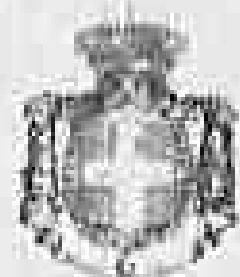

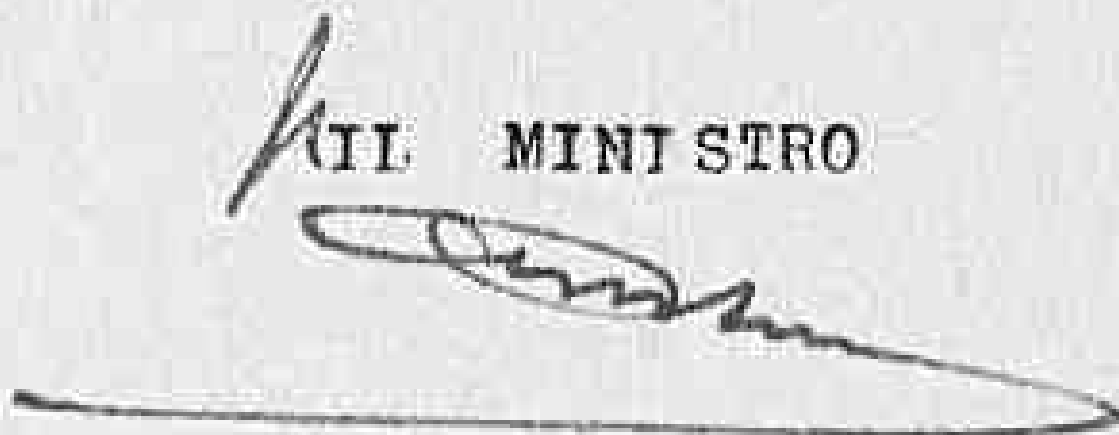

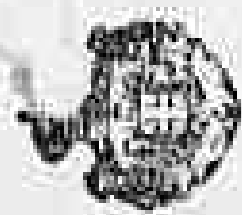

My dear Stone:

1. With reference to letter from USC, AFHQ, to EECB and CCB, a radiogram was sent to both boards on 29 February 1944, asking for a decision.
2. The reply, dated 1 March 1944, from the CCB, states that there is not sufficient military need to justify action at this time by CCB in connection with additional radio facilities in Italy.
3. However, the CCB, AFHQ, has radioced the CCB and EECB this date stating that additional facilities in Rome will be necessary within 30 days after occupation and requesting that the CCB reconsider their decision and that commercial companies be designated at this time for operation of Rome-U.S., and Rome-U.K. radio circuits.

1. WIRELESS - RADIO - TELEPHONE CIRCUITS.

I have received one demand from further three air units, in writing and also by a visit to A.F.M., I. of C., Italy, and a telephone call to A.F.M.F. The situation is that the cable in Italy and A.F.M.F. is not prepared to release any existing circuits. Further equipment is now being installed to provide additional circuits, and our further three will be provided for them. It is expected this will last about three weeks.

2. Radio Circuits.

I attended the conference in Algiers which decided against any use by the Italian Government of radio without A.F.M.F. authority. I do not think that permission will be given unless a strong case is presented, chiefly on grounds of security, and especially as we cannot undertake to monitor.

Do you wish any action to be taken on either point? I feel that it will have to be done through some sort of technical channel if any result is to be expected. Shall I prepare drafts on either subject?
