THROUGH: Director, Communications Sub Commission

TO : Office of Executive Commissioner

1. It is recommended that the Italian teletype facilities of the Signal Section be discontinued.

2. One teletype line is maintained and operated to the Italian State Postal and Telegraph switchboard by nine Italian Military personnel attached to AC from the Italian General Staff. When financial responsibility for communications is assumed by the Allied Governments, there will certainly be some expense to AC for these facilities, if not for personnel, surely for the direct line to San Silvestro and the traffic charge of 2 lire per group. Present average daily traffic, incoming and outgoing, is 1500 groups.

3. If the Italian facilities are continued beyond 1 July 1946, each message dispatched by them must be checked thoroughly to determine whether it can be sent part or the whole of the way by military facilities, or what the most economical commercial routing will be. This is a function of Signal Office, AFHQ. The accounting and records necessary to satisfy finance officers certifying message charges will be out of proportion to the value of the Italian facilities to AC.



The Navy teletype station in Palermo will not be closed for approximately eight weeks, according to information from the Navy received by the Chief Liaison Officer.

2. Both Maj. Hector of MMIA in Palermo and the Chief Liaison Officer in Palermo have indicated the desire to have the cipher operator returned to Comando Territoriale Sicilia. However, it is the opinion of this section that the transfer should remain in effect.

3. The CLO in Sicily can utilize Italian military teletype using cipher operator for classified traffic. Thus operator need not be idle.

4. The Navy station will cease operation soon, and it would seem more expeditious to allow transfer to stand than to recall the operator and retransfer him eight weeks hence.

1. Reference the attached correspondence, para 2A, we have kept a constant check on such delays in this Signal Office since the event of receiving the correspondence originally, and do not find any cases of excess delay, in the paraphrasing and onward transmission from this office.

2. With the event of the closing of the Sardegna Regional Headquarters, Transportation Sub-Commission has arranged for the Italian Ministry of Marines to handle its outgoing and incoming traffic direct in Ministry of Marines Cipher. This had decreased the need for the ALCOM Italian Cipher team in Sardegna to practically NIL, with only a total of two to four signals per day classified higher than RESTRICTED (both incoming and outgoing) being handled since 12 April 1945. Therefore, it is anticipated that on 20 April 1945, orders will be originated to return the Sardegna Italian Cipher team to its proper station.

3. Effective 20 April 1945, the Signal Center, Allied Commission, will accept for electrical transmission to Sardegna only cables classified RESTRICTED or IN CLEAN. MMIA and Air Dispatch Letter Service will then be the only alternative routes for CONFIDENTIAL and SECRET traffic to and from Sardegna.

1. The object of establishing Italian cipher personnel at all Regional Headquarters is a long-term policy designed to provide the Allied Commission with a method of confidential communications over civil telegraphs with and between Regional Headquarters, independent of Allied Military communications and Allied cipher personnel.

2. It is true that communications to Palermo can still be effected over British naval circuits; it is also true that it has been necessary to restrict the classification of messages dealt with to Cagliari to high priority traffic. Both these situations are however temporary; there is no guarantee that Allied communications to Palermo will be indefinitely maintained; the restriction on the Cagliari route has been necessary for a number of coincidental reasons, all temporary. One of the submarine cables has broken, causing a severe drop in traffic capacity: the military have withdrawn their main signal equipment in Cagliari but a good deal of traffic is taking place in connection with the withdrawal of rear parties and the rear link wireless set broke down. The military traffic should soon cease and the cable be repaired when it will be possible to lift the restriction. 4644

3. Practically all Allied Commission traffic sent over civilian routes should preferably be ciphered although of low security value, as internal Allied Commission matters of no military importance should not be open to Italian officials.

4. Will you please reconsider the matter in the light of the foregoing and particularly as a long-term policy to meet a probable situation when all military facilities including air mail services are withdrawn.

1. The communication required between U.S.A.C.C. and G6 proposed regions, size of field will be region (Tunis) presenting a general problem, and your suggestion is requested in this matter.
2. A.C.C. Communications are, of course, a military responsibility, and normally provided through common-user established adjacent to major military signal offices.
3. In the case of the proposed Regional HQ in the Tunis area, however, it is understood that there is likely to be a very small military contingent in that area, and no would seem probable that communications to that area through military channels may be indispensable.
4. On the other hand it is anticipated that the regular population, high manufacturing output and considerable political influence, good communications are therefore considered of importance to the effective control of this area.
5. In view of these circumstances, it is requested that the following be considered, one for A.C.C. HQ, one for Piedmonte Regional HQ, similar arrangements to this have of course been made in earlier cases, such as the Neplien - Brindisi and Rome - Salerno, linking army line communications could be provided.

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF GORDON GODFREY

The first of the new series of *Journal of the Royal Society of Medicine* was published on 1st January 1907. The Society has now issued 12 volumes, containing 120 articles, and the number of members has increased from 1,000 to 2,000. The Society's objects are to promote the study of medicine, to encourage research, and to disseminate knowledge among medical men. The Society's publications include the *Journal of the Royal Society of Medicine*, the *Transactions of the Royal Society of Medicine*, and the *Proceedings of the Royal Society of Medicine*.

The cause of the revolution was the same as that of the American Revolution, which was to secure the independence of the colonies from Great Britain. The colonies had been taxed without their consent, and were compelled to pay a large sum of money to the British government. They also complained of the want of representation in the British Parliament, and of the arbitrary power exercised by the British officials over them. These grievances, combined with the desire for self-government and the love of freedom, led to the outbreak of the revolution.

The community of Tadoussac, situated on the north shore of the St. Lawrence River, about 100 miles above Quebec, is the home of a number of Indians who have adopted the Catholic religion. They are called "Catholics" by the French, and "Indians" by the English. They are a poor people, and their mode of life is simple. They live in small houses, and their food consists mainly of fish and game. They are a peaceful people, and their chief occupation is fishing.
