Service from Gorizia was terminated on Tuesday at 1700 hours by land line failure. Due to poor coordination between the Special Services Officers of Rome and 88th Division all arrangements were not made in Gorizia to handle traffic on their newly assigned day of Wednesday.

3. Results for July, as compared with June, indicate the continued general decrease in demand due to redeployment of troops and decrease in the number of troops on leave in Rome.

1. Cognizance is always taken of the reports of circuit failures of the character indicated in the basic letter on the Transatlantic line.

2. The Signal Officer, 38th Division first tried open wire pairs, then a carrier channel and finally secured underground cable pairs for the subject circuit link. Another plan using aid of civil facilities where these will expedite service is being evolved. If this is arranged and proves successful, circuit time loss will be reduced to a negligible figure.

Naples Sunday service is unaffected. The effective date of the change will be Wednesday, 31 July, 1946.

2. The AFHQ Long Lines Liaison Office in Rome will take care of the TCO. No changes in the Rome local lines is necessary for this new schedule.

3. Rome Area MTOUSA special Services Officer will coordinate the new schedule with Gorizia and Leghorn Special Services Officers, who will publicize the change in their respective districts.

4. Italcable will notify all their interested personnel as well as Azienda di Stato, who will readjust their schedules.

5. All the above was carried out on the basis of verbal approval by the AFHQ Deputy Chief Signal Officer so as to provide more service to the troops in the Gorizia area, where the demand remains substantial, and decrease the wasted circuit time from Leghorn, where the demand has decreased markedly.

In support of the basic communication, requested transmission measurement tests from Freedom Exchange carrier room at AFPO telephone central office to UDINE and GORIZIA, indicate transmission losses as high as seventeen (17) decibels in the UDINE-GORIZIA link through the Spiral-Four (CF-1) system speech channel. This loss is believed to be unusually high and when tied into those inevitable in long lines to Rome, Leghorn and Caserta results in circuits which are practically unusable.

1. Radiotelephone service to the U.S.A. from Gorizia has been interrupted almost every operational day for more than a month now. Particularly, in view of the recent suggestion that Gorizia be allowed four operating days per week, instead of three, some definite corrective action should be taken as soon as possible.

2. Contact with local signals has revealed that almost invariably the trouble is on the Udine-Gorizia link, whose maintenance is a responsibility of the 88th division.

3. Special Services is asking the 88th Division Special Services Officer to bring as much pressure as possible to bear on the matter. At the same time it would doubtless be of invaluable aid if your office could apply needed pressure from the technically interested branch of this radiotelephone service.

1. Following is the result of the survey of the Month of June 1946 call tickets for the Italy-U.S.A. radiotelephone link. The results for May are shown for comparison.
2. The survey was conducted as follows:
 - (a) All calls were classified as to point of origin-Rome, U.S.A. (destination-Rome only), Leghorn, Gorizia, Naples.
 - (b) Each of the above classes was surveyed for completed collect calls.
 - (c) All the completed calls were surveyed for "Rebooks" i.e. calls where the called party would not be available until some later specified time, which in turn became the postponed or "Rebook" scheduled time.
 - (d) Next, all the completed calls (including "Rebooks") were analyzed to determine what delay category they fell in. The first category is those calls completed on or before the scheduled time (OT). The next four divide the first hour of delay into quarters. The next six divide the interval from one to four hours delay into half hour periods. The following group is calls delayed between four to five hours while the last group lumps together all those with more than five hours delay. The results of this part of the survey are expressed in percentage of completed calls so that at a glance it is possible to tell what percentage of calls were completed before any specified period.

2. Leghorn and Rome demands dropped to new lows, whereas the continuing large demand from Gorizia could not be met due to extremely bad land line conditions to Gorizia. For endless hours this last week the circuit stood idle because New York refused to accept traffic over such a poor line.
3. In view of the demands it is advisable to reduce, immediately the Leghorn operating days to two per week and raise that of Gorizia to four per week. However, such a system will not guarantee an increase in the handling of military traffic until the Gorizia land line is improved.
4. Your opinion as to the proposed change and the correct procedure to use to get the Gorizia line improved, will be greatly appreciated.
