SUBJECT: Transmission of Messages Outside the Mediterranean Theater of Operations.

TO : Advisory Council for Italy
Political Section

1. So much of letter on above subject, dated 6 December 1944, this Office, as refers to the types of messages which may be sent outside MTO in clear, is hereby rescinded. The following is quoted from letter file HQ05, Office of the Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ, dated 6 December 1944, and is substituted therefor:

a. All messages to be transmitted outside the Mediterranean Theater of Operations, whether by radio or submarine cable, will be sent in cipher. The only exceptions to this rule will be Press Dispatches, Communiques, messages liable to be published, and categories of messages authorized by AFHQ signal instructions or by special letters of instructions issued by AFHQ.

b. Messages classified "CONFIDENTIAL" or lower may be sent in the clear by submarine cable to GHQ, Middle East."

2. It is hoped that the above quotation from the subsequent letter from AFHQ may clarify the previous instructions issued on this subject.

Subject : Transmission of Telegrams to Missions Abroad

To : Political Section

1. Reference your 727/20 December 1944, the following procedure is recommended concerning the preparation of cables for transmission to Missions Abroad :

a. Prepare cables as "Book Messages", showing all addressees in the "Address" space. Here are two exceptions to this; Sofia and Bucarest, which may be handled in the usual manner until further notice. The words "Book Message" or "Multiple Address Message" should precede the list of addressees

b. Only the number of copies should be made as are required by the Adjutants' Office for a single telegram, regardless of the number of addressees.

2. It is pointed out that Commercial Companies assume the responsibility for delivery to all addressees shown in a book message (with the two exceptions noted above). The inclusion of the addressees within the cipher text of a telegram of this nature is entirely at the discretion of the originating Mission. In cases of Book Messages any internal address, however, should not indicate passing or retransmission instructions except for Ankara to retransmit to Sofia and Bucarest.

3. All of paragraph 3 of Ref. 723 should be deleted except its reference to Bucarest and Sofia.

Subject : Rome - Moscow Radio Telegraph Circuit

To : The Under-Secretary of State for P.I.

1. Further to our letter of 20th December, 1944 (C.115.101 CB) and with reference to your Prot. S/13/4017 of 23 November, the release of equipment and assignment of frequencies have been completed and satisfactory exchange of test signals has taken place.
2. Copies of censorship regulations for this circuit are enclosed. It will be observed that ciphered communications of the Italian Government are required to follow present authorised channels. The regulations for the public should be made public by your office at the earliest opportunity.
3. The circuit may be opened on 27th January. This Commission will notify the Russian Embassy to this effect. It is suggested that it be opened to the public on 1st Feb. 1945, so as to allow time for the notices to be circulated.

CENSORSHIP REGULATIONS FOR RUSS-MOSCOW RADIO-TELEGRAPH CIRCUIT:

1. All outgoing and incoming traffic, other than Press, will be submitted to Civil Censorship by the operating company prior to onward transmission or further delivery. Press traffic will be submitted to Field Press Censorship; Press messages may be in English, French or Italian only.
2. Russian Government official messages will be submitted to Civil Censorship for the purpose of checking the authenticity of the message.
3. Italian Government message traffic other than that authorized to be sent in clear text, will not be transmitted by this circuit, but will be handled through hitherto authorized channels of communication.
4. Official traffic to and from other governments will also be submitted to Civil Censorship for authentication in accordance with previously existing procedures. Languages permitted are those specified for such channels of communication.
5. All other types of traffic will be submitted to Civil Censorship for censorship. Languages permitted will be English, Italian, French, and Russian.
6. Civilian radio-telegraph traffic other than the classifications covered specifically by these regulations will be subject to complete censorship under the general cable and radio censorship regulations now in force.
7. Subjects which may not be mentioned in clear language messages include: ship movements, military topics of any kind, weather, movements of Allied government official or agents, any other information which may be of aid or comfort to the enemy.

ROME-MOSCOW RADIO-TELEGRAPH CIRCUIT
REGULATIONS FOR THE PUBLIC

In addition to general Censorship Regulation, the following regulations apply in particular to all civil traffic over the Rome-Moscow radio-telegraph circuit (other than Press traffic, which is covered by special regulations):

1. Only messages which are personal in nature will be permitted.
 2. All messages filed shall be at the sender's risk and may be acted upon at the discretion of the Censor without notice to the sender.

3. Reports of delivery, sender's corrections and all other services by a communications company at the request of a patron and the giving of any information concerning Censorship's action on any message are prohibited unless permission is obtained from Civil Censorship. This regulation does not apply to cancellations.

Patrons filing "reply prepaid" messages do so at their own risk.

4. The complete name and address of the addressee must appear on the message.

5. Signature.

(a) Sender should be clearly distinguished from any other individual with a similar name.

(b) A surname is rarely considered sufficient identification.

(c) Full name and address of the sender must be recorded on the message form.

6. Messages will not be passed unless the meaning of the text is clear to the Censor.

(a) Messages consisting of address and signature with no text are not permitted.

(b) English, French, Italian, and Russian languages are permitted.

(c) Numbers unrelated to the text are prohibited.

(d) Any word, term, phraseology or language having a double meaning as used, is prohibited.

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(c) All messages must be in plain language. Messages in code are not permitted.

7. Forbidden Subjects. Subjects which may not be mentioned in messages include: movements or locations of ships, troops or aircraft; positions of airfields, guns or service establishments; details of operations, arms, munitions, explosives, casualties, damage to any part of the armed forces of the United Nations, or to any transportation; details of location, time, or effect of air raids; details of any defense organization; mention of people arrested or interned; mention of movements of United Nations government or service officials or agents; confirmation of telegraph, cable or radio messages.

" Italian Government message traffic of a classification below 'Confidential' may be transmitted by this circuit either in clear text or in an authorised brevity code; Italian Government message traffic of 'Confidential' classification will continue to be handled through hitherto authorised channels of communications."

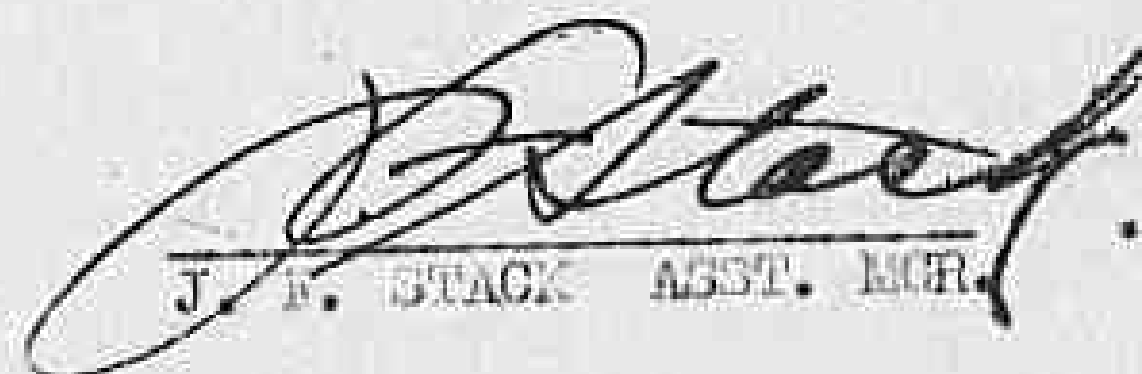

SUBJECT: Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic

TO : Communications Sub-Commission

1. Reference attached correspondence, a study of this traffic has been made, and it has been found that the error has been made in the Signal Center, Allied Commission. It has been found that at least 95% of Italian Foreign Ministry traffic is marked "FILAP" by the Cipher Security Mission. Due to instructions by the undersigned (not realizing the extent of FILAP application), the Signal Center has been making as nearly as possible an equitable disposition of this traffic to Cables & Wireless Ltd., and RCA for transmission.

2. However, I do not agree with Mr. Smith that this class of traffic has ceased via his routes during the past month. According to our records, Cables & Wireless Ltd. has received at least an equal share of the traffic during that period.

3. While I have given instructions that all Foreign Ministry traffic marked FILAP will be passed via Cables only, I cannot understand the nature of such traffic all requiring security transmission. I can understand that a certain percent of diplomatic traffic would require security transmission, but it seems to me that the proportion of Italian Foreign Ministry traffic requiring such transmission is completely out of proportion.

4. It is assumed of course that all Italian Ciphers were at some time compromised; however, with the employment of new keys it would appear to me that a certain amount of security would be regained.

SUBJECT: Clearance of Italian Foreign Ministry Traffic

TO : Communications SUB-Commission

1. Reference the attached correspondence, this office has made an exhaustive check with Cipher Control Mission's records, Signal Center Allied Commission, Cables & Wireless' records, and RCA records, and find that messages numbers 41, 47, 52, 53, and 62 passed through our Signal Center and was cleared to Cables & Wireless and RCA. All except 62 were cleared to Cables & Wireless. Our receipt times show: nr 41 191750, C&W; nr 47 021045 Mar, C&W; nr 52 111440 Mar, C&W; nr 53 151300 Mar, C&W; nr 62 231410 Mar, RCA. Cables & Wireless and RCA assures that the above messages were cleared to the addressee.

2. There is no record of the other messages mentioned in the original correspondence. It is believed that there is no such record because of the handling that this traffic has received heretofore by being typed in the Cable Section. At the present moment, there is no sure method of doing cross reference between Allied Commission reference number and the Italian Ministry number.

3. In view of the above, it is requested that the handling of Italian Ministry traffic as outlined in previous correspondence from this office, be favorably considered.

1. Approval has been received from the U.S. Department of State for the routing of west-bound commercial traffic by submarine cable.

2. The Federal Communications Commission, it is learned, will not establish any formula for division between radio and cable traffic, leaving this matter to be decided by agreement between the operating companies concerned. The Department of State has communicated with the companies.

3. From the foregoing it is assumed that the operating companies will now route westbound commercial traffic by cable as well as radio without further notice from Washington, as soon as they receive information from their head offices regarding the division of traffic to be made.
