le tre Sottocentrali di Quartu S. Elena, Senorbi ed Iglesias e l'ufficio di Cristano, cui già in precedenza facevano capo tutti gli uffici vicini.-

A S. Gavino convergono inoltre, una comunicazione "Baudot" con Sassari una "Hughes" con Nuoro ed un'altra con Cagliari ed una "Morse" con Cagliari Prefettura.-

L'attuale sistemazione, raggiunta peraltro solo da pochi giorni, assicura il collegamento con tutte le località della Sardegna e permette il regolare inoltre del traffico telegrafico.-

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II.- COMUNICAZIONI POSTALI

b) Interno: Malgrado le difficili condizioni dei mezzi di trasporto dovute a cause diverse (deficienza di materiale rotabile e di carbone per le linee ferroviarie; scarsità di carburante e di gomme per le linee automobilistiche), il servizio postale è garantito per tutti i paesi dell'Isola.-

Il servizio stesso si appoggia alla dorsale Olbia-Cagliari con le due diramazioni: Decimo-Iglesias e Chilivania-Sassari - Porto Torres.- Su queste linee, gestite direttamente dalle ff.ss., il servizio è eseguito con frequenza giornaliera.-

1. A letter has been received from the Director General, Italian State Railways stating that the I.S.R. originally had a radio-telegraphic set at CAGLIARI in SARDINIA which was used to communicate with the ICR H.Q. in ROME.
2. On the 17 Dec 1943 this set was closed down by the Allied Command in SARDINIA and the equipment was stored in Allied custody.
3. The I.S.R. now wish to have this set transferred to ROME for use between I.S.R. H.Q. in ROME and PALERMO.
4. Will you please obtain authority for the set to be released to the I.S.R. representatives in CAGLIARI so that they may arrange to send it to ROME.
5. Presumably there is no military objection to the use of such communication between ROME and PALERMO.

1. Further to advice given you on the 12th September and your acknowledgement of the same date it is unfortunate that this Department has again to complain of the unsatisfactory situation.

2. There is an urgent monthly requirement of 60,000 Tons of Sardinian Coal from that Island and the Ministry of War Transport Med. has reminded us that the delays caused to shipping due to our inability to transmit loading and destinations instructions are most seriously viewed.

3. When such breakdowns occur can an alternative channel be employed for priority messages? Your assistance is requested as at times we have barely 36 ~~hours~~ to transmit instructions.

Dear Brady,

I understand that there has been some doubt as to whether the Italians were using the Rome-Naples and other military circuits switched at night.

We made a check with the following results for 30 June and 1st July.

Is there any definite evidence that they were not used on any particular nights? I would like to know as they are always complaining of lack of circuits on this route. If your people get anything definite in future cases I would be much obliged if they could let me know as soon afterwards as possible giving the circuits concerned.

I might add that a failure to use the circuits does not usually mean lack of traffic but is simply laziness or lack of foresight or something similar. In this case, I know from tests that the route is much overloaded.

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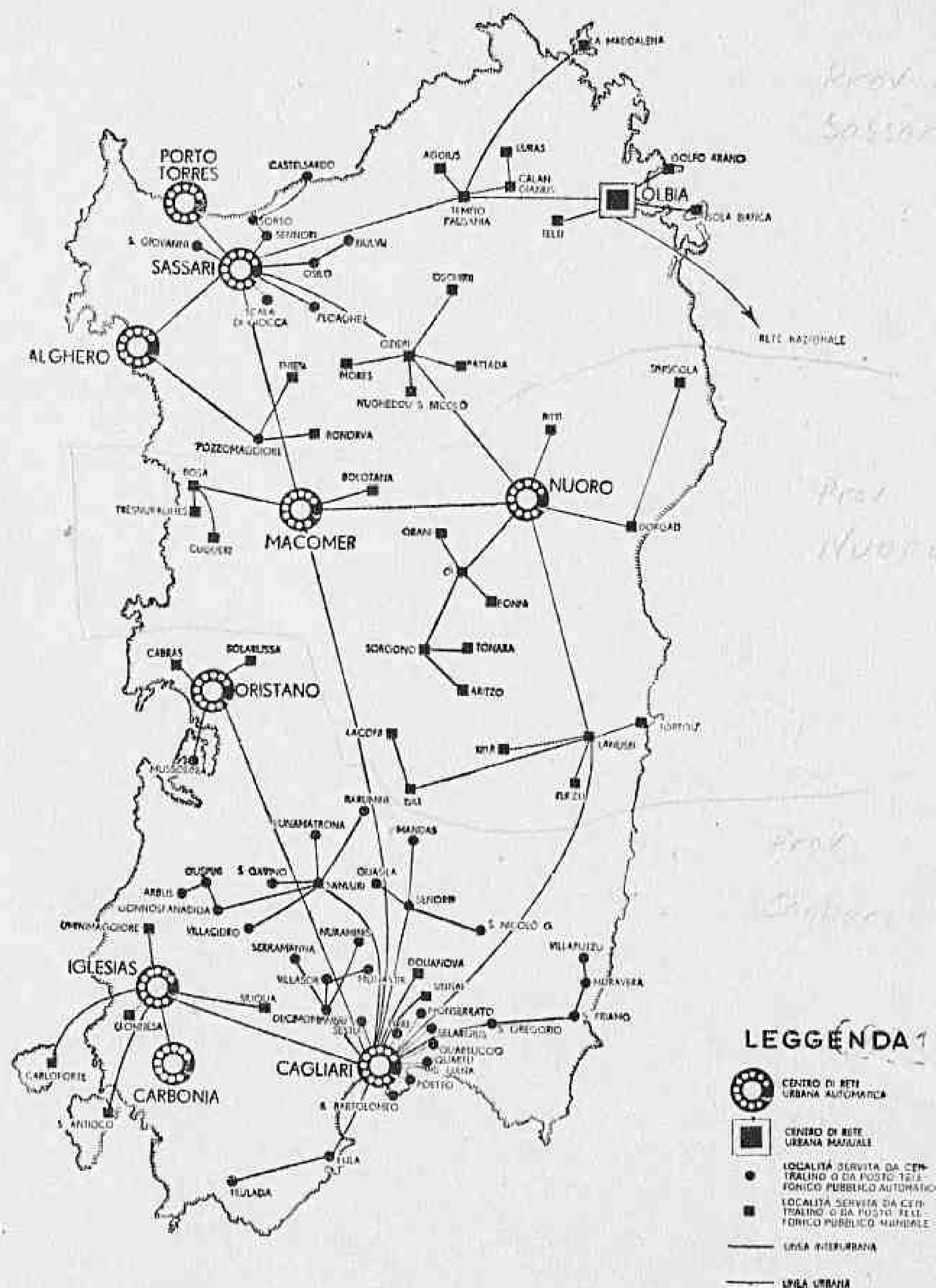

1. Reference is made to letter XII from Military Mission to Italian Army dated 2 January 1944, directed to your headquarters relative to opening up a wireless net Italian General Staff, Italian Supreme Command and Italian Force Headquarters Sardinia.

2. This matter was discussed with the Commission by Brigadier General Robert M. Webster, U. S. Army Garrison Commander of Sardinia, during his recent visit here. General Webster pointed out the urgent need for wireless communication with Sardinia and is most desirous that it be established.

3. Representations have been made to the Commission by the Italian Government to the effect that it is most essential that authority be given for the operation of a radio net to permit the Italian military administration to function.

4. The Allied Control Commission concurs in the request made by Brigadier Duchesne and recommends the approval of the proposed communications net.

Dear General Joyce:

I am informed by the Ministry of Communications that AFHQ, in answer to the request of the Ministry to resume operations of the radio circuit between Bari and Sardinia, replied negatively.

The necessity of contact with the Island, both from military and civilian standpoints, and the lack of explanation for such refusal make it seem advisable that your interest be counted upon in this respect.

At the same time, it grieves me to have been denied the opportunity to activate a radio service between the Government and the Military Commands and Ministries which remain in the Puglia, which would possess no way of communication in the event of urgency or possible interruption of telephone service.

I appeal, dear General, to your kindness so that these difficulties may be surmounted.

Headquarters Armed Forces Sardinia informs us that General Webster, O.C. Allied troops in Sardinia, has given orders that radio communication between the Armed Forces in Sardinia and the Stato Maggiore, should cease immediately, and that the radio station should be handed over to Allied representatives in Sardinia.

We bring to your notice that the radio communication thus suspended (which also included Headquarters Armed Forces, Campania) was the only rapid and direct means of communication between the Stato Maggiore and the dependent Headquarters.

We ask you, therefore, to examine the possibility of establishing at Headquarters Armed Forces, Sardinia and Headquarters Armed Forces Campania and this Stato Maggiore, cypher officers with Anglo-American cypher personnel, and so permit the continuation of the radio service in its old form, as we asked before in letter No. 2418/OP-V/Nov. 26 43.

Nella Russia Bianca 100 località sono state espagnate nel corso dell'avanzata russa a nord-ovest di Gomel, tra cui la stazione ferroviaria di Duda a 40 chilometri da Skotin.

Nel Pripet inferiore sono state liberate altre sette località.

A Korosten, Cernikov e Borislov i russi hanno respinto tutti i contrattacchi tedeschi.

L'avanzata sovietica

Nei combattimenti di ieri, 74 carri armati tedeschi sono stati distrutti e 22 velivoli sono stati abbattuti.

Nell'interno dell'ansa del Dnieper, a sud ovest di Dniepropetrovsk, parecchi caposaldi tedeschi, potentemente fortificati, sono stati espugnati dalle truppe sovietiche.

Successive notizie segnalano nuove avanzate sovietiche nella Russia Bianca, in una zona compresa fra Moghilev e Moxir, in un settore a 30 chilometri ad ovest di Gomel.

A sud, ai margini delle paludi del Pripet, le truppe sovietiche si avvicinano rapidamente verso Kalinkovici e Moxir.

Nella battaglia in corso, no-

menti che si svolgono nella steppa coperta di neve.

Il corrispondente britannico, Paul Winterton, in una corrispondenza da Kiev, descrive le atrocità commesse dai tedeschi in questa città durante la loro occupazione.

«Ho parlato con un architetto russo, di 76 anni, che è rimasto in Kiev durante tutto il periodo dell'occupazione tedesca, e con 3 ufficiali russi fatti prigionieri dai tedeschi e liberati con la cacciata dei nazisti. Il 28 settembre 1941 i tedeschi disposero che tutti gli ebrei si riunissero in un dato punto, portando con loro tutti gli oggetti preziosi che possedevano. Settantamila ebrei si recarono sul posto dove era già stata scavata una fossa lunga 750 metri, larga 30 e profonda 16 metri. Tutti gli ebrei furono posti sul bordo della fossa e fucilati con le mitragliatrici.

Nell'agosto 1943, quando i tedeschi già prevedevano lo sgombero della città, ordinarono ai 30.000 superstiti di trovarsi nel punto fissato la volta precedente dove erano preparati dei roghi eretti su pietre tolte al cimitero israelita. Trentamila furono anche loro trucidati. Furono quindi disotterrati i 70.000 cadaveri
