 Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command, APO 794

1. Effective 1 February 1946 the Allied Military Authorities in ITALY (less 13 Corps Area) will cease to be responsible for the provision of communications on behalf of the Italian Armed Forces.

2. At that date, all circuits forming part of the pre-war civilian network, now controlled by the Allies, but in use by the Italian Armed Forces, will be formally returned to Italian Government control. The appropriate Italian Military Authorities will be informed of these steps at once so that they may have the opportunity of re-requisitioning the facilities in good time.

3. The use by Italian Armed Forces of circuits on Allied Military routes, i.e. routes constructed with military stores entirely and maintained by Allied Signal personnel, will be discontinued, or alternatively, the maintenance taken over by the Italian Military Authorities.

4. As a result of this change in policy effective 1 February 1946, no Italian Military units or formations will be permitted access to the Allied Military Telephone or Telegraph networks in ITALY. There will be one exception to this ruling, namely, that they may use the military network entirely within the 13 Corps boundary.

5. This memorandum in no way absolves British Signals from their responsibilities for the provision of communications for British Liaison Units (BLU's) working with Italian formations.

1. In line with the subject of a short title to be used by the Air Forces Sub-Commission in addresses as discussed in the meeting yesterday morning, the CITE ACAIR is a designation which is used only in the internal address of cables. The practice of Air Forces Sub-Commission and its correspondents using the short-title designation of AFSC as the actual external cable address for the Sub-Commission is causing considerable delay of some cables which are being received by RAAC. RAAC has made efforts to catch the designation AFSC when it is intended for the Air Forces Sub-Commission, but on many occasions it has not been possible to determine if such cables were in fact intended for the Air Forces Sub-Commission or for the Air Force Service Command which also has a headquarters in this area.

2. Since the bulk of our traffic and that of RAAC is received via teletypewriter, an external address appears something like this:

LROF V _____ Nr 12
T AFSC ROME
FROM _____ 121450B
TO AFSC ROME
GR 33 BT

Unless there is a definite internal address ^{54?} that cites ACAIR or designates the Air Forces Sub-Commission as the actual addressee, RAAC is unable to determine if such a cable is for the headquarters here or for the Air Force Service Command in Rome.

3. It is therefore suggested that the Air Forces Sub-Commission be directed to use their FULL title in external addresses and notify their correspondents to do likewise, or devise some short-title address for external use as shown above in para 2. Unless this is done, the Air Forces Sub-Commission will continue to have delays on incoming traffic which cannot be avoided.

SUBJECT: Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic

TO : Office of the Executive Commissioner
(Attention: Major Stearns)

1. The Cipher Control Mission, Allied Commission, upon receiving Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic for checking, stamps all such traffic "approved for transmission by FILAP", which means that Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic must of necessity be transmitted via Cables & Wireless, Ltd., Since FILAP means "transmit by cable only".

2. Upon being approached by the representative of the RCA in Rome approximately one month ago, the undersigned directed that the Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic be given equitable distribution between Cables & Wireless Ltd. and RCA for transmission, without realizing that all Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic (with the exception of some clear texts) were being stamped for transmission by cables only. This resulted in error according to the present direction of the Communications Sub-Commission.

3. It is requested by this office that an investigation be made into the necessity for all Italian Foreign Ministry cipher traffic being transmitted via cables (secure means), since such cipher is, to the knowledge of the undersigned, purely diplomatic cipher and affords no security value. It is further pointed out that the American Embassy uses RCA channels only (with the exception of approximately 5% with similar diplomatic ciphers, and to my knowledge, the security of their ciphers is not impaired.

4. It is felt that this matter is possibly of small consequence; however, this office wishes to deal fairly with both British and American firms that may be represented in Italy.

SUBJECT: Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic

TO : Office of the Executive Commissioner
Communications Sub-Commission
(Thru: Adjutant, Allied Commission)

1. Due to the increase in Italian Foreign Ministry traffic over recent months and because of an extreme shortage of typists in the Cable Section, Office of the Executive Commissioner, the following is a proposal for the handling of outgoing Italian Foreign Ministry traffic:

a. Abolishment of the Allied Commission Reference number to such traffic. Propose that a separate series of consecutive numbers preceded by the letter "I" and assigned by Cipher Control Mission be instituted. By this separate series of numbers, the Cipher Control Mission and Signal Center can be assured that all Italian Foreign Ministry traffic is cleared properly to the transmitting agency.

b. The abolishment of authentication by the Adjutant of Allied Commission. Propose that Mr. Catty and/or Captain Duke of Cipher Control Mission be allowed to sign outgoing Italian Foreign Ministry traffic in the space "authenticated by", and that such signature be considered as complete authentication of this traffic.

c. Since the keeping of file copies of this traffic in Allied Commission Master and Float files serves absolutely no working purpose, the establishment of a and b above would allow the passing of Italian Foreign Ministry traffic direct from Cipher Control Mission to Signal Center, thus eliminating time lost by typing, etc., in the Cable Section, as well as relieving the Cable Section of unwarranted burden. The Cipher Control Mission's file would then become the permanent file of Italian Foreign Ministry traffic for the Commission.

2. If the above proposal receives favorable consideration, it will be necessary to ask the Italian government to furnish 3 cipher texts and 1 clear text of cipher traffic (plus copies for Cipher Control Mission) and 2 copies of clear text traffic (plus copies for Cipher Control Mission). It is felt that certainly speedier transmission will result, which of course will give more pleasant relations with the Italian Government. Also, actual Allied Commission traffic will receive better handling.

1. Reference basic communication and indorsements attached, this office is prepared to place the original plan into operation with the exceptions as shown below.

2. The separate series of reference numbers as mentioned in para 1a of basic communication, as agreed, will not be instituted. Instead, the consecutive annual series of reference numbers now in use by the Italian Ministry will be considered by the Signal Center as the reference numbers of this traffic, and it is requested that any query on non-delivery, etc., which may be directed to the Signal Center, be expressed with those reference numbers assigned by the Italian Ministry.

3. Since the Italian Ministry traffic will be on Italian Government message forms, there will be no space for the authenticator to sign such messages. The Adjutant, Allied Commission has agreed to the abolishment of authentication by the Adjutant; therefore the Signal Center, Allied Commission is prepared to accept the initialed stamp of the Cipher Security Mission as proper authentication, on Italian Foreign Ministry traffic only. A covering letter will be sent to Cables & Wireless and other Commercial Companies authorizing those companies to transmit Italian Foreign Ministry traffic bearing your stamp.

4. In line with our conversation on this matter, this office requests that your file be turned over to the Cable Section at the end of each thirty days, in order that the Allied Commission may maintain a permanent file of Italian Ministry Traffic.

1. As expressed in min 105 by Colonel Henderson, Communications Sub-Commission, Allied Governments are permitted to deal with the Commercial Companies directly in the handling of their traffic.

2. Neutral Governments must deal with Civil Censorship Group in the handling of their traffic. Such traffic should not come through any other section of ALCOM.

3. Italian Foreign Ministry traffic will continue to pass through the Commission. It has already been established that outgoing traffic of this nature will not be handled through Message Center, Office of the Executive Commissioner, but will be handed directly by the Cipher Security Mission to Signal Center for transmission. Incoming traffic is received by Signal Center in duplicate and one copy is passed to Cipher Security Mission for checking while the other copy goes to Message Center, Office of the Executive Commissioner for direct dispatch without scrutiny or typing.

4. It is recommended by this office that the Liaison Officer, Allied Commission, contact the Various legations, embassies, etc., represented in Italy, and inform them of the policy as outlined in min 105. If this is done through the proper liaison level contact, Message Center, Office of the Executive Commissioner will then only handle Italian Foreign Ministry traffic as stated in para 3 above.

TO : ALL CONCERNED

1. IT HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO MY ATTENTION THAT EYES ONLY, PERSONAL, AND TOPSECRET TRAFFIC IS BEING MISHANDLED BY VARIOUS MEMBERS OF OF THIS ORGANIZATION. IN THE FUTURE SUCH TRAFFIC WILL BE HANDLED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

EYES ONLY, PERSONAL, AND TOPSECRET TRAFFIC WILL, UPON BEING DECIPHERED, BE PLACED IN A SEALED ENVELOPE WITH THE SIGNAL CENTER INFORMATION WRITTEN ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE ENVELOPE, AND PASSED INTO THE SIGNAL CENTER FOR CLEARANCE AND DELIVERY. EYES ONLY AND PERSONAL TRAFFIC WILL HAVE PLACED ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE ENVELOPE THE NAME OF THE PERSON TO WHOM IT IS ADDRESSED.

2. IT IS THE ORDERS OF THIS HEADQUARTERS THAT ALL INCOMING TRAFFIC, WHETHER FOR MMIA OR FOR ANY OTHER ADDRESS INSIDE THIS HEADQUARTERS, ~~MMIA~~ WILL BE DELIVERED THROUGH THE ADJUTANT'S DEPT. IF A MESSAGE CANNOT BE BROKEN BY THE CIPHER ROOM CONCERNED BECAUSE IT IS IN A SYSTEM HELD BY MMIA, IT WILL BE RETURNED TO THE SIGNAL CENTER FOR CLEARANCE AND DELIVERY.

3. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL EITHER CIPHER ROOM ASSUME DELIVERY OF INCOMING TRAFFIC UNTIL IT IS FIRST CLEARED THROUGH THE SIGNAL CENTER. THE SIGNAL CENTER MUST HAVE A RECEIPT FOR ALL TRAFFIC, SHOWING TIME OF DELIVERY.

SUBJECT: Signal Traffic and Official Mail to Liaison Officers

TO : Office of the Executive Commissioner
(Attn: Major Stearns)

1. This office has informed the Communications Sub-Commission that the Italian Cipher teams located at Sicily and Sardegna will be held at their present locations until such time that the traffic load (signal) does not warrant their maintenance. As was suggested in our conversations concerning this, it is requested that the cable addresses for the Liaison Officers be as follows: LIAISON OFFICER ALCOM SARDEGNA, (CAGLIARI), etc.

2. Concerning addresses for official mail to the points in question, Lieut. Farris, Postal Officer, informs me that the use of and the publishing of Army Post Office numbers with physical locations such as Palermo, etc., is forbidden by postal regulations. Therefore, it is suggested that official mail be addressed in the same way as signal traffic, and that it be passed in the regular way through the message center and mail dispatch office. Mail addressed in this manner will be handled through the ADLS.

3. If the handling suggested in para. 2 above proves unsatisfactory, it may be possible for Lt. Farris to arrange for a special classified publication of APOs to be used in the manner suggested by you: LIAISON OFFICER ALCOM, APO ____.

3. Liaison officers will keep close touch with the senior military formation, American and British in their areas. They will endeavour at all times to assist military formations in their relations with Italian Government departments and agencies. They must, however, remember that they are Liaison officers and not executive officers and will not be able to carry out many of the functions of Provincial Commissioners.

Points which may require special attention are:

- a. Law cases affecting Allied personnel or property.
- b. Epidemics endangering Allied personnel.
- c. Requisitioning or requisitioning.
- d. Relations between Allied and Italian police force.

4. Liaison officers will, in the absence of specialist AG officers, assist the Allied Forces Local Resources Board, or Allied Procuring Agencies, as may be necessary, in their relations with the Italian authorities.

5. Liaison officers will be stationed at centres of importance to Allied interests. They will assist, as necessary, relations between the Allied Services and the local Italian officials.

Liaison officers will normally confine their activities to the neighbourhood of the HQ in which they are located but, in cases of necessity, they will of course deal with all matters arising from civil affairs affecting Allied interests within the Provinces as listed above.

6. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian local government, and, even if asked, they will not give official advice, on behalf of AC, to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome.

7. The AC liaison officer will be responsible for discipline and administration of all AC officers in his area.

SUBJECT: Classification of Documents

TO : Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission, APO 394

1. It has been brought to the attention of this office that on the evening of 3 September 1945, the Press Office, British Embassy, Rome, submitted to the Dispatch Letter Service, Allied Commission four pouches which were classified as confidential, and which necessitated registration before dispatch. One pouch, No. 3, dated 3/9/45, and which received the Allied Commission registration number 3-9359, became torn in the place where the pencilled pouch markings were made, and it was seen that the pouch contained newspapers which obviously could not be classified as confidential under existing theater regulations.

2. It is recommended that this matter be brought forcibly to the attention of the Press Office authorities of the British Embassy, pointing out to them that it is a serious violation of theater ALO and theater ARS procedures and orders to thus falsely classify any document so that it may receive registered handling through the military channels. Personnel of ALO and ARS offices are liable to heavy disciplinary action for accepting such documents, regardless of source of origin.

3. The other three pouches, while suspiciously similar to the above mentioned pouch, were dispatched unopened. It is recommended that this pouch be returned to the Press Office, British Embassy, Rome, for proper classification, and that the registration number already assigned to this pouch be cancelled.

SUBJECT: Outgoing Signal Traffic

TO : Establishments Section, Allied Commission
(Attn: Captain L. T. MONTANT)

1. Attention is called to the fact that many Sub-Commissions, Sections and Branches are disregarding the repeated notices in the Daily Bulletin in reference to submitting signal traffic for transmission as early as possible during the day. On Saturday night last, 4 August 1945, about thirty (30) outgoing signals were received by this office for authentication between the hours of 1700 and 1800 and about fifty-one (51) were received by the Night Staff Duty Officer between 1800 and 1900 hours. A good many of these messages were marked PRIORITY, and in some instances the reference numbers on these messages were obtained from the Cable Typing Pool the day before. This procedure is a direct violation of AFHQ Letter, subject: "Proper Use of Classification and Precedence", file AG 311.5/199 SIG-O, dated 11 June 1945 and other publications on this subject.

2. It is believed that a good many of these messages could easily be sent as letters for delivery by ELS or ADLS and other various messenger services, especially in those areas where a shortage of electrical facilities exist and delivery by ELS or ADLS would be more convenient and speedier.

3. A notice in the Daily Bulletin emanating from the Office of the Executive Commissioner on this subject is suggested as it seems that repeated notices from this office are of no avail.

SUBJECT: URGENT Signals

TO : Office of the Executive Commissioner

1. On this date the Labour Sub-Commission originated Cable 1287, classified RESTRICTED, with URGENT precedence. Mr. Piombino, Assistant Adjutant, called the Director, Labour Sub-Commission, asking for a reduction in precedence on this cable, but was refused. The subject matter contained in the cable was labour information, information on a recent meeting concerning same and the setting of 8 July 1945 as the date for a future meeting.

2. While it is realized by this section that such matter may be of national importance to the Italian situation, it is not the policy of this section to transmit URGENT or OPERATIONAL PRIORITY cables into the military signals network unless such cables are sent at the specific direction of the Chief Commissioner's Office or the Executive Commissioner's Office. Military signals facilities have become tremendously overloaded since the cessation of hostilities and AFHQ has published several directives concerning the over-use of high precedence cables into such facilities.

3. This section asks that all Sub-Commissions, Sections and Independent Sub-Commissions again be warned in the above matter, and that, with the permission of the Office of the Executive Commissioner, this section will accept no URGENT or OPERATIONAL PRIORITY cables for transmission unless they are sent at the specific direction of the Chief Commissioner's Office or the Office of the Executive Commissioner.
